- ō.pū**. 1. n. Clump, as of sugar cane, bananas, kava; cluster. Cf. *pū* 4. See ex., *'ahu'awa*. 2. vi. To open, as a flower; to rise, as water; to swell, as waves; to grow, as a foetus; to sit with knees gathered up. *'O Ka'ala, kuahiwi mauna kēhau, ke ōpū maila lā i Kama-oha* (PH 100), Ka'ala, mountain hill with cool rain, rising there perhaps at Kama-oha. 3. nvi. To rest, hover, live idly or lazily, exist; existence, rest. *'O ke ōpū wale iho nō kā mākou* (For. 4:171), ours is a bare existence. 4. n. A tower in a heiau. See drawing, li 57.
- ō.pū**. n. Belly, stomach, abdomen, tripe, gible; bag, as of a net (see ex., *mahola*); gizzard, bladder, crop of a bird (Oihk. 1.16), maw of an animal, womb; disposition. *Kai 'ōpū*, gible gravy. *'O ku'u 'ōpū, 'o ku'u 'ōpū! Ua ho'oka'awili 'ia au ma ku'u na'au* (Ier. 4.19), my bowels, my bowels! I am pained at my heart. (PPN *koopuu*.)
- ō.pua**. nvi. Puffy clouds, as banked up near the horizon, often interpreted as omens; cumulus or billowy cloud, cloud bank; to form such clouds. See sayings, *clouds, proud*. *'O Kona kai 'ōpua i ka la'i, 'ōpua hīnana kau i ka mālie* (chant), Kona with its cloud billows and sea in the calm, puffy clouds white like *hīnana* blossoms resting in the quiet. (PEP *ka(a)pua*.)
- ō.pua-**. See *nae'ōpuakau, wai'ōpua*.
- ō.pū aho.nui**. nvs. Patient; patience; a patient person. *Lit.*, disposition of great breath.
- ō.pū ai**. Same as *'ōpū ai'ai*.
- ōpū ai'ai**. n. Stomach; craw, as of a bird.
- ō.pua ki'i**. n. Cloud bank containing images.
- ō.pū ali'i**. Same as *na'au ali'i*.
- ō.pua maka 'upena**. n. Mackerel sky with cloud flakes; cirro-cumulus clouds. *Lit.*, net-mesh cloud bank.
- ō.pū ao**. n. Cluster of clouds.
- ō.pū ao**. Same as *na'auao*.
- ō.pū ā.pika.pika**. n. Beef tripe. *Lit.*, spotted stomach.
- ō.pū hale**. n. Hut, as in a forest.
- ō.pū hana.wai**. n. Bladder (euphemism for *'ōpū mimi*).
- ō.pū ha'o**. n. Hunger pains. *Lit.*, stomach longing for or missing something.
- ō.puhe**. n. Three species of endemic trees (*Urera*), related to the *olonā*, the bark of which was also formerly used for fishing nets. (Neal 320.) See also *hona, hōpue*.
- ō.pū hea**. nvs. Quiet, tranquil, calm, disinclined to work, lazy; tranquillity. Cf. *'ōhea*.
- ō.pū heha**. Same as *ōpū hea*.
- ō.pū hi**. Same as *'awapuhi*, a kind of ginger.
- ō.pū hue**. n. Round, low calabash. *Lit.*, calabash clump.
- ō.pū huli**. n. A "turned stomach," believed caused by falls, especially of small children, resulting in a kink or turning of the stomach, with attendant vomiting; a symptom is said to be a shortening of one leg; the cure is massage and binding of the stomach; this diagnosis and treatment are said to have been learned from the Portuguese.
- ō.pū hulu.hulu**. n. Beef tripe. *Lit.*, hairy belly.
- ō.pū ino, 'ō.pū ino.ino**. Same as *na'au ino*.
- ō.pū ka'e.moa**. Rare var. of *'ōpū ke'emoa*. *Lit.*, chicken-edge stomach.
- opu.kēa**. n. A large, strong, superior variety of sugar cane, the stalks yellow, sometimes rose-flushed, the pith white. (HP 223.)
- ō.pū ke'e.moa**. vs. Hardhearted, mean. *Lit.*, chicken crookedness gizzard.
- ō.pū kopē.kopē**. Same as *na'au kopē.kopē*.
- ō.puku.puku**. vs. Frowning, wrinkled; lowering, as clouds. Cf. *pukupuku, pupuku*. *'Ōpukupuku ke ao melemele* (birth chant for Ka-mehameha III), yellow clouds are lowering.
- ō.pū lau.oho**. n. 1. Case and larva of case moth (*Tineola uterella*), found on cement walls of basements or in caves, so called perhaps because the interior of the case is sometimes lined with hair. *Lit.*, head-hair womb. *Pūlauoho* is a short variant. 2. A strange mala-
- dy, the only symptoms of which were fine tracings of blood vessels on the stomach at birth which vanished shortly afterward. One with such tracings would grow up to be sterile, if a male, or if a female, would not have a child that lived more than a few months.
