

- Cf. *pā 4* for *pā i ka leo*. 'O ko'u makemake iā'oe, 'o ka pāleo iki aku (song), my desire with you, is to chat a little.
- pā.leo.leo.** Redup. of *pāleo*.
- pā.leo.leo.ā.** nvi. To talk loudly and unpleasantly; a din; loud reviling talk. (Gram. 6.5.)
- pale.ō.pua.** vt. To pardon offenses, as by a priest's offering, in pagan times only. *Rare. Lit.*, ward off billowy clouds.
- pale pā.kau.kau.** n. Table cloth.
- pale pā.kau.kau 'aila.** n. Oilcloth.
- pale.pale.** 1. Redup. of *pale 1-3*; to parry, as in boxing. *Palepale ke kapa o ka wahine hele ua o Ko'olau* (For. 6:476), protecting the tapa of the woman going into the Ko'olau rain. (PNP *palepale*.) 2. Same as *pale 4*.
- pale pā.pale.** n. Hat lining.
- pā.lepe.lepe.** n. Young cactus leaf.
- pale.piwa.** n. All species of eucalyptus trees. *Lit.*, prevent fever, so called because the leaves were used as fever medicine, and in the *pūlo'ulo'u* steam bath. Also 'eukalikia, nuhōlani. 'Aila palepiwa, eucalyptus oil.
- pā.lepo.** n. 1. Adobe wall. 2. Clay dish, soiled dish.
- pale po'o.hiwi.** n. Shoulder pads or protection.
- pale puka.ani.ani.** n. Window curtain, drapes.
- pale uhi.** n. Veil, covering.
- pā.leu.leu.** vs. Old, worn-out, as tapa, mats, or clothing. Cf. 'āleuleu.
- pale uluna.** n. Pillowcase. *Lit.*, pillow guard.
- pale uma.uma.** n. Breastplate, as in armor. (Isa. 59.17.) *Lit.*, chest shield.
- pale uma.uma unahi.** n. Brigandine (Ier. 46.4), coat of mail. *Lit.*, scales chest shield.
- pale 'umeke.** n. Dish towel. *Lit.*, bowl protection, so called because dish towels were tied about poi bowls to prevent dust or insects from falling in.
- pā.lewa.** n. Low wooden bowl.
- pale wa'a.** n. Persons who protect (*pale*) a log canoe being carried from the forest to the sea. Those in front were *pale mua*, those aft were *pale hope*.
- pale wai.** n. Breakwater.
- pale wai.ū.** n. Brassiere. *Lit.*, breast guard.
- pale.wā.wae.** n. 1. The joy weed (*Alternanthera amoena*), a small herb from Brazil, used as a low border for paths and flower beds. It has red, branching stems and variegated red, green, and yellow, small oval leaves. (Neal 334.) 2. Small, fan-shaped brown seaweeds (two species of *Padina* [*P. commersonii*, light-brown, and *P. vickersiae*, larger, darker-brown]), common on the reef, each fan more or less split and curled. Not eaten.
- pale wā.wae.** n. Foot covering or protection; house slipper or sandals (also *kāma'a pale wāwae*); leather part of stirrups covering the rider's feet. *He pale wāwae ko'u 'ili nona* (For. 5:547), my skin is [something] for her feet to walk upon.
- pali.** nvs, nvi. Cliff, precipice, steep hill or slope suitable for *olonā* or *wauke*; full of cliffs; to be a cliff. *Fig.*, an obstacle, difficulty; haughty or disdainful. See ex., *pu'upu'u 1* and saying, *ha'akoa'e. E pali paha wau?* Shall I become [magically] a cliff? *He pali lele koa'e* (poetic), a cliff where tropic birds fly [i.e., very high]. *Pali kaulu 'ole ka lani*, the chief is a cliff without a jog [of very high rank]. *Pali ke kua, mahina ke alo*, the back is a cliff, the front a moon [said of handsome persons]. *Pali mai nā maka o ka hoa* (song), the companion's eyes are a haughty cliff. (PCP *pali*, possibly PEP.)
- pā.lia.lia.** Var. of *ālialia*.
- pā lihi.** vi. To touch lightly, graze.
- pā li'i.li'i.** n. Small dish; saucer (preceded by *ke*).
- palika.** 1. Also *barika.* n. Carbuncle. (Heb. *barakath*.) 2. (Cap.) Also *Parisa.* nvs. Paris; Parisian. *Eng.*
- pali kā.moe.** n. Low hillock, terrace.
- pali.keā.** n. A sweet potato.
- Pali.kū.** n. 1. Initial point of a genealogy line. (Malo 2.) 2. Priests of Lono (Malo 159); ancient order of priests (AP.)
