

- loi.loi.** Redup. of *loi*; to find fault, criticize.
- lo'i.lo'i.** 1. nvs. Pools of water; having many pools; taro patches. Cf. *hālo'ilo'i*, *lo'i*. 2. Same as 'ālo'ilo'i, a fish. (KL line 157.)
- loina.** n. 1. Rule, custom, manners, code, precept, law; principle, as of a political party. 2. Observation, scrutiny.
- loio.** 1. vs. Thin, spindly. 2. Rare var. of *loea*, skill. 3. nv. Lawyer (*Eng.*), attorney, counselor; to act the lawyer; to judge. *Loio o ka 'ao'ao kū'e*, lawyer for the opponent. *E loio ana i ke 'ano o kēlā kēia mo'olelo* (Kep. 131), judging the nature of all the tales. **ho'o.loio.** To act the lawyer; to show off knowledge; to ask bewildering questions as a lawyer might.
- loio ho'o.kolo.kolo.** n. Prosecutor.
- loio kalana.** n. County attorney.
- loio kuhina.** n. Attorney general.
- lo'i pa'a.hao.** n. A "prison" taro patch, meaning that if a tenant failed to pay for use of the land he was imprisoned.
- lo'i Pō.'alima.** n. A "Friday" taro patch, meaning one worked for the *konohiki* (supervisor), as Friday was the work day.
- loka.** n. 1. Also *roda*. Rod. *Eng.* 2. Also *loga*. Log, Hebrew liquid measure (Oihk. 14.10).
- loka.** See *maloka*.
- lō.kahi.** nvs. Unity, agreement, accord, unison, harmony; agreed, in unity. *Mana'o lōkahi*, unanimous. **ho'o.lō.kahi.** To bring about unity; to make peace and unity; to be in agreement.
- lō.kā.lia.** n. 1. Coral plant (*Russelia equisetiformis*), a Mexican low shrubby plant, 30 to 120 cm high, with many leafless, green, quadrangular branches, used for low hedges and in rock gardens; it bears bright-red flowers resembling small firecrackers. (Neal 757-8). *Eng.* 2. (*Cap.*) Rosalie. *Eng.*
- lō.kā.lio, rosario.** n. Rosary. (Probably Latin *rosarium* or Spanish or Portuguese *rosario*.) Less common than *lei kolona*.
- loke.** nvs. 1. Rose; rosy. *Eng.* 2. Also *roke*. Roast. *Eng.* *Pipi loke*, roast beef.
- lō.keā.** n. 1. Long European knife with a white handle. 2. Child of a *nī'aupi'o*, *pi'o*, or *naha* chief, whose mother was related to him but of a junior line. (Kam. 64:5-6.)
- loke Hawai'i.** n. Double pink rose.
- loke hihi.** n. Climbing rose. (Neal 395.)
- loke hui.hui.** n. A pinkish-white rose, very fragrant and growing in a cluster; possibly the Duchess of Brabant, still common. (Neal 395.)
- loke kūkū.pele.** n. Sulphur rose. (Neal 395.)
- loke lani, roselani.** n. The common small red rose. It has been substituted for the pink rose, now rare, as the flower of Maui. (Neal 394.)
- loke lau.** n. Green rose (*Rosa chinensis*, f. *viridiflora*). (Neal 395.) *No ka pua loke lau ke aloha* (song), love for the green rose.
- lokeli, loteri.** n. Lottery. *Eng.*
- okema, rotema.** n. Broom tree (RSV), juniper (KJV). (Hal. 120.4.) Cf. *nokema*. Heb. *rothem*.
- loke-o-ka-lua-pele.** n. A pink rose growing in the Kī-lau-ea area, Hawai'i, commonly called volcano rose. (Neal 395.) *Lit.*, rose of the volcanic crater.
- loke pihi.** n. Tiny buttonhole roses (*Rosa chinensis* var. *minima*). (Neal 395.)
- loke wai kā.huli.** n. A kind of rose, red on the outside of the flower and pink in the center; used for hedges. (Neal 395.) *Lit.*, rose [with] changing color.
- lokia.** nvs. Roan, as a horse. *Eng.*
- lō.kihi.** Var. of common *lō'ihī*.
