

- hewa [said of O'ahu because of the prophecy made by Ka'ōpūlupulu about the death of the O'ahu chiefs upon the coming of foreigners]. **ho'ōne**. Pumice; to rub and polish with sand. (PPN 'one.)
- 'ō.nea**. Same as *nea*, desolate. **ho'ō.nea**. To cause desolation; to desolate.
- one'ā**. nvs. Afflicted, affliction. *I ka hiki 'ana mai o ke kolela, ho'okahi helena o kō mākou one'ā*, when the cholera came, all at once we were all afflicted.
- one'ā**. nvi. Black sand or gravel made of 'a'ā lava; volcanic cinder; to form such; gunpowder. *Lauahi Pele i kai o Puna, one 'ā kai o Malama* (chant), Pele swept her many fires down to Puna; seaward of Malama is a cinder heap.
- 'ō.nea.nea**. Redup. of 'ōnea. See ex., *desolate*. **ho'ō.nea.nea**. Redup. of *ho'ōnea*.
- one.hahi**. n. Menstrual blood. *Rare*.
- One.hali**. n. Name of a Kaua'i wind. *Lit.*, sand carrying.
- one.hali**. n. Sand carried away by the sea.
- one.hā.nau**. n. Birthplace, homeland. Cf. *kulāiwi*. *E Hawai'i ē, ku'u one hānau ē, ku'u home kulāiwi nei* (song by L. Lyons), O Hawai'i, sands of my birth, my (beloved) native home.
- 'ō.nehe.nehe**. Same as *nehenehe*, rustling.
- 'one'i**. loc. n. Here, local. See ex., 'ane'i 1. *Kō 'one'i keiki*, the local youngsters.
- 'oneki**. n. Deck. *Eng.*
- One-lau'ena**. n. Legendary homeland of the god Kāne, a land of plenty.
- one.mimiki**. n. Quicksand.
- onena**. vs. Sandy; pale. *Rare*.
- 'ō.nē.nē**. 1. vs. Fretful, fussy. Cf. *nē*. **ho'ō.nē.nē**. Caus/sim. 2. *Rare* var. of *nūnē*, speculation.
- one.one**. 1. vs. Sandy, gritty, grainy. (PPN 'one'one.) 2. n. Name of a seaweed.
- one.one-i.honua**. n. Name of a death-bringing prayer or for a heiau dedication (For. 4:148-9, 6:119).
- one.pohō**. n. Quicksand.
- one'ula**. vs. Vast, great, without bounds.
- one.wai**. n. Sand near outlet of fresh-water springs; *pokipoki*, sand crabs, are said to be found here.
- oni**. vi. To appear, reach out, jut or extend out. *Hala a'e ka lae o Ka-lā'au, oni ana Moloka'i mamua* (name chant for Ka-mehameha V), passing Ka-lā'au Point, Moloka'i appears ahead.
- 'oni**. 1. nvi. To move, stir, shift, fidget, squirm, wiggle; to take to court, as land matters; movement, motion. 'Oni ā pūhi, to squirm like an eel. 'Oni 'ino, to jar, shake badly. 'Oni 'ole, immovable, steady. *Ka moe 'oni 'ole a Niolopua*, the sleep without movement of Niolopua [death]. 'Oni hikiwawe, sudden movement, jolt. *Ua 'oni ke keiki*, the child has moved [the fetus]. *E 'oni ana nā keiki i ka 'āina o ka makua kāne*, the children are taking the matter of the father's land to court. **hō'oni**. To bestir, cause to move, shake, disturb, jiggle. See ex., *wilimo'o*. *Mai noho 'oe ā hō'oni i ka wai ua lana mālie* (hula chant), do not stay to disturb the water floating peacefully. *He mo'olelo hō'oni pu'uwai*, a heart-stirring story. (PNP *koni*.) 2. n. Spirals of several colors in composite leis.
- 'onia**. Pas/imp. of 'oni.
- 'ō.nihi.nihi**. n. Small taro shoots, as of the fourth generation. (Kep. 153). See *kalo* for names of generations.
- 'ō.niho**. vs. Toothed, sharp-edged, tooth-edged, serrated.
- 'ō.niho.niho**. 1. Redup. of 'ōniho. 2. n. Variety of 'ulae, lizard fish.
- 'onika**. n. Onyx. (Kin. 2.12.) *Eng.*
- 'ō.niki**. 1. nvt. A pinch, bit, as of *lā'au* (taro tops); to pinch off. 2. vs. Flat, smooth, level. *Rare*.
- 'ō.niki.niki**. Redup. of 'ōniki 1, 2.
- 'onina**. n. Moving, etc. See 'oni.
- 'ō.nina.nina**. vs. Yielding, soft, as fat cheeks. Cf. *lina*, *nina*, *papalina*.
- 'ō.nini**. 1. nvi. A slight breeze, puff of wind; to gasp for breath, blow softly, blink. *Na ka 'ōnini lākou e lawe aku* (Isa. 57.13), a breath will take them away. 2. Similar to *hulili*, dazzling; vibration. 3. n. A kind of surfboard difficult to manage, used by experts. *Rare*.
