

'ō.noni.noni. Similar to *noninoni*, agitated, and 'ānoninoni, mixed. See ex., *wehiwa* 2.

'ono.'ono. Redup. of 'ono. hō.'ono.'ono. To make tasty, flavor, create a desire. *Hō'ono'ono 'ai*, appetizer, condiment, dressing, relish, hors d'oeuvre. *Hō'ono'ono lau 'ai*, salad dressing. (PCP *konokono*.)

'ō.no'o.nou. Redup of 'onou; to force upon. *Ka ho'opiha 'ia 'ana o nā pū me ka pauka a me ka 'ōno'onou 'ia 'ana me nā 'ōhelo loloa*, guns filled with powder rammed in with long ramrods. 'A'ohe ia he kāne na'u i makemake, nāna ka 'ōno'onou, he was not the husband I wanted, she forced him on me. ho.'ō.no'o.nou. Caus/sim.

'onou. vt. To shove, push, force into, thrust on; to persuade; to give secretly or underhandedly; to offer in secret. See *kui 'onou. Piha 'onou*, full to the cramming point. *Ua 'onou 'oia i ka pepa i ku'u lima*, he thrust the paper into my hand. 'Onou ihola ka huli (Kep. 153), to shove in the taro shoots. hō.'onou. Caus/sim.

'ono.'ū. Same as the bird, 'ō'ū.

'onou po'o. v. To shove or push into something headlong, regardless of consequence. *Lit.*, shove head.

'ono wai. v. Thirsty; to crave water.

'ō.nū. nvi. A swelling, protuberance, hill; rising of the surface; bucking; erection of the male member; to swell. *Pipi ōnū*, bucking cow. ho.'ō.nū. To cause to swell, expand. *Ho'ōnū a'ela ka 'ale o ke kai*, the billow of the sea was swollen.

'ō.nuhē.nuhē. vs. Tainted, unsavory.

'ō.nuhē.nuhēa. Pas/imp. of 'ōnuhenuhe. *He 'ōnuhenuheha kahi mea haole* (Kep. 161), white man's things [food] are unsavory.

o'o. nvi. Matured, ripe, as fruit; of mature age, middle-aged, elderly; to mature, ripen, or grow old; an adult human, maturity (see ex., 'e'elekū). Cf. o'o 'ole. *Moloka'i pule o'o*, Moloka'i [of the] potent prayers [fig. reference to Moloka'i's fame in sorcery]. (PCP *oko*.)

'o'ō. vi. To crow, as a rooster; cock-a-doodle-doo. *Komo ka 'uhane a loko o ke kino ā ka umauma, ā ka pu'u, 'o'ō moa a'ela 'o Ka-welu* (For. 5:189), the soul entered within the body, up to the chest, to the throat, and then Ka-welu crowed like a chicken [a sign that she had been resuscitated]. (PPN *kokoo*.)

'ō.'ō. 1. Redup. of 'ō I; to pierce, lance, poke, put in, insert; to pierce the fetus in the womb with a sharp instrument in order to practice infanticide; to abort; to cut, as to let blood; to hurl, as a spear. *Lele 'ō'ō*, to leap into the water feet first, without splashing. 'Ō'ō he'e pali (Kep. 103), to poke out tiny octopuses from cracks. hō.'ō.'ō. To insert, put in, pierce, cause to pierce. 2. n. Digging stick, digging implement, spade. (PCP *kookoo*.) 3. n. A black honey eater (*Moho nobilis*), with yellow feathers in a tuft under each wing, which were used for featherwork; endemic to island of Hawai'i, now extinct. *M. bishopi*, endemic to Moloka'i, possibly also extinct. *M. apicalis*, the extinct O'ahu species. The Kaua'i species was called 'ō'ō 'ā'ā. See 'ē'ē 2, pīpī 3. (PPN *koo*.) 4. n. A type of fish, perhaps a swordfish.

'ō.'ō 'ā.'ā. n. The endangered Kaua'i species of 'ō'ō, honey eater (*Moho braccatus*); on Hawai'i, said to be the name for the male 'ō'ō. *Lit.*, dwarf 'ō'ō.

'ō.'ō.ahi. 1. Redup. of 'ōahi. 2. nv. Fire poker or shovel; to poke the fire.

'o'o'o. Redup. of 'o'e. *Rare*.

'ō.'ō halo. n. Harrow. *Lit.*, harrow (*Eng.*) digging implement.

'ō.'ō hao. n. Iron tool for digging, plow.

'ō.'ō hou. n. Plow. *Lit.*, new digging implement, or poking, digging implement.

'o'ohu. vs. Stoop-shouldered, bent, as with age. hō.'o'ohu. To walk stooped; to cause to stoop; to imitate a stooped person.

'ō.'ō.hū. Redup. of 'ōhū, swelling.

