- lepe.lepe.** 1. Redup. of *lepe* 1; fringed. (PEP *lepelepe*.) 2. n. Wattles. 3. n. Labia minor. (PCP *lepelepe*.) 4. Same as *lepelepe-o-Hina*.
- lepe.lepe-a-moa.** n. *Selaginella arbuscula*, small club mosses; used for leis, braided with rosebuds. (Neal 3-5.)
- lepe.lepe-o-Hina.** n. 1. Monarch butterfly (*Danaus plexippus*); Ka-mehameha butterfly. 2. Nudibranchia. 3. Same as *lepe-o-Hina* 1, a seaweed.
- lō.pelo, lepero.** Same as *lepela* (formerly only *leper*).
- lepe.lua.** nvs. A turncoat; unfaithful. *Rare*.
- lepe-o-Hina.** n. 1. A red seaweed (*Halymenia formosa*) with flat blades bearing fringed and irregular margins, with a variety of colors ranging from red to yellow; common allusion to swirling in water resembling movement of *pā'ū* in dancing. Also called *lehelehe'lio*, *lepelepe-o-Hina*, *limu-pepe-o-Hina*, *pā'ū-o-Hi'iaka*. 2. Same as *lepelepe-o-Hina*, a butterfly.
- lepe.ulū.** n. Split or crack in wood, running with the grain. *Rare*.
- lepo.** 1. nvs. Dirt, earth, ground, filth, rubbish, silt, soil, excrement; dirty, soiled. *Fig.*, common people (For. 6:391). See ex., *dust*. *Hana lepo*, stools, excreta; to excrete. **ho'o.lepo.** Caus/sim. (PEP *lepo*.) 2. Var. of *lipo* 1.
- lepo 'ae.'ae.** n. Dust.
- lepo hā.nai.** n. Dirt; rubbish carried to a pit, as to a compost pit. *Lit.*, fed dirt.
- lepo.hao.** nvs. Rust; rusty. *Lit.*, iron dirt.
- lepo kā.wili.** n. Adobe; clay. (Isa. 41.25.) *Lit.*, mixed earth.
- lepo kī.'aha.** n. Potter's clay, clay vessel. *Lit.*, cup dirt.
- lepo kuhue.** n. Type of clay. *Lit.*, solidifying dirt.
- lepo.lepo.** vs. Dirty, turbid; contaminated, as water. (PCP *lepolepo*.)
- lepo lo'i.** n. Taro-patch mud.
- lepo mā.noa.noa.** n. Clay. *Lit.*, thick dirt.
- lepo.nalo.** n. 1. A euphemism for *kūkaenalo*; wax; mole (anatomical); muslin. 2. A kind of seaweed.
- lepo.nō.nō.** Same as *'ai-a-ka-nēnē*, a plant.
- lepo.pā'a.** n. Hard earth; constipation.
- lepo.pele.** n. Match, sulphur (euphemism for *kūkaepele*). *Lit.*, volcanic dirt.
- lepo pō.** n. Night soil.
- lepo pohō.** n. Marshy ground, marsh, mire (Ioba 8.11).
- lepo pō.polo.** n. *Pōpolo* herb dirt, an uncomplimentary term for commoners. See *pōpolo*.
- lepo 'ula.'ula.** n. Red earth. *Fig.*, people interrelated for generations (*rare*).
- lepo uli.** n. Ashes of certain woods mixed with water, as for medicine. *Lit.*, dark earth.
- lepu.** n. Hare. (1843 Bible, Kanl. 14.7.) (Latin *lepus*, a genus.)
- Lepu.palika, Rēpupalika.** 1. nvs. Republican (political party). A newspaper, 1901-2, was entitled Home Rula Repubalika. *Eng.* 2. (*Not cap.*) n. Republic.
- leu.** n. Loins (rare, in a chant in Kam. 64:124).
- leu.wī.** n. Canoe with extra wide weatherboard; fore-point of a canoe where the two ends of the two weatherboards come together.
