

- called 'ai ha'a. (PPN *pasu*, PEP *pahu*.) 2. n. Stake, staff, stick, post, pole. Cf. *pahu hope*, *pahu hopu*, *pahukū*. 3. vt. To push, shove; to thrust or hurl, as a spear or javelin; to pierce with a sharp instrument, as in letting blood; to fall overboard (For. 5:123). Fig., to bruise the feeling of others. *Wai-pahu* (place name), pushing water, said to be named for water that forced its way out of the earth at Wai-pahu, O'ahu, said to have been formerly called Wai-pahū (see *pahū*). **ho'o.pahu.** To cause to push, etc. (PPN *pasu*.) 4. vt. To cut off short; odd-numbered. Cf. 'āpahu, 'oi 3, *pahupū*. *I pahu kō 'oukou 'ao'ao* (For. 6:53), if your side is odd-numbered. 5. n. Trunkfishes, boxfishes, cowfishes (*Ostracion*). Malo says that *pahu* were taboo to women (Malo 29). Also *moa*. 6. n. Name of a region below the 'ilima and above the *kula*. 7. n. Gill net used in shallow water. (Malo 213, Emerson note.)
- pahū.** nvi. To explode, burst; explosive, blast, thud; outburst. Cf. *pōkā pahū*. See ex., *walawala*. **ho'o.pahū.** To explode, set off, as dynamite or firecrackers; to blast, blow up. *Mokulele ho'opahū nui*, large bomber. (PPN *pasuu*.)
- pahua.** 1. Pas/imp. of *pahu* 3. See *hula Pahua*, a spear dance. (UL 183.) 2. vs. Downtrodden, as grass where cattle have stamped. *Rare*.
- pahu'a.** nvs. Unsuccessful, ineffective, ruined, spoiled; lack of success. *Ka pahu'a o ka 'awa i ke keiki*, the lack of effect of the kava on the child. *Ua pahu'a ia mea he "maka 'ewa'ewa,"* this thing "crooked eyes" [said insultingly of O'ahu] doesn't amount to anything. **ho'o.pahu'a.** To spoil, wreck.
- pā.hu'a.** Similar to *kipuka* 1, said especially of clear areas in pastures where it is easy to rope cattle.
- pāhua.** ho'o.pā.hu'a. To move sideways; to sail to windward. *Rare*.
- pahu anī.anī.** n. Glass box, especially a glass-bottomed box for fishing; glass case, as in a museum.
- pahu hae.** n. Flagpole.
- pahu hao.** n. Safe, strong box. *Lit.*, iron box.
- pahu hau.** n. Icebox, refrigerator.
- pahu hei.au.** n. Temple drum.
- pahu hō'ike.** n. Ark of the testimony. *Lit.*, testifying box. *E kau ana i mua o ka pahu hō'ike, i mua ho'i o ka noho aloha e kau ana maluna o ka pahu kānāwai* (Puk. 30.6), put it before the ark of the testimony before the mercy seat that is over the testimony.
- pahu hope.** n. Final goal or stake.
- pahu hopu.** n. Final goal. *Lit.*, catching goal.
- pahu hu.** n. Young of the fish *uhu*.
- pā.hū.hū.** vi. To gush, ooze forth, as blood. **ho'o.pā-hū.hū.** To cause to gush forth.
- pahu hula.** n. Hula drum.
- pahu i'a.** n. Small aquarium box for fish.
- pā.hu'i.hu'i.** Var. of *pāhi'uhi'u*, a game.
- pahu.kā'a.** n. Juice extracted from a green gourd by pounding, said to be used in an enema.
- pahu.kaina.** n. Ashes. Also *lehu*, *noho hale*.
- pahu.kala.** n. 1. Sham battle with sharp weapons. (Malo 66.) 2. Herald who announces (*kala*) war.
- pahu kā.lā.** n. Safe-deposit box.
- pahu kana.loa.** n. Prayer drum (perhaps from *pahu kala loa*, drum proclaiming to a distance).
- pahu kā.nā.wai.** n. Ark of the testimony. *Lit.*, legal box. Cf. *pahu hō'ike*.
- pahu kani.** n. Drum; tabret (Kin. 31.27), eardrum (Kel. 115; translation from Eng.). Fig., bald head. *Lit.*, sounding drum.
- pahu kapu.** n. A stake beyond which it was taboo to pass; sanctuary. *Lit.*, taboo stake.
- pahu.kū.** 1. n. Goal or stick at the starting place of a race. 2. n. Reserve of an army, especially a rear guard. 3. vt. To repel, as in war.
- pā.huku.** Same as *pōhuku*.
- pahu kui.** nv. Hypodermic injection; to be injected. *Lit.*, needle piercing.
- pahu kupa.pā'u.** n. Coffin. *Lit.*, corpse box.
