

- as of one speaking brokenly. **ho'o.pā.hema.hema.** Same as *pāhemahema*; to cause awkwardness, to fake lack of skill.
- pahemo.** nvs. About the same as *hemo*; loosened, slipping off; to loosen, get loose; weakening, as a voice. *Iwi pahemo*, dislocation. *Ua pahemo ka hō mai ke kū'au*, the hoe slipped off the handle. **ho'o.pahemo.** To cause to slip, slacken, loosen, etc.
- pā.hemo.hemo.** Redup. of *pahemo*. *Pa'a pāhemo-hemo*, to remember here and there, imperfectly, as a song. **ho'o.pā.hemo.hemo.** Redup. of *ho'opahemo*.
- pā.hene.hene.** vt. To ridicule, laugh at, make fun of, mock, scoff. **ho'o.pā.hene.hene.** Caus/sim.
- pahē.pahē.** Redup. of *pahē*.
- pā.heu.heu.** n. A fish (no data).
- pahi.** 1. nvt. Knife, flint; to skin, as cattle. (PCP *pa(f,s)i*.) 2. To stand on edge. (And.)
- pā.hia.** inter. How many to each? How many in a group?
- pā.hi'a.** nvt. A slipping, falling down; oblique cut; obliquely, as of clipping, cutting, falling; to miss. *Kū pāhi'a ku'u pua i ke kaha*, my arrow slipped to one side of the mark. *Lele pāhi'a*, leaping sideways into water without a splash, as in the *lele kawa* sport. (PCP *paasika*.)
- pā.hi'a.hi'a.** Redup. of *pāhi'a*. (PCP *paasikasika*.)
- pā.hīaku.** n. Bonito hook.
- pahi hahau.** n. Cleaver, chopping knife. *Lit.*, striking knife.
- pā.hihi.** vi. To spread, as vines; to stream, as water over a cliff.
- pahi kā.** n. Cane knife, machete. *Lit.*, striking knife.
- pahi kāhi.** n. Razor. Cf. more common *pahi 'umi'umi*. *Lit.*, shaving knife.
- pahi kā.kiwī.** n. Sickle, scythe, cutlass. *Lit.*, bent knife.
- pahi kani.kani.** n. Knife made of a piece of hoop iron. *Lit.*, sounding knife.
- pahi.kaua.** 1. Same as *kala li'ili'i*, a fish (see *kala* 3). 2. n. A long narrow bivalve, possibly the Pinna shells (Pinnidae).
- pahi kaua.** n. Sword. *Lit.*, war knife.
- pahi kaua pā.laha.laha.** n. Cutlass. *Lit.*, flat war knife.
- pahi keke'e.** n. Sickle.
- pā.hiki.** vi. To pass quietly, go lightly, touch gently.
- pahi koli.** n. Carving knife.
- pā.hiku.** vt. Sevenfold, by sevens; seven times; to distribute to seven or divide by seven.
- pā.hila.** vi. To stagger. Cf. *hilala*.
- pahi.lau.** vs. Untrue, false; untruth (contraction of *pāhili*, variable, and *lau*, much). Cf. *'alapahi*. **ho'o.pahi.lau.** To tell lies.
- pahili.** vt. To braid. *Fig.*, to confuse, entangle, deceive.
- pā.hili.** vi. To blow strongly, as a wind, especially of a veering wind; to lash, as a storm. *Makani pāhili*, strong wind, cyclone, hurricane. *Ka pāhili 'ia o ka 'ama'u e ka Māluālua*, the lashing of the 'ama'u fern by the Māluālua wind. **ho'o.pā.hili.** To cause such a wind; to blow, as such a wind, etc.
- pahilo.** Same as *puāhilo*.
- pahi lolē pipi.** n. Sharp knife used for dressing beef. *Lit.*, knife for skinning beef.
- pahi.lolo.** vs. Proud, strutting. *Rare*.
- pahi maka lua.** n. Double-edged sword or knife.
- pahinu.** vs. About the same as *hinu*. *Kāma'a pahinu*, patent-leather shoes; *lit.*, shiny shoes. **ho'o.pahinu.** To make shiny, etc.
- pahi.ō.** vi. Leaning, slanting, stooping; tall, slender (And.). See *hiō*.
- pahi 'ō.** n. Dagger. *Lit.*, piercing knife.
- pahi 'oki.'oki.** n. Carving knife.
- pahi 'oki.'oki pipi.** n. Butcher knife.
- pahi 'oki pepa.** n. Paper knife.
- pahi olo.** nvt. A saw; to saw.
- pahi olo lua.** n. Whipsaw.
- pahi olo poe.poe.** n. An unknown type of saw mentioned in wills during the 1850s.
- pā hipa.** n. Sheepfold.
- pahi pa'a uma.** n. Drawknife. *Lit.*, knife solid [at] chest.
