

**pau.lā.ʻī.** vi. To walk over the sea or fire, as a god.

**pau.lēhia.** vs. To be overwhelmed (Kel. 107); completely, totally immersed, absorbed. *Paulehia i ka hiamoe*, fast asleep. Also *paulehua*.

**pau.lēhia.** vs. Expert; to be such.

**pau.lēhua.** Same as *paulehia*.

**pau.lēle.** nvt. Faith, confidence, trust; to have faith, confidence, to believe implicitly; to lean against, rely on. *Paulele 'ia*, trusted, trustworthy. *'A'ole au i 'ike i ka paulele nui* (Luka 7.9), I have not seen so great faith.

**pā.uli.** nvs. Dark, as sea or skin; gloom, darkness. *Ua ho'i ka pāuli makani kualau* (For. 5:91), the gloomy wind showers have gone. *He pāuli hiwa na ka ua hāoa*, deep gloom of the pelting rain.

**pau.lia.** Pas/imp. of *pau l*. Rare.

**Pā.uli-kū-ali'i.** n. A star observed by priests in the month of Ikiiki. *Lit.*, chief-like darkness.

**-paulina.** ho'o.pau.lina. Same as *ho'opaulinalina*.

**pau.lina.lina.** vi. To gird the waist tightly, to stretch, make taut.

**-paulinalina.** ho'o.pau.lina.lina. To waste time on trifles, to take life easy, relax.

**pā.uli.uli.** Redup. of *pāuli*.

**pau loa.** vs. All, everything, to have all. Cf. *pau. Pau loa iāia ka 'ike*, he has all the knowledge.

**pau.lua.** See *wa'a paulua*.

**pā.'ulu.'ā.** vt. To abuse, mistreat, knock around; to beat carelessly, as poi that one does not pound until all the lumps are removed.

**pauma.** vt. Pump; to pump. *Eng.*

**pā.uma.** 1. n. Large curved needle, as used in sewing gunny sacks. 2. vs. Curved, bent, as a needle. 3. n. Breastbone, as of a chicken. 4. vi. To turn, move along, push; to turn into the wind, to face the wind, as a ship, bird. *Pāuma wāwae*, tread of feet. *Kīkaha koa'e, lele pāuma ka hulu māewaewa* (PH 206), the tropic bird soars, the tousled feathers beat against the wind. 5. vi. To slosh a canoe back and forth, so as to empty it of water. *Rare*.

**pā.uma.** nv. Standing wrist wrestling: the players face each other, and each grasps the other's right thumb, and tries to force the opponent's hand to his chest; to wrestle thus. *Lit.*, chest touching.

**pau.ma'a.lēa.** Intensive of *ma'alea*.

**pau.mā.'ēle.** vs. Dirty, defiled, sordid, unclean. *Ua pau-mā'ēle kō 'oukou mau lima i ke koko* (Isa. 59.3), your hands are defiled with blood. **ho'o.pau.mā.'ēle.** To soil, make dirty, smear, pollute, befoul, defile.

**Pau.maka.** n. A star in the month of Ikiiki, an omen for chiefs.

**pau.mā.kō.** nvt. Grief, mourning, lamentation; to weep loudly. *I ka paumākō o ko'u na'au* (Hal. 61.2), when my heart is overwhelmed. **ho'o.pau.mā.kō.** To cause great grief, lamentation; to pretend grief.

**pauma.kō.kō.** Redup. of *paumākō*.

**Pau-makua.** n. A small bright star that appears on the night of Hilo in the month of Welo and stays all the month.

**Pau-makua-lani.** n. A star observed by priests, in the month of Kaulua and visible through the month of Ikiiki. Cf. *Ka-'ōnohi-ali'i*.

**-pau manawa.** ho'o.pau manawa. To waste time; not worth doing, undesirable, unnecessary, waste of effort.

**pā.uma.uma.** Same as *pa'iāuma*.

**pau.mau.no'o.no'o.** n. Keepsake, memento. *Rare. Lit.*, all continuing thoughts.

**pauma.wai.** n. Water pump.

**pā.ume.'ume.** 1. nvi. Tug-of-war game; to play such a game, in land or sea. Also *hukihuki*. 2. nvt. Contentious, quarreling, contending, fighting.

**pā.'umi.** vt. Ten times, tenfold, by tens; to divide by tens or distribute by tens; decimal.

**pau.ne'i.ne'i.** Excited; to cry out, as in excitement. (And.)

**pau.nihi.nihi.** n. Small, worthless taro shoots.

**pau nui.** vi. All (followed by qualifying verb or noun). *Pau nui nā koa i ka nāholo*, all the soldiers fled. *Pau nui mai nei ke kalo i ka 'ai 'ia*, all the taro has been eaten. *Ua pau nui ka hana*, all the work is finished.