- ō.pule**. 1. Same as *'ōpulepule* 2. 2. n. A wrasse (*Anampses cuvier, A. godeffroyi*); the name may be qualified by the terms *lā uli* and *uli*. (Malo 46.) 3. Same as *mai'a koana*.
- ō.pule-kai**. n. Stroke in *lua* fighting.
- ō.pule.pule**. 1. vs. Moronic, somewhat crazy, psychotic. See *pule* and ex., *'ōhewahewa. ho.ō.pule.pule*. Caus/sim. 2. vs. Spotted, speckled, mottled. 3. n. A spotted land moss.
- ō.pū makani**. n. Bellows. *Lit.*, wind belly.
- ō.pū maka 'upena**. n. Beef tripe. *Lit.*, net mesh belly.
- ō.pū malu.malu**. n. Shady clump; a humble way to refer to one's house.
- ō.pū mimi**. n. Bladder. *Lit.*, urine belly.
- ō.pū nā.hele.hele**. n. Cluster or clump of any growth; thicket.
- ō.pū nini**. vs. Jealous. *Lit.*, jealous disposition.
- ō.pū nui**. nvs. Corpulent, large-bellied; corpulency; big belly.
- ō.pū 'ō.hao**. n. Disease in which the abdomen becomes enlarged and hard, while the limbs are enervated; dropsy. Cf. *'ōhao* 1.
- ō.pū 'opi.opi**. n. Beef tripe. *Lit.*, folding belly.
- ōpu.opu**. 1. vs. To belch; filled, as a calabash. 2. Redup. of *'opu* 2. **hō.opu.opu**. To think, surmise, want. *'Eā, ua pi'o ka uahi lepo i ka lani, ke hō'opu'opu lā kō ia ala kupa* (chant), oh, the dusk cloud bends in the sky, the native son is speculating.
- ō.pū pa'a**. nvi. The ability to go a long time without eating; to fast for a long time; one who can go long without eating. This was believed due to a belated dropping off of the umbilical cord in infancy. *Lit.*, solid stomach.
- ō.pū pala'ai**. vs. Potbellied, pumpkin-bellied.
- ō.pū palula**. vs. Idle, indolent, eating food without working; potbellied. *Lit.*, sweet-potato-leaf stomach; said to be so called because it took little effort to cook sweet potato leaves.
- ō.pū pipi**. n. Beef tripe.
- ō.pū pua'a**. n. Pig intestine; tripe.
- ō.pū puna.lua**. See *punalua*.
- ō.pū'u**. 1. nvi. A bud, the budding breasts of a girl, the budding spur of a young cock; to bud; a child; a geometric cone. *Na 'ōpu'u maka mo'a me ke ahi* (Oihk. 2.14), fresh ears [of grain] parched with fire. *He 'ōpu'u 'oe, he kākala kēlā* (FS 95), you have young spurs, that one [a cock with old] spurs. 2. n. A whale-tooth pendant, not tongue-shaped like the *lei palaoa*. See ex., *hulali* 1. *Ka-lani-'ōpu'u* (name of a chief), the whale-tooth pendant high chief. 3. n. A large surf, swell. (UL 36.)
- ō.pū'u kai.mana**. n. A cut diamond, as for a ring.
- ō.pū 'uku.uku**. vs. Of limited ability, importance, or strength, as once said of women and children. *Lit.*, small disposition.
- ō.pū'u mai'a**. n. The root bud and buds of a banana plant, and the sheaths enclosing them.
- ō.pū'u.pū'u**. 1. vs. Lumpy, bumpy, hilly, rough, as cloth or a road. 2. n. Knuckle, as on fingers, wrist. 3. n. Shore fish listed by Malo (no data). (Malo 46.)
- ō.pū weu.weu**. n. Clump of grass, a polite depreciatory way to refer to one's home, however magnificent it may be. *'Oku'u wahi ōpū weuweu lā, nou ia*, my little clump of grass shelter is for you.
- ou**. 1. n. Float, as on a net. *Rare*. 2. vs. To lean on something, hide. *Rare*. 3. poss. Your, yours (*o*-form, zero-class, singular; Gram. 8.4). (PPN (')*o'ou*.)
- o'u**. 1. n. A fish (no data). 2. poss. Mine, my, of me (*o*-form, zero-class; Gram. 8.4). (PPN *ho'oku*.)
- 'ou**. 1. nvs. Sharp, protruding, piercing; to protrude, project, jut out, pierce, puncture; to reach out for; to stretch out; to sound sharply; pinnacle, high peak;