- pahi.pahi.** nvi. To slap hands; to play "peas-porridge-hot"; this game; a game formerly played by children: a rotten object was buried in the sand and others were asked to dig for it, while the leader said "*kōhi kōhi kūpā, no wai, no wai ka lima i hawahawa*," gather, gather, dig, whose hands, whose hands are dirtied.
- pahi pa'i.pa'i.** n. Pruning knife.
- pahi pā.kā.kā.** n. Chopping knife of any kind.
- pahi pelu.** n. Jackknife, penknife, folding knife.
- pahi po'o muku.** n. Short-bladed knife. *Lit.*, cut head knife.
- pā.hi'u.hi'u.** 1. nvt. A game: throwing darts at a target, or pushing a stone with sharp sticks to a goal; to play this game. *Hele ana 'oe i hea? Hele ana i ka pāhi'ihī'u.* Where are you going? To play *pāhi'uhī'u* [to pry into others' affairs, snoop]. 2. n. A type of sorcery. (Kam. 64:131, 140.)
- pahi 'umē.** n. Drawknife.
- pahi 'umi.'umi.** n. Razor. *Lit.*, beard knife.
- pā.hiwa.** nvs. Dark, to darken (note that *hiwa* is a sacred, desirable black that contrasts with *ulī*). *Lau pāhiwa* (KL line 280), dark leaf. *Ka lani nui pāhiwa* (chant), the sacred, dark, heavenly one. **ho'o.pā.hiwa.** Caus/sim.
- pahi waka.waka.** n. Flaming sword (Kin. 3.24); saw, sword. *Lit.*, shining knife.
- pahō.** Var. of *pohō*.
- pā.hoa.** n. Short dagger; sharp stone, especially as used for a weapon; Moloka'i name for stick for beating clothes; taboo sign. *Ko'i pāhoa*, stone battle-axe. *Kūkulu i ka pāhoa*, to set up a taboo sign.
- pā.hoe.** nv. To paddle; to drive fish into a net by beating the paddles rhythmically against the canoe; paddler. Cf. *homa* 3, *kāpapa*. *E pāka'au 'ia nō i nā pāhoe āpau* (Nak. 106), 40 [fish] for each paddler.
- pā.hoe.hoe.** 1. nvt. Smooth, unbroken type of lava, contrasting with 'a'ā; to turn into *pāhoehoe* lava (see ex., *namu* 2). 2. n. Satin. *Pāhoehoe lau*, brocaded satin. 3. Redup. of *pāhoe*. *Ha'a ke akua i ka la'i o Mahiki, pāhoehoe i luna o ka Pu'u-lena* (chant), the goddess does a bent-knee dance in the calm of Mahiki, paddling above the Pu'u-lena breeze.
- pā.hoe.hoe.pole.** Hooks used in catching sea turtles. (And.)
- pā.hohonu.** n. Soup plate, deep dish (preceded by *ke*).
- pā.hola.** vt. 1. To spread about, extend, diffuse; spread too thin, dissipated. Cf. *hohola*. *E pāhola mai i kou aloha maluna o mākou* (prayer), spread forth your love to us. **ho'o.pā.hola.** To cause to spread, have spread. 2. To stupefy fish by drugging with 'auhuhu, the poison spreading (*pāhola*) through the water.
- pā.hola.hola.** Redup. of *pāhola* 1, 2.
- pahole.** Same as *pohole*.
- pahole.hole.** Redup. of *pahole*.
- pā.hō.lēi.** n. Legendary name for *kava*. (For. 5:607.)
- pā.holo.** vi. To appear in great numbers, as octopuses. *Rare*.
- pā.holo.holona.** n. An enclosure for animals, as a dog pound.
- pā.holoi.** n. Wash pan or basin (preceded by *ke*).
- pā.hono.** vt. To mend, sew up a tear, patch, darn, repair. **ho'o.pā.hono.** To have mended, etc.
- pā.hono.hono.** Redup. of *pāhono*. **ho'o.pā.hono.hono.** Redup. of *ho'opāhono*.
- pā ho'o.kani.** n. Phonograph record.
- paho'o.lā.** Torn tapa. (And.)
- pā ho'o.lapa.lapa.** n. Saucepan (preceded by *ke*). *Lit.*, boiling pan.
- pā ho'o.puni.** n. Central corral.
- pā.hou.hou.** Same as *pā'ou'ou*, young of the fish *hou*.
- pahu.** 1. n. Box, drum, cask, chest, barrel, trunk, tank, case, ship binnacle, collection box, keg, ark, coffin, dresser, bureau, cabinet; bald heads were sometimes ridiculed as drums. Cf. *hulipahu*, *pahu pāpale*. *Hula pahu* (UL 103), dance to drum beat, perhaps formerly
