

- tended to the chief's tobacco supplies and lit his pipe for him, a responsibility since the lighter put the pipe into his own mouth. (Kep. 131.)
- mū.ko'i.** vs. Sharp, projecting, of the forehead, not considered attractive. Cf. *ko'i 1*.
- mū.koki.** Same as *nākoki*.
- mū.kole.** vs. Red, raw, galled, as an open sore; inflamed. Cf. *kole*, raw.
- mū.kole.kole.** Redup. of *mūkole*.
- muko.mimi.** n. A variety of 'ōmilu, a fish.
- muku.** 1. nvs. Cut short, shortened, amputated; at an end, ceased; anything cut off short; short, brief, quick (*rare*). *Ua muku ko'u lolo*, my dress is shortened. *He kanaka wāwae muku*, a person with amputated foot. *Ho'ohuli muku a'ela nā wa'a*, the canoes turned sharply. (PPN *mutu*.) 2. n. A measure of length from fingertips of one hand to the elbow of the other arm, when both arms are extended to the side. 3. n. Broken section of a wave or crest. See *lala 1*. 4. (*Cap.*) Same as *Mumuku*, a wind. 5. (*Cap.*) n. Thirtieth night of the moon, when it has entirely disappeared (*muku*). (Malo 35.) 6. n. Starboard ends of 'iako (outrigger booms), hence starboard sides of a canoe.
- muku.ela, mutu.ela.** n. Weasel. (Biblical: probably derived from the genus name *Mustela*, hence from Latin.)
- muku.muku.** Redup. of *muku 1*. (PPN *mutumutu*.)
- muku.muku waha nui.** n. Probably a kind of triggerfish (no data). *Lit.*, big-mouthed cut-short. (PPN *mutumutu*.)
- mula, mura.** n. Myrrh. (Mele 4.14.) *Eng.*
- mule.** 1. vs. Bitter, as herbs; insipid, warm. 2. *Rare* var. of *mumule*.
- mulea.** Same as *mule 1*. (Puk. 15.23.)
- mū.lēhu.** 1. *Rare* var. of *mōlehu*. 2. (*Cap.*) n. One of three stars in a triangle, the others being Polo 'Ula and Polo Ahi Lani; they may be Alpha, Beta, and Gamma Cassiopeiae. In one account Mūlehu is a variant name for Venus.
- mulei.** 1. n. Bird name (no data). 2. Perhaps a transitive form of *mule 2*, silent.
- muleko, mureto.** n. Myrtle tree. (Zek. 1.8.) (Gr. *myrtos*.)
- mule.lēhu.** Redup. of *mūlehu 1*.
- mule.mule.** Redup. of *mule*. *Fig.*, unpleasant person, one with a sour disposition. *Mea mulemule* (Puk. 12.8), bitter herbs.
- muli.** loc. n. After, behind, afterward, by and by; last, because, following behind; younger, youngest; follower; thin end of a pearl-shell shank; stern of a canoe, back. (Gram. 8.6.) *I muli*, afterwards. *Mamuli o kona akamai*, because of his cleverness. *Muli iho*, younger. *Muli loa*, youngest. *Mamuli o ka puke*, according to the book. *He muli pala kūkae*, excrement-smearing younger one, said in contempt by older brother or sister of a younger one, referring to the times he has helped to clean the youngest; also said contemptuously of one of a junior line. (PPN *muri*.)
- muli hope.** n. Youngest child; very last.
- muli pō.ki'i.** n. Younger brother, sister, or cousin. *Fig.*, genitals.
- muli.wai.** n. River, river mouth; pool near mouth of a stream, as behind a sand bar, enlarged by ocean water left there by high tide; estuary. (PPN *muriwai*.)
- mumu.** n. Thud-like sound, as of footsteps. *Rare*. Cf. *kamumu*.
- mū.mū.** 1. vi. To rinse out the mouth, as with water; to swish water about in the mouth. *ho'o.mū.mū*. Same as above. 2. vs. Silent, mum. *'Ai māmā*, to eat silently without smacking the lips; this was said of stingy people who ate silently so that others would not know they were eating and they would not have to share their food. *Māmā ka 'ōlelo*, indistinct speech. (PPN *muhu*.)
- muhu.** 3. vs. Dull, blunt, rounded, as an axe. Same as *kāmāmā*.
- mumuhi.** nvi. Buzzing, as of mosquitoes, perhaps a higher tone than the *mumuhi*.
