

- odorata*), a shrub or small tree in the mahogany family, from south China and Indo-China, grown ornamentally for the handsome leaves and fragrant flowers, which are tiny, round, and yellow; clusters of them are used for leis. (Perhaps Chinese *mei-sui-lan*; Gram. 2.9.) (Neal 493.)
- mikili.** Var. of *nakili*. Rare.
- miki.lima.** Short for *mikini lima*.
- mī.kilolo.hua.** Same as *mīkololohua*.
- miki.miki.** 1. Redup. of *miki* 1, 2; energetic. *Na ka miki-miki mua nō ka loa'a*, for the most alert one the gains. 2. vt. To talk in a friendly and ingratiating way, as to obtain a favor. 3. n. A crape myrtle. (Neal 616-7.)
- mikina.** Same as *miki'ana*. See *miki* 1, 2.
- miki.nalo.** n. 1. A sundew (*Drosera anglica*), a small insectivorous bog plant found in the Hawaiian Islands only on Kaua'i in mountain bogs. The leaves bear stick glands to catch insects. (Neal 374.) *Lit.*, to suck flies. 2. Venus's-flytrap.
- miki.nole.** Var. spelling of *mikanele*, missionary.
- mī.kini.** n. 1. Machine (*Eng.*), motor, engine. 2. Mitten (*Eng.*), glove.
- mī.kini'ai.ana.** n. Clothes presser, mangle. *Lit.*, ironing machine.
- mī.kini'apo.leo.** n. Recorder. *Lit.*, machine that catches the voice.
- mī.kini.helu.** n. Adding machine, comptometer.
- mī.kini.holoi.** n. Washing machine.
- mī.kini ho'o.ma'e.ma'e.hale.** n. Vacuum cleaner.
- mī.kini ho'o.pa'a.** n. Recording machine; any machine that binds.
- mī.kini.humu.humu.** n. Sewing machine.
- mī.kini.kaomi.** n. Press, as for clamping material, pressing clothes.
- mī.kini.kiko.kiko.hua.** n. Typewriter.
- mī.kini.lima.** n. Glove, mitten. *Lit.*, hand mitten (*Eng.*).
- mī.kini.nā.nā iā.loko.o.ke.kanaka.** n. X-ray machine. *Lit.*, machine inspecting innards of man.
- mī.kini'oki.mau'u.** n. Lawn mower. *Lit.*, grass-cutting machine.
- mī.kini.pa'i.nū.papa.** n. Printing press. *Lit.*, machine to print newspapers.
- mī.kini.wili.** n. Drill. See ex., *wili* 1.
- mikino.lia.** n. Magnolia (*Magnolia grandiflora*), a tree from southeastern United States, with large, white, fragrant flowers. *Eng.* (Neal 356.)
- mikino.lia.hihiu.** Same as *lākana*. *Lit.*, wild magnolia.
- mikino.lia.hohono.** Same as *lākana*, *mikinolia kukū*. *Lit.*, bad-smelling magnolia.
- mikino.lia.kukū.** n. Same as *lākana*, *mikinolia hohono*. *Lit.*, thorny magnolia.
- miki.oi.** 1. vs. Dainty and neat in craftsmanship, or in doing anything; deft; excellently made, as result of workmanship. *Mikioi ka hana'ia'ana o kēla pākaukau*, this table is neatly and skillfully made. **ho'o.miki.oi.** To do neatly; to work with skilled craftsmanship; to handle daintily. 2. (*Cap.*) n. Name of a strong, gusty wind of Ni'ihau (For. 5:95, UL 238). *Ka makani Mikioi o Lehua*, the gusty Mikioi wind of Lehua Island. 3. n. A native variety of sugar cane. (HP 225.)
- miki.ona, misiona.** n. Mission. *Eng.*
- mikio.nali, misionari.** nvs. Missionary. *Eng.*
- mikio.neli.** nvs. Missionary. *Eng.*
- miki.palaoa.** Same as *'auko'i*, a shrub.
- miko.** 1. vs. Seasoned with salt (Kol. 4.6); salted, tasty. Cf. *mikomiko ho'o.miko*. To season, salt. *Ho'omiko ai me ka pa'akai* (Oihk. 2.13), season with salt. 2. nvi. To kink, snarl, become ensnared; kink, snarl. *Ua miko ka lopi*, the thread has kinked.
- mī.kohu.** vs. Good-looking, attractive, becoming. *Miki-lima mīkoku*, good-looking gloves.
- mī.kohu.kohu.** Redup. of *mīkoku*.
- mī.koi.** vt. To nibble, eat in small pinches, as salt or *'inamona* with poi. *Kāmano mīkoi*, salmon eaten in small bits.
- mī.koi.koi.** Redup. of *mīkoi*.
