

- mana'o aka.mai.** n. Clever thought, wise thought; spirit of wisdom. (Puk. 28.3.)
- mana'o oene, mana'owene.** n. A variety of taro, same as *mana'ulu* except that the petiole is pinker. (HP 24.) This term may be qualified by the colors *ke'oke'o*, *lenalena*, *melemele*, *'ula'ula*.
- mana'o.ha'i.** nvi. Something to say, thought to express, predication, theorem, problem; to predicate.
- mana'o ha.iki.** nvs. Narrow or intolerant mind; narrow-minded, intolerant.
- mana'ohe.** n. A variety of taro (HP 33.)
- mana'o ho'o.ha.like.like.** n. Comparison.
- mana'o ho'o.mana.mana.** n. Superstition.
- mana'o ho'o.nalo.nalo, mana'o ho'o.nane.nane.** n. Hidden or figurative meaning.
- mana'o ho'o.pili.pili.** n. Hidden or figurative meaning.
- mana'o 'ino.** nv. Evil thought or idea, hatred, ill feeling; to hate.
- mana'o.'i'o.** nvt. Faith, confidence; to have faith, confidence; to believe. *Kumu mana'o'i'o*, creed. *Pelika o ka mana'o'i'o*, covenant of faith. *Mana'o'i'o Nikine*, Nicene creed. *Ua mana'o'i'o i ke Akua*, [he] believes in God.
- mana'o ka.la.** vs. Money-minded, commercial.
- mana'o ki'e.ki'e.** n. Pride, conceit. *Lit.*, high opinion.
- mana'o kipi.** n. Rebellious thoughts; disloyal.
- mana'o koho.** n. Supposition, presumption.
- mana'o.ko.kua.** n. Hypothesis, lemma; thought to help. *'O ka mana'okokua, 'oia kekahi mana'o a kumumana'o paha, i ho'oia 'ia i mea kokua ma ka ho'oia 'ana i ka mana'oha'i nui a me ka wehe 'ana paha i ka naneha'i*, a hypothesis is a thought or proposition used as a demonstration and aid to proving a main predication [or theorem] or for the solution of a problem.
- mana'o ku.pa'a.** Same as *mana'o pa'a*; doctrine.
- mana'o.lana.** nvt. Hope, confidence, expectation; to hope (*mana'o* + *-lana*, nominalizer: Gram. 6.6.2).
- mana'o lau.la.** nvs. Broad-minded, tolerant, tolerancy.
- mana'o.lia.** Pas/imp. of *mana'o*.
- mana'o lo.kahi.** vi. Unanimous.
- mana'o maoli.** n. Literal meaning; a real or true opinion.
- mana'o.na'o.** Redup. of *mana'o*; to meditate, ponder. (Hal. 63.6.)
- ma.na'o.na'o.** nvs. Horrible, dreadful, pitiful, horrifying, gruesome, shocking; shocked, horrified; heartsick, overcome with grief or horror; heartbreaking; grief. *Kona mana'ona'o* (Laie 591), his grief. *Mana'ona'o au i ka pepehi o ku'u keiki i kana wahine*, I am horrified at the beating given his wife by my nephew. **ho'o.ma.na'o.na'o.** To cause a sensation of horror, grief.
- mana'o nui.** nv. Important matter or idea, sense, signification; meaning (*Ni'ihau*). *Me ka mana'o nui*, with every consideration [formal ending of a letter]. *Mea mana'o nui 'ia*, person or thing constantly in mind.
- mana'o 'ola.lau.** n. Confused, erroneous thinking, hallucination.
- mana'opa'a.** nvs. Conviction, determination, firm intention; convinced, determined, resolute (Laie 591). *He mana'opa'a kona ua pono kana hana*, he is convinced his conduct is righteous.
- mana'opelu.** n. A native variety of taro, named for a fish, *'opelu*, the corms of which were used as *'opelu* bait; the leaf stem is green with white streaks, becoming maroon above. (Whitney; HP 23.)
- mana'o.pili.** n. Corollary, as in mathematics.
- mana'o poina.** n. Postscript, afterthought, forgotten opinion.
- mana'o ulu.wale.** n. Whim, fancy, impulse, notion, random thought, thought that has come for no particular reason.
- mana'o wale.** vt. To suppose, presume.
- mana'o wehe.wehe.** n. Explanatory thought, scholium, explanation.
- mana'owene.** Var. spelling of *mana'oene*.
- mana piha.** n. Supreme, absolute power.
