

- papa 'ō.lewa.lewa.** Same as *papa lewalewa*. (Malo 212, Emerson note.) *Rare*.
- Papa o nā Kahu Kula o ke Kula.nui.** n. Board of Regents of the University.
- pā.pā.ono.** Redup. of *pāono*. *Ā 'o ua po'e mea ola lā 'ehā, ua pāpāono lākou i nā 'ēheu* (Hoik. 4.8), and the four beasts had each of them six wings.
- papapa.** n. Young stage of *nenuē*, rudder fish.
- papa.pā.** Redup. of *pā 1*.
- pā.papa.** 1. vs. Low, flat, as a reef. Cf. *hāpapa*. 2. n. Beans, peas, lentils; the hyacinth bean (*Dolichos lablab*), from tropical Asia, a long vine somewhat like the Lima bean and having edible seeds, growing wild in Hawai'i. Also *pī*. (Neal 468.) *Ka pāpapa maka a me ka pī a me ka pāpapa pāpā'a* (2 Sam. 17.28), beans and lentils and parched pulse.
- papa pā'a.kai.** n. Salt flat. *Fig.*, sour disposition.
- papa.pā'i.** Reduplication and frequentative of *pā'i 1*.
- papa pā'i.** n. Printing press. *Ka mana o ka papa pā'i*, the power of the press.
- papa pā'ina.** n. Table for eating.
- papa palaoa.** n. Breadboard; cake (Ier. 7.18); pancake, wafer (*rare*).
- papa pala.pala.** n. Writing desk, board, or flat surface where writing is done.
- papa.papa.** Same as *papa 1*. *Rare*. *I ka papapapa ka nalu o O'ahu* (chant), the waves of O'ahu on the flat reefs. (PPN *papapapa*.)
- papa.pau.** Redup. of *papau*; everyone. *A no ka hewa 'ana o Kumu-honua mā, papapau ai kōnaka i ka make* (Kep. 49), because of the sin of Kumu-honua, everybody died. **ho'o.papa.pau.** Redup. of *ho'opapau*.
- papa pelena (berena).** n. A flat cake. *Biblical*.
- papa pō.haku.** n. 1. Row or tier of stones. 2. Slate, stone tablet. 3. Stone table, stone flat, or stone surface, as for pounding.
- papa po'o.** n. The leading division, class, rank, especially the first company of warriors sent out to plunder in order to provoke war. *Lit.*, head rank.
- papa.pū.** 1. n. Row or tier of guns, class of guns. 2. vs. Completely covered, as rocks by shellfish. *Papapū ka pōhaku i ka 'opihi*, the rock is covered with limpets.
- papa.pueo.** n. A variety of taro, grown on Maui; petioles deep-pink at base, grading to light-pink and green with white edge; corm used for poi. *Lit.*, owl flat.
- papa pu'u.kani.** n. Choir, choral group.
- papau.** vs. Deeply engaged, as in an activity; finished; engrossed, absorbed, united; all, all together. Cf. *pau*. *Ua papau ko'u no'ono'o i ka hana*, my entire thoughts are absorbed in the work. *Papau pū lākou i ka 'eha*, they were all hurt. **ho'o.papau.** To devote oneself, to make an effort to finish up, to concentrate.
- pā.pā'u.** nvs. Shallow, shoal. *Pāpā'u ka 'ike o kēlā kōnaka*, that man's knowledge is shallow. (PNP *papaku*.)
- pā.paua.** n. A bivalve (*Isognomon*), clam. (KL line 25.) But cf. *'ōlepe pāpaua*.
- pā.paua momi.** n. A bivalve (said to be *Chama iostoma*).
- papa uhi wa'a.** n. Board used to cover space forward of the forward outrigger boom.
- papa'ula.** n. A mat motif consisting of a row of opposing triangles with their apices touching.
- pā.pā.uli.** Redup. of *pāuli*. *E ho'omaka mai ai ka 'ino ka pāpāuli makani, ua, a me ke kai* (Kep. 93), beginning the storm, wind bringing clouds and dark seas, rain, and sea.
- papau make.** nvi. To die, of many; complete annihilation; cemetery (*rare*).
- pā.pā'umi.** Redup. of *pā'umi*.
- papa'unu.** vt. To fill up, cram.
- papa waena.** n. Middle floor or story; middle class or layer.
- papa waha nui.** n. Large baglike net used for *akule* fish.
- Papa-wai.** n. Rain name associated with Olowalu, West Maui.
- pā.pā.walu.** Redup. of *pāwalu*.
- papa wili.** n. Mixing board or tray.
- papa wili 'ai.** n. Mixing board, food trough, board for kneading poi, kneading trough (Puk. 12.34).
