

- tense, as emotion; exhausting, wearisome, of labor. *Rare.*
- makā'eo.** vs. Angry-appearing (probably a contraction of *maka ke'eo*, angry eyes). **ho'o.makā'eo.** To look at with anger, to avoid looking at because of anger; not to recognize because of anger.
- maka'eu.** n. Mischievous or roving eyes, naughty eyes.
- maka'ewa'ewa.** See *'ewa'ewa 1.*
- makaha.** 1. Inflamed or swollen eye. (And.) 2. Pig disease. (And.)
- mā.kaha.** 1. vt. Fierce, savage, ferocious; to seize property, to desolate, plunder, cheat. See *kaha 4.* *Ka'ū mā.kaha*, fierce Ka'ū [a description of the Ka'ū people, referring to their killing of several oppressive chiefs]. 2. (*Cap.*) n. Name of a star; this star and Mākohi-lani were near the Pleiades, and were said to be patrons of fighters. 3. Same as *mākahakaha*. 4. vt. To speak disparagingly or insultingly of. *'O Hawai'i nō kēia i mā.kaha 'ia ai he palu lā'*, the people of [the island of] Hawai'i are spoken of derisively as lickers of ti leaves [so called because they were said to have done this at a feast in the time of Ka-mehameha where not enough food was provided].
- mā.kā.hā.** n. Sluice gate, as of a fish pond; entrance to or egress from an enclosure.
- maka.hahi.** Same as *makahehi*. *Ua haka mai lākou ia'u me ka makahahi* (Hal. 22.17), they stared at me with wonder.
- maka.hai.** vs. Hasty; active, as a child into everything.
- Maka-hai-aku.** Name of a star.
- Maka-hai-wa'a.** n. Name of a star. *Lit.*, eye following canoe.
- mā.kaha.kaha.** nvi. Clearing, as rain. **ho'o.mā.kaha.kaha.** To show signs of clearing. *Ke ho'omākahakaha maila ka ua*, there are signs that the rain is clearing.
- maka.haka.haka.** n. Sunken eyes, as of one long sick; deep pit or hollow; open space, as a clearing in a forest or clear space in a lava flow.
- Mā.kaha Kona.** n. Star name (no data). (Kuhelani.)
- mā.kā.hala.** n. Three shrubs in the tomato family: (1) wild tobacco or *paka* (*Nicotiana glauca*), from South America, with long, narrow, yellow flowers and ovate, blue-green leaves; (2) day cestrum (*Cestrum diurnum*), from the West Indies, with small, white, tubular flowers, fragrant by day; oval leaves; black berries; (3) orange cestrum (*Cestrum aurantiacum*), from Guatemala, with longer, narrow, orange flowers. (Neal 750-1.) On Ni'ihau, *Tecomaria capensis*, cape honeysuckle; cf. *'i'iwi haole*.
- mā.kā.hala'ula.** n. A shrub similar to *mā.kā.hala* (3), orange cestrum, except that the flower is bronze-red.
- maka.hā.lili.** n. A marine shell (*Peasiella tantilla*).
- maka.hani.** vt. To step lightly, touch lightly, to skim lightly. Cf. *hani*, *māhani*.
- maka.hau'iole.** Rare var. of *haumaka'iole*.
- maka.hehi.** nvt. Admiration, desire for, wonder; amazement; attractive, entrancing; to admire; be entangled. *Nani e makahehi 'ia ai*, beautiful and alluring. *Ua holomua 'oia, ā he 'oihana noho'i ia nāna i makahehi nui*, he advanced, an employment indeed in which he was much admired. **ho'o.maka.hehi.** Caus/sim.
- maka.hekili.** n. Hailstone. *Lit.*, thunder eye. Cf. *huahekili*.
- maka.helei.** n. Eye with lid drawn down; ectropion. Cf. *helei*. *Eia ka pua'a wāwae loloa, ua maka helei*, here is a pig with long legs [a human sacrifice] with drawn eyes [fat cheeks, fat].
- makahi.** A kind of fish. (And.)
- mā.kahi.** 1. vs. One-eyed (short for *maka kahi*). See chant, *mākole 1.* 2. n. Net mesh large enough to admit the entrance of one finger; a net with such a mesh. *Mā.kahi 'oā, mā.kahi 'oene, mā.kahi hoene*, a mesh larger than one finger's width, but not large enough for two fingers (*mālua*).
- maka.hia.** nvi. Roving, unsteady, restless eyes; sleepless.
