

- pā'ani lā'au.** n. Any stick game.
- pā ā.nue.nue.** n. Pearl-shell lure named for the rainbow (*ānuenuē*).
- Pā'ao.** n. Name of a star, said to be one of a large group resembling a double canoe. *Pā'ao* was a famous priest said to have conveyed a colony from Central Polynesia to Hawai'i.
- pā'ao'ao.** 1. vs. Sideways, one-sided. *Kau pā'ao'ao*, to place on the side. 2. n. Latent childhood disease, with physical weakening; a general term for ailments. *Rare*. *Kahuna hāhā pā'ao'ao*, practitioner who felt (*hāhā*) infants to see if they had *pā'ao'ao* disorders.
- pa'aola. ho'o.pa'a.ola.** Life insurance; to get life insurance.
- pa'a.oloulu.** n. Young *loulu* palm leaves, as used in making hats.
- pa'a.ono.** n. Hexagon.
- pa'a.pa'a.** 1. n. Dispute, argument, quarrel. **ho'o.pa'a.pa'a.** To argue, dispute; argument, quarrel. 2. Same as *pāpa'a 1*. *Ua pa'apa'a kō lākou alelo i ka make wai* (Isa. 41.17), their tongues burned with thirst. (PCP *pakapaka*.) 3. n. A fish (*Dascyllus albisella*). 4. n. A kind of sugar cane. Also *ho'opa'apa'a*.
- pa'a.pa'a'ina.** 1. nvs. Brittle, crisp, crackling; to snap, crackle. *Ka pa'apa'a'ina o nā kākalaioa* (Kekah. 7.6), the crackling of thorns. **ho'o.pa'a.pa'a'ina.** To make a crackling sound, etc. 2. n. A variety of taro. 3. n. A variety of sweet potato.
- pa'a.pa'a.kai.** vs. Salt-encrusted.
- pa'a.pa'a.nā.** 1. vt. To ease, as pain; to soothe; to entertain, amuse. *Pa'apa'anā mai i ua wahi 'eha nei ona*, easing his little pain. **ho'o.pa'a.pa'a.nā.** To cause pain to be soothed; to entertain. 2. vi. To hurry, hasten. *Rare*.
- pa'a.pa'ani.** vt. Playful, to play frequently. Cf. *pā'ani*.
- pa'a.pa'ina.** Redup. of *pa'ina*. *Nā leo hurō e pa'apa'ina i ka lewa*, the sounds of hurrah burst forth in the air.
- pa'a.pani.** *Rare var. of papani*.
- pa'a.poe.poe.** n. Globe, circular solid, sphere. *Lit.*, round solid.
- pa'a.pū.** vs. Covered with, solid with, teeming with, crowded, congested, as people, fog, or clouds; dense, impervious, nonporous; stifling, stuffy, as a room; thick or coarse, of banana fruit peeling (HP 173). (Ioba 7.5.) *Pa'apū o loko*, tense, repressed. *Pa'apū i ka ulu lā'au*, forested, wooded. *Pa'apū ka umauma*, the chest is stifled [as from a severe attack of asthma]. **ho'o.pa'a.pū.** To make crowded, covered with, stifling, etc. *Ua ho'opa'apū lākou i kō waena ou me ka haunaele* (Ezek. 28.16), they filled those around you with violence.
- pa'au.** *Rare var. of pa'a'a*.
- pa'a.ua.** nvi. Hard physical labor or drudgery; a drudge (perhaps contraction of *pa'a*, hold, and *uaua*, tough); to work hard. **ho'o.pa'a.ua.** To enslave, overwork, treat as a drudge.
- pa'au.hau.** n. A variety of sweet potato.
- pa'a.uma.** nv. A type of hand wrestling in which each player tried to push his opponent's hand back to his chest (*uma*); to wrestle thus. *Pahi pa'a uma*, draw knife.
- pa'a.waha.** nv. Gag; to gag the mouth (Hal. 39.1). *Lit.*, make the mouth solid.
- pa'a.waiwai.** **ho'o.pa'a.wai.wai.** To insure property; property insurance.
- pa'a.walu.** n. Octagon.
- pa'a.wela.** nvt. A burned area; a scar from burning; to burn. *Ma kahi maika'i e pa'awela ana nō* (Isa. 3.24), instead of beauty, burning. 2. n. Probably a wrasse fish.
