

nana.au. Var. of *lanaau*.
nanae. 1. Redup. of *nae* 1. 2. vs. Potbellied, fat. *Rare*.
nana'e. n. Small piece of land. *Rare*.
nana.hā. Redup. of *nahā*.
nanahe. 1. Same as *nahenahe*. 2. Weak, as from not eating; thin, as silk.
nana.heā. vs. Animated, as birds; lively. *Rare*. Cf. *Tnana*.
nana.hili. Redup. of *nāhili*.
nanaho. Redup. of *naho*.
nā.nā.honua. n. A tropical American shrub (*Brugmansia candida*), known as the angel's trumpet; it bears white, trumpet-shaped, pendent flowers to about 25 cm long. Though flowers and leaves are poisonous to eat, the plant is grown for its high ornamental value. (Neal 748-9.) *Lit.*, earth-gazing. Cf. *lā'au hānō*.
Nā.nā Hope. n. Pollux. Cf. *Māhana, Nānā Mua*.
nanahu. Redup. of *nahu*.
nana.hū. vs. Bent out of shape, crooked, as a stick.
nā.nāhu. 1. Var. of *lānahu*. *Nānahu pikimana*, coal; *lit.*, bituminous (*Eng.*) charcoal. **ho'o.nā.nāhu.** To turn into charcoal, as burnt wood. (PEP *ngaalafu*; cf. Métraux p. 236.) 2. n. A native variety of sugar cane, the red mutant of *'akilolo 'ula'ula*. (HP 220.)
nana.hua. 1. Same as *nanahu*; ill-feeling, bitterness. 2. n. A post temporarily set up in the back of the *mana* house in the heiau enclosure; later a *haku 'ōhi'a* image was installed in this place (Malo 166); name of the two posts at the entrance of a temple to which the *'aha* (taboo cord) was fastened.
nana.huki. vs. To pull away from; contrary, disdainful (perhaps from *nanā*, surly, and *huki*, pull).
nanai. 1. vs. Difficult to climb, as a cliff; stiff-backed; to walk with stiff back; to strut, act the dandy; to lean back stiffly or haughtily; stiff-backed; humped over as a result of stiffness. Also *lanai*. 2. Swift. (AP.)
nā.nai. 1. Same as *pānānai*, shallow. 2. vi. Empty, as a taro patch. *Rare*. 3. vi. Taking an uneven course, as a canoe in a rough sea, or a kite. *Rare*.
nana'i. vi. To spread, as a topped tree. *Rare*.
nā.nā'i. Var. of *Lā-na'i*, island name. (For. 6:493.)
nanai.eā. vs. Weak, feeble, frail.
nā.naina. n. General appearance, view, aspect, panorama, sight, scenery, scene.
nanaka. Redup. of *naka* 1, 2; marked in sections, as a turtle's back or breadfruit skin. **ho'o.nanaka.** Caus/sim.
nana.keā. vs. Pale, wan. (FS 199.)
nā.nā ke'e. See *ke'e*.
nanaki. Redup. of *naki*.
nā.nā kokoe. See *kokoe*.
nā.naku. Same as *'aka'akai*, great bulrush (*Scirpus validus*). (Neal 88-9.) (PEP *nga'atu*; cf. Easter *nga'atu* and Emory 1972, p. 62.)
nana.kuka, nanasuka. n. Nainsook. *Eng.*
nā.nā.kuli. vi. To look at but not respond when spoken to; to see but pay no attention, ignore. For the O'ahu place of this name, see Pukui, Elbert, and Mookini, 1974.
nanala. Redup. of *nala*, to plait. (PPN *lalanga*.)
nā.nā.lā. n. Sunflower (*Helianthus annuus*). Also *pua nānā lā*. (Neal 840.) *Lit.*, sun-gazer.
nanali. Redup. of *nali*.
nā.nā.lia. Pas/imp. of *nānā*.
nā.nā.maka. vt. To look at without helping; indifference to one in trouble; heartless. *Ua nānā maka 'oia i kona makuahine*, he was indifferent to his mother.
nanamu. Redup. of *namu*; to grumble.
Nā.nā Mua. n. The star Castor. Cf. *Māhana, Nānā Hope*. According to some, both were the names of a single star. *Lit.*, look forward.
nanana. 1. vi. To flutter, as wings. Cf. *nana* 2. **ho'o.nanana.** Caus/sim. *Ho'onanana ka manu e lele*, the bird flutters its wings to fly. 2. Redup. of *nana*, to plait. (PPN *lalanga*.) 3. Same as *nananana* 1, spider. 4. n. Swelling, as in dropsy. *Rare*.