- lewa.** 1. n. Sky, atmosphere, space, air, upper heavens; aerial. *Ka'aahi kau i ka lewa*, elevated train. *He wai kau i ka lewa: he niu* (riddle), water perched in the sky: a coconut. *Mahele kua lewa*, air force. 2. vi. To float, dangle, swing, hang, oscillate; swinging, dangling, pendulous, afloat, unstable; limber-jointed, of admired hula dancers. Cf. *akalewa*, *ha'alewa*. *Halelewa*, tabernacle. *Hōkū lewa*, moving star, planet. *One lewa*, shifting sand. *Kai lewa*, deep sea out of sight of land. *Ka moana lewa loa*, the deep ocean. *Waiū lewa*, long, pendulous breasts. *E ola ana 'oia nei a lewa ke kanahiku*, he will live on to past seventy. **ho'o.lewa.** (a) To float, as a cloud; to lift up and carry, as on a stretcher; to suspend. *Moe ho'olewa*, stretcher, hammock. *Nā mea ho'olewa*, peddlers [they carried their goods swinging on a carrying pole; cf. *kālewa* 1]. (b) To rotate the hips in dancing, sway. See song under Hopoe. *He aha ē ka hana a 'Ana-pau lā? Ho'olewa ka hana a 'Ana-pau lā* (song), what is the work of 'Ana-pau there? Rotating the hips is the work of 'Ana-pau there. (PNP *lewa*.) 3. nvs. Homeless vagabond, wanderer; landless, homeless. *He lewa hele, 'a'ohe kahua pa'a*, a wandering traveler without fixed residence. *Po'e lewa* (1 Pet. 2.11), pilgrims. 4. vi. To know thoroughly, as a type of work; to be thoroughly familiar with, as a place. *Ua lewa ia'u ka hana o ke kuiki kapa*, I'm thoroughly familiar with the work of quilting. *Ua hele au i kēia mau kuahiwi ā lewa*, I've gone to these mountains until I know every nook and corner. 5. (*Cap.*) n. Name of a star.
- lewa. ho'o.lewa.** Funeral. *Anaina ho'olewa*, funeral wake.
- lewaa.lani.** n. Part of a heiau temple where human sacrifices were offered.
- lewaa.nu'u.** n. Probably a part of the *lananu'u mamao* turret.
- lewa ho'o.makua.** n. Space just above the surface of the earth. (Malo 10.)
- lewa lani.** n. Highest stratum of the heavens.
- lewa lani lewa.** n. Lower atmosphere, just above the *lewa ho'omakua*.
- lewa.lewa.** 1. Redup. of *lewa* 2; oscillate. *Kulapepeiao lewalewa*, dangling earrings. *Keiki ma'i lewalewa*, boy before the age of puberty who did not wear a malo; *lit.*, child dangling genital. **ho'o.lewa.lewa.** (a) Same as *lewalewa*; to cause to dangle. (b) Kind of fish net suspended from a canoe in the deep sea. Also *maiewa*. (PNP *lewalewa*.) 2. n. Unconcealed penis of a boy, usually called *ma'i lewalewa*. 3. (*Cap.*) n. Nickname for Gilbertese, because their stretched ear lobes dangled.
- lewa lilo loa, lewa luna lilo.** n. Outer space, highest atmosphere.
- lewa mawaho.** n. Outer space.
- lewa nu'u.** n. Space in the heavens lower than the *lewa lani*; atmosphere reached by birds.
- lewa.walo.** vi. To run calling (probably a contraction of *lele wawalo*).
- lewia.kana, leviatana.** n. Leviathan. (Ioba 41.1.) *Eng.*
- lewika, Levita.** n. Levites. *Eng.*
- li.** 1. nvi. Chills; to have chills; to tremble with cold; shuddery feeling of horror. Cf. *hulifi*. *Li ka 'ili, li ka 'i'o*, to have goose flesh. *Pi'i ka li*, to get chills. 2. nvt. Lace, as of shoes; to lace or tie. Cf. *li kāliki, li kāma'a*. *E li mai i ke kāma'a o La'a-kea*, tie La'a-kea's shoes. 3. nvt. To hang, gird; to furl or reef, as a sail. (PNP *lii*.) 4. n. Third note in musical scale, mi.
- li-** A prefix to many kinds of seaweeds, short for *limu*.
- lia.** Var. of *liha* 1. (PNP *lia*.)
- lia.** Pas/imp. suffix corresponding to *'ia*. See *kaulia*, *kālia* and especially Gram. 6.6.3. (PNP *-lia*.)
- li'a.** 1. nvt. Strong desire; yearning, amorous; to wish for ardently, crave. 2. n. Fear, chills. (For. 5:585.) (PPN *lika*.)
- lia.'aki.malala.** n. Rear admiral. *Eng.*
- LI-anu.** n. A wind reported at Hālawā, Moloka'i. (For. 5:103.)
- li'anu.** n. Cool chill.
- li'apu.** A variety of taro (no data). (HP 33.)
- li'a.wahine.** n. *Kukui* blossoms used as medicine, named for a woodland goddess. *Lit.*, female desire [or fear]. Also *kihawahine*.
- liha.** 1. n. Nit, louse egg. Also *lia*. (PPN *lisa*.) 2. Same as *liliha*; dreadful, fearful.
- liha.liha.** 1. Same as *liliha* 1. *Lihaliha wale*, rich and oily; pitiful. *Lihaliha wale ke moni akula* (song about fish), so wonderfully rich to swallow. 2. Redup. of *liha* 1; many nits.