- pae.** 1. nvs. Cluster, row, group; margin or bank, as of a taro patch; level, as of a platform. Cf. *pae 'āina*, *pae kō*, *pae moku*. *I ka hele 'ana o ka imu ā 'ena'ena*, *ua 'ōhelo noho'i ka lā'au ulu imu a nonoho a pae like*, when the oven is red-hot, the oven-poking stick is pushed around so that [the stones] are in even levels. **ho'o.pae.** To build up an embankment, row, cluster. (PNP *pae*.) 2. vi. To land, disembark, come ashore; to mount or catch a wave, as of a surf rider; washed or drifted ashore. *Niho pae*, a loose tooth. *Manu pae*, a bird that lands from afar, as a migratory bird. *Palaoa pae*, whale washed ashore. *Pae i ka nalu*, to ride a wave into the shore. *Po'e pae mai*, immigrants. *'A'ole e pae nā wa'a o ke ali'i iā'oe* (Nak. 56), the chief's canoes cannot land because of you. *E 'ai kākou. Mahalo, ua pae kēia wa'a*. Let's eat. Thanks, this canoe has landed [i.e., I have eaten]. **ho'o.pae.** to cause to land, reach shore. *Ho'opae malū*, to smuggle, bring in secretly. *Waiwai ho'opae malū 'ia*, smuggled goods. (PPN *pae*.) 3. n. Type of sweet potato, pronunciation uncertain. (For. 5:664-5.)
- pa'ē.** vs. To strike the ear, as a distant sound. *Pa'ē mai ana ka leo o ke kai*, the sound of the sea strikes the ears.
- pā'ē.** nvt. To peel, as bark; a bunch of cleaned bark, as of *olonā*. *Rare*.
- paea.** n. Flint (*Eng.*, fire.) *Pōhaku paea*, flint (Isa. 50.7); agate, carbuncle (Isa. 54.12).
- pa'ea.** n. A variety of taro.
- paea.ea.** nvi. 1. To fish with a light pole offshore; pole-fishing. *Kanaka paea*, fisherman. *Hele kākou i ka paea*, let's go pole-fishing. 2. nvi. A chant of supplication; to chant thus, perhaps so called as a means of "fishing" for something. (PH 149.)
- pā.ea.ea.** 1. vs. Smooth, calm, as the sea. 2. n. A variety of fish mentioned as having sharp protuberances (Malo 46). 3. vt. To signal with the arms. *Rare*.
- paea.ea 'a'ama.** n. A method of catching 'a'ama crabs with a coconut fiber snare on a coconut midrib; it is looped over the crab's eye and jerked upward; to crab thus.
- paea.ea 'ō.hiki.** nv. A method of catching 'ōhiki sand crabs, with a blossom, usually *nohu*, tied to the end of a line as bait; to crab thus.
- pae 'āina.** n. Group of islands, archipelago.
- pā'ē'ē.** vs. 1. Here and there, everywhere but the right place. *Kuhi pā'ē'ē*, to misdirect, mislead, give inaccurate information. **ho'o.pā'ē'ē.** To cause to go astray, mislead, misrepresent. 2. Supernatural. *Ka lāhui kino pā'ē'ē i kapa 'ia he Melehune*, a people with supernatural bodies, called Melehune.
- pae.heu.** n. Large bundle. *Rare*.
- pae.hewa.** vi. To stray.
- pae.hi'a.** vt. To fasten 'aho sticks to thatching, of a house.
- pae.humu.** n. 1. Taboo enclosure about a chief's house or about a heiau (Kep. 137). *Mālama o pā ka 'auwae i ka pae humu* (saying), be careful or the chin will rest on the taboo enclosure [you will get into serious trouble]. 2. Bannister.
- pa'ēke.** n. Pocket. *Eng.*
- pā'ēke.** n. Small corral.
- pae.ki'i.** n. Row of clouds, as on the horizon. *Lit.*, row of images.
- pae.kō.** n. Cultivation of sugar cane growing along a border.
- pā'ele.** 1. nvt. Negroid, dark, black; to blacken; to tattoo solid black without design; to paint black, as a canoe; to blot. *Pā'ele i ka 'alaea a me ka nānahu* (FS 259), paint black with red coloring and charcoal. **ho'o.pā'ele.** To blacken, etc. 2. (*Cap.*) n. Negro, Black. 3. n. A variety of sweet potato. Also *nika*.
- pā'ele-hili-mā.noa.noa.** n. A variety of taro. *Lit.*, thick-barked blackness.
- pā'ele hili mā.noa.noa.** n. A variety of sweet potato.
- pā'ele kū.lani.** n. Solid tattooing of one side of the body; Ka-hekili, chief of Maui, was said to have been tattooed thus. *Lit.*, chiefly darkening.
- pā'eli.** vt. To dig the earth, as to plant in a taro patch. **ho'o.pā'eli.** to cause such digging.
- pā'eli'eli.** Redup. of *pā'eli*. **ho'o.pā'eli'eli.** Redup. of *ho'opā'eli*.