'o'oi. 1. Redup. of 'oi; prickly; sting, as of scorpions

(Hoik. 9.10); to protrude, as eyelashes. *Nahele 'o'oi* (2 Sam. 23.6), thorns. 2. n. An inedible seaweed. Also called *popohe makali'i*.

'ō.'ō ihe. nv. To hurl spears or javelins; sport of spear throwing.

'o'oki. 1. Redup. of 'oki. (PPN *kokoti*.) 2. vs. To take effect, as intoxication. 'O'oki maila ka 'ona o ka 'awa (FS 135), the intoxication of the kava took effect.

'ō.'ō kila. n. Steel spade.

'ō.'ō kope. nvt. A rake; to rake. *Lit.*, scratching digging implement.

'ō.'ō kū.pī.pī. n. A name for the female 'ō'ō, honey eater. *Hawai'i*.

'o'o.lā. 1. Short for 'o'olapū. 2. Same as 'o'ololā, young of fish.

'o'ola.pū. *Rare* var. of 'olopū, inflated.

o'ole. Var. spelling of o'o 'ole.

'o'o.le'a. nvs. Hard, stiff, strong, inflexible, rigid, harsh, rough; rigor, strength, hardness. *Fig.*, strenuous, severe, strict, stubborn, obstinate; obstinacy. *Lauoho 'o'ole'a* (Kep. 67), coarse hair. 'O'ole'a nā lālā, strong of limb. 'O'ole'a ke a'a koko, hardening of arteries. 'O'ole'a nā 'ami, stiff joints. 'O'ole'a nā 'ōlelo, harsh of speech. 'Ā'Ā 'o'ole'a, stiff-necked; *fig.*, disobedient, heedless. *Hana 'o'ole'a*, hard physical labor. *Ka lokomaika'i a me ka 'o'ole'a o ke Akua* (Rom. 11.22), the kindness and the severity of God. hō.'o'o.le'a. To harden (Ezek. 3.8), stiffen, resist, strengthen. *Hō'o'ole'a kino*, to strengthen the body, as with physical exercise; calisthenics.

'o'olo.hua. Same as 'olohua.

'o'olo.kū. nvs. Boisterous, stormy, blustering, disturbed; upset, as stomach; fury, rage. (Kep. 175.)

'o'olo.lā. n. Young of fish. *Rare*.

'o'olo.īī, 'o'olo.lī'i. Redup. of 'ololī, narrow.

'o'olo.ma'o. n. Variety of bird, perhaps the ma'o, thrush.

'o'olo.pū. Redup. of 'olopū; to change, as appearance. See ex., *kohu* 1.

'o'olu. 1. n. Two edible, fragile, red seaweeds (*Champia* sp. and *Chondria tenuissima*). They melt in fresh water, hence must be cleaned in sea water. 2. vs. Thin, feeble. 3. *Rare* frequentative of 'olu. 4. n. A variety of taro.

'o'oma. nvs. Concave; concavity, spout, gouge, flare of a bonnet; oval-shaped chisel; large sharp nose. Cf. *pāpale 'o'oma. Kī'aha 'o'oma*, vase. *Kī'aha 'o'oma wai* (Luka 22.10), pitcher. hō.'o'oma. To shape concavely; to turn down the rim of a hat on both sides of the face so that the front is like the flare of a bonnet.

'o'oma noho. n. Leather covering of stirrups.

'o'o.moa. Same as moa 3.

'ō.'ō.nui. Same as *kūpīpī*, a fish.

'ō.'ō nuku mū. Same as *mamo*, a honey creeper. *Lit.*, 'ō'ō with sipping beak.

o'o'o. 1. vs. Parsimonious, careful of one's property. 2. n. A small dipper for bailing, as a coconut shell.

'o'o.'ō. Redup. of 'o'ō, to crow.

o'o'ole. vs. Immature, minor.

'o'o.'o'ō. Same as 'o'o'ō.

'o'opa. nvs. Lamé, crippled; a cripple, lame person; to limp, be lame. *Ua 'o'opa ma kona mau wāwae* (2 Sam. 4.4), he was crippled in his feet. hō.'o'opa. To cause lameness, to feign lameness. (PCP *kokopa*.)

'ō.'ō pā.laha.laha. n. Trowel. *Lit.*, flat digging instrument.

'ō.'ō palau. nvt. A plow; to plow. *Lit.*, plow (*Eng.*) digging implement. *E ku'i lākou i kō lākou mau pahi kaua i 'ō'ō palau* (Isa. 2.4), they shall beat their swords into plowshares.

'o'ope. Redup. of 'ope. (For. 5:665.)

'ō.'ō.pā. n. Spade. *Lit.*, spade (*Eng.*) digging implement.

'o'opu. n. 1. General name for fishes included in the families Eleotridae, Gobiidae, and Blennidae. Some are in salt water near the shore, others in fresh water, and some said to be in either fresh or salt water. Variet-