- 'oni.nihi**. Same as 'ōnihinihi.
- 'oni.nini**. vt. To pick at food with no appetite, as would a sickly child. Cf. *mīnole*.
- 'ō.nini-pua-'i'o**. n. Sea rain at Hāna, Maui.
- 'ō.nino**. Var. of 'ōlino 1.
- 'ō.nino.nino**. Redup. of 'ōnino.
- 'ō.ni'o**. vs. Spotted, streaked with various colors, as a pig, or as tapa prints. **ho'ō.ni'o**. To spot or print with colors, as tapa.
- oni.oni**. Redup. of *oni*. *Pu'u-onioni* (place name), extending hill.
- 'oni'onī**. Redup. of 'oni 1, 2; to wag; striped. *Ki'i 'oni'onī*, moving picture, movie. **hō'oni'onī**. Redup. of *hō'oni*. (PNP *konikoni*.)
- 'ō.ni'o.ni'o**. Redup. of 'ōni'o; embroidered (*Biblical*); mottled. **ho'ō.ni'o.ni'o**. Caus/sim. *E ho'ōni'onī'o 'oe i ka pālule olonā . . . a e hana 'oe i ke kā'ei, he humu-humu 'ōni'onī'o* (Puk. 28.39), you shall weave the coat in checkerwork of fine linen . . . and shall make a girde embroidered with needlework.
- 'oni.pa'a**. vs. Fixed, immovable, motionless, steadfast, established, firm, resolute, determined (this was the motto of Ka-mehameha V and of Lili'u-o-ka-lani. *Lit.*, fixed movement. See ex., *makehia*. **hō'oni.pa'a**. To fix, establish firmly. *E hō'onipa'a loa wau iā 'oukou* (Jer. 42.10), I will plant you securely.
- 'ō.niu**. 1. nvt. A spinning top; to spin a top; informal game with dancing and top spinning; spinning, whirling. *Ke 'ala 'ōniu*, dizzy fragrance. **ho'ō.niu**. To spin, as a top; to cause to whirl. *Ua ho'ōniu aku 'oia i kona hoa huluhula*, he whirled his dancing partner. 2. See 'ami 'ōniu, a hula step. 3. vt. To set, as type. 'Ōniu huakēpau, to set type. 4. n. Coconut-husking stick.
- 'ō.niu.lā'au**. v. To ward off clubs, as in mock warfare.
- ono**. 1. n. Large mackerel type fish (*Acanthocybium solandri*), to 1.5 or 1.8 m in length; choice eating. Known in Florida and the West Indies as the wahoo. (PPN 'ono.) 2. num. Six; sixth. (PPN *ono*.)
- 'ono**. nvt. Delicious, tasty, savory; to relish, crave; deliciousness, flavor, savor. Cf. *mea 'ono*. 'Ono ka pu'u, tasty to the palate; *lit.*, the throat craves. *He 'ono 'i'o nō* (song), how delicious. *Ho'omanawanui i ka 'ono*, wait patiently and you'll have what you crave. *Hana 'ia maila ka wai ā 'ono* (Puk. 15.25), the waters were made sweet. **hō'ono**. To tempt the appetite; to make tasty, season. (PCP *kono*.)
- 'ō.nohi**. n. 1. The eyeball; center; setting, as of a ring. *Fig.*, eyes. See ex., *hehelo*. 'Ōnohi kaimana, set diamond. 'Ōnohi kau maka, beloved one; *lit.*, eyeball placed in the eye. 'Ōnohi uliuli, dark pupil of the eye. *Kahi mea iāia ka 'ōnohi o ka pahu hula*, the one who has the central [role] among hula drummers. *He pa'akai poepoe li'ili'i, he 'ōnohi awa ka inoa*, small round-grained salt is called milkfish eyeball. (PNP *kanofi*, PCP *ko(a)nofi*.) 2. Patch or fragment of a rainbow. (Laie 351.)
- 'ō.nohi.ā.i'a**. n. Cataract of the eye. *Lit.*, eyeball like fish, so called because of alleged similarity of a cataract to a fish eye.
- 'ō.nohi.awa**. n. Black moss found in fresh water (no data). *Lit.*, eyeball of the fish, *awa*.
- 'ō.nohi-ka'i-ole-pohi.hihi-ka-lawai'a-o-ka-lā-ino**. n. Stroke in *lua* fighting. *Lit.*, rainbow patch that does not move, puzzling the fisherman on a stormy day.
- 'ō.nohi.lēhua**. n. A mother-of-pearl lure that was said to catch fish by day or night without fail.
- 'ō.nohi.maka**. n. Pupil of the eye.
- 'ō.nohi.nohi**. 1. Same as 'ōlohilohi, 'ālohilohi. 2. n. A variety of sweet potato.
- 'ōnohi'ula**. n. Red eyeball; red rainbow segment; cloud with red hues of rainbow; variety of red tapa; *fig.*, fury, anger.
- ono mā.lani**. Variety of *ono*, a fish.
