

- is over [i.e., rest a bit]. *Ke nae iki nei nō*, some breath remains [as of a dying person]. **ho'o.nae**. To cause shortness of breath. **2.** nvs. Fragrant, sweet-smelling; fragrance. *He 'ala ka nae o ka palai* (song), the perfume of the *palai* fern is sweet. **3.** n. Fishing net with small meshes; net structure to which feathers were attached for feather capes. Also *naepuni*, *puni*, 'upena 'ōhua *palemo*. **4.** To give or parcel out equally, as food. (And.)
- na'ē**. **1.** loc. n. Easterly, windward (used in some localities only, as on Moloka'i). See *a'e 2, 4. Mai na'e ā lalo* (For. 5:665), from east to west. **2.** conj. But, yet, furthermore, still, nevertheless. (Gram. 11.1.)
- nae 'ā. 'ī.kū**. n. Croup. *Lit.*, gasping croup.
- nā.ēhēhē**. vs. Soft, thin.
- nae kuku**. n. Bag nets of fine-meshed *nae* (netting) consisting of rectangular pieces joined together; a stick (*kuku*) was used at each end of the foot or lower rope.
- naeō**. **1.** n. Rock crevice, as in the sea; full of holes, chinks. *Ka ula noho i ka naeō* (FS 49), the lobster living in the crevices. **2.** vs. Stretched out of shape; yielding, soft, miry, spongy; misshapen; swamp, mire, bog; to stretch. **ho'o.naeō**. Caus/sim.; to soften, as earth for planting.
- nā. 'ēō**. Same as *nā. 'ēle. 'ēle 1.*
- naeōeōeō**. Redup. of *naeō*, crevice. (And.)
- nā. 'ēō. 'ēō**. **1.** Var. of *nāhelehele*. **2.** vs. Rotten, as timber. *Rare*.
- nae.nae**. Redup. of *nae 1. Ua nae nae ko'u na'au* (Hal. 38.10), my heart pants. (PEP *ngaengae*.)
- na'ē.na'ē**. **1.** n. All species of native genus in the daisy family (*Dubautia*), which are shrubs or small trees with narrow leaves and small yellow, orange, purple, or white flower heads borne in large cone-shaped clusters. (Neal 845.) Also *hanupaoa*, *hina-'ai-ka-malama*, *ne'ine'i*. **2.** vs. Fragrant, as the *na'ena'e* bloom. (But cf. *nae*, fragrant.) **3.** n. Design on outer sheet of a sleeping tapa. **4.** n. Fish of surgeon family (*Acanthurus olivaceus*). **5.** vs. Quick, alert.
- nae.naeō**. Redup. of *naeō 2.*
- na'ē.na'ē pua kea**. n. A kind of *na'ena'e* (*Dubautia paleata*), from Kaua'i, with large round flower heads, each head with 25 or more light yellow becoming purplish florets. *Lit.*, white-flowered *na'ena'e*.
- na'ē.na'ē pua meō.meō**. n. A kind of *na'ena'e* (*Dubautia laxa*). *Lit.*, yellow-flowered *na'ena'e*.
- na'ē.na'ē 'ula**. n. A kind of *na'ena'e* (*Dubautia raillardoides*) from Kaua'i, with white to purplish flowers. *Lit.*, red *na'ena'e*.
- nae 'oai.kū**. n. Severe asthma.
- nae. 'ō.pua.kau**. n. A disease, accompanied by shortness of breath (*nae*). Cf. *wai'ōpua*.
- nae 'owai.kū**. Var. spelling of *nae 'oai.kū*.
- nae.puni**. Same as *nae 3.*
- nae wai.kū**. Same as *nae 'oai.kū*.
- naha**. **1.** vs. Bent, curved, bowlegged. **2.** nvi. Union of a chief with his half-sister; their offspring was entitled to the *kapu noho*; to take part in such a marriage. (Malo, 55; Kamakau 64:9-10, 22.) Later *naha* was changed to mean what Malo calls *ho'i*.
- nahā**. **1.** vs. Cracked, broken, as a dish; smashed to bits, as masonry; to act as a purgative; to split; loss of virginity. See ex., *ko'okā. Lā'au nahā* (FS 129), purgative. 'Aila nahā, 'aila ho'onahā, castor oil. *Umauma nahā* (FS 195), hunger. **ho'o.nahā**. To smash, shatter, crack, split; to take a purgative (PEP *ngahaa*.) **2.** vi. To blot out from sight. *Holo akula lākou ā nahā nā moku o Hawai'i nei, ā nalowale ka 'āina* (For. 4:161), they sailed on until the islands of Hawai'i here were blotted out of sight and the land disappeared.
- nahae**. **1.** vt. Torn, rent; tear; to rip or tear (said figuratively of emotions). See *hae 3.* (PCP *ngasae*.) **2.** vs. Branching out, as a family. *He nahae ali'i kēia*, this is a royal branch.