**pau.ōa.** n. A fern (*Dryopteris squamigera*) to 90 cm or more high, the stem clothed with tan scales, the frond triangular to ovate and two or three times pinnate.

**pā.'ū-o-Hi'i.aka.** n. 1. A native beach vine (*Jacquemontia sandwicensis*), in the morning-glory family, with pale blue or white flowers and small rounded leaves. *Lit.*, sarong of Hi'iaka, so named because the goddess Pele, on returning from a long morning's fishing trip, found that this little vine had spread itself over her baby sister, Hi'iaka, whom she had laid on the beach, and had protected the baby from the sun. (Neal 710.) Also *kākua-o-Hi'iaka*. 2. A kind of red seaweed with wide, thin thallus. Perhaps same as *limu hā'ula*. 3. Same as *lepe-o-Hina*, a seaweed. 4. A variety of taro: petiole and leaf have smoky look; corm white, used to make good, gray poi. 5. A variety of sweet potato.

**pau 'ōle.** vs. Endless, unceasing, always. *Me ke aloha pau 'ole*, with love forever.

**pā.'ū-o-Lu'u.kia.** See *pā'ū l*.

**pau 'ono.** vs. Very delicious, etc. Cf. *'ono*.

**pā.'ū-o-Pala'e.** Another name for the *pala'ā* fern. *Pala'e* was a servant of Pele and a companion of Hi'iaka.

**pau pā.'ēle.** vs. Very black, dirty. See *pā'ele*.

**pau.pau.** Same as *papau*. *Ke kū lā nā ki'i 'elua i ka pau-pau make* (For. 6:369), the two images stood there in the slaughter of all.

**pa'u'pa'u.** Redup. of *pa'u l*, 2.

**pa'ū.pa'ū.** Redup. of *pa'ū*. **ho'o.pa'ū.pa'ū.** Redup. of *ho'opa'ū*. 2. n. Overlaid tapa (Kam. 76:115) said to be so called because it was wet during its manufacture; sometimes worn by dancers.

**pau.pau.aho.** Redup. of *pauaho*. See *ex.*, *kahiko l*.

**pa'u.pa'u.hia.** Redup. of *pa'uhia*. **ho'o.pa'u.pa'u.hia.** Redup. of *ho'opa'uhia*.

**pā.'upena.** n. A series of network of pens or corrals.

**Pa'ū-pili.** n. Rain name associated with Lahaina, Maui. *Lit.*, rain that moistens *pili* grass. *Ua 'ike 'ia 'oe e Rain Pa'ū-pili* (song), you are seen by Pa'ū-pili rain.

**-pau pilikia.** ho'o.pau pili.kia. To attend the calls of nature. *Lit.*, to put an end to trouble. *Wahi ho'opau pilikia*, toilet, outhouse.

**pau pono.** vs. Completely finished, terminated.

**pau pū.** vs. All together, including all; completely demolished, etc. Cf. *pau. Pau pū kākou i ka huhū 'ia e ke kumu*, every one of us was scolded by the teacher.

**pā.'ū.'ū.** 1. Redup. of *pa'ū*, soaked. 2. n. Second stage in the growth of *ulua*, a fish. Cf. *pāpio, ulua*. 3. n. A variety of sweet potato.

**Pau.wala.** n. A star that appears in the night of Muku in the month of Māhoe Mua, and remains visible through the month of Māhoe Hope; it follows the star Ulu-loa, and was considered the latter's "servant."

**pā.uwea.** Var. spelling of *pā.uea*.

**pawa.** 1. n. The darkness just before dawn, predawn. See *mokupawa*. *Moku ka pawa*, the predawn darkness is breaking. *I ka moku 'ana o ka pawa* (1 Sam. 11.11), in the morning watch. 2. vs. Smooth, fat and sleek. *Rare*. 3. n. Custom. *Rare*. 4. (Cap.) n. Name of a star (no data).

**pā.wā.** Same as *oeoe*, bull-roarer.

**pā.wa'a.** Untamed, unruly, uncivil, bad-mannered. (AP.)

**pā.wa'a.** n. Canoe enclosure; touching of canoes.

**pā.wai.** Same as *limu kala wai*, pond scums.

**pā.wai.** 1. n. Water trough or container. (Kin. 30.41.) (Preceded by *ke*). (PCP *paa wai*.) 2. v. To have water, take a sip or drink.

**pā.waina.** n. Vineyard.

**pā.walē.** n. Native dock (*Rumex giganteus* and *R. skottsbergii*), a coarse erect or vinelike plant with ovate or oblong leaves, and topped with panicles of tiny flow-