- mana piko.** n. A native variety of taro, distinguished by purple on leaf center and extending on main veins; a fair table taro. (Whitney; HP 24.)
- mana pipika.** n. A variety of taro. *Lit.*, crinkled *mana*.
- mana.pua.** See *mea'ono pua'a*.
- mana ua.uahi.** n. A variety of taro, the leaf stem mainly light green, the leaf blade with white leaf center, veins, and edges. (HP 24.) *Lit.*, smoky-gray *mana*.
- manau.ea, manauwea.** n. 1. A small red seaweed (*Gracilaria coronopifolia*), with stiff, cylindrical, succulent stem and branches, a good alga for making food gels (KL line 53). The term may be qualified by *pala kea*, *pehu*, or *puakea*. Rarely *manaiea*; often called "short ogo" and "long ogo" (Japanese, dialectal). *Ogo* or long *ogo* is *G. bursa-pastoris*. 2. A variety of taro.
- mana'uele, mana'uwele.** Same as *mana'oene*, a taro.
- mana'uh.pua'a.** n. A variety of taro.
- mana'ula'ula.** n. A rare variety of taro, distinguished by its purplish-red flecked petioles; mainly used as table taro. (HP 24.) Also *mana ha'ula'ula*.
- mana uli.uli.** n. A variety of taro, introduced from South Seas; makes good poi of yellow color. The corms are tough and rubbery when cooked. Noted for prolific branching. *Lit.*, dark *mana*.
- mana'ulu.** n. A native variety of taro distinguished by pinkish petioles. The corms have orange-yellow flesh when cooked (like fruit of breadfruit) and are used mainly as table taro. (Whitney 27; HP 24.) *Lit.*, breadfruit *mana*. Cf. *mana'oene*.
- manau.wea.** Var. spelling of *manauwea*.
- manawa.** 1. n. Time, turn, season, date, chronology, period of time. Cf. *ha'i manawa*. *No ka manawa*, for the time being, for a short time or while, temporary. *Ia manawa*; *ia manawa no*, at this time, then, contemporary. *Nā manawa apau loa*, always, all the time. *I ka manawa hea*, when. *'Elua manawa*, twice, two times. *No ka manawa pōkole*, for a short time or while, for awhile. *Mai kēia manawa aku*, henceforth, from now on. *Manawa iki*, a moment. *Manawa mau loa*, eternal; eternity. *Manawa 'ole*, in no time, instantly, immediately. *Manawa ua*, rainy season. *Ho'opau manawa*, to waste time. *I kēlā manawa i kēia manawa*, now and then, from time to time. *'O kou manawa kēia*, this is your turn. *I ka manawa o Ka-mehameha*, in the time of Ka-mehameha. *Nā bona no ka manawa*, term bonds. 2. vs. For a short time, infrequent. *Kū manawa ka moku*, the ship stops infrequently. 3. n. Affections, feelings, disposition, heart, seat of emotions. Cf. *manawahuwā*, *manawa 'ino*, *manawale'a*, *manawanui*. *Hāli'ali'a mai ke aloha pili pa'a i ku'u manawa* (song), recalling love dwelling firmly in my affections. (PPN *manawa*.) 4. n. Anterior fontanel in the heads of infants; top of the head of adults at position of the fontanel.
- manawa.ea.** 1. nvi. Hard breathing, panting for breath, from exertion; to pant thus, breathe. *Lit.*, rising breath. (PPN *maanawa*.) 2. n. Infancy before the fontanel closes. *Lit.*, rising fontanel.
- manawa hana.** n. Working time or shift.
- Manawa-wahine.** n. Name of a star, said to appear in the first night of the month *Nana* and to vanish after the night of *Muku*. *Lit.*, female power.
- manawa.hua.** 1. nvs. Discomfort of the stomach, or indigestion, with gas and often diarrhea, thought to be caused by wrong diet or by excessive handling of animals, such as kittens or puppies, which might also become sick; to suffer thus; great grief, as over the loss of a loved one; to grieve. *Lit.*, swollen stomach. Cf. *lūmanawahua*. *Manawahua kai ko'o*, great distress, pain; surging pain, distress [*lit.*, strong sea, stomach discomfort]. 2. n. A native fern (*Doryopteris* spp.), about 30 cm high, with heart-shaped fronds divided into many long segments. Also *'iwa'iwa*.
- manawa.huā, manawahuwa.** nvs. Jealous, jealousy; to bear a grudge. *Ua manawahuā 'oia i nā hoahānau*, he bore a grudge against his brethren.
- mana.wai.** vs. Warped, depressed, bent in. *Rare*.
