

- mā.ua.** pronoun. We, us (dual, exclusive). (Gram. 8.2.) *Kā māua*, belonging to us, our. (PPN *kimarua*, PNP *kimaaua*, PEP *maaua*.)
- ma'u'a.** vs. Careless, as of clothing, mats, tapa, property. *I loko nō o ka hune, komo ma'u'a nō i ka lolo*, in spite of poverty, wearing clothes without taking care of them.
- maua.'ā.lina.** vs. Powerful, strong, of superior strength, athletic; to exercise strength, to use force. *Rare*.
- mau.æ.** Var. spelling of *māwae*, crack. (Puk. 33.22.)
- mau.'a'ē.** nvt. To intrude, transgress, break taboo, interrupt, meddle in the concern of others; to step over; to flaunt, as authority; to override, as a veto; such action. Cf. 'a'ē, to break taboo. *He ho'oki'eki'e, he mau'a'e i ka 'ōlelo a ka makua*, proud and heedless of parental advice.
- mau.'a'ē.'a'ē.** Redup. of *mau'a'e*; lawless. *Mau'a'e'a'e 'o Milu mā i ke kapu o Kāne* (Kep. 49), Milu and his companions broke the taboo of Kāne.
- maua.kala.** Var. of *mahuakala*, disbelieving. **ho'o-maua.kala.** Var. of *ho'omahuakala*. *Rare*.
- mā.ua.ua.** vs. Tough, leathery, as skin of the old; old.
- mau.ele, mauwele.** vt. To clear, as brush.
- ma'u.ele, ma'uwele.** vs. Lazy, without energy.
- mau.ele.kā, mauwelekā.** vt. To clear, as brush; tangled, snarled. *Kā ke ala, mauerekā!* Cut a pathway! Cut and Clear!
- ma'u.hā.** vs. Weary, aching, tired. *E noke ana ua wahi keiki nei 'o Māui i ka hoe a ma'uhā nā po'ohiwi*, the boy Māui kept plying the paddle until his shoulders ached.
- mau.ha'a.lēle.** vt. To abandon, leave, as one's family; to cease, as sinning; to pass on, die. *He mau hō'ailono mauha'alele*, signs of death.
- mau.ha'a.lēlea.** 1. Pas/imp. of *mauha'alele*. 2. n. A prayer to a forest god before cutting down a tree to be made into an image.
- mau.ha'a.lina.** 1. vs. Heavily burdened, weighted down. *Rare*. **ho'o.mau.ha'a.lina.** To oppress, burden. *Rare*. 2. To bore, pierce, as a hole in a rock. (And.)
- mau.hala.** nvs. Grudge, resentment, spite; unforgiving, to nurse revenge. **ho'o.mau.hala.** To bear a grudge, cherish revenge. *Kū'ē (kaua) ho'omauhala*, feud. *Mai ho'omauhala i nā keiki* (Oihk. 19.18), do not bear any grudge against the children.
- mau.hili.** vs. Entangled, snarled, interwoven. Cf. *hili*. *Keawe-a-mauhili* (name), Keawe entangled [in taboo] or interwoven [as chiefly blood].
- Māui.** n. 1. Name of one of the Hawaiian islands. Cf. Māui, the demigod. 2. (Not cap.) A variety of sweet potato.
- Mā.ui.** 1. n. The demigod and trickster who snared the sun. 2. n. Name of a star near the Pleiades. 3. (Not cap.) nvs. Sprain, bruise; sprained, bruised; pit-ripened, of bananas. See prayer, *nūpolupolu*. *Māui ka pua, uē 'eha i ke anu*, bruised is the flower which weeps, hurt by the cold. **ho'o.mā.ui.** To bruise, sprain, beat down, as by heavy rain or sea; to crush, as a leaf for a poultice; to cause a sprain; to ripen bananas by burying in a leaf-lined pit. (PNP *maui*.)
- mā.ui.ui.** 1. vi. To ask continually, frequently. Cf. *ui*. **ho'o.mā.ui.ui.** To ask over and over, mull over in the mind. 2. Redup. of *māui*, bruise. (PNP *mauiui*.)
- mauka.** See *uka*, inland.
- ma.'uka.** Same as *mā'uka'uka*.
- mau.ka'a.** Same as *milika'a*.
- mā.'uka.'uka.** nvs. Unskilled person; not adept, awkward, said derisively of an unsuccessful suitor. *Nā limahana mā'uka'uka*, unskilled laborers.
- Mau.kele.** n. Place name at Puna, Hawai'i.
- ma'u.kele.** n. Rain-forest area.
- mauki.** Same as *maoli*, native.
