

- terms *ha'awale* and *moana*. (PCP *paatiki*.) 3. vs. Broiled, as puppies that were split and laid flat.
- pā.ki'i.ki'i.** 1. Redup. of *pāki'i* 1. **ho'o.pā.ki'i.ki'i.** Redup. of *ho'opāki'i*. 2. n. Small dip net used in fishing in shallows.
- pakika.** vs. Slippery, smooth; to slip, slide. *He pakika, he pahe'e i ke ala* (song), slipping, sliding on the road. **ho'o.pakika.** To make smooth, as by polishing; to make slippery, as by greasing; to cause to slip and slide.
- pā.kika.kika.** Redup. of *pakika*. **ho'o.pā.kika.kika.** Redup. of *ho'opakika*.
- pakika.wai.ō.** Same as *kikawaiō*.
- pā.kī.kē.** nvt. To answer saucily or rudely; rude, sarcastic, insolent, saucy, impudent; rudeness. Cf. *-kīkē, 'u'u. Pākīkē 'ia* (For. 4:291), insulted, taunted, jeered at. **ho'o.pā.kī.kē.** Caus/sim.
- pā.kī.kē.kī.kē.** Redup. of *pākīkē*.
- paki.kī.** Redup. of *pakī*. **ho'o.paki.kī.** Caus/sim.
- pā.kiki.** Same as *pāki'i* 2.
- pā.kī.kī.** 1. Redup. of *pāki* 1; to crush, as pandanus aerial roots with a stone in order to obtain fibers for kava strainers. **ho'o.pā.kī.kī.** Redup. of *ho'opāki*. (PCP *paatitii*.) 2. n. A variety of poisonous crab, said to be the same as *kūmimi*.
- pā.kiko.** nvi. Temperate, abstemious, frugal, economical, skimpy; temperance (sometimes preceded by *ke*). *'Ai pākiko, eat sparingly; continence. Inu pākiko, drink temperately. He pono ke pākiko mamua o nā hana ho'okelakela wale aku, it is better to be economical than to [indulge in] extravagant display.* **ho'o.pā.kiko.** Caus/sim.
- pā.kī.kō.** n. Stone adze.
- pā.kī.kō.ōle.** nvi. A rolling, rumbling sound; to rumble.
- pā.kiko.kiko.** 1. Redup. of *pākiko*. **ho'o.pā.kiko.kiko.** Caus/sim. 2. vs. Scattered, dotted, spotted.
- pā.kīlio.** v. To ride a horse until it is exhausted or dead.
- pā.kini.** n. Tin pan, pan, basin (preceded by *ke*). *Pā kini holoi, wash pan.*
- pā.ki'o.** vi. To settle in pools, as rain water; to drizzle; to evacuate the bowels.
- pā.ki'o.ki'o.** Redup. of *pāki'o*; to leave excreta here and there, as an animal. *Ua pāki'oki'o, short showers; to rain often and clear between showers.*
- pā.kipa.** n. Barkeeper. *Eng.*
- pakī.pakī.** Redup. of *pakī*. **ho'o.pakī.pakī.** Caus/sim.
- pakipa.kika.** Redup. of *pakika*. **ho'o.pakipa.kika.** Redup. of *ho'opakika*.
- Pā.kī.pika, Fatifika.** nvs. Pacific. *Eng.*
- pā.kīpō.haku.** v. To throw stones.
- pako, baso.** n. Bass. *Eng.*
- Pakoa.** n. Catholic term for Easter, Passover. (Gr. *Pascha* or possibly Portuguese *Pascoa* or Spanish *Pascua*.)
- pā koa.** n. Barracks.
- pako (bato) 'aila.** n. Measures of oil. (Luka 16.6.) (Gr. *batous*.)
- pako.hana.** Same as *kohana*; bare. *'Au pakohana i Wai-niha, nā lehua o Lulu'u-pali* (song), swimming naked at Wai-niha, are the *lehua* blossoms of Lulu'u-pali.
- pakokē.** Rare var. of *pakeko*.
- pā.kole.** 1. Var. of *pōkole*, short. **ho'o.pā.kole.** Var. of *ho'opōkole*. 2. n. A fish (no data). 3. vs. Uncertain. *Rare.*
- pā.kō.lea.** vt. 1. To train to grow straight, as an infant's crooked limb; to train to grow in a desired shape, as a plant. 2. To tie or fasten, as a canoe mast. 3. To gather information about one's relatives.
- pā.kole.kole.** 1. Same as *pākalakala*, a seaweed. 2. Redup. of *pākole*.
- pā.kolo.kolo.** n. Probably a weir (term used in land claims of the 1840s).
- pā.kō.II.** n. Musical scale, named for the first three notes of the scale.
- Pā-kolo.lio-kai.ā.ulu.** n. Wind associated with Ke-ālia, Maui.
- pā.kolu.** vt. By threes, three at a time, three times, three-fold; to distribute to three, to divide by three, treble.
