

mō.kole. Var. of *mākole*.

**moko.moko.** nvt. Rough, hand-to-hand fighting of any kind, whether boxing (*ku'i*) or free-for-all wrestling; prize fight; a fighter, pugilist, boxer; to box, fight. (PCP *motomoto*.)

**moku.** 1. vs. To be cut, severed, amputated, broken in two, as a rope; broken loose, as a stream after heavy rains, or as a bound person; to punctuate. *Moku ka pawa*, dawn has broken. *Kai moku ka noho 'ana*, relations separated by the sea. **ho'o.moku.** To cut and divide; a cutting, division, separation. (PPN *motu*.) 2. n. District, island, islet, section, forest, grove, clump, severed portion, fragment, cut, laceration, scene in a play. Cf. *mokupuni*, *momoku*. *Moku lehua*, *lehua* forest. **ho'o.moku.** To place one over a *moku*, district. (For. 6:377.) (PPN *motu*.) 3. n. Ship, schooner, vessel, boat, said to be so called because the first European ships suggested islands. Many types are listed below. 4. n. A stage of pounded poi (such poi sticks together as a mass and can be separated cleanly (*moku*) from the pounding board). (Kep. 165.)

**mō.kū.** 1. vi. Remaining long in one place, stationary; tied to a stake, as in punishment; to hold in one place, as to drown; to be anchored or stationed, as ships in a harbor. 2. nvt. Method of fishing *pāpa'i* crabs with bait and a net; to fish thus.

**moku.ā.hana.** nvi. Dividing into factions, strife, opposing sides; disagreement. **ho'o.moku.ā.hana.** To divide, alienate. *Ho'omokuāhana i kā lākou mau alelo* (Hal. 55.9), confuse their tongues.

**moku.ahi.** n. Steamship. *Lit.*, fire ship.

**moku.ahi.** Same as *momoku.ahi*.

**moku.ahi.lawe.koa.** n. Troop ship.

**moku.ahi.lawe'ō.hua.** n. Passenger ship.

**moku.ā.hua.** n. Grief, sorrow, pity, disappointment.

**moku.āina.** n. State, as of the United States; district; island.

**Moku.āina-hui-'ia.** n. United States.

**moku.ā.wai.** vi. To flow as a stream swollen by rain; to rush, as a crowd (2 Oihk. 23.12); multitudinous.

**moku.aa.** n. Airplane. *Lit.*, air ship.

**moku'eli.awa.** n. Harbor dredge.

**moku.hale.** n. House set apart, as for training practitioners of sorcery or healing. (Kam. 64:106.)

**moku.hali.hali.** n. Ferry.

**moku.hali.hali.koa.** n. Troopship.

**moku.hali.hali.moku.lele.** n. Aircraft carrier.

**moku.hā.li'i.** n. 1. A medicinal plant. 2. (*Cap.*) Name of a god of canoe makers.

**moku.hau.** n. 1. Clump of *hau* trees; *hau* thicket. 2. Iceberg. *Lit.*, ice island.

**moku.hia.** Pas/imp. of *moku*, to cut. *Pa'a 'ole i ka mokuhia a ka waimaka* (chant), unchecked in the bursting forth of tears. *Mokuhia ka hī*, excessive discharge of feces. *'A'ole pio ke aloha i nā wai he nui loa*, *'a'ole ia e mokuhia e nā waikahe* (Mele 8.7), waters cannot quench love, nor can floods drown it. *Mokuhia mahope*, to run after. (PPN *motusia*.)

**mō.kuhi.kuhi.** vs. Sweet, as sugar.

**moku.holo.ahi.** n. Steamship.

**moku.kā.lēpa.** n. Trade ship, clipper ship.

**moku.kaua.** n. Battleship, cruiser, warship.

**moku.kele.** See *kele*, watery.

**moku.kia.kahi.** n. One-masted ship, sloop.

**moku.kia.kolu.** n. Three-masted ship, bark.

**moku.kia.lua.** n. Two-masted ship, as a schooner; brig.

**moku.kolo.** n. Tugboat.

**mō.kū.kū.** Redup. of *mōkū* 1, 2.

**moku.lā.'au.** n. Grove of trees.

**moku.lawe.hae.** n. Flagship.

**moku.lawe.koa.** n. Troopship.

**moku.lawe.lawe.** n. Tender.

**moku.lawe.leka.** n. Mail ship, packet.

**moku.lawe'ō.hua.** n. Passenger ship.

**moku.lawe.ukana.** n. Freighter.

**moku.lehua.** n. Solemn feast after the cutting (*moku*) of an *'ōhi'a* log for a temple image; cluster of *lehua* trees.

