- mā.kua.** 1. Plural of *makua*. (Gram. 8.1.) (PNP *maatu'a*.) 2. Same as *kūnehi*, sunfish.
- mā.ku'a.** Var. of *māku'e*, dark brown, dark red.
- makua ali'i, makuali'i.** n. Progenitor, patriarch, head of a tribe.
- makua.hine, makuwahine.** n. Mother, aunt, female cousin or relative of parents' generation. *Lit.*, female parent. 'Olelo *makuahine*, mother tongue. **ho'o.makua.hine.** To act as or claim to be a *makuahine*; to treat as a *makuahine*. (PPN *matu'a fafine*.)
- mā.kua.hine.** Plural of *makuahine*. (Gram. 8.1.) (PCP *maatu'a wahine*.)
- makua.hine hanauna.** n. Female cousin of the parents' generation.
- makua.hine kō.lēa.** n. Stepmother.
- makua.hine makua.** n. Aunt who is older sister or cousin of the father or mother. *Lit.*, older mother.
- makua.hine 'ō.pio.** n. Aunt who is younger sister of the father or mother. *Lit.*, young mother.
- makua.hine papa.kēma.** n. Godmother.
- makua.hō.nō.wai.** Rare var. of *makuahūnōai*.
- makua.hū.nō.ai, makahūnōwai.** n. Parent-in-law; uncle- or aunt-in law; cousin of parent-in-law (sex may be designated by addition of *kāne*, male, or *wahine*, female). *Ho'ohoihoi makuahūnōai*, to please an in-law [of one whose first enthusiasm fades]. *Kona mau makuahūnōai* (Laie 613), his parents-in-law.
- makua kāne.** n. Father, uncle, male cousin of parents' generation. **ho'o.makua kāne.** To act as or claim to be a *makua kāne*; to address or treat as a *makua kāne*.
- mā.kua kāne.** Plural of *makua kāne*.
- makua kāne hanauna.** n. Male cousin of the parents' generation.
- makua kāne kō.lēa.** n. Stepfather.
- makua kāne makua.** n. Uncle who is older brother or cousin of the father or mother.
- makua kāne 'ō.pio.** n. Uncle who is younger brother of the father or mother.
- makua kāne papa.kēma.** n. Godfather.
- Makua-ka'ū.mana.** n. Name of a star, said to be in the Kaulua constellation.
- makua.keahu.** n. Spirit of a living person.
- makua kō.lēa.** n. Stepparent.
- mā.kua.kua.** 1. Redup. of *makua*; aged, old. *Ua mākuakua kēlā kanaka*, that person is old. 2. vs. Coarse, thick, as cloth; furrowed, as plowed land. 3. n. A variety of grass. 4. n. Young of *mākua*, a fish.
- mā.ku'a.ku'a.** Same as *māku'eku'e 1*.
- makua.li'i.** Same as *makua ali'i*.
- makua lua.** vs. Very old. (For. 6:400.)
- makua meā keiki.** n. A person who has children; mother and child.
- makua-o-ka-limu-kohu.** n. A seaweed. *Lit.*, parent of the *limu kohu*.
- makua-o-ka-iti.poa.** n. Sponge crab. Cf. *kumulipoa*.
- makua papa.kēma.** n. Godparent.
- makua 'uhane.** n. Spiritual father, Catholic priest.
- makua wahine.** Old spelling for *makuahine*. (FS 173.)
- mā.ku'e.** 1. nvs. Dark brown, any dark color. *Lole māku'e* (2 Oihn. 2.7), purple. *Poni māku'e*, dark purple. 'Ula *māku'e*, dark or purplish red. *Kanaka 'ili māku'e o ka moana Pākīpika*, dark-skinned native of the Pacific Ocean. (PCP *matuke*.) 2. nvi. Frown, scowl; to frown, scowl. 3. n. A native fern (*Elaphoglossum hirtum* var. *micans*), with long, narrow, undivided fronds, which are coated on both sides with soft, brown scales.
- mā.ku'e.ku'e.** 1. Redup. of *māku'e 1, 2*. 2. n. Bunch grass. 3. Same as 'alinalina. *Moloka'i*.
- mā.ku'e lau li'i.** n. A small native fern (*Grammitis hookeri*), with narrow, unbranched fronds 8 to 24 cm long, clothed with dark-red hairs. *Lit.*, small-leaved *māku'e*.
- maku'i.** n. Joint, joining. *Rare*.
- maku.ika, makuisa.** n. Marquis. *Eng.*
- maku.kana.** n. Boxfish (*Lactoria fornasini*).