- mumuhi.** 1. nvi. Buzzing, humming sound, as of flies, perhaps a lower tone than the *mumuhi*; to swarm. *Rare*. Cf. *muhu*. (PPN *mumusu*.) 2. vs. Fat, very plump. *Rare*.
- mumui.** *Rare* var. of *muimui*.
- mumuia.** Pas/imp. of *mumui*.
- mumuka.** Same as *pupuka*, ugly.
- mumuku.** 1. Redup. of *muku 1*; amputated, mutilated, maimed; premature, as a baby. *Pau nā pepeiao ā mumuku* (For. 5:417), all the ears were cut off. *ho'o.mumuku*. Caus/sim. 2. (*Cap.*) n. Name of a strong wind at Ka-wai-hae, Hawai'i.
- mumule.** vs. Speechless, silent, taciturn, mute, sullen, sulky. *Ua mumule loa au me ka leo 'ole* (Hal. 39.2), I was dumb with silence. *ho'o.mumule*. Caus/sim.
- mumulu.** vi. To swarm, as flies, bees, mosquitoes.
- mū.nā.** Same as *muni 1*. *Rare*.
- mūna.munā.** Redup. of *mūnā*.
- muni.** 1. vt. To eat sparingly, as of an invalid. *Rare*. 2. vs. Indistinct. *Rare*. 3. n. Protuberance, hillock. *Rare*.
- muni.muni.** Redup. of *muni 1*.
- munini.** Same as *munimuni*. *Rare*.
- mū.nō.** vs. Of retarded or imperfect growth, as plants, hair; to weaken and die; dry rot.
- munu.** n. A goatfish (*Parupeneus bifasciatus*).
- mu'o.** nvi. Leaf bud; to bud, of a leaf; soft tip of aerial pandanus root; younger branch of a family. *Mu'o o ka lima* (Kep. 159), fingertips bunched together as though to form a bud. *I ka mu'o o ka lā* (For. 4:137), at the sun's rays. (PPN *muka*.)
- mu'o.hala.** n. Pandanus budding leaf at the top of a bunch; tip of aerial pandanus root.
- mu'o.iki.** vi. Narrowing, tapering; to bud but a little, to cease budding. *Ulu akula ke kō a mu'oiki*, the sugar cane grew until it ceased budding.
- mū.'okole, mu'omu'okole.** Same as *mu'oiki*.
- mu'o.koli.** vt. To trim (*koli*) new buds and leaves; to pull, as hairs, as of human or pig.
- mū.'ō.lēlo.** vi. To speak constantly or in groups. *Mā'ōlelo ke kai*, the sea speaks on.
- mū.'olo.** 1. vi. To sag, hang down too long, hang loose, flop. Cf. *'olo 2*. *Papalina mū'olo*, sagging cheeks. 2. n. Water gourd.
- mū.'olo.'olo.** Redup. of *mū'olo 1*.
- mu'o.mu'o.** Redup. of *mu'o*; flower covered by the calyx. Cf. *'ōmu'omu'o*. (Probably PPN *mukomuko*.)
- mu'o.mu'o.iki.** Redup. of *mu'oiki*.
- mū.'ou.'ou.** vs. Short, stubby, blunt, as a nose; fat and short. Cf. *pāpale mū'ou'ou*.
- mu'u.** 1. n. Second generation of taro. Same as *'ohā*. See *kalo* for names of generations. *'O ke kalo ka mua, ā mahope ka mu'u, ā mahope loa ka 'ae* (Kep. 153), first the *kalo*, then the *mu'u*, and finally the *'ae*. 2. vt. To miss, as in playing marbles.
- mū.'ululū.** Same as *kā'ululū*, chilled.
- mu'u.mō.kā.kī.** vi. To collect or heap up untidily. *Mu'umōkākī maoli kēia lumi*, this room is heaped up in a most untidy way.
- mu'u.mū.nā.** vs. Insipid, tasteless.
- mu'u.mu'u.** 1. nvs. Cut-off, shortened, amputated, maimed; person with arms or legs missing, amputee. *Hula mu'umu'u* (UL 213), a sitting dance. 2. n. A woman's underslip or chemise; a loose gown, so called because formerly the yoke was omitted (cf. *mu'umu'u 1*), and sometimes the sleeves were short. Cf. *holokū*.
- mu'u.mu'u moe pō.** n. Nightgown. *Lit.*, slip for sleeping at night.
- mū.wā.wahi.wa'a.** n. Tereido, shipworm.