- loko.** 1. loc. n. In, inside, within; interior, mainland, inside; internal organs, as tripe, entrails (Gram. 8.6). *I loko*, into, inside, on or to the mainland. *I ka moe 'ana o loko o ka hale* (FS 259), while those in the house slept. *Ua lawe nui au no loko a'e o kēia mau kānāwai*, I have taken much from within these laws. *Kō loko*, those inside. *Mea o loko*, things inside, contents. 'O ka
- inaina i loko o kekahi hana hewa*, malice in respect to the commission of any offense. *Make na loko*, death caused by own relatives, or failure to observe one's taboo gods; *lit.*, inside death. **ho'o.loko.** To insinuate, suggest, implant a thought, either good or bad. (PPN *loto*.) 2. n. Character, disposition, heart, feelings. Cf. *loko hāiki*, *loko 'ino*, *loko li'u*, *lokomaika'i*. (PPN *loto*.) 3. n. Pond, lake, pool. 4. n. Mainland of the United States (noted in a chant dated 1860, State Archives). *I loko aku nei au*, I've been to the mainland. 5. n. In spite of, regardless. *I loko nō o ka waiwai, hana nō*, in spite of wealth, working anyway. 6. n. By means of. *Loa'a ka 'āina iā mākou maloko o ka ikaika* (For. 4:47), we won the land by force.
- loko hā.iki.** nvs. Hardhearted, narrow-minded; tight-fisted, parsimonious; such a person; ill will.
- loko i'a kalo.** n. Combination fishpond and taro patch. (Summers, 1964:23.)
- loko 'ino.** nvs. Merciless, heartless, evil, malevolent, barbarous, cruel; such a person.
- loko kai.** n. Lagoon.
- loko ku'i.** n. Man-made salt-water pond. *Lit.*, artificial lake.
- loko li'u.** 1. n. Salt pond. 2. nvs. Cross, embittered, sour in disposition; such a person.
- loko.loko.** n. Puddles, small pools. Cf. *hālokoloko*.
- loko.maika'i.** nvs. Good will, good disposition, generosity, grace; kind, humane, gracious, benevolent, beneficent, obliging. *Nā lā o ka lokomaika'i*, days of grace [time allotted for paying a bill].
- Loko-pa'a.kai.** n. Salt Lake City.
- loko pa'a.kai.** n. Salt pond or lake.
- lokou, logou.** n. Word, logos (Ioane 1.1).
- loko ulu.** n. Seedling bed. *Lit.*, inside growing.
- loko 'ume iki.** n. Shore fishpond with lanes leading in and/or out of the pond, used for trapping fish and probably only on Moloka'i. (Summers, 1964:12-19, 24.) *Lit.*, small pond drawing in.
- loko wai.** n. Fresh-water pond or lake; fountain (Sol. 5.16).
- loku.** nvi. Downpour of rain; blowing of wind; to pour, of rain; to blow, as a gale; torrential. *Fig.*, to feel deep emotion, pain, sorrow; to weep profusely; intense. Also *noku*. *Ka ua loku*, the pouring rain. *Ke aloha loku i ka pu'uwai*, love surging in the heart. *Ke loku nei ka makani*, the wind is blowing in a gale. **ho'o.loku.** To pour, as rain; to disturb; agitated.
- lō.kū.** n. A game, perhaps like *kilu* (FS 163); a place for indoor games; evening entertainment (Ii 63-4).
- loku.loku.** Redup. of *loku*. Cf. *ha'alokuloku*, *ka'alokuloku*. **ho'o.loku.loku.** Redup. of *ho'oloku*.
- lola.** 1. vs. Drooping, hanging downward; droopy, sluggish, lazy, idle. *Lola moe hālau*, lazy one who sleeps in the workhouse [a lazy person]. **ho'o.lola.** Caus/sim. 2. n. A native fern (*Asplenium acuminatum*), with much-subdivided fronds. 3. n. A variety of taro. 4. nvt. Roller, rolling pin; to roll. *Eng.*
- lō.lā.** vi. To sun. *Ke lōlā maila lākou*, they are sunning.
- lola ho'o.palaha.** n. Roller. *Lit.*, flattening roller.
- lola.lola.** Redup. of *lola* 1. **ho'o.lola.lola.** Caus/sim.
- lola māhu.** n. Steam roller.
- lole.** 1. nvt. Cloth, clothes, costume, dress, gown; to wear clothes. Cf. *'a'a lole*. *Komo i ka lole*, to put on a dress. 2. vt. To unfold, turn inside out, reverse; to strip or peel off, as bark; to skin, flay (Mika 3.3); to scalp; to handle, turn over with the hands. *Mea lole pipi*, butcher. *Hele akula 'o 'Ōma'o-kāma'u . . . lālau ihola i ka 'auwae (o Hākau) a lole a'ela i luna* (FS 141), 'Ōma'o-kāma'u went . . . grabbed (Hākau's) chin and yanked it up. **ho'o.lole.** Caus/sim. (PCP *lole*.) 3. n. Depigmentation, as of palm of hand or soles of feet.
- lolea.** vs. Worn smooth by friction, wear, or constant handling; turned inside out; weathered; skinned, flayed. Cf. *lole* 2.
- lole'ae.'ae.** n. Fine cloth, gauze.
- lole 'au.'au.** n. Bathing suit.
- lole hā.pai.** n. Maternity dress.
