

- ers, belonging to the buckwheat family. Also *uhauha-kō*. See also *hu'ahu'akō*.
- pā.wali.** vi. To talk soothingly, softly, sweetly, sometimes to flatter or deceive. *Lit.*, touch smoothness.
- pā.walu.** vt. By eights, eightfold; to divide by eights, to have eight, distribute to eight, eight times. See *pāpā-walu*; song, *lino* 2; and chant, *malia* 1.
- pā.wao.** vi. To see indistinctly, uncertainly. *Rare*.
- pawa.pawa.** Redup. of *pawa* 2. *Rare*.
- pā.wā.wahi pīpi.** n. Pen or corral for separating cattle.
- pā.wehe.** nvt. Generic name for colored geometric motifs, as on *makaloa* mats made on Ni'ihau, bowls, and gourds; to make such designs.
- pā.wehe pū.pū.** n. Tapa beater design.
- pā.wehi.** vt. To beautify, adorn. Cf. *wehi* 1. *Ua Kani-lehua i pāwehi ho'oipo 'ia . . . me ka lehua*, Kani-lehua rain lovingly adorned . . . with *lehua*.
- pā.wela.** nvs. Overcooked, scorched, burned; a burn.
- pā.welu.** vs. Old, worn, ragged. *Fig.*, worthless.
- pā.weo.** vi. To turn away the face, as in order to avoid seeing someone. *Maka pāweo*, to avert the eyes. *Ā he aha kāu hana e pāweo nei, ē ka makani Pu'u-lena* (song), why are you turning away, O Pu'u-lena wind.
- ho'o.pā.weo.** To cause to turn away, snub, etc.
- pā.wili 'ai.** Same as *papa wili 'ai*. (Puk. 8.3.)
- pē.** prep. Like, resembling. (Gram. 9.12.) *Pē kēia*, like this, thus. (PPN *pehee*, PNP *pe*.)
- pē-, pē-** Like, resembling (in the demonstratives *pēia*, *pēlā*, *pēnā*, *penei* and *pehea*). (Gram. 8.3.) (PPN *pehe-*.)
- pē.** 1. vs. Crushed, flattened; humble, low, modest. *Na'au pē*, modest heart. *Kani pē*, a hollow flat sound. **ho'o.pē.** To crush, break fine, mash, pulverize; to cringe, assume a humble or fearful attitude. See ex., *kūpaoa*. (PPN *pe'e*.) 2. vs. Perfumed, sweet with fragrance. *Nolu pē i ke onaona* (song), softly fragrant with perfume. **ho'o.pē.** To perfume, anoint. 3. vs. Drenched, soaked (often following *pulu* or *nolu*; sometimes *drenched* and *perfumed* [*pē* 2] are combined). *Pulu pē nei 'ili i ka ua*, this skin is drenched and soaked by the rain. (PEP *pe'e*.) **ho'o.pē.** To drench, soak. 4. vt. To bribe. Cf. *kīpē*. **ho'o.pē.** Caus/sim. 5. nvt. Pay; to pay. *Eng*.
- pea.** 1. Also **fea.** n. Fair, carnival, exhibit. *Eng*. 2. n. Pear, avocado (*Persea americana*). (Neal 363-4.) *Eng*. 3. Also **bea.** n. Bear. *Eng*.
