

- logs for images (*haku 'ōhi'a*), *kuili*, and *hono* rituals (Ii 38).
- lo'ulu**. n. An endemic fern (*Coniogramme pilosa*) with leaves somewhat like those of the breadfruit tree ('ulu), but the divisions narrower and deeper.
- loulu hiwa**. n. A small native fan palm (*Pritchardia martii*), with thick trunk to 1.9 m high. (Neal 97-9.) *Lit.*, dark *loulu*.
- loulu lolo**. n. A native fan palm (*Pritchardia hillebrandii*), with trunk to 6 m high. *Lit.*, yellowish *loulu*.
- lo'u pali**. n. Shelter formed by an overhanging cliff. (Malo text, chapter 33, section 3.)
- louulu**. n. Betrothal gift, as sent from one family to another. *Rare*.
- lū**. 1. vt. To scatter, throw, as ashes; to sow, broadcast; to shed, as a chicken its feathers or a tree its leaves; to push aside; to drip, as water; to shake; to cast off, as grief; to spend recklessly, squander, discard. *Pau ke kālā i ka lū 'ia*, all the money was squandered. (PPN *ruu*.) 2. n. Seeds of the *pua kala*, prickly poppy. 3. n. Gunshot, so called because the pellets suggested the *lū* seeds. 4. n. Scalloped hat braid, as made of bamboo, sugar-cane stem, pandanus, or coconut.
- lua**. 1. n. Hole, pit, grave, den, cave, mine, crater. *Lua* is a hole that has a bottom, contrasting with *puka*, perforation. *Ho'opihā i ka lua o ka inaina*, fill the pit of wrath [eat heartily]. **ho'o.lua**. To bake in the oven. Cf. *ho'olua* under *lua* 3 and *kālua*. *Pua'a ho'olua*, pork and taro tops baked in ti leaves, called *loulau* today. (PPN *lua*.) 2. n. Toilet, outhouse, bathroom, cellar. 3. num. Two, second, secondary, twice, deuce, double; doubly, much, a great deal. *Ka lua kēia o ko'u hele 'ana mai*, this is the second of my trips here. *'O ka lua ia o nā keiki*, this is the second of the children. *Ka'uka'u lua*, to delay much. *Kaumaha lua*, extremely sad or heavy. *Konikoni lua i ka pu'uwai*, throbbing, throbbing in the heart. **ho'o.lua**. To do twice, repeat, do over and over; to bake twice, as food in the oven. (PPN *rua*.) 4. n. Equal, likeness, duplicate, copy, match. See *lua 'ole*. *Ōla'i ikaika loa i 'ike 'ole 'ia kona lua*, very strong earthquake, the like of which had never been seen before. 5. n. Companion, mate. Cf. *kōko'o*. 6. n. A type of dangerous hand-to-hand fighting in which the fighters broke bones, dislocated bones at the joints, and inflicted severe pain by pressing on nerve centers. There was much leaping, and (rarely) quick turns of spears. Many of the techniques were secret. *Lua* holds were named (see *fight*). *Lua* experts were bodyguards to chiefs. Also *ku'i a lua*. See *O'ahu*.
- lua-**. To enjoy oneself. Cf. *luakaha*, *lua'ia*, *lua'luana*, *luana*.
- lua**. 1. **Ho'o.lua**. Name of a strong north wind associated with Makaiwa, Kaua'i; Hāna, Maui; and Hālawā, Moloka'i. At Hālawā the name may be qualified by *Iho*, *Ka'i*, *Kele*, *Pehu*, *Wahakole* (Nak. 69). *Ho'olua nui*, big Ho'olua wind; *fig.*, to talk loudly and to no purpose. 2. (*Not cap.*) Dual number in pronouns and possessives, as *'olua*, *kāua*, *māua*. (PPN *-rua*, PNP *-lua*.)
- lu'a**. 1. vs. Old and wrinkled, worn and shabby with use, worn-out; sagging, hanging down, flimsy, soft, pliable. See *'ālu'a*. 2. Same as *nu'a*, heap, pile.
- lu'a ho'o.lu'a**. (a) To bear many children. (b) To lay an egg, as of a chicken.
- lua'a**. vt. To pound poi. (For. 6:397.)
- lua.ahi**, **luaahi**. 1. n. Victim, as of wrath. *Mai pa'akiki aku 'oe i ke anu*, 'o ke kino mai nō ka luaahi, don't persist in going into the cold, the body will suffer for it [*lit.*, be the victim]. *Akahahe!* *He luaahi aku ia!* Be careful! There's a fire pit [Danger]! 2. vs. Fearful, mighty. *Ka lima luaahi o ke kōa*, fearful arm of the warrior.
- lua.ahi**. n. Pit of fire; hell.
- lua.ahi ho'o.ma'e.ma'e**. n. Purgatory. *Lit.*, cleansing fire pit.
- lua.'ā.pana**. nvs. Jester (For. 5:479); hilarity, sport; to laugh, jest, indulge in uproarious merriment.