- Ē Lono makahia, lele* (Kep. 37), O Lono with the restless eyes, fly.
- maka.hia.moē.** nvi. Sleepy eyes; sleepy, drowsy.
- maka.hiapo.** n. First-born child, oldest child. *Lit.*, first-born person. (PCP *mata(f,s)iaipo*.)
- maka.hiki.** 1. nvs. Year, age; annual, yearly (sometimes written *MH.*) See *kūlana*. *'Ehia ou makahiki?* How old are you? *Hō'ike makahiki*, annual report. *Hō'ike no 'elua makahiki*, biennial report. *Kēlā ma kēia lua makahiki*, every two years, biennial. *I ka makahiki*, in the year; yearly. *Nui nā makahiki*, many years; old, aged. (PEP *mata(f,s)iti*.) 2. n. Ancient festival beginning about the middle of October and lasting about four months, with sports and religious festivities and taboo on war; this is now replaced by Aloha Week.
- Maka.hiki Hou.** n. New Year. *Hau'oli Makahiki Hou*, Happy New Year.
- maka.hiki.lā.keu.** n. Leap year. *Lit.*, extra-day year.
- maka.hiki.lele'oi.** n. Leap year. *Lit.*, year jump ahead.
- maka.hila.hila.** nvs. Bashful eyes; bashful, timidly averting one's gaze.
- maka.hinu.** n. Kind of hard stone.
- maka.hinu.** n. Bright face, cheerful look. **ho'o.maka.hinu.** Caus/sim.; to conceal annoyance or anger by pretense of cheerfulness.
- maka.hi'ō.** n. Eyes that dart in every direction, as if looking for mischief; a mischievously alluring look.
- mā.kahi'oā.** See *mā.kahi*.
- Maka-holo-wa'a.** n. Name of a star, perhaps variant name for the North Star. *Lit.*, sailing-canoe eye.
- maka.hou.** n. Beginning, new start. **ho'o.maka.hou.** To begin again.
- maka.hune.** n. Fine mesh or weft, as of net or mat.
- makai.** See *kai*, ocean.
- mā.kai.** Rare var. of *mānai*, needle.
- mā.kā'i.** nvt. Policeman, guard; to police, inspect, spy. Cf. *luna māka'i*. *Ua mau kānaka lā nāna i māka'i i ka 'āina* (Jos. 6.22), the aforementioned men who had spied in the country. **ho'o.mā.kā'i.** To act as a policeman; to appoint or invest as a policeman. (Probably PPN *mata + -ki*, transitivizer; PCP *maatiki*.)
- makaia.** A rare term defined in For. 5:165 as a swift runner; probably *makai'a*.
- mā.kāia.** nvi. Revenge, vengeance, treachery, betrayal, traitor, betrayer, turncoat; treacherous. (Laie 513.) *Kū ho'i kāu hana i ka mākaia*, you've behaved treacherously.
- maka.i'a.** n. 1. Whitened pupil of a blind person's eye, cataract. *Lit.*, fish eye. 2. A kind of stone, used for adzes and poi pounders. Also *māhikihiki*. 3. See *makaia*.
- makaia.uli.** n. A limpet, *Cellana exarata*; flesh within 'opihi shells. (KL line 27.) See *'opihi*.
- maka.ihe.** n. Spear point.
- mā.kā'i ho'o.malu.** n. Probation officer.
- mā.kā'i ho'o.malu pō.** n. Patrolling night police. *Lit.*, police making night peaceful.
- maka.ihu.** n. Bowsprit of a canoe; sharp point at the bow. *Lit.*, bow point.
- maka.ihu.wa'a.** n. Phosphorescent light seen in water at night.
- Maka-ihu-wa'a.** n. Star name.
- mā.kā'i.kā'i.** nvi. To visit, see the sights; to stroll, make a tour, take a walk; to look upon (Puk. 3.4); spectator. *Māka'ika'i hele*, to stroll here and there. *Po'e māka'ika'i*, visitors, sight-seers, tourists, spectators. *Māka'ika'i 'ia*, visited. **ho'o.mā.kā'i.kā'i.** To take others on a visit; to show the sights; to escort. (PCP *maatikitaki*.)
- maka'ike.** vt. To see clearly and with keen powers of observation; to see more than most, especially to see supernatural things or ghosts not seen by others; to have the gift of second sight. *Lit.*, seeing eye. Cf. *'ike maka*.
- maka.iki.** n. Eye smaller than the other. *Lit.*, small eye.