- mā.kū.koa'e.** n. Tropic bird phantom, a poetic name for death and the spirit of death; to hover, of this bird; also similar to *akua ho'ounauna*. *Ua mākūkoa'e 'oia*, the tropic bird phantom hangs over him [he is dying or the victim of sorcery].
- mā.kū.kū.** Redup. of *mākū 1*.
- Makula.** n. Saturn.
- makule.** vs. Aged, elderly, old, of people. Cf. 'elema-kule, old man.
- makulu.** 1. Var. of *nakulu*. *Makulu ka noe i ka lehua*, the mist drips upon the *lehua* flowers. 2. (Cap.) n. Saturn.
- mā.kulu.kulu.** 1. Redup. of *makulu 1*. 2. (Cap.) n. Saturn.
- mā.kuma.** Same as *hākuma*. *Mākuma ke aloha*, love intense.
- mā.kuma.kū.** Redup. of *mākū*; thick, heavy.
- mā.kuma.kuma.** Redup. of *mākuma*.
- maku'u.** 1. n. Topknot of hair; pommel, horn, of a saddle; end pieces of a canoe; neck cut on the stern end of a canoe hull hewn in the mountains, to which a rope was fastened for dragging the canoe to the sea. 2. n. Bundle, as of white tapa fastened to ridgepole during certain ceremonies. (Malo 171.) 3. nvi. Uncontrollable bowel discharge, as after eating great quantities of *wolu (walu)*, a fish; to have such discharge.
- maku.wahine.** Var. spelling of *makuahine*.
- mala.** 1. vs. Aching, as after unaccustomed exercise; stiff and sore, bruised. See *mamala*. **ho'o.mala.** To cause such aching. (PPN *mala*.) 2. vs. Sour, as fermented sweet potatoes, insipid. See *mamala*. (PPN *mara*.) 3. Same as 'āhui, bunch, as of bananas.
- māla.** n. Garden, plantation, patch, cultivated field, as *māla 'ai, māla kalo, māla kō, māla kūlina*. (PPN *ma'ala*.)
- māla 'ai.** n. Taro patch, food garden or plantation.
- Malae.** nvs. Malaya; Malay. *Eng.*
- malae. ho'o.malae.** To feign friendship.
- mā.la'e.** vs. Clear, calm; clear of weeds, as a field; serene, as a cloudless sky. Cf. *la'e, kāla'e. ho'o.mā.la'e*. To clear, explain clearly; to calm, cheer, dispel gloom; to clear away, as brush or weeds.
- Malaea.** Same as *Malaia*. (Kep. 67.)
- māla'ea.** Pas/imp. of *māla'e. ho'o.māla'ea. Pas/imp. of *ho'omāla'e*.*
- mā.la'e.la'e.** Redup. of *māla'e. ho'o.mā.la'e.la'e.* Caus/sim.
- mā.lahi.** Short for *ma'alahi*.
- mala.hia.** Pas/imp. of *mala 1, 2*. (PNP *ma(a)lasia*.)
- malai.** Var. of *palai 2*.
- malaia.** 1. Pas/imp. of *mala 2*; soured, a sour disposition, crosspatch. 2. (Cap.) nvs. Malay, Malaya, Malaysia. *Eng.*
- malaila.** See *laila*.
- mā.lai.lēa.** 1. nvs. Bitter, sour; sour or disagreeable disposition (For. 6:502). **ho'o.mā.lai.lēa.** To cause sourness; to embitter. 2. n. A kind of 'ahi, a fish.
- Malai.lua.** 1. n. Name of a strong, blustering wind at Nu'u-anu; to blow, of this wind. 2. (Not cap.) Hornless goat or cow (said to be named for a particular goat at Kona, Hawai'i). (AP.)
- malai.ōa.** vs. Broken into small or minute particles, as dust. *Rare*.
- malaka.** nvs. Mulatto. *Eng.*
- mala.keke.** n. Molasses. *Eng.*
- Malaki.** n. March. *Eng.*
- mala.kia.** Rare var. of *malahia*. 'Eha *malakia ka 'ili i ka 'oli'oli* (chant), the skin is hurt, sore with joy.
- mala.kile, maratire.** n. Martyr.
- māla.lā.'au hua 'ai.** Orchard.
- mā.lalai.ōa.** 1. nvs. A thin person; thin. See ex., *wili-mo'o*. 2. n. Person skilled in trade or occupation. (Malo 194, 201.) *Rare*.