- pā hula.** n. Hula troupe, hula studio, place reserved for hula dancing.
- pahu lolō.** n. Clothes chest or trunk.
- pahulu.** 1. nvs. Nightmare (named for a chief of evil spirits on Lā-na'i who was killed by Ka-ulu-lā'au; his spirit enchanted certain fish, especially goatfish (*weke*); if a *weke* head is eaten near bedtime, nightmares are said to result; the closer to Lā-na'i the *weke* is caught, the worse the nightmare); ghost; haunted; unlucky. *He hale pahulu*, a haunted house. *Pō nā maka i ka noe, i ka pahulu i ke ala loa*, eyes blinded by the mist, by the haunts of the long road. **ho'o.pahulu.** to have a nightmare; nightmare; to haunt; to bring bad luck; unlucky. 2. nvs. Exhausted, worn-out, of over-farmed soil; such soil. **ho'o.pahulu.** To exhaust the soil; to let the land rest and lie fallow. 3. n. Volunteer sweet potatoes, sweet potatoes of the second growth.
- pahulu.hope.** vs. Demented, to behave as if crazy.
- pahu.lulu.** vs. Somewhat rainy, showery. *Rare*.
- pahu mana.mana.** n. Intersection, crossroads. *Lit.*, branching stake.
- pahu meli.** n. Beehive.
- pahuna.** n. A pushing, thrust, hurling, piercing, etc., as of an *ihe* spear. Cf. *pahu* 3. *Ho'okahi nō ia pahuna, 'o ka hā'ule nō ia*, but a single thrust and he fell.
- pahu noho.** n. Box, as at a theater.
- pahu 'ō.lōlo.** n. Phonograph. *Lit.*, speaking box.
- pahu pā.** n. Meat safe, cupboard. *Lit.*, dish box.
- pahu.pahu.** 1. Redup. of *pahu* 3. *Ua pahupahu 'oia i kāna kaikaina*, he bruised the feelings of his younger brother. (PPN *pasupasu*.) 2. nv. Billiards, pool; to play billiards or pool. 3. Redup. of *pahu* 4; blunt, dull.
- pahū.pahū.** 1. Redup. of *pahū*; firecrackers. **ho'o.pahū.pahū.** Redup. of *ho'opahū*; to drum or stamp with force; to squeeze certain types of small fish so they burst. (PPN *pasuupasuu*.) 2. Same as *kā'eke'eke*. 3. n. Tiny and worthless taro offshoot from an offshoot of several generations. (Kep. 153.) See *kalo*.
- pahu pa'i.** n. Small sharkskin hula drum. *Lit.*, beating drum.
- pahu.pa'i.ki'i.** n. Camera, kodak. *Lit.*, box for printing pictures.
- pahu paka.** n. Tobacco box or container.
- pahu pala.pala.** n. Writing desk; formerly a container for the coloring liquid used in printing tapa. *Lit.*, document box.
- pahu pā.nā.nā.** n. Binnacle.
- pahu pā.pale.** n. Hatbox; wooden block upon which a hat is plaited; such hats are called *pāpale pahu*.
- pahu pelika (berita).** n. Ark of the covenant (Ios. 3.3). *Lit.*, covenant box.
- pahu po'o li'i.li'i.** n. Keg. *Lit.*, small-headed barrel.
- pahu.pū.** vs. Cut in half, cut in two, severed, cut short, chopped off. *Nui pahupū*, of uneven size; poorly proportioned, as overly large buttocks, shoulders; unsymmetrical. *E 'oki 'o mua me hope o ka wa'a ā pahupū* (FS 187), sever the bow and stern of the canoe, completely sever.
- pahu pukē.** n. Bookcase.
- pahu 'umē.** n. Drawer, bureau, buffet.
- pahu wai.** n. Water barrel, tank.
- pahu waiho lolō.** n. Clothes chest or trunk.
- pahu wai.hona.** n. Chest of drawers, cabinet, bureau.
- pai.** 1. vt. To urge, encourage, rouse, stir up, excite. **ho'o.pai.** To encourage, cause to rouse, etc. 2. vt. To raise, lift up, increase. (PCP *pai*.) 3. vt. To laud, praise, exalt. Cf. *pai ali'i*. 4. vt. To pamper, spoil, as a favorite child; to make a pet of. *I kū nō ka ho'oki'eki'e i ka pai 'ia e ke kupuna wahine*, the willfulness is due to being pampered by the grandmother. 5. n. A funnel-shaped wicker basket used for catching shrimps and small fish, so called because it was lifted (*pai*) from the water. Also 'apai, 'āpua. 6. n. A native fern (*Adenophorus hymenophylloides*) with clustered, narrow, pinnate fronds, 5 to 13 cm long, growing on trees at rather high altitudes. Also *huna palai*, *palai huna*. 7. n. A
