

Pae-loa-hiki. n. Name of a star or for the Milky Way. *Lit.*, eastern long row.

pae moku. n. Group of islands, archipelago. *Lit.*, cluster of islands.

pae moku.puni. n. Archipelago.

paena. n. Landing place, as of canoes (*paena wa'a*) or of waves (*paena nalu*); landing. Cf. *pae 2.* (PCP *paenga.*)

pae niho. n. Row of teeth.

pae.pae. 1. nvt. A support, prop, stool, pavement, house platform; plate of a house on which the rafters rest; block to keep an outrigger float off the ground; log or wooden horse that supports a seesaw; to support, hold up, sustain; rows. *Loina paepae āhua*, customs that add prestige; *lit.*, elevated mound customs. *E paepae mai i ka uluna ā ki'eki'e*, pile the pillows high. *Paepae 'o'opu*, old term for a built-up pool for keeping 'o'opu fish. **ho'o.pae.pae.** To build up a *paepae* (platform) or a taro embankment; to finish a space in quilting. (PPN *paepae.*) 2. Redup. of *pae 2.* **ho'o.pae.pae.** Redup. of *ho'opae.* 3. n. Boom of a ship. Cf. *kaula paepae.* 4. Same as *iwi 'ao'ao.*

pa'ē.pa'ē. Redup. of *pa'ē*; to publicize. **ho'o.pa'ē.pa'ē.** To be noisy, as a distant sound; to talk loudly.

pae.pae kt. n. Ti-stalk fence (the stalks are crossed and a stick put into the notches made by the crossings).

paepae komo huila. n. Axle of a wheel (1 Nal. 7.33). *Lit.*, support where wheel enters.

pae.pae puka. n. Threshold (Isa.6.4). *Lit.*, door platform.

pae.pae puka.ani.ani. n. Window sill.

pae.pae wā.wā. n. Footstool. (Iak. 2.3.)

pa'ē pū. nvi. To sound together, a deafening roar.

pae pu'u. n. Row or cluster of hills.

pa'ewa. nvs. Crooked, misshapen, bent, uneven, odd, imperfect; wrong, incorrect; error, mistake. *Helu pa'ewa*, odd number. Cf. *'auipa'ewa.* **ho'o.pa'ewa.** To cause to be crooked, wrong, etc.

pā'ewa'ewa. Redup. of *pa'ewa*; biased, partial, unfair, prejudicially. *E 'imi pono me ka pā'ewa'ewa 'ole*, investigate carefully and impartially. **ho'o.pā'ewa'ewa.** Redup. of *ho'opa'ewa.*

paha. 1. nvt. To improvise a chant; an improvised or conversation chant, as the *kepakepa.* (PCP *pa(f,s)a.*) 2. n. Uncooked young taro leaves. (PH 74.) Cf. *lū'au, pē'ū.* 3. Same as *kūpala*, a plant. 4. n. A kind of surfboard. *Rare.* 5. Short for *pahāha.* *Rare.* 6. Part. Maybe, perhaps, probably, possibly, may, might (very common, used to make speech less blunt and more conciliatory, something like English use of the conditional mode; it frequently follows 'a'ole and *pēlā*, and never occurs after a pause). (Gram. 7.5.) 'A'ole *paha*, maybe not, possibly not, likely not, probably not. *Pēlā paha*, maybe so. *Ā . . . paha*, or. 'Elua ā 'ekolu *paha* (For. 4:259), two or three. 'O ka po'e *kōkua e hana i kekahi hewa 'ofeni, ā ua noho paha malaila*, the people who help in the committing of an offense, or are present there. *Hele paha*, [I] may [or might] go. (PCP *pa(f,s)a.*)

pā.hā. vt. By fours, four at a time, four times; to distribute to four; to divide by four.

pā.hā'a. vs. Short in stature.

pā.hā'a.hā'a. 1. Redup. of *pā.hā'a.* 2. Same as *no'uno'u*, a gourd.

pahaha. n. Young stage of the mullet, also called *kahaha.* (KL line 173.)

pahāha. vs. Swollen, as the neck or the cheeks of one with mumps; to strut, walk proudly. *Rare.* Cf. *'auwae-pahāha, manō pahāha.* **ho'o.pahāha.** To cause swelling; to hoist the shoulders; to strut.

paha.kū. n. Name of a design on Ni'ihau mats consisting of squares with corners touching and forming a line.

pā.hala. n. A method of making mulch soil by placing pandanus (*hala*) branches and leaves in holes in rocky soil containing mulch, and then burning the *hala* for fertilizer.