- pali kū.** n. Vertical cliff.
- pali ku'i.** n. Notched, toothed cliff; joined succession of cliffs.
- palila.** n. An endangered gray, yellow, and white Hawaiian honey creeper (*Psittirostra bailleui*, *P. kona*); endemic to the island of Hawai'i. Its bill is especially suited for opening *māmane* tree pods. Its only home is on Mauna Kea, Hawai'i. See ex., *olokē, pi'oloke*.
- palile.** Same as *lile*. *Rare.*
- pā.ii.lea.** vs. Inactive, sluggish.
- palili.** n. Small weak taro shoot (preceded by *ke*). *He make nō ke kalo, ā ola nō i ke palili* (saying), the old taro stalk is dead, but survives in the shoots [the ancestors are dead, but survive in their offsprings].
- Pali-loa.** n. Rain name.
- pali loa.** nvs. Distant or tall cliff. *Fig.*, distant, aloof, disdainful; aristocratic, regal.
- palima.** nvt. Primer; to study a primer. *Eng.*
- pā.lima.** 1. vt. Five times, in fives, fivefold; to divide in fives or distribute in fives. *Hānau pālima*, quintuplet birth. **ho'o.pā.lima.** To divide in fives; same as above. 2. n. Temporary booth occupied by priests during taboo days of a heiau.
- pā.lina.** Rare var. of *papālina*. Cf. *puhi pālina*.
- pali.pa'a.** n. Cliff.
- pali.pa'a maoli.** n. Base of a cliff. (*Thrum's Annual*, 1925, p. 68.)
- pali.pali.** vs. Precipitous, full of cliffs and steep hills. **ho'o.pali.pali.** Caus/sim. *E 'eku i ka moku e kupu ā pu'u, e ho'opalipali ana ke kua, ho'opalipali ke alo* (KL lines 488-9), root up the land that it may grow high, build cliffs in back, build cliffs in front. (PCP *palipali*.)
- Pali-uli.** n. A legendary land of plenty and joy, said to be on Hawai'i, where chiefs' children were raised; now a place name on several islands. *Lit.*, green cliff. See chant, *pulelo* and saying, *glory. Hanohano Pali-uli i ka ua noe*, majestic is Pali-uli in the misty rain [said in admiration of a person].
- palo.** n. 1. Revelation, as from the gods. *Rare.* See For. 6:4. 2. Parlor. *Eng.*
- palō, ho'o.palō.** vi. 1. To feign ignorance. 2. To act the goody-goody.
- pā.loa.** 1. Same as *pāku'ipai*; long seine, as used for mullet. (PCP *paaloo*.) 2. n. A fish (no data).
- pā loa.** n. Long fence or enclosure, long wing fence to guide cattle to corral.
- pā.loka, balota.** n. Ballot, poll, vote. *Eng. Koho pāloka*, to vote. *Po'e koho pāloka*, voters. *Ka pāloka a Kū*, the ballot cast by Kū. *Ka pāloka o Kū*, the vote for Kū. *Hū'awi i ka pāloka*, to cast a ballot.
- paloke.** vs. Broken. *Eng.*
- pā.loke.** Same as *pālokeloke*.
- pā.loke.loke.** vs. Loose-fitting, as a peg or key; not solid, wobbly, as a table.
- palola, parola.** n. Parole. *Eng.*
- pā.lola.** vs. Helpless, blundering, awkward. *Rare.*
- pā.lola.lola.** Redup. of *pāloka*, helpless.
- palolo.** vs. Glib-tongued, garrulous; gossiping, as maliciously. *Palolo lua*, very gossipy, glib. **ho'o.palolo.** To cause garrulousness; same as above.
- pā.lolo.** n. Clay; hard, sticky mud; mortar (Puk. 1.14).
- palolo hua.** vs. Glib in speech, garrulous.
- pālo.lolo.** Redup. of *pāloka*; claylike, sticky.
- palo.meka, barometa.** n. Barometer. *Eng.*
- pā.lona, barona.** n. Baron. *Eng.*
- pā.lo'o.** Rare var. of *pāmalō*.
- palu.** 1. vt. To lick, lap. (Nah. 22.4.) **ho'o.palu.** To cause to lick, to lick. (Perhaps PPN *palu*.) 2. n. A relish made of head or stomach of fish, with *kukui* relish, garlic, chili peppers; fish bait made of fish head or stomach, also used for chumming. See *ku'i palu* and ex., 'u'u. *Kā palu*, a bailer with *palu* bait in it [said deprecatingly of ordinary food]. *Ahu ka 'ala'ala palu*, a heap of octopus liver bait [not worth anything at all]. (PPN *palu*.) 3. Same as *palupalu*.