- mau.koli.** 1. vt. To ration food or water, as in time of drought. 2. vs. Small, thin, fine, as a thread. 3. vs. Stilled, hushed, as worshippers. *E maukoli ke anaina*, let the assembly keep still. 4. vt. To offer to the gods, as food. *Eia ka 'awa, a nāu pono'i nō e maukoli aku i kō akua iā Kū-kā'ili-moku* (prayer), here is kava, for you indeed to offer to your god, Kū-kā'ili-moku. 5. vs. Constant, persevering. *Rare*.
- Mau.kuku.** n. Name of a star, perhaps related to Kona-mau-kuku.
- mā.'ula.'ula.** 1. Same as 'ula'ula, red. 2. n. Red earth, as used in coloring.
- ma'ule.** nvi. Faint, faint-hearted; dispirited, weak; fainting. **ho'o.ma'ule.** To cause fainting; to faint; to feign fainting. *Ā ua ho'oma'ule ho'i iā mākou no kō mākou mau hewa* (Isa. 64.7), and has consumed us because of our iniquities. *Ho'oma'ule ka lemu* (For. 6:27), relax the buttocks [as during rituals].
- mau.leho.** vs. Calloused. Cf. *leho*, callus. **ho'o.mau-leho.** To cause calluses; to oppress, overwork.
- mau.lele.** n. Flotsam and jetsam. (For. 4:75.)
- mā.'ule.'ule.** Redup. of *ma'ule*.
- mauli.** n. 1. Life, heart, seat of life; ghost, spirit. *Mauli hiwa*, choice or precious life. *Ā lele nui nā mauli o ua po'e nei*, the spirits of these people have flown away together [death]. (PPN *ma'uri*.) 2. Fontanel. 3. (Cap.) Twenty-ninth of the old month. (Malo 32.) (PCP *mauli*.)
- mā.uli.** Same as *uli*, dark.
- mauli.au.honua.** nvs. Descendant of old chiefs of a land; established, ancient, as a family. *Ua kū kēia welo ā mauliauhonua*, this family is old and well established.
- mauli.'awa.** nvi. Hiccough; dying gasp; to hiccough, gasp in dying. *Mauli'awa ke aho*, the breath has gasped; hiccoughed.
- mau.lihi.lihi.** vs. Hanging precariously, fastened slightly.
- mau.lina.** nvi. Failure; failing; to fail. *Rare*.
- Mauli-ola.** n. Place name at KI-lau-ea Volcano, Hawai'i. (PH 94.)
- mauli ola.** n. Breath of life, power of healing. *Ka lā i ka mauli ola*, sun at the source of life. *Kihe a mauli ola*, sneeze and live [exclamation to one who has sneezed, to ward off ill effects].
- mā.uli.uli.** Redup. of *māuli*, dark.
- mā.'ulu.** Same as *mā'ulu'ulu*. See *puehu 1*.
- mau.lua.** vs. Difficult, hard.
- mā.ulu.kua.** n. Upland forest, said to be similar to *uka wao lā'au*. *Mai ka uka māulukua ā hiki i ka pali kaha-kai*, from the upland forest to the shore cliff.
- mā.'ulu.'ulu.** vs. Lame, stiff, as from exercise; tired.
- mau.mau.** 1. Redup. of *mau 1*, frequent, often. *Kai maumau*, neap tide. *Maumau 'ole kāna 'ōlelo*, his words are inconsistent. **ho'o.mau.mau.** Redup. of *ho'omau*. *E ho'omaumau i ka 'ikena* (song), continue seeing [one another]. 2. vs. Not sticky, not tenacious; of poi of medium texture, neither hard nor watery.
- ma'u.ma'u.** Same as 'āma'uma'u, ferns. *Hale-ma'u-ma'u* (name of the pit at KI-lau-ea Crater), 'āma'u fern house.
- ma'ū.ma'ū.** Redup. of *ma'ū*, moist. **ho'o.ma'ū.ma'ū.** Caus/sim. See ex., *mūki*.
- mau.maua.** Pas/imp. of *maumau 1*; to do it continuously, repeat; repetitious; repeating (Kel. 59).
- mau.mau.æ.** Doubtful. (And.)
- mauna.** 1. nvs. Mountain, mountainous region; mountainous. *Mauna Loa* (name), Long Mountain. (PPN *ma'unga*.) 2. n. Kind of hard stone from which adzes were made.
- mā.una.** nvt. Waste; mistreatment; wasteful; injured; abusive; to waste, injure, mistreat. *Mai māuna wale i ka mea 'ai*, don't waste food unnecessarily. *Māuna ka 'ili i ka wa'uwa'u 'ia*, the skin is injured in being scratched. *'O kēlā ke kāne, māuna ka 'ili*, with that man, (your) skin will be bruised [you will be beaten]. **ho'o.mā.una.** To waste, spend carelessly, abuse; to help oneself lavishly, as to drinks. *Ho'omāuna i ke kino*, to waste the body, as in dissipation.
- Mauna Kea.** n. The highest mountain on Hawai'i. *Lit.*, snow mountain.
