

- frightened horse. Also *lei'ō. ho'o.ii'ō.* To frighten, cause to shy, leap.
- II.'oa.** Pas/imp. of *II'ō.*
- lio hei.hei.** n. Race horse.
- lio holo noho.** n. Saddle horse.
- lio huila māhu.** n. Horse with a steam wheel, an old name for train. (Kel. 98.)
- lio hulu 'aeko.** n. Dark-gray horse. *Lit.*, eagle feather horse.
- lio ka'a.** n. Carriage horse.
- lio kau.** n. Riding horse.
- lio ke'a.** n. Stallion.
- lio keiki.** n. Colt.
- lio lā'au.** n. Merry-go-round; horse on a merry-go-round; sawhorse; wooden horse, as used in quilting. *Holo lio lā'au*, to ride on a merry-go-round. *I Kanēkina i ka holo lio lā'au me ka ulua* (Elbert and Mahoe 78), riding the merry-go-round at Kanēkina with the *ulua* fish [man].
- lio laho.** n. Stallion. *Lit.*, testicle horse.
- lio lawe ukana.** n. Pack horse. *Lit.*, horse carry gear.
- lio.lio.** Redup. of *lio 2*; tense. *Ke liolio nei ke kaula likini*, the rigging lines are drawn tight.
- li'o.li'o.** 1. vs. Bright, dazzling, dazzled. Also *liko 2, lile 1, lino 1. ho'o.li'o'li'o.* Caus/sim. (PCP *likoliko.*) 2. Var. of *li'o*: name of the sound made by the 'a'o bird; to call thus. 3. Redup. of *li'o.*
- Lio.lio-i-Wawau.** n. Name of a star, and name for the southern sky. (PH 206; Wawa'u is a widely distributed Polynesian place name: see Pukui, Elbert, and Mookini, 1974, p. 229.) (PPN *Wawa'u.*)
- liona.** n. Lion. *Eng. Hui Liona*, Lions Club.
- liona kai.** n. Sea lion.
- lio peki.** n. Pacing horse.
- lio po'a.** n. Gelding.
- lio wahine.** n. Mare.
- II.pa'a.kai.** n. *Limu* salted for indefinite storage without refrigeration; on Kaua'i usually *limu kohu* from Ni'ihau. Some consider *līpehe*, *līpehu*, and *līpa'akai* as variants of *limu kohu*.
- II.paha.** Same as *līpahapaha*, a seaweed.
- II.paha.paha.** n. A general term for sea lettuce (*Ulva fasciata* and *Monostroma oxyspermum*), common green seaweeds with delicate broad blades, usually with wavy margins. Eaten as a minor element mixed with other tastier seaweeds. Also *līho'a'a*, *līpaha*, *līpālaha-laha*, *pahapaha* (probably restricted to Kaua'i), *pakā-ia* (restricted to Hawai'i), and *pālalahala* (Maui, Moloka'i, and O'ahu).
- II.pahē'e.** 1. Same as *pāhe'ehe'e*, a seaweed. Called *līpā-hoe* on Maui. 2. Same as *limu lū'au 1*, a seaweed. *Kaua'i.*
- II.pā.he'e.he'e.** Same as *līpahē'e 1.*
- II.pā.hoe.** Same as *līpahē'e 1*, a seaweed. *Maui.*
- līpaki, libati.** n. Liberty. *Eng.*
- II.pā.laha.laha.** Same as *līpahapaha*, sea lettuce.
- II.pala'ō.** Same as *līpālāwai*, fresh-water algae.
- II.pā.lā.wai.** n. Edible, green, fresh-water algae, consisting of tufts of branching threads (*Pithophora* spp. and *Stigeoclonium* spp.), or of a network of threads (*Hydrodictyon*), or of simple threads (*Spirogyra* spp.). Also *līpala'ō*, *nehe*, *pala'ō*, *pālāwai*.
- II.palu.** n. A seaweed much like *hulu lio 3*, and perhaps the same; edible, green, soft, slippery tufts.
- līpano, libano.** n. Frankincense. (Mat. 2.11.) (Gr. *libanos.*)
- līpa.oa.oa.** n. A seaweed. *Lit.*, fragrant seaweed. (GP 78.)
- II.pe'e.** Same as *līpe'epe'e.*
- II.pe'e.pe'e.** n. Some native species of a genus of edible red seaweeds (*Laurencia parvipapillata*, *L. dotyi*, *L. succisa*), short, with stiff, knobby branchlets, nestling especially in basaltic rock. Also *āpe'epe'e*, *ho'onunu*, *līpe'e*, *pe'epe'e.*
- II.pehe, II.pēhu.** Same as *līpa'akai*, salted *limu*.
- līpe.lala, liberala, liberale.** nvs. Liberal. *Eng. Ka 'ao'ao līpelala*, the liberal party. *Ka Liberale*, The Liberal [Hawaiian newspaper, 1892-3].
