

- pā.lau 'ula.** n. Thick mat of reddish-brown pandanus leaves with meshes about 4 to 5 cm wide.
- pā.lau.weka.** Same as *palaweka*.
- pala.wai.** n. 1. Athlete's foot. 2. Bottom lands. *Penei ke 'ano o ka mahi 'ai 'ana o ka palawai*, this is how the bottom lands were cultivated.
- pā.lā.wai.** Same as *limu kala wai*, pond-scums.
- pā.lawa.iki.** vs. Neat, tidy, dainty, fastidious; having good taste in clothes and the like.
- pala.weka.** vs. Dim, obscure, indistinct, hazy, as moonlight. Cf. *palauweka, pāpalaweka, palapalaweka*.
- pala.wili.** vt. To twist, turn. *Moe kahuli, hī'ō i ka nahele i ka palawili 'ia e ka noe*, land shell lying down, restless in the forest as it is twisted by the mist.
- pale.** 1. nvt. To ward off, thrust aside, parry, fend off, bar, shield, defend, protect; to ignore a command or law, make void, nullify, prevent, repulse, resist, break, avoid, not adhere to; protection, defense, barrier, warding off, guard; curtain (Puk. 26.4); bib, partition, bar, railing, bulwark, shield, sheath, outer garment; division, canto of a song, scene of a play, division of song in a hula (preceded by both *ka* and *ke*). *Pale lua* (Heb. 9.3), second veil or partition in the temple of Solomon. *Pule pale* (Kep. 57), prayer asking for protection. *Pale 'ōlelo*, disobey. *'Ili pale o kāma'a*, sole of shoes. *Pale hewa i ke kuke*, avoid the duty, smuggle. *Ninainau pale*, cross-examination. *Mea pale*, defendant. *Pale ka 'a'aka*, crosspatch, cantankerous person; *lit.*, cranky one who shoves. *Ua pale ka pilikia*, the trouble is thrust aside, finished, over. *Pale kauoha*, to ignore, fail to carry out a command. *Pale i ke a'o a ka makua*, to thrust aside the teaching of the parent. *Pale ka leo* (Kel. 61), voice is silenced [in death]. *He lā ika-ika 'ole o ke au i ke pale* (For. 5:561), a day when the head current was not strong. **ho'o.pale.** To fend or ward off; to separate, partition off; to defend in court; to disown. *Ma ka 'ao'ao ho'opale*, on the side of the defendant. (PPN *pale*.) 2. vt. To deliver, as a child. 3. nvt. Lining, as of a garment; leaf lining of a ground oven; flap of a *malo*; to cover, overlay, line; to form a barrier. See *pale hou*. 4. n. Gunwale lashed to a canoe. 5. n. An interval of time in music, a bar in music which separates the staff into measures. See below. 6. n. Presser foot on a sewing machine. 7. n. Apron, bib. 8. Also **bale, bare.** n. Barley (*Hordeum* spp.), bran. *Eng. Hua pale*, grain of barley.
- palea.** Pas/imp. of *pale 1*.
- pale.'a'ahu.** n. Underclothes, underwear. (Kel. 105.)
- pale ahi.** n. Fire protection; fireproof.
- paleha.** vs. Loose, slack, sagging; shaking, as a loose object. Cf. *palaleha*.
- pale hā.li'i moena.** n. Coarse mat covering, as spread on the ground; insulting epithet for worthless, low person.
- pale hā.nai.** n. Child's bib.
- pale hau.hana.** See *hauhana*.
- palehe.** Rare var. of *paleha*.
- pale hope.** n. 1. After part of a canoe. 2. Bearers of the after part of a canoe. Cf. *pale wa'a*.
- pale hou.** n. Sweatband, in a hat; protection from perspiration.
- pā lehu.** n. Ash tray (preceded by *ke*).
- pale.hui.** n. Brace or bar, in punctuation. *Lit.*, joining border.
- pale huila.** n. Fender, as of a car. *Lit.*, wheel guard.
- pale.'ili.** n. Undershirt. *Lit.*, skin protector. Cf. *palema'i*.
- pale.'ili o lalo.** n. Underdrawers. (Kel. 105.)
- pale.'ili o luna.** n. Undershirt. (Kel. 105.)
- paleka, bareka.** n. Carbuncle. (Puk. 28.17.) (Heb. *barakath*.)
- pale ka'a.** n. Car bumper.
- pale kai.** n. Breakwater; any wall or embankment that protects the land from the sea, levee; taffrail of a vessel; railing of a vessel. *Lit.*, sea guard.
