

**liha.lihau.** Redup. of *lihau* 1. *Makulu ka noe, lihalihau*, dripping fog, cool and damp.

**li.hau.** 1. nvi. Gentle cool rain that was considered lucky for fishermen (UL 241); moist and fresh, as plants in the dew or rain; cool, fresh, as dew-laden air. *Onaona ke 'ala o ka maile i ka lihau 'ia e ka ua noe* (song), sweet fragrance of the *maile*, kept fresh and moist by the misty rain. *Lihau mai nei 'oe*, you are freshly adorned as the cool dew-laden plants. 2. n. A variety of sweet potato (no data). (HP 142.)

**lihe.** Rare var. of *liha* 1.

**lihe.lihe.** Redup. of *lihe*.

**lihi.** n. 1. Edge, rim, border, boundary, margins, brim. Also *nihī*. See *nihī* for PPN. Cf. *kaunihinihi*. 2. Small quantity, particle, a little bit, minutia; slight. *'Ike lihi*, to glimpse. *Lihī kama'āina*, slight knowledge, casual acquaintance. *'A'ohē ona lihi ho'omaopopo iki*, he didn't in the least understand. *'A'ole lihi launa o ka pilikia*, there's no end to the trouble. *'A'ohē o'u lihi hoihoi*, I haven't a particle of interest, not the slightest interest. *He lihi pili kō mākou*, we are remotely related. *Lihī launa 'ole*, not the slightest association. *'A'ole e lilo kahi huna, 'a'ole ho'i kahi lihi iki o ke kānāwai* (Mat. 5.18), not one jot, not one tittle shall in any wise pass from the law. **ho'o.lihi.** Caus/sim.; to gird. 3. Right or interest in property. *He lihi ko'u i laila*, I have an interest there. 4. Point of fishhook. (Kam. 76:77.) 5. Pearl-shell lure, as for *'ōpelu* fish. 6. Piece of land usually between two *ahupua'a* and of unestablished ownership.

**lihili.** vs. Confused, bewildered, unsuccessful. *Rare*. Cf. *hili, hilikau*.

**lihi.lihi.** 1. Same as *lihi* 1-3. 2. n. Eyelashes, eyelid. See ex., *'ea'ea* 1, *lau* 7. *Lihilihi maka* (Ioba 16.16), eyelid. *Lihilihi maka ku'i*, artificial eyelashes. *Lihilihi moku*, eyelash that breaks off and gets into the eye. *Lihilihi pi'i*, eyelashes that are long and curl upward. *Lihilihi 'o'oi*, long bristling eyelashes. *Moe i ka lau o ka lihilihi* (Kep. 115), to doze; *lit.*, sleep on the tip of the eyelashes. *'Ike lihilihi* (Kam. 64:98), to observe critically. *Nā lihilihi o 'Āwihi-ka-lani*, eyelashes of the blinking lord [a poetic reference to sleep]. 3. n. Lace. *Kui lihi-lihi*, crochet needle or hook. 4. vt. To crochet. *Ka hana lihilihi 'ana*, crocheting. 5. n. Petals. 6. n. A variety of sweet potato (no data). This may be qualified by the term *palu*.

**lihi.lihi hana lima.** n. Handmade lace; crocheting; any handmade trimming, as of knitting, tatting.

**lihi.lihi kaka.hiaka.** n. Hairy spurge (*Euphorbia hirta*). (Neal 516, 519.) *Ni'ihau*.

**lihi.lihi kui lau.oho.** n. Maltese or hairpin lace.

**lihi.lihi mō.lina.** n. 1. Lace edging. 2. A variety of taro.

**lihi.lihi 'ula.** n. Narrow band of red, as on a skirt.

**lihi lou.** n. Tip of a barbless fishhook.

**liho.** vs. Choice, precious. *Rare*.

**liho.liho.** vs. Very hot, fiery, glowing. *Ka-lani-nui-kua-liholiho-i-ke-kapu* (name for Ka-mehameha II), the great chief with the burning back taboo [he could not be approached from behind].

**li'i.** 1. vs. Small, tiny. (PPN *riki, liki*.) 2. Short for *ali'i*, chief, being especially common after *nā*: *nā li'i*, the chiefs.

**li'i.li'i.** vs. Here and there, piecemeal, a little at a time; small, little, in bits, diminutive, infantile, few. Cf. *ha'āpuka*. *Mea li'i li'i*, trifle. *Kū'ai li'i li'i*, retail buying or selling. *Uku li'i li'i*, to pay in installments. *Lele li'i li'i*, to scatter or fall in every direction. *'Oki li'i li'i*, to cut a little at a time. *'Oki ā li'i li'i*, to cut into small bits. *Kau li'i li'i*, scattered or lying here and there. *Ko'u wā li'i li'i*, the time of my infancy. **ho'o.li'i.li'i.** To decrease, lessen, make small. (PPN *likiliki*.)