-pāhala. ho'o.pā.hala. Sceptical. *He kanaka ho'opā-*

hala, he mana'o'i'o 'ole (Kep. 107), a skeptical person of no faith.

pā hale. n. House lot, yard, fence.

pā hali.hali. n. Tray (preceded by *ke*). *Lit.*, plate for carrying.

pā.haneli, pāhaneri. nvt. A hundredfold, by the hundred; to distribute to a hundred.

pā hao. n. 1. Iron fence. 2. Iron dish, pan (preceded by *ke*).

pā.ha'o. 1. About the same as the more common *pāha'oha'o.* 2. n. Name of a guessing game. *Rare.*

pā.ha'o.ha'o. vs. Mysterious, puzzling, incomprehensible; transfigured. **ho'o.pā.ha'o.ha'o.** To mystify, bewilder, cause wonder, puzzle; transfigured. *Ho'opā-ha'oha'o 'ia ihola ia i mua o lākou* (Mat. 17.2), he was transfigured before them.

-pahaola. See *akepahaola.*

paha.paha. 1. Redup. of *paha 1, 5.* (PCP *pa(f,s)apa(f,s)a.*) 2. Same as *lipahapaha*, sea lettuce. 3. n. O'ahu name for a kind of stone used for poi pounders. Called *makawī* on Kaua'i.

paha.paha kua.hiwi. n. A liverwort (*Dumortiera* sp.).

paha.paha-o-Poli.hale. n. A kind of *pahapaha* said to be found only at Poli-hale, Kaua'i; after drying it was believed to revive when immersed in sea water; it was made into leis. (FS 103.)

paha.paha wai. n. A sea lettuce (*Ulva* sp.) with narrow frond. Found where sea and fresh water meet.

pā.hau. 1. n. Striped flatfish. (KL line 156.) 2. nvs. Person who cared for chief's food and clothes; well-cared for, as clothes. *Rare.* 3. vt. To filch. *Rare.*

pā hau. n. 1. Enclosure or fence of *hau* trees. 2. White pearl-shell lure or shell.

pahē. vs. Soft-spoken, soft-mannered; soft and about to spoil, as fruit; pulp, of fruit. See the more common *waipahē.*

pā.heā.heā. nvt. To call, especially to invite someone to eat; hospitality.

pahē'e. 1. vi. Slippery, smooth, as a surface; soft, satiny; to slide, slip, skid; sliding, slipping. Cf. *holo pahē'e, pakika, pōhaku pahē'e 'ānai. Lole pahē'e* (Hoik. 18.12), silk. 'Ōlelo *pahē'e*, fluent speech; glib or cunning tongue. **ho'o.pahē'e.** To cause to slip, slide; to make smooth, slippery; to smooth with oil, as the hair; to lubricate. See ex., *kū 13.* (PPN *paseke.*) 2. n. Cleared area, bare dirt. 3. n. Spear throwing (FS 114-5); dart-throwing; sport of sliding a stick over a smooth surface; the dart itself. Buck describes the darts as from 34.5 to 67 inches (about 85 to 170 cm) long, tapering at one end, with the greatest diameter of from 1 to 1½ inches (2.6 to 3.9 cm). Cf. *moa 5.* 4. n. Shallow hole or grave, as for flexed burial. (For. 5:571.) 5. Same as *pāhe'ehe'e*, seaweed.

pā.he'e.he'e. 1. Redup. of *pahē'e 1.* *Wahi pāhe'ehe'e* (Hal. 73.18), slippery places. **ho'o.pā.he'e.he'e.** Caus/sim. (PPN *pasekeseke.*) 2. n. A green cushion-shaped solid seaweed (*Porphyra* sp., formerly *Dictyosphaeria*). Also *lipahē'e, lipahē'ehe'e, lipāhoe, pahē'e.*

pahē'e'ulu. nv. To bowl; bowling.

pahelo. nvt. 1. A snare, noose, trap; to ensnare, trap; deceit, treachery. 'Ōlelo *pahelo*, deceitful speech. *I pahelo a i 'ūpiki no ka po'e* (Isa. 8.14), a trap and a snare to the people. **ho'o.pahelo.** To cause to be ensnared; to ensnare, deceive. 2. Same as *mānai*, needle.

Pahelo-hala. n. Wind off Wai'anac, O'ahu (PH 161), and associated with Naue, Kaua'i (For. 5:97). *Lit.*, pandanus ensnarement.

pā.hele.hele. Redup. of *pahelo*, snare. *He pāhelehele puhi no Hāmākua*, an eel snarer from Hāmākua. *He pāhelehele 'ōpae* (Nak. 85), a snarer of shrimps.

pahelo. 1. Var. of *pakelo.* **ho'o.pahelo.** Var. of *ho'opakelo.* 2. vt. To peel, as taro. *Kaua'i.*

pā.hema.hema. About the same as *hemahema*: awkward, unskilled. *Pāhemahema i ka ho'onohonoho 'ana i nā hua 'ōlelo*, awkward in the arranging of words,