- lua.'ehu**. vs. Many and colorful. *Lua'ehu ka i'a i loa'a mai i hei mai i ka 'upena* (song), colorful and many are the fishes caught, snared in the net.
- lua'eli pō.haku**. n. Quarry. *Lit.*, pit for digging stones.
- lua'eli wai.wai**. n. Mine.
- lua.haka**. n. Outhouse.
- lua.hēle**. nvt. Pitfall, seduction, deception; to lead astray, seduce, deceive.
- luaahi**. See *luaahi*.
- lua.hine**, **luwahine**. 1. nvs. Old woman, old lady; to be an old woman. See saying, *hopena ho'o.lua.hine*. To act or dress like an old lady; to try to be like one. (PEP *lua'fine*.) 2. See *kaula lua'hine*.
- lua.hoana**. n. Halo or rainbow around sun or moon. *Lit.*, polished pit.
- lua ho'o.ki'o wai**. n. Cistern.
- Lua-ho'o.moe**. n. Name of a star, said to appear in the month of Hinaia-'ele'ele.
- lua.huna**. n. Hidden or secret cave or pit, as where bones of the dead were hidden.
- lua'i**. nvi. Vomit; volcanic eruptions; to vomit, retch, erupt; to banish, expel, drive out, as people. (Probably PPN *lua*, to vomit + *-i* or *-a'i*, transitivizers: Gram. 6.6.4.) Cf. *hikāka*, *lua'i koko*. *Lua'i ā koko*, to vomit food until blood comes. *Lua'i pō*, outcasts, as wandering souls not accepted in the realm of the dead; *lit.*, night vomit. **ho'o.lua'i**. Emetic; causing vomiting; to cause a vomiting, to feign vomiting; to gag; to drive out people. (PPN *lua'aki*.)
- lua.iēle**. vi. 1. To live a dissipated life, reckless of health; to dissipate. See *-iēle*. *Luaiele wale iho nō i 'ō i 'ane'i*, going here and there [as a fickle lover]. 2. Swaying. *Nani ka 'ōiwi o ka lā'au i ka luaiele 'ia e ka makani*, beautiful the body of the tree swayed by the wind [some are handsome even in adversity or dissipation]. **ho'o.-lua.iēle**. Caus/sim. *Ho'oluaiele i ka mana'o* (Cleghorn 59), distressing the thoughts.
- lua'i koko**. nv. Any kind of sickness with vomiting of blood; to vomit blood.
- lua'i.kū**. vs. Disgusting, nauseating, sickening. *'O kāna mau hana, he mea e lua'ikū ai*, what he does is disgusting.
- lua'i pēle**. n. Volcanic eruption, lava, sulphur, brimstone (Hoik. 9.17).
- lua.kaha**. nvs. Enjoyable, pleasant, as a place to which one is attached; to while away the time enjoyably. *He luakaha kō mākou nohona i kēlā 'āina*, our stay at that land was comfortable and pleasant.
- lua.kā.lai**. Same as *luahoana*. *Lit.*, hewn pit.
- lua.kā.lai lani**. Same as *luakalai*.
- lua.kele**. n. Cave for concealing. For roots cf. *lua* (pit) and *hānakele* (to bury).
- lua.kini**. nvi. Temple, church, cathedral, tabernacle; large heiau where ruling chiefs prayed and human sacrifices were offered; to perform temple work (For. 6:48).
- lua ko'i**. n. Adze quarry.
- lua kupa.pa'u**. n. Tomb, grave.
- lua.lā'i**. Same as *luana*. (*Lua-* + *-la'i*, transitivizer: Gram. 6.6.4.) *E aha ana lā ku'u lani, e lua'ia lā i Lākana* (chant for Ka-lā-kaua), what is my lord doing, enjoying life in London.
- lua li'i.li'i**. n. Outhouse, toilet. *Lit.*, small pit.
- lua.loa**. n. Large fishhook, as used for large fish or sometimes for bonito.
- lua.lua**. 1. vs. Uneven, full of holes, rough, bumpy, as a road. 2. Same as *lua'ue*, a fishing net.
- lua.lu'a**. Redup. of *lu'a*; aged.
- lua.lua'i**. 1. Redup. of *lua'i*. **ho'o.lua.lua'i**. Redup. of *ho'olua'i*. 2. vi. To raise and chew the cud.
- lua.lua.'ina**. Var. of *luluā'ina* 1, 2.
- lua.luana**. Redup. of *luana*.
- lua.meki**. n. Deep pit or cave. (Zek. 9.11.)
- luana**. vi. To be at leisure, enjoy pleasant surroundings and associates, live in comfort and ease, enjoy oneself, relax, be content. (See *lua-*, *-na*.) *He aha kō 'oukou e hana nei? E luana wale ana nō*, what are you all doing? Just enjoying ourselves. **ho'o.luana**. Caus/sim. Cf. *lumi ho'oluaana*.
