

- Stone fastened to rope, used as a war weapon, said to be triangular in shape. **8.** A small gastropod mollusk. Also *kāmoa*.
- mo'a.** nvi. Cooked; burned, as by sun; cooking, cooked food; made brittle, as tobacco leaves over a fire. *Mo'a loa*, overcooked, well done, hard boiled. *Mo'a hapa*, partially cooked, soft-boiled. *'Ai i kalo mo'a* (FS 83), eat cooked taro [enjoy a life of ease, contentment]. **ho'o.mo'a.** To cook, bake. (PPN *moho*.)
- moa 'alae.** n. Completely black chicken, so called because the mudhen (*'alae*) was black. *Moa 'alae hulu 'ula*, black chicken with red feathers at neck and rump.
- mō.æ.** Var. spelling of *mōwae*.
- Moa'e.** n. Trade wind. *Moa'e kū*, strong *Moa'e*. Also *Noe*. (Elbert and Mahoe 59.)
- Moa'e Lēhua.** n. Trade wind.
- moa ha'a.** n. Bantam, any short-legged chicken.
- mō.aho.aho.** Var. spelling of *mōwahowaho*.
- moa ho'o.moē.** n. Broody hen.
- moai.** nvi. Bending over, arching, as a tree. *Rare*.
- moaka.** Same as *mōakaaka*. *'O moaka kū ke ao* (chant), the cloud stands clear.
- mō.akaaka, moakaka.** nvs. Clear, plain, intelligible, manifest; clarity. *'Ike mōakaaka*, to see clearly. Cf. *akaaka*. **ho'o.mō.akaaka.** Explanation, definition; to explain clearly, clarify, define.
- moa kā.kala.** n. Cock with sharp spurs. *Fig.*, warrior who is a good fighter.
- moa kānē.** n. Rooster, cock. *Lit.*, male chicken.
- mo'a kolē.kolē.** vs. Cooked rare, as beef.
- moa kua.kahi.** n. First cock crow. *Lit.*, chicken rising first. Also *moa kū kahi*. Cf. *moa kualua*, second cock crow.
- moala.** vt. To raise to the mouth, as poi, or as a Chinese feeds rice into his mouth. *Rare*. Cf. *ala*, to rise.
- mo'ala.** **1.** n. An edible crab found in ponds and shallow water, probably *Podophthalmus vigil*. **2.** vi. To relish food, as after having lost the appetite. *Rare*. *Ke mo'ala maila ka 'ono o ka 'ai*, the savor of food has been renewed.
- mō.'ala.ala.** vi. Going here and there, as one asking for handouts; to gad about. *Rare*. Cf. *kō'ala'ala*, quick.
- mo'a lē'a.** vs. Well-cooked, as pig.
- mō.'ali.** nvs. Impression, trace, scar, mark, as left by a knife cut; furrow, rut, track, groove, thread, welt, strand; small, fine. See ex., *puahilohilo*. **ho'o.mō.'ali.** To make an impression; scar, tracing, groove.
- mō.'ali.'ali.** Redup. of *mō'ali*.
- moa.mahi.** vt. To cherish and cultivate. *Ua moamahi 'oia i ka na'auao*, he cherished and cultivated wisdom.
- moa mahi.** n. Fighting cock. *Fig.*, successful warrior.
- mo'a maka.** vs. Barely cooked. *Lit.*, cooked raw.
- moa.moa.** **1.** vt. To act the part of a cock; to care for, attend to; to supply with food, as a child or ward. **ho'o.-moa.moa.** To accompany, as a cock with hens; to care for, protect, cherish. **2.** n. Sharp point at the stern of a canoe. **3.** n. Paper nautilus. Also *'auwa'alālua*, *'au-moana*, *moamoa wa'a*. **4.** Same as *pahu*, trunkfish. (PPN *moamoa*.)
- moana.** **1.** n. Ocean, open sea, lake. (PPN *moana*.) **2.** n. Campground, consultation place for chiefs. **ho'o.-moana.** To camp, camp (see ex., *'ipuka*). *Hele akula lākou . . . ā ho'omoana ma 'Etama* (Puk. 13.20), they went . . . and encamped at Etham. **3.** vs. Broad, wide, extended, expansive, spread out. **ho'o.moana.** To spread down, as mats.
- Moana Anu 'Ā.kau.** n. Arctic Ocean.
- Moana Anu Hema.** n. Antarctic Ocean.
- moa.naana.** Redup. of *moana 3*.
- moa nahole.** See *moa 3*.
- moana kai.** n. Salt sea (Nah. 34.3), salt lake; deep sea.
- moana pa'a.kai.** n. Salt sea (Nah. 34.12), salt lake.
- moana wai.** n. Fresh-water lake; sea (Mat. 8.27).
- moa nē.nē.** n. Speckled chicken, so called because of resemblance to the *nēnē*, goose.
