

- sesses. *Ua noho 'o Pele i luna o 'Ane*, Pele possessed Annie. **ho'o.noho**. To summon a spirit to possess. (PPN *nofo*.) 4. vs. A strong negative following *mai*. *Mai noho 'oe ā kolohe i ka'u mea hana*, don't you dare disturb my work.
- noho. ho'o.noho**. Bone hooks lashed together. (Malo 79.)
- noho ali'i**. nvt. Throne, reign, chieftainship, tenure as chief, rule; to reign, act as chief.
- noho aloha**. nvs. Mercy seat (Heb. 9.5); on friendly terms; dwelling at peace; friendly relationship.
- noho 'ā.mana**. n. Pack saddle. *Lit.*, y-shaped crosspiece saddle.
- noho 'ana**. n. Conduct, bearing, deportment, treatment, condition, way of life, term of office, stay. *Kona noho 'ana*, his stay. *Pelā nō ka noho 'ino'ino 'ana o Hākau iā 'Umi* (FS 125), such was the cruel treatment of Hākau to 'Umi. *E holo 'oe i Hawai'i e nānā ai i ka 'āina, i ke kanaka, a me kō laila noho 'ana* (FS 183), go to Hawai'i, examine the land, the people, and the local way of life.
- noho.anu**. n. Native geraniums (*Geranium* spp.), shrubs and small trees found only at high altitudes in Hawai'i. They have small, ovate, green or silvery leaves, edged or tipped with teeth, and reddish or white flowers. *Lit.*, cold dwelling. Cf. *hinahina* 4.
- noho au.puni**. nvt. To rule; a reign, ruler. (FS 169.) *Nā lā o kona noho aupuni 'ana*, the days of his reign.
- noho hale**. nv. House occupant, owner, sitter, appointee, legatee; to act in such capacity; *fig.*, ashes. See ex., *'imi hale* 1.
- noho hana 'ole**. vi. To be unemployed, inactive; to sit alone.
- noho hele**. nvi. To sojourn briefly and then go on elsewhere; to travel with brief stopovers (FS 173).
- noho hiki.ki'i**. n. Chair that tilts backward. (Kel. 136.)
- noho ho'o.hihi**. n. Possession by a spirit that has taken a fancy (*ho'ohihi*) to the recipient, perhaps causing him to act strangely.
- noho ho'o.kolo.kolo**. n. Judgment seat.
- noho huila**. n. Wheel chair.
- noho'i**. intensifying part. (*nō + ho'i*). (Gram. 7.5.) *Aue noho'i*, Oh oh. *'O au noho'i*, really me.
- noho ka'a.wale**. v. 1. To live apart. See also *plural*.
- noho 'ie**. n. Wicker chair.
- noho kai**. nvi. Dweller on the seashore; to live by the sea.
- noho kā.lele**. n. Armchair.
- noho kanaka**. v. To serve under. *Ua nui ka po'e Kaua'i i ho'opa'a mai iā lākou iho e noho kanaka aku no Pāka'a* (Nak. 27), many Kaua'i people bound themselves as subjects of Pāka'a.
- noho kāne**. v. To marry, of a woman; to live with a man.
- noho kā.pae**. nvi. Sidesaddle; to ride sidesaddle. *Fig.*, to have an illicit love affair. See also *kāpae*.
- noho kapa.kahi**. n. Sidesaddle.
- noho keiki**. v. To be a child.
- noho kū**. n. Straight chair.
- noho lihi.lihi, noho 'ana nihi.nihi**. nv. Strict way of life, rigid observance of taboos; rigid way of sitting during ceremonies; genteel deportment, etiquette; to observe proper decorum, circumspect conduct. (Kep. 125, 141.)
- noho lio**. n. Saddle.
- Noho-loa**. n. North Star.
- noho loa**. nvi. To remain long, permanently.
- noho lō.'ihi**. 1. n. Bench, settee. 2. vi. To stay long.
- noho male**. nv. To be married; wedlock.
- noho male 'ole**. nv. To remain unmarried; spinsterhood, bachelorhood.
- noho.mā.lie**. n. The yellow oleander or be-still tree (*Thevetia peruviana*), an ever-blooming shrub or small tree from tropical America, with long narrow leaves and yellow funnel-shaped flowers. All parts of the plant are poisonous to eat. (Neal 693.) *Lit.*, be still.
- noho mā.lie**. See *mālie*.
- noho moe**. n. Couch, divan.