- pale.kaiko, paredaiso.** n. Paradise. (Probably Gr. *paradeisos*.)
- pale.kalapa, paregarapa.** n. Paragraph. *Eng.* Also *paukū*.
- pale kalu.kalu.** See *kalukalu*.
- pale.kama, balesama.** n. Balsam. (Ezek. 27.17.) *Eng.*
- pale.kana.** nvs. Safe, saved, rescued; convalescent; to ward off, brush aside, rescue, protect; to recover from illness; defense, savior, safety, security. *E ho'oikaika mai 'oe ia'u ā laila palekana wau* (Hal. 119.117), strengthen me, then I am saved. (*Pale 1* + *-kana*, nominalizer: Gram. 6.6.2.) **ho'o.pale.kana.** To save, rescue.
- pale kaua.** n. War defense, shield (Kin. 15.1), defensive armor.
- pale kau.oha.** v. To break or ignore a law.
- pale ke'ōhi.** n. Stirrup shield.
- pale keiki.** nv. To deliver a child; midwife (Kin. 38.28). *Kauka pale keiki*, obstetrician.
- paleki.** n. Brake. *Eng.*
- pale.kikena, paresidena.** Var. of *pelekikena*, president. *Eng.*
- pale kiko.** n. Repeat mark in music.
- pale kila.** n. Armor. *Lit.*, steel shield.
- pale kō.hina.** n. Boundary left by cutting; division between taro patches.
- pale.kokī.** n. Petticoat, skirt. *Eng.* Cf. *pūheheo*.
- pale kō.kō.** n. In music, vertical row of dots which forms a repeat mark. *Lit.*, prolonging bar.
- pale kolo.** n. Horse or ox next to wagon tongue.
- pale.kona, falekona.** n. Falcon. (Oihk. 11.14.)
- palela.** 1. vs. Lazy, indolent, slow-moving; to saunter along as though bored. (Puk. 5.17.) **ho'o.palela.** To cause laziness; same as above. 2. Var. of *palala*, barrel. *Palela li'ili'i*, small barrel, keg.
- pale lā.** n. Awning. *Lit.*, sun protection.
- pale lau.ʻ.** n. Ti-leaf covering; said also to be a prayer asking for release from a taboo that prevents one from leaving a taboo spot.
- pale.lā.** Rare var. of *palalē 1, 2*.
- pale.lei.** n. Head covering of tapa wrapped over the head with the ends hanging down in front. *Rare*.
- pale lima.** n. A shield, worn on the arm; armguard.
- pale lio.** n. Saddle blanket. *Lit.*, horse guard.
- pale.lona, farelona.** n. Furlong, in surveying. *Eng.*
- pale lua.** n. Double bar in musical notation.
- pale lua 'ele.'ele.** n. Heavy black bar in musical notation.
- pale.ma'i.** n. Underdrawers; sometimes used for undershirt (Kel. 45). *Lit.*, genital protection.
- pale.ma'i o lalo.** n. Underdrawers.
- pale.ma'i o luna.** n. Undershirt.
- pale maka.** n. Veil that conceals the face, especially as worn by Arab women.
- pale makani.** n. Windshield.
- palemo.** 1. vi. To sink, be sunk, slip away, vanish; drowned. *Hoku palemo*, the full moon (*hoku*) that vanishes at sunup. **ho'o.palemo.** To drown, plunge into water, sink. (PPN *m(a,e)lemo*, PCP *palemo*.) 2. vs. Promiscuous. *He nohona palemo*, a promiscuous way of living. *He kāne palemo*, a temporary male lover. 3. n. Young of *uhu*, a fish.
- pale moe.** n. Bed sheet.
- pale mua.** n. 1. Fore part of a canoe. 2. Bearers of the fore part of a canoe. Cf. *pale wa'a*.
- palena.** n. 1. Boundary, limit, border, margin, juncture, separation, partitioning; terms of a fraction. Cf. *kau-palena*. *'O ka ho'ohelu a me ka mahale pū, ua kapa 'ia lāua 'elua, 'o nā palena o ka hakina*, the numerator and denominator together, are called the terms of the fraction. **ho'o.palena.** Caus/sim.; to confine. 2. Also **barena.** Var. of *pelena*, crackers.
- palena 'āina.** n. Land boundary.
- palena 'ole.** vs. Boundless, without limit, vast. *He pale-na 'ole ka 'ike*, unsurpassed knowledge.
- pale noho.** n. Seat cover.
- pale nui 'ele.'ele.** n. Heavy black bar in musical notation.
- pā.leo.** nvi. To converse, chat; to talk loudly; chatting.
