

- luna helu kā.lā.** n. Teller, as of a bank. *Lit.*, officer who counts money.
- luna ho'o.hana.** n. Manager, administrative head, overseer. *Lit.*, supervisor to cause work to be done.
- luna hō.'oia.** n. Auditor. *Lit.*, proving officer.
- luna hō.'oia.'i'o pala.pala.** n. Certifier of title. *Lit.*, officer who certifies the truth of document.
- luna ho'o.kō.** n. Executive officer. *Lit.*, officer who accomplishes.
- luna ho'o.kō kau.oha.** n. Executor.
- luna ho'o.luhi.** n. Taskmaster. (Puk. 5.6.) *Lit.*, officer who makes weary.
- luna ho'o.malu.** n. Chairman; speaker, as of the House of Representatives; presiding officer; comptroller.
- luna ho'o.nā.** n. Commissioner who settles land claims.
- luna ho'o.pono.pono.** n. Editor, supervisor, administrator, director.
- luna ho'o.pono.pono wai.wai.** n. Executor, as of an estate; trustee.
- luna ho'o.puka.** n. Publisher. *Lit.*, officer who makes appear.
- luna.'ike.hala.** n. Conscience. *Lit.*, officer who knows wrong. (Oih. 23.1.) 'A'ole 'āpono 'o ku'u luna'ikehala i kēlā, my conscience does not approve of that.
- luna.kahiko.** n. Elder (Puk. 3.16); elderly leader.
- luna kā.kau kope o ke au.puni.** n. Notary public. *Lit.*, officer who writes the government copy.
- luna kā.lā.** n. Comptroller.
- luna kana.lima.** n. Leader of fifty men. (2 Nal. 1.10.)
- luna kā.nā.wai.** n. Judge, magistrate; Book of Judges in the Old Testament; referee, as in a fight; judicial. *Lit.*, law officer.
- luna kā.nā.wai 'ā.pana.** n. District judge.
- luna kā.nā.wai ho'o.kō kau.oha.** n. Probate judge.
- luna kā.nā.wai ho'o.malu.** n. Police justice.
- luna kā.nā.wai ka'a.puni.** n. Circuit judge.
- luna kā.nā.wai ki'e.ki'e.** n. Chief justice.
- luna kā.nā.wai kō.kua.** n. Associate justice.
- luna kaua.** n. War officer, captain, commander.
- luna kau.kani (tausani).** n. Officer in charge of a thousand or more men. *Lit.*, Officer of a thousand (*Eng.*)
- luna kia.** n. Upper part of a pillar, chapter (1 Nal. 7.16).
- luna kia'i.** n. Supervisor; overseer of others; bishop (Pilipi 1.1).
- luna ki'e.ki'e.** n. High officer.
- luna koa.** n. Military officer. Cf. *ali'ikoa*.
- luna ko'i.ko'i.** n. Ambassador; important officer.
- luna kula.** n. School superintendent, schoolmaster, school committee (old term).
- luna kula.nui.** n. School superintendent (old term).
- luna lawe hana.** n. Chief servant, minister (Kol. 1.23). *Lit.*, officer undertaking work.
- luna lawe.lawe no ke kene.lala.** n. Aide-de-camp. *Lit.*, officer serving for the general.
- luna leka.** n. Postmaster. *Lit.*, letter officer.
- luna.maka.'āi.nana.** n. Representative in the legislature. *Lit.*, people's officer.
- luna mā.kā'i.** n. District sheriff, chief of police.
- luna mā.lama wai.wai.** n. Trustee.
- luna.mana'o.** Same as *luna'ikehala*.
- luna mēle.** n. Chorister. *Rare*.
- luna nā.nā.** n. Inspector; judge, as in song contests.
- luna nā.nā helu.** n. Auditor.
- luna nā.nā koho.** n. Election official.
- luna noho.** n. Chairman.
- luna nui.** n. Chief officer or foreman, especially head overseer of a sugar plantation, superintendent.
- luna 'ohana.** n. Head of a family; headman of a tribe. (1 Oih. 9.34.)
- luna 'ohi kā.lā 'au.hau.** n. Tax collector.
- luna 'ohi kuke.** n. Collector of customs.
- luna.'ō.lēlo.** n. Apostle; communication officer; proclaimer. (Oih. 1.2.)
- luna pai.** n. Officer who called warriors to battle. *Lit.*, urging officer.
- luna.wae.mana'o.** n. Conscience. *Lit.*, officer that selects thoughts.
- luna wai.** n. Water master, one in charge of water distribution.
- luna wehe pili.kia.** n. Representative in the old Hawaiian parliament. *Lit.*, officer who removes trouble.
- luni.** vs. Limping, unsteady. *Rare*.
