

of family discord: Nānā 137-8]. *Hele i ka make*, to pass away in death [common statement in wills]. *Emi maila 'o Ka-malama, ā 'ane'ane nō e make i nā wahi koa* (FS 85), Ka-malama fell behind and was almost killed by the warriors. **ho'o.make**. To kill deliberately, execute; to pretend to be dead; to let die; to let diminish, grow faint. *Mai ho'opae 'oe, e ho'omake 'oe i kou nalu*, don't catch [the wave], let your wave get smaller. (PPN *mate*.) **2.** nvs. Desire, want; to want. Cf. *make 'ai, -māke'aka, make wai*. After 'a'ole, *make* expresses a weak command, as "you better not." 'I *mai nei ke ali'i, 'a'ole make kaha ka 'ōpū o ka pua'a* (FS 205), the chief said, better not cut open the pig's stomach. 'A'ole *make hana*, better not do it. *Mai make hele 'oe!* Don't get the notion of going. (PCP *mate*.) **3.** n. Price, barter, exchange. Cf. *makehewa, makepono*. 'Ehia hua moa *make ka hapalua*, how many eggs for fifty cents? *Ā make na 'Iwa, na ke keiki 'aihue a Kukui, 'o ka waiwai o ku'u wa'a* (FS 21), the reward for 'Iwa, Kukui's thieving son, is the value of my canoe.

mā.kē. n. Masthead. *Eng.*

makea. Pas/imp. of *make 1, 2.*

mā.keā. Same as *mahakea 1-3.*

make 'ai. vi. Hungry. *Lit.*, want food. (PCP *mate kai*.)

-māke'aka. ho'o.mā.ke'aka. Witty, comic, funny, amusing; to cause laughter, exercise wit or humor. *Hana ho'omāke'aka*, funny antics; to do something to provoke laughter. 'Ōlelo *ho'omāke'aka*, joke, witticism. *Mea ho'omāke'aka*, joker, wit, clown.

make anu. vs. To be very cold, chilled, freezing.

Make.au.pē'a. n. Name of a star or constellation. See *Mekeaupe'a*.

make 'awa.hua iho. n. Death due to mental depression. (Kam. 64:44.) *Lit.*, bitterness within death.

make'ē. vt. Covetous, greedy, desirous to have; to prize, have affection for. *He make'e keiki*, a great affection for children. *Ka mālama make'e loa* (Kel. 50), to preserve a desired object with great care. **ho'o.make'ē.** Caus/sim.

make'ē kā.nā.wai. vs. Law-abiding.

mā.ke'ē.ke'ē. Redup. of *make'e*.

make'ē kū.lana. nv. To desire to preserve the status quo; conservative.

make'ē pono au.puni. vs. Patriotic; desirous for the welfare of the nation.

make'ē wai.wai. nvs. Avarice, covetousness (Ier. 22:17); eagerness to acquire wealth.

mā.kē.hā. nvi. Shish, to shish, swish, especially accompanied by flash, as of skyrockets; flash, as of lightning; to flash. *Ka-uila-mākēhā-o-ka-lani* (name), flashing lightning of heaven.

make.hewa. nvs. Bad bargain, vain undertaking; in vain, useless, without profit. Cf. *makepono*. 'A'a *makehewa*, rash, desperate. *Makehewa ke kino u'i, 'o kēlā ke kāne*, the youthful beauty is wasted on a man like that.

make.hia. Pas/imp. of *make 2*. 'Onipa'a *ana ka pono, 'onipa'a me ka makehia* (song), let the right stand firm, stand firm because it is wanted.

make kaka ola. n. Death caused by capturing the spirit of a live person. (Kam. 64:43.) *Lit.*, death strike [the] living.

make.kau. vs. Warlike.

mā.keke. n. **1.** Market. *Eng.* **2.** Black mustard (*Brassica nigra*), a cosmopolitan herb, a weed in Hawai'i, but formerly cultivated for the seeds, which are the main source of table mustard. Small yellow flowers, and later erect seed pods, are borne on tall stems. *Eng.* *Hua mākeke* (Mat. 13:31), grain of mustard seed.