- nohona**. n. Residence, dwelling, seat, mode of life, existence, relationship. *Nohona kuhina*, residence of the minister; embassy. *Nohona wa'a*, canoe thwart, seat. *Ua la'i ka nohona*, life is peaceful. *He nohona kā'ē'ē kō ka makua kāne me ke keiki*, there is a strained relationship between father and son. (PEP *nofonga*.)
- noho ni'o**. n. A pretense to knowledge or skill; bluff, false front. Also *poupou noho ni'o*, which Emerson (Malo 73) translates 'tale-bearing'.
- noho.noho**. Redup. of *noho* 2, 3. **ho'o.noho.noho**. Redup. of *ho'onoho*; to pretend to be possessed by a spirit; to arrange, classify, organize. *Ho'onohonoho hou*, to reorganize, rearrange. *Ho'onohonoho papa*, to classify. *Ho'onohonoho i nā noho*, to arrange the chairs. *Papa ho'onohonoho kūlana hana*, classification board of positions. *Ho'onohonoho 'ana*, arrangement, system. *Ho'onohonoho ho'olilo*, to plan or budget expenses. (PPN *nofonofa*.)
- nohonoho. ho'o.noho.noho**. A variety of yam (*uhi*) having tuber with white flesh and red skin; vine and its wings green, petiole red, veins of blade red and green.
- nohonoho helu. ho'o.noho.noho helu**. To calculate, compute, figure.
- noho.noho.pu'u.one**. Same as *hinahina* 3. *Niihau*.
- noho 'oi.hana**. See *'oihana* 1.
- noho 'opi.'opi**. n. Folding chair.
- noho pa'a**. vi. To live permanently; to settle down; to be established. **ho'o.noho pa'a**. Caus/sim.
- noho pai.pai**. n. Rocking chair. *Ho'oluli noho paipai*, to rock the rocking chair.
- noho papa**. 1. vs. Arranged in order, as feathers in a hatband, shingles on a roof; placed in rows or regular formation, as soldiers. **ho'o.noho papa**. To arrange, put in order. *Ho'onoho papa i ka 'olelo*, a talk thoroughly covering an entire subject. 2. vi. To dwell in one place for generations.
- noho poka.kā'a**. n. Swivel chair.
- noho polo.lei**. vi. To sit properly, straight. *Noho pololei 'ole*, to sit improperly, slouch.
- noho pono**. nvi. Sitting properly, behaving well; moral deportment; morality.
- noho.pū**. vi. To live together, especially out of wedlock; to cohabit.
- noho pū**. vi. To sit quietly or dejectedly.
- noho uka**. nvi. Upland dweller; to live inland.
- noho wahine**. v. To marry, of a man; to live with a woman.
- noho wale**. vi. To do nothing; to be idle or inactive; to sit alone.
- nohu**. n. 1. Scorpionfish (*Scorpaenopsis cacopsis* and other scorpaenids) with poisonous spines. The fish is edible. (PPN *nofu*.) 2. A prostrate, hairy perennial (*Tribulus cistoides*), found on coasts of tropical regions around the world. It has spiny dry fruits, yellow five-petaled flowers; each leaf has about twelve leaflets. (Neal 477.) Also *nohunohu*. 3. A native variety of taro. Also *nohu 'ele'ele, mākokō*. See ex., *hanoa*. 4. Soft, porous stone, used in scouring.
- nohu. ho'o.nohu**. (a) To scowl, frown. (b) To reef, as the sails of a ship. (AP.)
- nohu.nohu**. Same as *nohu* 1, 2, 4.
- nohu 'oma.kaha**. n. Variety of *nohu* (*Scorpaenopsis diabolus*).
- nohu pinao**. Variety of *nohu*. *Lit.*, dragonfly *nohu*.
- nohu po'o lā.'au**. n. Variety of *nohu*; it was believed that its eggs hatched into sharks. *Lit.*, wooden-headed *nohu*.
- noi**. nvt. To ask for something, request, solicit, appeal, apply, make a motion, move, propose, plea; proposal, request, petition, motion (in documents of the 1860s, often preceded by the article *ke*). Cf. *nīnau*, to ask a question, *noinoi, nonoi*. *Ka mea noi*, the applicant, petitioner. *Ma ka noi a Mr. Mahelona*, on motion of Mr. Mahelona. *Ke noi aku nei au i kou 'olu'olu*, I am asking a favor of you. *Noi ha'aha'a*, to beg humbly,