**mokule.'ia.** Same as *kāhala*, amberfish. *Rare*.

**moku.lele.** n. Airplane, flying ship. *Ma ka mokulele*, by air.

**moku.lele.holo.kai.** n. Hydroplane.

**moku.lia.** Pas/imp. of *moku*, to cut. *Pau ka limu i ka mokulia* (Kep. 105), all the seaweed is broken off.

**moku.li'i.li'i.** n. Islet, small ship, small grove or cluster.

**moku.lua.** n. Two adjacent islets.

**moku.lu'u.** n. Submarine. *Lit.*, diving ship.

**moku.māhu.** n. Steamship.

**moku.moku.** 1. Redup. of *moku* 1. Cf. *palaoa moku-moku*. *Ko'a mokumoku*, broken coral bits. (PPN *motumotu*.) 2. n. Kinds of fish.

**moku.moku.ā.hana.** Same as *mokumokuāhua*.

**moku.moku.ā.hua.** Redup. of *mokuāhua*, grief. *Ua mokumokuāhua kona manawa i kona kaikaina* (Kin. 43.30), his bowels did yearn upon his brother.

**moku.moku.hā.nui.** n. A damselfish. Also *hānui*.

**moku.moku.mana.hua.** Same as *mokumokuāhua*.

**moku.moku.waha.nui.** n. Name of a deep-sea fish (no data). *Lit.*, big-mouthed *mokumoku*.

**mokuna.** n. Division, boundary, border, as of land; severed portion, cut piece, part, severance; chapter, section, as of a book; platoon, as of soldiers (a *mokuna* may be divided into *mahele*, sections, and into *paukū*, squads). (PCP *motunga*.)

**moku.'oi.** vt. To scratch. *Ni'ihau*.

**moku'ō.koho.lā.** n. Whaling ship. *Lit.*, ship for piercing whales.

**moku.o.loko.** n. A district (as Kona), not an island. (Malo 16.)

**moku.pā.papa.** n. Low reef island.

**moku.pawa.** vi. To break, come intermittently. Cf. *pawa* 1. *Ua like me ka 'eku 'ana a ka pua'a ka moku-pawa o ka 'āina*, the breaking up of the soil is like a pig's rooting. *E mokupawa ai ka ua mahina 'ai*, the farming rains are intermittent.

**moku.pē'a.** n. Sailing vessel, yacht.

**moku.popopo.** n. Hulk, as of a rotted vessel.

**moku.pū.** vi. Completely severed. (For. 5:705.)

**moku.puni.** n. Island. *Mokupuni pālahalaha*, low or flat island, atoll.

**mola.** vs. Turning, twisting, spinning; unstable. Cf. *kāmola*. *He huila nui e ka'a mola ana*, a big wheel revolving.

**mō.la'e.** vs. Clear, unobstructed; easily understood. *Mōla'e ke alo o ka pali*, the face of the cliff is clear. Also *māla'e*.

**mō.la'e.la'e.** Redup. of *mōla'e*.

**mola.keā.** nvi. Clear, clarity. *Ke pane aku nei au me ka molakea*, I hereby answer clearly.

**molaki, moraki.** n. Mortgage. *Eng.* *Mea pa'a molaki*, mortgagee.

**molaki.wai.wai.lēwa.** n. Chattel mortgage.

**molala, morala.** nvs. Moral. *Eng.*

**molalē.** vs. Clear, plain, unobstructed.

**mō.lale.lale.** Redup. of *molale*.

**mola.mola.** Redup. of *mola*.

**mole.** 1. n. Tap root, main root; bottom, as of a pit or of a glass; ancestral root; foundation, source, cause. *'O ka puni kālā 'o ka mole nō ia o ka hewa* (1 Tim. 6.10), love of money is the root of evil. *Ho'i hou i ka mole*, return to the family, as after estrangement. (Perhaps PNP *mole*.) 2. vs. Smooth, round, bald. **ho'o.mole.** To smooth. (PNP *mole*.) 3. n. Name of the smooth, uncarved side of a tapa beater, as used at the end of the beating to smooth out the cloth. 4. To linger, loiter, lag; backward. (And.) **ho'o.mole.** To cause delay; to delay. 5. n. Bag in the *pāku'iku'i* net. See *'upena papa*. 6. n. Mole. (Oihk. 11.29.) *Eng.*

**molea.** Pas/imp. of *mole* 2. *Fig.*, plain, homely.

**mole.ana.honua.** n. Geometry. *Lit.*, base for measuring land.
