

- similar face. *Pa'a lole makalike*, uniform, as of military.
- maka lilio**. n. Eyes with epicanthic fold.
- maka.lio**. vs. Taut, as a rope. *Lit.*, tight mesh.
- maka.loa**. n. 1. A perennial sedge (*Cyperus laevigatus*), found in or near fresh or salt water in warm countries. From a horizontal, creeping stem rise long, slender unbranched stems, each topped by a small inflorescence. Formerly the plants were valued in Hawai'i for making the fine Ni'ihau mats. (Neal 86.) Also *makoloa*. 2. General name for shellfish with long sharp edges (*Thais intermedia*, *Drupa morum*). Also *aupūpū*, *pūpū 'awa*. (KL line 30.) See also *'ōlepe makaloa*. 3. A seaweed.
- maka loa**. vs. Very green, as a fruit; barely cooked, very raw.
- maka loko.maika'i**. n. Bountiful eye (Sol. 22.9); one who looks kindly, charitably, and with good will. *Lit.*, good-hearted face.
- maka lolē**. n. Eyelid turned back, exposing the under side of the lid; an insulting term, as prisoners were tortured by tattooing the exposed eyelid. *Lit.*, turned eye.
- maka lua**. 1. vs. Two-face, double-edged; two-fold, as a plaited mat; hypocritical. 2. n. Socket of the eyeball. *Fig.*, depths of the sea. 3. n. Fishing net with mesh wide enough to admit two fingers. *Lit.*, double mesh.
- mā.kā.lua**. nvi. Hole for house posts or for planting, as taro; to dig such a hole.
- mā.kā.lua.kēle**. n. A large *mākālua* hole.
- maka luhī**. n. Tired eyes, tired people, especially those who have been working hard on a community project. Cf. *'aha'aina maka luhī*.
- maka.luku**. vt. To plan slaughter; to determine to destroy.
- maka.māe**. vs. Precious, of great value, highly prized, darling (Hal. 22.20). *Mea makamae*, precious object, treasure.
- maka.maka**. 1. n. Intimate friend with whom one is on terms of receiving and giving freely; pal, buddy; host. *Fig.*, anything very helpful, as education. Cf. *maka*, beloved. *Kona makamaka*, his friend. **ho'o.maka.maka**. To befriend, be a friend to, make a friend, cause to be friends. Cf. *ho'okūmakamaka*. *Ho'omaka-maka wahine*, to make friends with a woman. 2. Redup. of *maka*, raw, fresh. 3. n. Buds, as forming on the corm of a taro. (HP 5.)
- maka.maka.hā.nai**. n. Friend.
- maka.maka.hēlu.hēlu**. n. Reader, as of a newspaper. *Lit.*, reading friend.
- maka.maka.nui**. n. One with a host of friends because of a genial, kindly, or hospitable nature; many friends.
- makamē, madamē**. n. Madame. *Eng. Makame Pele*, Madam Pele.
- maka mino**. n. Indented, non-protruding nipple, as is difficult for a baby to grasp.
- maka moēna**. n. Mesh in mat made by plaiting over one and under one; similar style in quilting; check plait. *Lit.*, mat mesh.
- maka momi**. See *momi* 5.
- maka.mua**. n. Lead horses or oxen in a team.
- maka mua**. n. First, beginning, commencement, first time; first child of a family. *Lit.*, first end. *Maka mua o ka huaka'i* (FS 137), beginning of the procession. *'O ka maka mua kēia o ko'u ho'ā'o 'ana i ka 'ōlepe*, this is the first time I've tasted an oyster.
- makana**. nvt. Gift, present; reward, award, donation, prize; to give a gift, donate. Cf. *maka* 2. *Kāna makana*, his gift [one that he gives or receives]. *Makana kā ho'i!* What a gift! [sometimes said sarcastically, indicating that a person is ungrateful].
- makana.ā**. n. Plants growing on lava beds (probably a contraction or *maka i nā 'a'ā*, budding in the lava).
- makana aloha**. n. Gift of friendship or love; freewill offering.
- makana.hēle**. vs. Wild, untamed; of the wilderness or forest. *Lit.*, forest person. *Pua'a makanahēle*, wild pig. *Nohona makanahēle*, living in the forest. *Mikana ma-*
- kanahēle*, papaya growing wild. **ho'o.makana.hēle**. To let a garden grow wild; wild, untamed.
- makana.hēle**. n. Parting gift. *Lit.*, going gift.