-makeke'eo. ho'o.make.ke'eo. Resentful.

mā.keke nui. n. Large market, supermarket.

makela, masela. n. Muscles. *Eng.*

makele. Same as *kele 1*. *Ka ulua makele*, the fat, large deep-sea ulua, a fish.

make.lia. n. Material. *Eng.*

makeli.monio, materimonio. n. Matrimony. *Eng.*

make loa. vs. To die (in contrast to *make*, which may mean "defeated, faint"). For a pre-Christian concept, see *make 1*.

make.make. **1.** nvt. Desire, want, wish; to want, like, prefer, favor, wish; willing (often replaced colloquially by *mamake*). See *make 2*. *E mālama 'ia Kou make-make*, may Thy will be done. **ho'o.make.make.** To cause or feign desire. **2.** Redup. of *make 1*; defeated. (For. 6:371.) (PPN *matemate*.)

make.makika. n. Mathematics. *Eng.*

make.makika ho'o.pili 'ia. n. Applied mathematics. *Lit.*, referred mathematics.

make.makika 'okoa. n. Pure mathematics.

makena. **1.** nvi. Mourning, wailing, lamentation; to wail, lament, weep for joy. *Nona kēia makena e uwē 'ia mai nei* (For. 4:47), this wailing that is being sobbed forth here is for him. (PPN *matenga*.) **2.** n. Calm, of sea, atmosphere. Cf. *make, dead*.

mā.kēna. vs. Many, numerous; often, much. *Mākena wale ua moa*, lots of chickens. *Mākena kā ho'i ko'u hilahila iā'oe*, how you humiliated me; you made me ashamed of you.

makena.wai. n. Place where a stream disappears in the ground.

mā.kē.neki. n. Magnet, magneto. *Eng.*

make pilau. nvs. Complete defeat, as in card games, to be completely defeated.

make pō.loli. nvi. To die of starvation; faint with hunger.

make.pono. nvs. Bargain; profitable, reasonable in price or in conduct. Cf. *makehewa*.

make ulu niu. nvs. Madness; to be mad. (Kam. 64:43.) *Lit.*, death [from] whirling. *Rare*.

make wai. nvi. Thirst; thirsty. See ex., *iho 7*. (PEP *mate wai*.)

make wale. vi. To die of itself, to die without cause, to die or wilt easily. 'O *ka mea make wale* (Oihk. 22:8), that which dieth of itself.

māki. vi. To march. *Eng.*

mā.kī. vt. To roll, fold. *He aha ka mea i māki 'ia ai kēia moena*, why was this mat rolled up?

mā.kia. **1.** nvs. Aim, motto, purpose; to aim or strive for, to concentrate on. 'Onipa'a *kā Lili'u-o-ka-lani mākia*, stand firm was Lili'u-o-ka-lani's motto. **2.** nvt. Pin, nail, wedge, spike, stake, bolt; to nail, bolt, crucify, pin; to establish, as a kingdom; to destroy by sorcery; to drive stakes, as in surveying; to fasten. *Mākia 'ia ma ka lā'au ke'a*, nailed to the cross.

mā.ki'a. conj. Maybe, perhaps, probably. *Māki'a o uha-ele aku kāua*, we'll probably go.

maki.awa. n. Round herring (*Etrumeus micropus*); common in estuaries, as at Pearl Harbor. Also *miki-awa, 'ōmaka*.

makihi. *Cressa cretica* (Remy 19). Cf. Neal 701.

maki'i.lohe.lohe. n. A service during *luakini* dedication. (For. 6:45.)

makika. n. **1.** Mosquito. *Eng.* In Puk. 8:16, *makika* translates "gnats" (RSV) and "lice" (KJV). In Hal. 105:31, *makika* is "swarm of flies" (RSV) and "divers sorts of flies" (KJV). **2.** Plant blight that attacked sweet potato, taro, and other food crops, believed caused by mosquitoes.

makiki. **1.** Same as *kiki*, to peck. *Makiki moa*, cockfight. **2.** n. Type of stone used as weights for octopus lures (Malo 19), and for adzes.

maki.koe. vs. Long, tall, slender, as a tree.

mā.kila. nvt. Maui name for *mānai*, needle; to string, as leis.

makili. vi. To crack, appear through a crack, show, come to light; to come off, as shingles; cracked, split open. *He lā makili loa ka uka* (For. 6:299), a sun just peering forth in the uplands. *Ua makili mai ka mālamalama ma ka hakahaka o ka puka*, the light shows through the open space of the door. **ho'o.makili.** To
