- nakulu'ai.** vs. Praiseworthy, upright. *Rare.*
- nā.kulu.kulu.** Redup. of *nakulu*.
- naku.naku.** Redup. of *naku 1*.
- nala.** 1. Var. of *ulana*, to plait. (PPN *(la)langu*.) 2. n. A kind of fish (no data). (KL line 143.) 3. n. A measurement of 6 cm. *Eng.*, nail.
- Nā-lā.lani-a-pili-lua.** n. Name of a constellation. *Lit.*, the lines of the clinging ones.
- nale.** 1. vs. Clear, bright. Cf. *kōnane, kōnale*. (PCP *ngale*.) 2. Not fast; movable; independent. (And.)
- naleko, naredo.** n. Nard (RSV), spikenard (KJV). (Mele 4:13.) (Gr. *nardos*.)
- nale.nale.** Redup. of *nale 1, 2*.
- nali.** vt. To nibble, gnaw. (PPN *ngali*.)
- nalili.ko'i.** n. A variety of taro. (HP 33.)
- nali.nali.** Redup. of *nali*.
- nalo.** 1. vs. Lost, vanished, concealed, hidden, forgotten, missing; to lose, pass away, disappear (a *loa'a*-type word, see Gram. 4.4 and *pōnalo 2*; see ex., *'ikena*). *Nalo ka umu* (FS 133), the oven is covered. *'A'ole au e nalo iā'oe*, you will not fail to recognize me. **ho'o.nalo.** To cause to be lost; to conceal, secrete, put out of sight. (PPN *ngalo*.) 2. n. The common housefly and other two-winged insects. See *pōnalo 1*. (PPN, PCP *lango*; note Hawaiian metathesis.)
- nalo'aki.** n. Small stinging fly, as the stable fly (*Stomoxys calcitrans*) and horn fly (*Haematobia irritans*); gnat, hornet.
- nalo.hia.** Pas/imp. of *nalo 1*. See ex., *kīhe'ahe'a*. (PEP *ngalo(f,s)ia*.)
- nalo hope'eha.** n. Hornet (Puk. 23.28) and other Hymenoptera. *Lit.*, fly with stinging posterior.
- nalo kele.awe.** n. A fly, perhaps the hover fly (Syrphidae). *Lit.*, brass fly.
- nalo lawe lēpo.** n. Mud wasp, as *Sceliphron caementarium*. *Lit.*, dirt-toting fly.
- nalo loa.** vs. Lost forever, forever.
- nalo meli.** n. Honey bee (*Apis mellifera*). (Kanl. 1.44.) *Lit.*, honey fly.
- nalo meli mō.'i wahine.** n. Queen bee.
- nalo meli noho hale.** n. Drone bee. *Lit.*, house-staying honey bee.
- nalo meli pa'a.hana.** n. Worker bee. *Lit.*, industrious honey bee.
- nalo nahu.** n. Stinging fly. *Lit.*, biting fly.
- nalo.nalo.** Redup. of *nalo 1*. **ho'o.nalo.nalo.** Hidden; to cause to disappear, camouflage. Cf. *mana'o ho'onalonalo*, *'ōlelo ho'onalonalo*. *Kuhikuhi ho'onalonalo*, to speak in an enigmatic way or with hidden meaning so that only the confidant understands. (PPN *ngalongo*.)
- nalo paka.** n. Tick (Hippoboscidae); ensign fly (Evaniiidae). *Lit.*, lean fly.
- nalo pilau.** n. Bluebottle fly (Calliphoridae). *Lit.*, stink fly.
- nalo.wale.** vs. Lost, gone, forgotten, vanished, missing, hidden, extinct, disappeared (especially if unaccountably so); infinite (Gram. 10.3); to lose.
- nalu.** 1. nvi. Wave, surf; full of waves; to form waves; wavy, as wood grain. *Ke nalu nei ka moana*, the ocean is full of waves. **ho'o.nalu.** To form waves. (PPN *ngalu*.) 2. vt. To ponder, meditate, reflect, mull over, speculate. Cf. Eset. 6.6. *Nalu wale ihola nō 'o Keawenui-a-'Umi i ka hope o kēia keiki* (For. 4:261), Keawenui-a-'Umi pondered about the fate of this child. (PPN *na(a)nunga*.) 3. n. Amnion, amniotic fluid. (PPN, PCP *lanu*; note Hawaiian metathesis.)
- nalu.ā, naluwā.** vt. To nourish resentment, sulk.
- nalu.ea.** n. Nausea. Cf. *poluea*.
- nalu ha'i lala.** n. Wave that breaks diagonally.
- nalu ho'o.kau.maha.** vt. To ponder sadly, brood.
- nalu.kai.** vs. Weatherworn, as old canoes or persons who have weathered the storms of life. *Lit.*, ocean wave.