- makana.lau**. Same as *makalau*.
- maka.nau**. n. Twinkling of eyes. *Rare*.
- makani**. 1. nvs. Wind, breeze; gas in the stomach, flatulent wind; windy; to blow. *Fig.*, anger, gossip; to show anger. Cf. *ani*. *Makani nui*, strong wind, gale. *Makani 'olu'olu*, fair wind. *Mai wala'au a'e ho'i o makani auane'i* (saying), don't talk too much or the wind will blow [gossip]. *Hāmau o makani auane'i*, be still or there will be anger. *Kali i ka makani 'ōahi*, wait for the firebrand wind. (PPN *matangi*.) 2. n. Ghost, spirit. See *kahuna makani*. 3. interj. Call of sentinel, similar to "all's well".
- Makani-hā.nai-loli**. n. Name of a gentle wind; it is said to permit *loli* to come out of their holes and feed. (UL 207.) *Lit.*, wind that feeds sea slug.
- makani hau none**. n. Ice-cold mountain wind. *Lit.*, icy, annoying wind.
- makani holo 'ū.hā**. n. Cold wind. *Lit.*, wind running [over] thighs. (PH 187.)
- makani ka'a.will.will**. n. Tornado. *Lit.*, wind revolving twisting.
- makani kama.āina**. n. Usual wind of a place.
- makani kū honua**. n. Sudden strong wind, gust. *Lit.*, wind arriving suddenly.
- makani noho**. n. Spirit that possesses a medium and speaks through him. *Lit.*, spirit that takes possession.
- makani 'olu'olu**. n. Favorable or fair wind, refreshing breeze.
- makani pā.hili**. n. Cyclone, hurricane.
- makani pū.kī.kī**. n. Gust, strong wind.
- makani uluulu, makani hēle uluulu**. n. Hurricane.
- makani willi**. n. Whirlwind, twisting wind.
- maka nui**. n. A variety of sweet potato. (HP 142.)
- maka.nunui**. vs. Widely spaced, as grooves on a tapa beater.
- maka nunui**. n. Big eyes. Cf. *ki'i maka nunui* under *ki'i* 1.
- Makao**. n. 1. Star name (no data). (Kuhelani.) 2. A city, governed by Portugal, near Hong Kong.
- mā.kā'o**. Same as *ka'oka'o* 3, arid. Cf. *kūmimi māka'o*.
- maka 'oi**. n. Piercing, penetrating, sharp eyes.
- mā.kā'o.kā'o**. 1. Var. of *mōka'oka'o*. 2. nvs. High; height. *Māka'oka'o ke ahi 'au hau i ka pali*, high on the precipice are the firebrands.
- maka ole**. n. Eyetooth; point of a dog's tooth. *Fig.*, point of an 'ō'ō, digging stick; sprouting plant.
- maka onaona**. n. A sweet, lovely, or tender expression of face or eyes; also said of the eyes of the *kole*, a fish. *Ā ua lilo ihola 'oia i mea ho'omakaleho mau 'ia e nā kaikamahine maka onaona o Kaua'i*, this became something much wanted by the fragrant-eyed girls of Kaua'i.
- maka.'opihi**. n. 1. *'Opihi* scooped out of its shell. 2. A fine pandanus mat, of 6 cm strands. *Lit.*, fine mesh.
- maka.ō.pi'i**. Same as *mākole mākōpi'i*.
- maka.ō.pio**. n. A variety of taro.
- maka 'ou**. n. Excelling eye, epithet for a councilor (*kā-laimoku*), who had served under three rulers in three generations, and hence was regarded as full of wisdom.
- maka.pā**. 1. vs. Feeble, of light, as firelight in the daytime; shy, wild, as a bird. 2. n. Stones that break in a fire, not desirable for the *imu*.
- maka.pa'a**. nvs. Person blind in one eye, one-eyed; blind in one eye (it was considered bad luck to meet such a person); blind (Oihk. 22.22). *Lit.*, closed eye.
- maka pala**. vs. Soft, ripe; ready to burst, of a boil.
- maka.pā.pipi**. n. Hollow worn in lava rock by the sea, where salt is collected, natural salt pan.
- maka.pēhu**. nvs. Swollen; suffering from hunger; hungry person. *Ola ka makapehu i'a 'ole*, the suffering from lack of fish is over.
- maka pela**. n. Dirty face; sticky, dirty eyes. See ex., *hā-puku* 1, 2.
