

2. (*Cap.*) n. Wind associated with Kā'ana-pali, Maui. (Nak. 68.)
- Nā-hui.hui.** n. The Pleiades. Also *Nā-huihui-a-Makali'i*, the clusters of Pleiades.
- nahu.kua.koko.** n. Labor pains. (Mika 4.9.)
- nahu.maka.** n. Fattened, as a dog for offering.
- nahuna.** n. Bite.
- nahu.nahu.** Redup. of *nahu*; to suffer pangs of childbirth. *Pala nahunahu* (Kep. 93), partially ripe, of a fruit that can be bitten into, as a mountain apple. *Ka ua nahunahu*, the pelting rain.
- nahu.nahu.ihu.** n. Family discord, quarrel. *Lit.*, nose biting.
- nahu.nahu.pū.** vt. To bite into with relish. *Nahunahupū i ke alopiko*, bite the belly [of the fish] with relish.
- na'i.** 1. nvt. To conquer, take by force; conqueror. 'O *Ka-mehameha ka na'i aupuni*, Ka-mehameha, the conqueror of the nation. (PCP *ngaki*.) 2. vt. To strive to obtain, endeavor to examine or understand. *Ua na'i 'oia i ka pono o nā keiki*, he does all he can for the well-being of the children.
- na'i.** A rare transitivizer. Cf. *hili*, to wander, and *hili-na'i*, to believe; *pī*, to sprinkle, and *pīna'i*, to fill a crack; Gram. 6.6.4. (PPN *-naki*.)
- naia.** vs. Insecurely tied. *Rare*.
- na ia.** Same as the poss. *nāna*, but rare. See ex., *kāpe'a*, Gram. 9.11.
- nai'a.** n. Porpoise, dolphin. (KL line 138.)
- na'i.au.** vt. To add to, join to. *Rare*.
- nā.i'i.** vt. To remove, take out. *Rare*.
- nā.ī.īkē.** vt. To refuse to see, especially a relative or friend; to disown.
- naika, naita.** n. Knight. *Eng.*
- nā.īkē.** Same as *nā.ī.īkē*.
- nai.kola.** Similar to *'aikola*, *ho'ona'aikola*. **ho'o.nai.kola.** To show contempt, as by destruction. *'A'ohe koe i ka ho'onaikola 'ia e ka makani* (For. 4:476), nothing survived the contemptuous destruction by the wind.
- na'ina.** n. Conquering, endeavoring, etc. Cf. *na'i 1, 2*.
- nai.nai.** Rare var. of *nanai* and *nānai*.
- na'i.na'i.** 1. Redup. of *na'i 1, 2*. 2. vs. Crabbed, bitter, cross, of sour disposition; morose; ill-disposed; opposing. *Rare*. 3. vi. To shorten, to make short. *Rare*. 4. Similar to *pīna'i 1*. *Rare*. 5. n. Variety of fish (no data).
- na'i.na'i mimi.** n. Contest in urinating by small boys. *Lit.*, urine striving.
- na'i.na'ina mimi.** Same as *na'ina'i mimi*.
- naio.** n. 1. Pinworm, as in the rectum; white specks in feces; larvae, as of mosquitos; worm in dung or in taro. See *pala naio*. (PCP *ngaio*.) 2. Inferior taro left in the field after the crop is removed. 3. The bastard sandalwood (*Myoporum sandwicense*), a native tree, with hard, dark yellow-green wood, scented like sandalwood. Leaves are narrow-oblong, pointed, grouped at branch ends; flowers are small, pink or white; fruit, small, white, round. (Neal 791.) Cf. *'a'aka*. 4. Name of a seaweed.
- naio 'ai kae.** n. Dung-eating pinworm, said contemptuously of slanderers.
- naio.ēa.** n. A native variety of taro, with long, blackish leaf stem; blades large, dark-green; grown in uplands, valued for its red poi. (Whitney 48; HP 25.) Also *'ele'ele* and also qualified by the colors *'ele'ele* and *'ula'ula*.
- naio makika.** n. Mosquito larvae.
- naka.** 1. nvi. To quiver, quake, tremble, shake, as jello or as with cold or fear; shaky, unsteady, shivering, shaking. *Ka naka o nā kuli* (Kel. 82), the shaking of the knees. 2. vi. To crack open, as earth from the heat; cracked and peeling, as the skin of one who has drunk kava to excess. 3. n. A land shell (*Thaumatodon nesophila*). 4. n. A sea creature. (Perhaps PPN *ngata*.)
- Nā-kā-a-Maka.li'i.** n. Pleiades. (Kep. 79.) *Lit.*, the bailers of Makali'i.
- nakaka.** Redup. of *naka 2*. **ho'o.nakaka.** Caus/sim.
- naka.kaka.** Redup. of *naka 2*.
- naka kā.ni'o.** n. A land shell (*Nesophila thaanumi*). *Lit.*, streaked *naka*.
- naka kua mauna.** n. A land shell (*Nesophila thaanumi*, *N. nesodonta*). *Lit.*, mountain-ridge *naka*.