- mīko.koi.** 1. Redup. of *mīkoi*. 2. n. A native variety of sugar cane; a lighter brown-red mutant of *manulele* without purple cast to leaves and sheath. (HP 221.)
- mī.kole.** 1. vt. To eat fastidiously, in small portions; to nibble, as at salt or relish; to eat sparingly. 2. vs. Persevering, continuing at a task little by little; working bit by bit. *'O kona mīkole nō ia ā hiki i ka wā e loa'a ai*, he perseveres until he obtains.
- mī.kolele.hua.** Var. of *mīkololohua*.
- mī.kolo.hua.** Same as *mīkololohua*.
- mī.kololo.hua.** vs. Eloquent, fascinating in speech, moving, pleasing, delightful, entertaining. Cf. *miko* 1.
- mī.kolo.lia.** vs. Changeable or varying in appearance, as the sea. Rare.
- miko.miko.** Redup. of *miko* 1; garnish; delicious; salted lightly; entertaining, instructive, as conversation. Cf. *mīkololohua ho'o.miko.miko*. Caus/sim.
- miko.mikoi.** Redup. of *mīkoi*.
- mī.kua.kua.** n. A medicinal plant (no data).
- mila.** n. Mill (tenth part of a cent). *Eng.*
- mīle.** n. 1. Bunch of 40 loose, cleaned *olonō* fibers. Rare. Also *'apana*. 2. Mile, mileage. *Eng.*
- mīleka, mīleta.** n. Millet. (Ezek. 4.9.)
- mīle loa.** n. Nautical mile, knot. *Lit.*, long mile.
- mīle.nio.** n. Millennium. *Eng.*
- mili.** vs. 1. To handle, feel of, fondle, caress, as a beloved child; fondled, beloved. *Ka i'a mili i ka lima*, the fish [*'o'opu*] fondled in the hand [easily caught]. (PPN *mili*.) 2. Slow, inefficient in work. Cf. *mili'apa, mili-mili*. *Nui ka mili o kāna hana*, his work is very slow.
- mīlia.** Pas/imp. of *mili* 1. *Ka-pua-i-mīlia* (name), the beloved flower or child.
- mīli.ame.kele, milliametere.** n. Millimeter. *Eng.*
- mīli.ani.** vt. To fondle gently. *He pua ua mīliani'ia e ka Mālua Kī'i Wai* (song), she was a flower gently caressed by the water-fetching *Mālua* wind.
- mīli'apa.** vs. Slow, dilatory.
- mīli.ka'a.** vt. To handle over and over, to do repeatedly; to keep doing something of little value; to repeat slowly; to fondle or caress over and over. *Ua mīlika'a'ia e ka Inu-wai*, caressed repeatedly by the Water-drinking wind.
- mīli.kana.** Same as *mīkana*.
- mīli.lani.** vt. To praise, exalt; to give thanks; to treat as a favorite. *E komo'oukou i loko o kona 'Ipuka me ka mīlilani* (Hal. 100.4), enter into his gates with thanksgiving.
- mīli.mīli.** 1. Redup. of *mīli* 1; toy, plaything; favorite, darling, pet, beloved; to examine with interest or curiosity and admiration. *Kō kino ē, kī'i mīlimīli* (song), your body, a beloved doll. (PPN *mīlimīli*.) 2. Redup. of *mīli* 2. *He keu noho'i kou mīlimīli*, how extraordinarily slow you are.
- mīli.nanea, mīli.mīli.nanea.** nvt. Cherished person that absorbs and delights one; absorbed and charmed; to enjoy and take delight. *Mīli nanea mau i kāna mo'opuna*, constantly absorbed and delighted in his grandchild.
- mīli.ona.** num. Million. *Eng.*
- mīli.'opu.** vs. Easy to catch with the hands, as some fish; easily handled. *Ka i'a mīli'opu i ka lima* (song), the fish caught in the hand.
- mīlo.** 1. n. A tree to 12 m high (*Thespesia populnea*), found on coasts of the eastern tropics; used for shade, the wood for calabashes, other parts of the tree in many ways, as for medicine, dye, oil, gum. It is related to the *hau* and resembles it somewhat. (Neal 563-4.) (PPN *mīlo*.) 2. nvt. Curl; to curl, twist, as sennit strands; to whirl, as water; to spin, as a tale; abortion. Cf. *'ōmīlo. Mīlo li'i*, fine twisting [as sennit]. *Mīlo'ia ka mo'olelo*, the tale was told. (PPN *mīlo*.)
- mīlo lopi.** nv. Distaff for spinning thread; to twist thread (written *mīlo lope* in Sol. 31.19).
- mīlo.mīlo.** Redup. of *mīlo* 2.
- mīlu.** 1. vs. Soft, rotten. 2. (*Cap.*) n. Underworld, ruler of underworld. (Kam. 64:51-60.)
- mīlu.mīlu.** vs. Gloomy, shady, solemn.