- moani.** nvi. Light or gentle breeze, usually associated with fragrance; wafted fragrance; to blow perfume. (See chant, *kokoe*; Mele 1.12.) *Moani ke 'ala o ka 'awapuhi*, wind-blown is the ginger perfume.
- Moani 'Ala.** n. Name of a land breeze that wafts out to sea at Puna, Hawai'i. *Lit.*, fragrant breeze, so named for the fragrance of pandanus.
- moani.ani.** Redup. of *moani*.
- Moani.ani Lēhua.** n. Name of a rain or wind associated with Puna, Hawai'i. *Lit.*, wind that wafts the fragrance of *lehua* blossoms.
- moano.** **1.** n. Goatfish (*Parupeneus multifasciatus*). The young are called *'āhua* or *'ōhua*; the red color was believed caused by eating *lehua* flowers. The name may be qualified by the terms *'au kī*, *kea* (*P. chryserydros*), *pāpa'a*, *ukali*, *ukali ulua*. **2.** nvi. Pale red color, as of the *moano* fish. *Fig.*, to bloom. *Moano ka lehua* (For. 6:293), the *lehua* flowers become red. **3.** n. A native variety of sugar cane, named for the fish; a red cane becoming dark-purple; pith dark-brown. (HP 224.) **4.** n. A variety of taro. (HP 33.)
- moano 'ā.hua.** n. Young *moano*, goatfish.
- moa pua hau.** n. A chicken with yellow feathers. *Lit.*, *hau*-flower chicken.
- mo'au.** vs. Stretched or spread out. *Moe mo'au ke kaha-one*, the sandy beach lies stretched out.
- Moa'ula.** n. Waterfall, Hālawā, Moloka'i, and wind there.
- moa 'ula hiwa.** n. Predominantly red chicken.
- moa.uli.** Short for *moana uli*, dark blue sea. *Kēlā 'āina i ka moauli* (Kep. 17), that land in the dark blue ocean.
- moa wahine.** n. Hen. *Lit.*, female chicken.
- moe.** **1.** vi. To sleep, lie down; to lie in wait, ambush; to prostrate oneself, as before a chief; to lay down, as cards; to sit on eggs; horizontal, prone. See ex., *'oni*, *death*. *Kapu moe*, prostration taboo. *Hale moe*, sleeping house. *Moe kau a ho'oilo*, sleep summer to winter [the sleep of death]. *Moe ka ihu o ka pua'a*, the nose of the pig is down [a pig has been killed for ceremony]. *'A'ohe e moe ku'u maka ā kō ku'u makemake*, my eyes shall not sleep until my desire is obtained. *Moe ke kanaka*, a human sacrifice was made. *Moe 'ia ka iwi 'ao'ao e ke kanaka 'ē* (For. 4:47), the rib bones will be laid to rest by strangers. **ho'o.moē.** To put to sleep, to lay down; to set, as a hen (Isa. 59.5) or fish net; to offer, as a sacrifice; to deposit, as in banks; to bring down, as a club (FS 241); to "drop" a matter; to defer, postpone, rest a while; to table, as a motion; to lay, as bricks or cement; to subscribe, as to a newspaper. As an epithet for Ka-lā-kaua, *moe* probably refers to the *kapu moe*. Cf. *ho'omoemoe*. *Ho'omoemoe kimeki*, to pave. *Koa ho'omoemoe*, reserve militia (term used in 1845). (PPN *mohe*.) **2.** nvt. To marry, mate with, sleep with, cohabit; marriage. *Moe i kā ha'i*, to sleep with the mate of another. **ho'o.moē.** To arrange a match. *Huaka'i ho'omoemoe wahine* (FS 157), trip to arrange for a bride. *Ho'omoemoe ā ipo*, to cause to take as a sweetheart or lover. **3.** n. Bed, sleeping place. **4.** n. Dream. *Ka mea nāna nā moe* (Kin. 37.19), dreamer. *He aha ka puana o ka moe?* What is the answer of the dream [what will the result be]? **5.** vs. Calm, as the sea. **6.** Same as *moea 2*. Cf. *kāmoe*. **ho'o.moē.** Caus/sim. See ex., *kāo'o*.
- moea.** **1.** Pas/imp. of *moe 2, 3*. **2.** vi. To press onward, go straight toward. *Moea 'oe i Hawai'i nui*, go directly to great Hawai'i.
- moe.ā.hua.** n. **1.** A variety of sweet potato. **2.** (*Cap.*) Wind name, Ke-kaha, Kaua'i. (For. 5:95.)
- moe ai.kānē.** nv. Sodomy, sodomist; to commit sodomy (1 Kor. 6.9). *Lit.*, friend mating.
- moe awa.keā.** nvi. One who gets up long after sunrise; a late sleeper; to sleep late.
- moe hā.lau.** v. To sleep in the *hālau* (shed), sometimes said of a lazy, uncooperative person. See ex., *lola*.
- moe.hewa.** vi. To sleep restlessly; to fidget, talk, or walk in one's sleep; disturbed in one's sleep; nightmare; to have a nightmare. *Lit.*, wrong sleeping.