**li'i.poe.** n. Same as *ali'ipoe*, canna.

**lika, lita.** n. Liter. *Eng.*

**līkā.kini.** n. Garters. *Lit.*, tie stockings (*Eng.*).

**līkā.likī.** nv. Corset lace; to lace up a corset.

**līkā.ma'a.** nv. Shoelace; to lace shoes.

**likā.nia, litania.** n. Litany. (Latin *litania*.)

**like.** vs. Alike, like, similar, resembling, equal, same, uniform, mutual. Cf. *'ālike, hālike*, and below. *Hana like*, to do together. *Mea like*, similar thing, copy. *Ola like*, living at the same time, contemporaneous; a similar way of living. *Nā mea like 'ole*, miscellany, assortment. **ho'o.like.** Same as the more common *ho'ohālike*; to equalize, make alike, translate. (PEP *lite*.)

**like 'ā like.** vs. Equal, exactly alike.

**like.like.** Redup. of *like*. **ho'o.like.like.** Redup. of *ho'olike*.

**like loa.** vs. Exactly alike, identical.

**like me.** vs. Such as, according to, like. *He hale e like me kēia*, a house such as this.

**like 'ole.** vs. Various, all, different, not alike. *Nā pua like 'ole o Hawai'i*, the varied flowers of Hawai'i.

**Like.pona, Lisebona.** n. Lisbon. *Eng.*

**like pū.** vs. Just the same, alike, similar.

**liki.** 1. nvi. To boast, brag, exult; boaster. See *kūkaliki*. *Kū ka liki i Nu'u-anu*, boasting like Nu'u-anu [said of a boaster]. 2. vt. To tighten, gird on; to pucker; stiff, as a limb. Cf. *kāliki, pūliki*. *E liki mai 'oe ā pa'a ke kaula*, tighten the rope securely. 3. n. Astringent, as medicine. 4. n. A substance or glaze, such as juice of ti roots, that prevents colors from fading or mixing, a mordant.

**likiki.** n. Ticket, receipt. *Eng. Likiki ho'oka'a*, receipt; *lit.*, ticket for payment.

**liki.liki.** Redup. of *liki* 2; tight. Cf. *'ālikiliki*. *Likiliki loa kēia lole*, this dress is too tight. **ho'o.liki.liki.** To tighten.

**likini.** n. Rigging. *Eng.* See ex., *liolio*.

**likini wā.wae.** n. Leggings.

**liki pahu.** n. Iron hoop, barrel hoop. *Lit.*, barrel tightener.

**liko.** 1. nvi. Leaf bud; newly opened leaf; to bud; to put forth leaves. *Fig.*, a child or descendant, especially of a chief; youth. Cf. *'ōhua liko*. *Liko ali'i*, chief's child. (PPN *lito*.) 2. vs. Shining, glistening, as with dew; sparkling, glowing; burning. *Ke liko a'ela ka ua i ke kai*, the rain sparkles on the sea. (PPN *lito*.) 3. vs. Fat, fleshy. 4. n. A Tahitian banana (*Musa troglodytarum*). 5. vi. To burn. *Rare*.

**liko.lehua.** n. 1. A variety of sweet potato. 2. A kind of seaweed.

**liko lehua.** n. *Lehua* bud; red *lehua* leaves as used for leis or medicine; such a lei, as made in the KI-lau-ēa volcano area. See ex., *kohu* 1 (the reference here is probably to a young and pretty girl).

**liko.liko.** Redup. of *liko* 1-3; fresh, young, oily. *He ahi likoliko o ka wela* (chant), glowing fire of heat. *Kai likoliko*, gravy full of fat or grease; oily sea water. (PPN *litolito*.)

**likula, ligura.** n. Ligure. (Puk. 28.19.) *Eng.*

**lila, lira.** 1. See *laila*. 2. nvs. Lyre, harp (Kin. 4.21); lyric. *Lira kamali'i*, children's lyrics [a book of songs]. (Latin or Gr. *lyra*.)

**līlā.** vs. Spindly, undeveloped, as of plants; thin, as a line of words across a page. Cf. *'e'a* 2. *He mai'a līlā, 'a'ohē 'i'o*, a thin banana without substance [either fruit or plant]. (PPN *lila*, PCP *liilaa*.)

**līlā.līlā.** Redup. of *līlā*. (PPN *lilalila*.)

**lile.** vs. 1. Bright, shiny, dazzling, sparkling. 2. In unison, as chanting. *Rare*.

**līlō.** 1. Var. of *līlā*. 2. n. Upland patch, as of *olonā*. (HP 199.) *Kaua'i*.

**lilei.uli.** v. To cleanse, as of sin. *Rare*.

**lile.lile.** Redup. of *lile* 1.

**lili.** 1. nvs. Jealous; highly sensitive to criticism; jealousy, envy; anger and mental anguish felt if one's loved ones are criticized. *Lili punalua*, see *punalua*. **ho'o.lili.** To provoke jealousy; jealous. (PPN *lili*.) 2. vs. Blasted, as fruit.

**-lili. ho'o.lili, holili.** Rippled surface of the sea, as caused by fish; undulation or vibration of light in the hot sun;