- nā.hae.hae**. Redup. of *nahae. Nāhaehae 'ana o ka 'uhane* (Isa. 65.14), vexation of spirit. (PCP *ngasae*.)
- nā.hā.hā**. Redup. of *nahā. Nāhāhā i ke ania e ka makani*, broken by the blowing by the wind.
- naha.naha**. Redup. of *naha 1.*
- nāha.nahā**. Redup. of *nahā*.
- naha.nahae**. Redup. of *nahae*.
- nahana.wele**. Rare var. of *nahawele 1.*
- naha.wele**. **1.** n. A bivalve of the family *Isognomonidae*. Also *mahawele*. On O'ahu, the *Perna costellata*, *Atrina* sp. **2.** Same as *hulu 'lilo* (*Chaetomorpha antennina*), a seaweed.
- naha.wele li'i.li'i**. n. A shell (*Brachidontes crebristriatus*). *Lit.*, small *nahawele*.
- nahe**. Rare var. of *nahenahe*.
- naheka, nahesa**. n. Snake. *Naheka wela* (Kanl. 8.15), fiery serpent. (Heb. *nahas*.)
- naheka (nahesa) huelo kani**. n. Rattlesnake. *Lit.*, tail-sounding snake.
- nahelo**. n. Forest, grove, wilderness, bush; trees, shrubs, vegetation, weeds. Cf. *ho'omakanahelo. 'Upu mai ana ke aloha i ka uka nahele o Puna*, loving memory returns of the forest uplands of Puna. (PCP *nga(f,s)ele*.)
- nā.hele.hele**. Redup. of *nahelo*; weeds, undergrowth. *Piha kēia māla i ka nāhelehele*, this patch is full of weeds. (PCP *nga(f,s)ele(f,s)ele*.)
- nahelo mane'ō**. n. Nettle. (Isa. 34.13.) *Lit.*, itching plant.
- nahe.nahe**. vs. Soft, sweet, melodious, as music or a gentle voice; soft, as fine cloth; softly blowing, as a gentle breeze; gentle-mannered, soft-spoken, suave. (PPN *ngasengase*.)
- nahi**. Var. of *lahi*, thin.
- nāhi**. **1.** paucal article. Some, few, the, the little (contraction of *nā*, the, and *wahi*, little). See ex., *pōka'aka'a 2*, Gram. 10.4. 'Auhea akula nāhi keiki? Where are the boys? (PPN *ngaafi*.) **2.** n. The fires (contraction of *nā ahi*, as in the name *Nāhi-'ena'ena*).
- Nā-hiku**. n. Constellation of the Big Dipper. *Lit.*, the seven.
- nā.hili**. vs. Blundering, confused, perplexed, wandering off the course; careless, awkward. *I hea aku nei lā i nāhili ai ka 'au wa'a?* Where did the canoe fleet wander off to? **ho'o.nā.hili**. To cause a blundering, wandering, as by misdirecting; to procrastinate, waste time through blundering.
- nāhi.nāhi**. Var. of *lahilahi*.
- nāhio.lāa**. n. A variety of taro.
- naho**. nvs. Hollow, as a cleft where fish hide; deepset, as eyes of a starving person; eye sockets.
- nahoa**. **1.** vs. Bold, defiant, daring. Cf. *uahoa. ho'o.nahoa*. Caus/sim.; to challenge. 'A'ohe wa'a ho'onahoa o ka lā 'ino, no canoe defies a storm; *lit.*, no canoe defiant of a stormy day [do not venture in the face of danger]. **2.** nvi. Head wound; intense headache; mental agony; hit or wounded in the head. Cf. *hoa*, mallet, club. *Po'o nahoa*, fractured skull.
- nā.hoa.hoa**. Redup. of *nahoa 1, 2.*
- Nā-hō.kū.mā.hana**. See *Māhana*.
- Nā-hō.kū.pā**. n. Constellation of five stars forming a circle; they are said to be near *Nā-hiku*, the Big Dipper. *Lit.*, enclosure stars.
- naholo**. vi. To flee, of several; to run away; gone away (2 Sam. 23.9). *Pau nui nā koa i ka naholo*, every last one of the soldiers fled. **ho'o.naholo**. To chase, cause to run. (PPN *ngaasolo*.)
- nā.holo.holo**. **1.** Redup. of *naholo*. (PNP *ngaasolosolo*.) **2.** (Cap.) n. Name of a star, perhaps Venus.
- naho.naho**. Redup. of *naho*.
- nahu**. **1.** nvt. To bite; to have a tendency to bite, as a dog; to sting, as beating rain; pain, as of stomach-ache or of childbirth; bite. **ho'o.nahu**. To bite, cause a stomach-ache; to pretend to bite. **2.** n. Inexplicable bruise seen on the body, believed caused by the ghost of a living person who was about to die. Also *nahu akua*. (Nānā 156-7.)
- nahua**. **1.** Pas/imp. of *nahu*. See ex., 'apoa. *Loa'a akula i ka nahua a ka 'ino*, caught by the pelting of the storm.