nana.nai. Redup. of *nanai* 1.
nana.nai.eā. Redup. of *nanaiea*.
nanana.keā. Redup. of *nanakea*.
nana.nana. 1. n. Spider (*Araneida*); today this is the house spider, formerly the outdoors spider. Cf. *pe'epe-'emakawalu*. 2. Var. of *lanalana* 1, 2.
nanana.nai.eā. Same as *nananaiea*.
nana.napa. Redup. of *napa* 1-3. *Rare*.
nanani 'ole.'ole. n. A variety of sweet potato.
nanani ke'o.ke'o. n. A variety of sweet potato.
nā.nā-nu'u. n. Design on Ni'ihau mats consisting of alternating solid and white triangles.
nana.nu'u mamao. Same as *lananu'u mamao*.
nanao. Redup. of *nao* 1, 2. (PPN *nanao*.)
nā.nā 'ole. nvi. Disregard, heedless disregard; oblivious; to pay no attention. *Nānā 'ole i kō ha'i ola*, heedless disregard for the lives of others. *Me ka nānā 'ole, pehea kāna hana, ua makemake 'ia nō*, regardless of the quality of her work, she's liked anyway.
nana.pau. A tree. (And.)
nana.piko. n. A native variety of taro.
nā.nā.pono. vt. To watch carefully, pay particular attention to, note carefully, stare at, observe, scrutinize.
Nā.nā-pua. n. Said to be a name for Eromanga Island in the southern New Hebrides; Boki sailed for here in 1829 to get sandalwood; his ship disappeared. (RC 293.) *Lit.*, look at flowers. See *'Āina-wohi*.
nanau. 1. Redup. of *nau*, to chew. 2. vs. Unfriendly, bitter, crabbed, estranged; to pay no attention to a call; to ignore, as former friends. Also *lanau*. *Rare*.
nanauha. Same as *kākāuha*, rigid. **ho'o.nanauha.** Caus/sim.
nanauki. Same as *nāukiuki*.
nā.nā uli. nv. To study the sky, as for omens; one who does so.
nanawa. Same as *nanau* 2. (And.)
nā.nā.wale. vt. Just to look, especially to look on without helping.
nāna.waū. vs. Weakened, unhealthy, as plants; sickly. See ex., *kūloku*. **ho'o.nāna.waū.** To cause to be weak and unhealthy.
nanō. 1. n. Riddle, puzzle, parable, allegory; to riddle, speak in parables (Mar. 4.2). See *kōnane* 2. **ho'o.-nanō.** To make riddles, speak in parables. (Perhaps PCP *nane*.) 2. Rare var. of *nini* 3, fence.
nanēa. 1. nvs. Of absorbing interest, interesting; fascinating, enjoyable; repose, leisure, tranquility; relaxed, at ease, at leisure, amused, engaged with, busy with; to have a good time. *He hana nanēa ke kui lei*, lei making is pleasant. **ho'o.nanēa.** To pass the time in ease, peace, and pleasure; to relax, lounge, repose; absorbed, contented. *He hana ho'onanēa ka ho'okani pila*, playing a musical instrument is pleasant. (PNP *nanēa*.) 2. Same as *mohihihi*, a vine. 3. n. A seaweed (*Hypnea nidifica*).
nanō.hā'i. n. Problem, riddle to be solved. *Lit.*, telling riddle. See ex., *mana'okōkua, wehe 'ana*.
nanō.huna. n. Hidden riddle, conundrum.
nanēki. n. Nankeen, denim. *Eng.*
nanō.nanō. Redup. of *nane* 1. **ho'o.nanō.nanō.** Same as above; puzzling, riddling; figurative. See *'olelo ho'onanenane*.
nani. 1. nvs. Beauty, glory, splendor; beautiful, pretty, glorious, splendid. *Nani makamae*, precious, exquisite. **ho'o.nani.** To beautify, adorn, trim, decorate, glorify, honor, exalt, praise, adore; decorative, glorifying. *Nā mea ho'onani*, decorations of any kind. *Ho'onani kākou iā Ia* (hymn), let us adore Him. *Mea ho'onani kino*, any bodily adornment, as jewelry. 2. n. Beautiful flower (sometimes followed by *-o* + place name: see below. 3. n. Good thing (idiom). *He nani nō ia*, it's a good thing. 4. conj. Since, because. *Nani ho'i ua ki'i 'ia maila e make, he aha lā ho'i . . .* (Kel. 37), since [I] am indeed summoned by death, what of it . . . *Nani nō ia e hele ana 'oe i ke kula, e ho'oikaika i ka ha'awina*, since you are going to school, work hard on the lessons. 5.