- nalukua loloa.** n. Long wave.
- naluli.** vi. Shaky, unsteady, swaying (less common than *luli*).
- naluli.luli.** Redup. of *naluli*.
- nalulu.** nvi. Dull headache; dull pain in the stomach, queasy; to have such pains. *Nalulu ka 'ōpū*, uneasy stomach. **ho'o.nalulu.** To cause a pain in head or stomach. *Ho'onalulu ho'i keiki*, the children give [me] a headache. (PNP *nga(a)lulu*.)
- nalumiki.** n. Receding wave.
- nalumuku.** n. Broken section of wave.
- nalunalu.** vs. Rough, of a sea with high waves; to form high waves. (PPN *ngalungalu*.)
- nalupū ki.** n. Wave that shoots high.
- naluwā.** Var. spelling of *naluwā*.
- Nā-mā.hoē.** n. Castor and Pollux, Gemini. *Lit.*, the twins. Also *Māhana*.
- namau.ahi.** vs. Thinly scattered, few, of sparse growth. *Namauahi nā maile o kēia wahi*, the *maile* vines of this place are sparse.
- namu.** 1. nvt. Unintelligible muttering, gibberish; any foreign language, especially English; to speak gibberish or a foreign language, to mumble. *Namu haole*, English. *He aha ka namu?* What's the foreign term [What's the price]? *Ka mea namu li'ili'i* (Isa. 8.19), those that mutter. **ho'o.namu.** To pretend to speak in a foreign language, to mutter, mumble, speak gibberish. (PNP *nanu*.) 2. vt. To nibble; to chew with closed mouth. *Ua namu ā pāhoehoe 'ia*, nibbled at and changed to *pāhoehoe* lava. (PPN *lamu*.) 3. n. Name of a fish. (no data).
- Nā.mū.** n. Legendary little people. *Lit.*, the silent ones. Cf. *Nāwā*, the noisy ones.
- namu.namu.** Redup. of *namu 1, 2*; to grumble, complain, mumble, babble.
- namu pa'i'ai, namu pa'i kalo.** n. Pidgin English. *Lit.*, hard-poi gibberish, hard-taro gibberish.
- nana.** 1. Var. of *ulana 1*. *E nana moena ana*, plaiting mats. 2. Short for *'nana*. Cf. *kīnana, pūnana*. (PPN *langu*.) 3. (*Cap.*) n. Name of a star (no data). 4. (*Cap.*) n. Name of a month. See *'e'elekū, month*. 5. n. A variety of taro. 6. Similar to *manana*; to spread. 7. n. A variety of fish (no data). (KL line 141.)
- nāna.** n-poss. For him, her, it; by him, her, it; belonging to him, her, it, whose (cf. *nona, a-form*, Gram. 9.11). (PCP *naana*.)
- nanā.** vs. Snarling; to strut or provoke, as one looking for a fight, as a threatening boaster, or stiff-legged dogs ready to pounce on each other; sexually excited, of males; to stretch, as muscles. *Ihu nanā*, snarling nose; *fig.*, quarrelsome, aggressive. **ho'o.nanā.** Aggressive, looking for a fight, threatening; to antagonize.
- nā.nā.** 1. vt. To look at, observe, see, notice, inspect; to care for, pay attention to, take care of. Cf. *kūnānā, nānā 'ole*. *Mai nānā i kāna 'ōlelo*, don't pay any attention to what he says. *He keiki nānā mākuā*, a son who cares for his parents. *Nānā ma ka 'ākau*, dress right [military command]. *Maika'i ke nānā aku*, good-looking. *Nānā i nā puke*, to audit accounts. *Nānā a'ela ia ma nā ki'i maka nunui, koe nō nā ki'i maka li'ili'i*, he caters to the important people, and leaves out the ordinary folk. *Hiamoe wale ke kāne, nānā wale ka wahine*, the husband just sleeps, the wife looks about but has nothing. **ho'o.nā.nā.** To cause to look, show. *Ho'okūkū ho'onānā, nānā kō maka i ka mahina* (children's game chant), stand about, look, let your eyes see the moon. 2. nvi. Quiet restful. Cf. *nā 1*, calmed. *Kau i ka nānā ka moe* (For. 6:396), sleep in peace. *Hula ho'onānā* (UL 244), a hula for amusement. (PPN *ngaan-gaa*.) 3. n. Goat. Cf. *kao 5*.
- nana'a.** Var. of *na'ana'a*.
- nā.nā ao.** nv. Cloud interpreter, one who observes the clouds; to observe omens in the clouds; seer, forecaster. *'A'ole ho'i e nānā ao* (Oihk. 19.26), nor practice witchcraft (RSV), nor observe times (KJV).