- luni.hini.** n. Perhaps a land shell. *Na ka lunihini leo le'a* (For. 6:534), by the sweet-voiced *lunihini*.
- lunu.** Same as *nunu 1, 2*. Cf. 'ālunu, 'ānunu.
- lu'oni.** One who delivers a victim to the sacrificial altar; to so deliver. (AP.)
- lupa.** Same as *lupalupa*. Also *nupa*.
- lupa.lupa.** 1. vs. Flourishing, of luxuriant growth, lush, thriving. *Lupalupa ke oho o ka palai*, thriving fronds of fern. **ho'o.lupa.lupa.** To cause to flourish; lush. See *nupanupa*. 2. nvi. Purifying ceremonies of various sorts, as to insure growth or to cleanse contaminated persons, as those who have buried the dead; prayer for the soul of one who has just died; to conduct such ceremonies.
- lupe.** n. 1. Kite. Cf. *ka'ialupe*. *Ho'olele lupe*, to fly a kite. Four types of *lupe* were said to exist; *lupe lā*, a round kite, *lit.*, sun kite; *lupe mahina*, kite with tapa covering cut in a crescent shape, *lit.*, moon kite; *lupe manu*, kite with wings on the side, *lit.*, bird kite; *lupe maoli*, kite suggestive of European kites in shape, *lit.*, genuine kite. (PPN *lupe*.) 2. Same as *hthīmanu*, sting ray. 3. Flattened end of the forward end of the outrigger float outside of the joining of the outrigger boom to the float. 4. A kind of seaweed.
- lupea.** vs. Pleasing, attractive, as plants. *Lupea ka uka i ka palai*, the inland is lovely with ferns.
- lupe'a.** vs. Drunk, intoxicated; to distress.
- lupe'a.keke.** n. Hawaiian stormy petrel (*Oceanodroma castro cryptoleucura*). Also *oeoe*.
- lupe.lupea.** Redup. of *lupea*. *Lupelupea i ke 'ala*, attractive with perfume.
- lupepa.** n. 1. Rhubarb (*Rheum raphaniticum*). (Neal 328.) *Eng.* 2. Calomel and tartar emetic.
- lupo.** 1. Var. of *ulupō 3*. (PPN *lupo*.) 2. n. Wolf. (Latin *lupus* or Gr. *lukos*.)
- lūpō.** See *ulupō 3*.
- Lū-pua.** n. Wind name associated with Wai-niha, Kaua'i. *Lit.*, flower scattering.
- lū pua.** v. To scatter flowers, as by a flower girl at a wedding; to decorate graves with flowers. *Lā Lū Pua*, Decoration Day.
- lu'u.** vi. To dive, plunge into water, immerse, duck; to dip in, as a shrimp net. **ho'o.lu'u.** To dip, immerse, dye. *Ho'olu'u 'ili*, to tan hides. *Ho'olu'u pa'akai*, basket for storing salt (*pa'akai*); to dye salt with ochreous earth. *Waiho'olu'u*, color dye. *Po'e ho'olu'u*, dye makers. *Ho'olu'u lahilahi*, to dye lightly, tint. (PPN *ruku*.)
- lu'ua.** Pas/imp. of *lu'u*. **ho'o.lu'ua.** Pas/imp. of *ho'olu'u*. *Pā'ū no'eno'e i ho'olu'ua*, dyed printed skirts.
- lu'u 'ili.** n. Tanner of skins and hides. **ho'o.lu'u 'ili.** To tan skins.
- lu'u.kia.** nvt. Coconut fiber lashing; to lash thus. *Pā'ū-o-Lu'ukia*, a kind of lashing, referring to a legendary woman's sennit chastity belt.
- lu'u kimo.** vi. To dive headfirst.
- lu'u.lu'u.** 1. vs. Bent or bowed down, as with weight, sorrow, or trouble; painful, sorrowful, sad, wretched, woeful, bereaved, downcast, depressed, toilsome, overlaid. *Lu'ulu'u Hanalei i ka ua nui, kaumaha i ka noe o Alaka'i*, Hanalei is downcast with great rains, heavy with mists of Alaka'i [said in dirges to describe the weight of grief]. *Hala ka lu'ulu'u kaumaha*, the heavy sorrow is over. **ho'o.lu'u.lu'u.** To cause sorrow, grief; to oppress, load down. (PPN *rukuruku*.) 2. Redup. of *lu'u*; to set a *hīna'i*, fish trap. **ho'o.lu'u.lu'u.** Redup. of *ho'olu'u*; to set a fish trap.
- lu'u po'o.** v. To dive headfirst.
- luwa.hine.** Rare spelling of *luahine*.
- Luwele, Luvere.** n. Louvre. (*French.*)