- II.pē.pē.** Same as *līpe'epe'e. Ni'ihau.*
- II.pepei.ao.** n. 1. A seaweed. Also *limu pepeiao* and *limu kulapepeiao*. 2. A fresh-water moss, usually qualified by *wai*.
- līpi.** nvs. Adze, chisel; any sharp edge; sharp mountain ridge; sharp, tapering. (PPN *līpi.*)
- līpi hoe.hoe.** n. Adze or chisel with broad, flat blade. *Lit.*, paddle-like chisel.
- līpi kā.hela.** n. Adze or chisel with concave blade.
- līpi kuke.** n. Adze or chisel with thin, tapering blade.
- līpi.līpi.** Redup. of *līpi*. See *Po'o-līpilīpi*. (PPN *līpilīpi.*)
- līpina, ribina.** Var. of *līpine*. *Līpina ali'i*, royal ribbon or decoration.
- līpine, ribine.** n. Ribbon. *Eng.* See also below.
- līpine ho'o.kani.** n. Tape, of a recorder.
- līpine kiko.kiko.** n. Typewriter ribbon.
- lī.pioma.** n. Small rounded adze or chisel.
- līpo.** 1. nvs. Deep blue-black, as a cavern, the sea, or dense forest; dim, distant; grief (see ex., *ha'alipo*). See *kumulipo*. *Līpo lolohuamea*, the dark depths [the unfathomable mystery of the gods]. (Probably PPN *līpo.*) 2. (*Cap.*) n. Name of a star in the southern skies, and hence sometimes the name for the southern sky.
- līpoa.** Pas/imp. of *līpo 1*. *Ua līpoa wale i ka ua ka nahele*, forest dark with rain.
- II.poa.** n. 1. Bladelike, branched, brown seaweeds (*Dictyopteris plagiogramma* and *D. australis*) with conspicuous midrib on blade, unique aroma and flavor; highly prized on all islands. 2. Same as *līpoa kuahiwi*.
- II.poa kua.hiwi.** n. A nonedible mountain moss.
- II.pohā.pohā.** Same as *pohāpohā 3*, a seaweed.
- līpo.līpo.** Redup. of *līpo 1*. See ex., *lūlana. Ka moana nui līpolīpo*, the great blue ocean. *Ka uliuli līpolīpo o nā lau nāhelehele*, the deep green of the forest leaves.
- līpo wao nahele.** n. Gloom and darkness of a great forest.
- II.pu'u.** Same as *līpu'upu'u*. (KL line 90.)
- II.pu'u.pu'u.** n. An edible green seaweed (*Valonia utricularis*), with turgid joints and short branches. Also *kūkae-o-Kamapua'a*.
- liu.** 1. nvt. Leakage, bilge water; to leak, of a canoe or ship. (PPN *liu.*) 2. Same as *liuliu*.
- li'u.** 1. nvs. Slow, tardy, taking a long time; a long time. *Ala li'u ka lā o Wai'anae*, the Wai'anae sun rises slowly. *'A'ohe i li'u iho kona hiki 'ana mai a hiki maila 'oe*, he hadn't been here long when you arrived. 2. vs. Well-salted, salty, seasoned. 3. vs. Deep, profound, as of skill or knowledge. Cf. *kuli'u*, *lili'u*, *li'ua*. *Li'u ka 'ike i ke kālai wa'a*, he's skilled in canoe carving. *Li'u ka na'auao i loko ona*, wisdom within him is profound.
- liua.** 1. Same as *niua, niniu*, dizzy, etc. (For. 6:295.) 2. Same as *kūhi-'ai-ka-mo'o-wahie*, a lobelia.
- liu.ā.** Dissolute. (AP.)
- li'ua.** Same as *li'u 1, 2*. *'A'ole i li'ua*, it wasn't long.
- li'u.lā.** n. Twilight, dusk; mirage, hallucination. Cf. *poni li'ulā. Ka hulali a ka wai li'ulā*, the glitter of water in the mirage.
- liu.liu.** nvs. Prepared, ready; to make ready; preparations (Kel. 49). **ho'o.liu.liu.** To prepare.
- li'u.li'u.** Redup. of *li'u 1*; to pass much time; to spend much time. *'A'ole i li'uli'u ma Maui*, did not spend much time at Maui. *Li'uli'u nō nā lā i ua ai*, it rained many days. *Li'uli'u aku mahope* (2 Sam. 7.19), a great while to come. *E kali iho a li'uli'u*, wait a while. **ho'o.li'u.li'u.** To cause a delay, prolong, procrastinate.
- II.wali.** Soft, thin, as poi or dough. (And.)
- liwele, livero.** n. Book (French; seen in a Catholic publication but very rare).
- L. K.** Abbreviation for *luna kāmāwai*, judge.
- lō.** n. 1. A black insect, earwig (Dermaptera). (PPN *loo.*) 2. Front half of the skull. (And.) 3. Lord. *Eng.* 4. (*Cap.*) A line of O'ahu chiefs. (Kam. 64:5.)