- naka kua po'i.** Same as *'opihi kapua'i lio*.
- Naka.like, Nazarite.** n. Nazarite. *Biblical. Eng.*
- naka.naka.** Redup. of *naka 1, 2*.
- Nā-kao.** n. Belt and sword in the constellation of Orion. *Lit.*, the darts.
- naka 'ō.ni'o.ni'o.** n. A marine mollusk (*Pleurobranchus*). *Lit.*, mottled *naka*.
- nakapa, natapa.** n. Stacte. (Puk. 30.34.) (Heb. *nataph*.)
- Na-ka-ūi.lani-'ēlua.** n. Star name (no data). (Kuhelani.)
- nake.** n. Name of a fish (no data). (KL line 142.)
- nā.keā.** n. Endemic fresh-water fish (*Awaous [Chonophorous] stamineus*) of the *'o'opu* or goby family, favorite for eating, sometimes 30 cm long. Also *nāwao*, *nōkeā*. Cf. *'o'opu kumu iki*, *'o'opu lehe*.
- nakeke.** 1. nvi. Rattling, as of a window; rustling, as of paper. **ho'o.nakeke.** To make a rattling or rustling noise. *'O wai kēlā e ho'onakeke maila i nā pā?* Who is that rattling the dishes? (PPN *ngatete*.) 2. n. A brown seaweed (*Hydroclathrus clathratus*), resembling *pūhā* and closely related to it, but the surface pierced with holes of different sizes; not eaten.
- nake.keke.** Redup. of *nakeke 1*. *He pili nakekeke*, a loose or uncertain relationship.
- nakele.** nvs. Soft, boggy, slippery, yielding, sinking in; a shallow boggy area. *Nakele 'ā*, fresh lava soft and not yet cold. **ho'o.nakele.** Caus/sim.
- nā.kele.kele.** Redup. of *nakele*. **ho'o.nā.kele.kele.** Caus/sim.
- naki.** Same as *nāki'i*. **ho'o.naki.** Caus/sim. (PNP *nati*.)
- nā.ki'i.** vt. To tie. Cf. *nīki'i*. *Nāki'i ā pa'a*, tie securely, tighten.
- nā.ki'i.ki'i.** Redup. of *nāki'i*.
- nakili.** vi. To glimmer through, as light through a small opening; to begin to open, as eyes of a young animal; to twinkle. *Rare*. Also *mikili*.
- nā.kili.kili.** Redup. of *nakili*.
- naki.naki.** 1. Redup. of *naki* (Hal. 105.22). 2. n. Difficult breathing, as during an asthma attack.
- nakoā. ho'o.nakoā.** Brave, daring.
- Nā-kō.kō-a-Maka.li'i.** n. Probably Pleiades. (HM 368.) *Lit.*, the nets of Makali'i.
- nako.kolo.** Similar to *nākolokolo*. (For. 6:450.)
- nā.kolo.** 1. nvi. Rumbling, roaring, as of surf or thunder; reverberating. See ex., *'u'ina. Ua ha'alulu ku'u manawa, ua nei nākolo i ke aloha* (Laie 521), my heart trembles, reverberating sighs of love. 2. Redup. of *kolo*, to crawl (perhaps *nakolo*). (For. 6:450.)
- nā.kolo.kolo.** Redup. of *nākolo 1, 2*.
- naku.** 1. vi. To root, wallow, as a hog; to tread, trample, push, as through mud or grass; to struggle; to roil, as water; to delve, search. Also *haunaku*. See *'aka'akai* and ex., *oi 2. Naku li'i*, groveler. **ho'o.naku.** Caus/sim. (PPN *natu*.) 2. Same as *nānaku*, a bulrush. 3. n. A kind of red-skinned onion.
- nākū. ho'o.nākū.** To suffer gas pains. *Ho'onākū nā mauna, ka'ahē nā mokupuni* (birth chant for Ka-mā-malu), the mountains are in distress, the islands gasp for breath.
- nakue.** Active, diligent. (And.)
- naku'ē.** 1. nvi. Elbowing; to elbow; piston-like motion. Cf. *ku'e*, to elbow. 2. Var. of *nāku'i*.
- nā.ku'i.** nvi. To rumble, roar, thump; rumbling; beating, as the heart; thrilled (perhaps *naku 1 + -i*, transitivizer; Gram. 6.6.4). *Ka nāku'i o ka pū kuni ahi*, the roar of the cannon. **ho'o.nā.ku'i.** Caus/sim.
- naku.lēhu.** n. A variety of white sweet potato.
- nakuli. ho'o.nakuli.** Apathetic; lack of interest. *Rare*.
- nakulu.** nvi. Dripping, as water; patter, clatter, rattle, echo; rumbling, as the stomach; grumbling; vibrating, as thunder; to spread or circulate, as rumor. *Ua nakulu akula kēia lohe i ke alo ali'i* (Laie 599), this report reached the presence of the chief. **ho'o.nakulu.** Caus/sim. *Ke ho'onakulu nei i ku'u manawa; no ku'u ipo*