- pā.konā.konā.** Similar to *konākonā*, contemptuous. (For. 6:454.)
- Pā-kō.nane.** n. Name of a star said to appear on the night of Hilo in the month of Hinaia-'ele'ele.
- pā.kō.nane.** vi. To shine brightly, of the moon.
- pā.koni.** vi. To throb, ache, as teeth.
- pā.ko'u.** Rare var. of *pōko'u*, short.
- paku.** vt. To send away, expel; to unite portions of tapa by beating. *Rare.* Cf. *kipaku*. (PEP *patu*.)
- pakū.** vi. To burst out, break open; squeeze out; crushed. See ex., *au* 4. **ho'o.pakū.** To burst, etc.
- pā.kū.** n. Curtain, screen, partition, veil; partitions before openings of deep-sea bag nets. *Fig.*, shield, defense. *Iēhowa kō mākou pākū* (Hal. 89.18), the Lord our defense. *Kū pākū ka pali o Nihoa i ka makani* (saying), the cliff of Nihoa stands as a bulwark against the wind [said of one bravely facing misfortune]. (PCP *paatuu*.)
- pā.kū.ā, pā.kū.wā.** vs. Commonplace, trite, ordinary. **ho'o.pā.kū.ā.** To do over and over; to render commonplace or trite, as a song.
- pā.kū.'ai.** n. Public mart (term found in laws 1845-7).
- pā kua.lau.** n. Pearl-shell lure that is dark-colored inside. *Lit.*, showery lure.
- pā.kū.oi.** vi. To do hurriedly and without thoroughness, to skimp. *Rare.*
- pā kuhi.kuhi manawa.** n. Sundial. *Lit.*, flat surface telling time.
- pā.ku'i.** 1. nvi. To splice or add on, append, annex, supplement, engraft (Rom. 11.17), graft; suffix, prefix, affix; extension, wing of a house; additional. See *'ōlelo pāku'i. Lumi pāku'i*, additional room. *Mea pōmaika'i pāku'i*, fringe benefits. *Hō'ike pāku'i*, rebuttal. 2. vt. To beat, pound, oppose, oppress. *Ua pāku'i ka makani mamua o lākou* (Mar. 6.48), the wind beat ahead of them. **ho'o.pā.ku'i.** To beat, cause to beat. (PCP *paatuki*.) 3. vs. Heavy scented, whether sickly sweet or foul. *Ua ho'opailua loa mākou i kēia kālā, ua pāku'i, we are sick of this money, [it's] foul smelling. Pāku'i lua nā pali o Pelekunu* (saying), doubly foul-smelling are the cliffs of Musty [said of vile-smelling places]. *Ua ana pāku'i lā i ke aloha* (chant), satiated with the aroma of love.
- pā ku'i a lua.** n. Arena where *lua* fighting was taught. *Lit.*, striking in *lua* style enclosure.
- paku'i.kui.** Var. of *pākukui* 1, 2.
- pā.ku'i.ku'i.** 1. Redup. of *pāku'i* 1, 2; to splash by beating the water; disjointed, as a poorly constructed story. (2 Sam. 22.43.) **ho'o.pā.ku'i.ku'i.** Redup. of *ho'opāku'i*. *Ua ho'opāku'iku'i 'ia mai kō lāua noho 'ana malaila e nā kānaka, their way of life there received blow after blow from the people.* (PCP *paatukituki*.) 2. vt. To argue, contradict. **ho'o.pā.ku'i.ku'i.** Caus/sim. 3. n. A long fishing net; Emerson specifies a net laid in coral reef, into which fish were driven by beating the water (Malo 212, Emerson note); the joining together of long nets. Also *'aku'iku'i*. 4. n. A surgeonfish (*Acanthurus achilles*), good eating. (PEP *paatuki*.)
- pā.ku'i.pai.** n. Shrimp net. Also *pāloa*.
- pakū.kū.** Redup. of *pakū*. *He hehi 'ia . . . a pakūkū ka waina, the grapes were tramped on and crushed. Pakūkū ahi ka makani* (For. 6:387), the wind breaks forth like fire.
- pā.kukui.** 1. nvi. Shiftless, vagabond; to wander; to play the wanton; to nibble but not take the hook, of fish. 2. n. A method of enriching the soil for taro plantings by use of *kukui* leaves, which in rocky areas were covered with dirt in order to make soil. *Lit.*, candlenut enclosure. (Kep. 153.)
- pā.kule.** Var. spelling of *pā akule*.
- pā.kū.makika.** n. Mosquito net or netting.
- paku.paku.** Rare var. of *pokopoko*, short.
- pakū.pakū.** 1. Redup. of *pakū*. **ho'o.pakū.pakū.** Redup. of *ho'opakū*, to pop, as a Portuguese man-of-war that is stepped upon on the beach. 2. n. A seaweed. Also *pakēpakē*.
- pā kupa.pa'u.** Same as *pā ilina*.