- pape.kema, bapetema.** nvt. To baptize, baptismal; baptism. Also *papakema*. Cf. *keiki papakema, papakema*.
- Pape.kike, Bapetite.** n. Baptist. *Eng.*
- pape.kiko, bapetiso.** 1. nvt. To baptize; baptismal. 2. (*Cap.*) nvs. Baptist.
- pā pepa.** n. Paper plate or dish (preceded by *ke*).
- Papine.** n. Baffin. *Eng. Kai o Papine*, Baffin Bay.
- pā.pine.** n. Pen where oxen were yoked together, corral.
- pā.pio.** 1. Same as *pāpiopio*, a fish. (PCP *papio*.) 2. vt. Pressed down, flat, especially of a woman's *pā'ū*, skirt; furred, as a flag, or as the *makahiki* banner; to hold flat; to tuck under, as a hen with chicks; sideways. *Noho pāpio*, to sit properly with knees together and feet to one side, of women. *Pāpio i ka palekoki*, to hold the skirt flat down [as in a strong wind]. *Ka-malo-pāpio* (name), the *malo* [-flap] held down.
- pā.pī'o.** nvi. To form an arch; to arch; an arch.
- pā.pio.pio.** n. The young stage of growth of *ulua*, a fish.
- pā.pipi.** Same as *pānini*, cactus. *Lit.*, cattle fence.
- pā.pipi pua.** Same as *pānini-o-Ka-puna-hou*.
- pā pō.haku.** n. Stone wall.
- Pā.polo.hiwa.** n. Name of a star observed by priests.
- pā.po'o.** v. To dive to the opening of a *papa* (net) in fishing. *Lit.*, head touching.
- pā.pū.** 1. n. Fort, fortress. *Lit.*, gun enclosure. *Alanui Pāpū*, Fort Street. 2. nvs. A plain, clear piece of ground; clear, unobstructed, visible, in plain sight, directly confronting. *Pāpū like* (For. 5:649), level, even. *Kū pāpū mai ka pali i mua o ka hale*, the cliff stood directly visible in front of the house. (PCP *paapu*.)
- pā.pua.** nv. To shoot with bow and arrow; archery.
- pā.pū.heā.** n. Dead calm.
- pā.puhene.** Same as *pūhenehene*, the game.
- pā.pū.lewa.** n. Flying fortress, battleship.
- papulo, papuro.** n. Papyrus, rush (Ioba 8.11). (Gr. *papuros*.) See *kaluhā*.
- pā.pulō, bafulo.** n. Buffalo. *Eng.* Cf. *pūpalō*.
- papuna, babuna.** n. Baboon. *Eng.*
- pā puni.** n. Circular enclosure, surrounding wall, as about a fishpond.
- pau.** 1. vs. Finished, ended, through, terminated, completed, over, all done; final, finishing; entirely, completely, very much; after; all, to have all; to be completely possessed, consumed, destroyed. (Used in *loa'a*-type constructions, Gram. 4, as: *E pau nō kēia hana iā kākou*, we will finally finish this work; also an intensifier before verbs: see *pau 'eka, pau kilo, pau lehia, pau 'ono, pau pā'ele*. *Pau* or *pau ā* precedes some words with meaning of "very, very much." Cf. *pau ma'alea, pau 'ole, pau 'ono*. Cf. also *apau, kū'ike, pau a pau, pau loa, pau nui, -pau pilikia*. *Pau ka ha'awina*, the lesson is finished. *Pau ke ka'a i ka nāhāhā*, the car was completely destroyed. *Pau 'eka*, very dirty, filthy. *Okī pau ka hana a ka huila*, extremely wonderful is the doing of the wheel. *Pau nā luna i ka 'eha*, all the officers were injured. *Pau i ka lilo*, all sold, gone, taken, consumed. *Ka pau 'ana ihola nō ia o ka'u ha'awina*, my lesson is just finished. *Pau Pele, pau manō*, consumed by Pele, consumed by a shark [an oath meaning "may I be destroyed if I have not spoken truth"]. *Pau po'o, pau hi'u*, consumed head, consumed tail [total destruction]. **ho'o.pau.** To put an end to, finish, get rid of, suppress, terminate, conclude, annul, stop, cancel, revoke, repeal, abolish, consume; to dismiss or discharge, as from work; to use too much, waste; cancellation, finishing; completely, all. Cf. *ho'opau mana-wa*. *Ho'opau 'ana*, abolition, cancellation, revocation. *Ho'opau ho'o'ino 'ia aku*, dishonorably discharged [as from the armed services]. *Ho'opau 'ai*, to waste food, said figuratively of one not worth his food. *Ho'opau*