- pe'a.** 1. nvs. A cross (X-shaped; cf. the Christian cross, *ke'a*); to cross, as the hands or arms; to cross and tie; to turn and go. *Pe'a a'ela nā lima i ke kua*, crossed the hands on the back [a sign of grief (FS 285), anger, danger, or an insulting way to wish bad luck on another]. **ho'o.pe'a.** To cross and tie; *fig.*, to persecute. *No ka huāhuā i ho'ope'a aku ai lākou iāia* (Mat. 27.18), for envy they had bound him. (PCP *peka*.) 2. n. Bat. Cf. more common *'ōpe'ape'a*. *Hanalei . . . 'āina a ka pe'a i noho ai* (FS 95). *Hanalei . . . land where the bat lived*. (PPN *peka*.) 3. n. Starfish, various species of Asteroidea. (KL line 18.) Also *pe'ape'a*, *hōkū kai*. 4. n. Sail, as of a canoe. 5. n. Forks or branches made of stalks of feathers bound at their bases with *'ie'ie* roots, coming together to form the *ko'o* (stalk) which in turn is attached to the *kāhili* staff. 6. n. Boundary, edge, border, as of land. *Mai kēlā pe'a ā kēia pe'a*, from that border to this. *E kau mai ana 'o Hala-'ani'ani ma ka pe'a o ka nalu* (Laie 509), *Hala-'ani'ani* landed on the edge of the wave. 7. vs. Menstruating, unclean, tattered (FS 167); to menstruate. *Hale pe'a*, menstrual house. *Kapa pe'a* (Isa. 64.6), filthy cloth. 8. n. Kite. 9. n. Ti-leaf thatch bundle. 10. n. Base of a leaf. *Rare*. 11. n. Sacred house.
- pe'a hēke.** n. Triangular sail set above the gaff; topsail. Cf. *kia lua pe'a heke*.
- pe'ahi.** 1. nvt. Fan; to fan, brush, wave, signal, beckon, winnow. *Ka mea i pe'ahi 'ia i ka pe'ahi* (Isa. 30.24), which has been winnowed with the fan. **ho'o.pe'ahi.** To beckon or wave, pretend to wave, etc. (PCP *peka(f,s)i*.) 2. n. The open hand, bones of the hand. *Kou pe'ahi 'ākau, a me kou lima* (Hal. 44.3), your right hand and your arm. 3. n. A native fern (*Microsorium spectrum* syn. *Polypodium spectrum*) about 30 cm high, the fronds broad, pointed, commonly three-lobed. (Neal 26.) 4. n. A dark-colored stone with grain said to suggest the fingers of a hand. *Rare*.
- pe'ahi lima.** nv. The open hand, a hand's breadth (Ezek. 40.5); to beckon or wave with the hand.
- pe'ahi uila.** n. Electric fan.
- pe'a hope.** n. Mainsail.
- pe'a ihu.** n. Jib sail. *Lit.*, bow sail.
- pe'a.kua.** n. A trusted relative of a chief who attends to his personal needs. *Lit.*, back-cross, so called because such a person might go behind the back of the chief.
- pe'a kua. ho'o.pe'a kua.** To cross the hands behind the back. See *pe'a* 1.
- pe'a nui.** n. Mainsail. *Lit.*, big sail.
- pe'a oe, pe'a oe.oe.** n. A long sail.
- pe'a.pe'a.** 1. Redup. of *pe'a* 1; crossing. *Fig.*, entangled, perplexity. 2. n. Hawaiian bat (*Lasiurus cinereus*). Also *'ōpe'ape'a*, *'āpe'ape'a*, *pe'a*. (Probably PPN *pekapeka*.) 3. n. Small *pe'a*, starfish. (KL line 18.) 4. Redup. of *pe'a* 7; filthy, unclean; slime. (KL lines 589-92.) 5. See *pe'ape'a pōhaku*.
- pe'a.pe'ahi.** Redup. of *pe'ahi* 1. **ho'o.pe'a.pe'ahi.** Redup. of *ho'ope'ahi*.
- pe'a.pe'a pō.haku.** n. Heap of pebbles, as at the opening of an octopus burrow.
- peawa, beava.** n. Beaver. *Eng*.
- pea.wini.** n. Fair wind. *Eng*.
- pe'ē.** vi. 1. To hide oneself; hiding, clandestine. Cf. *hūnā*, vt, to hide an object. *E pe'e ana au iā La'a-kea*, I'm hiding from La'a-kea. **ho'o.pe'ē.** To hide or pretend to hide. (PCP *peke*; cf. Maori *whakapeke*.) 2. vs. Coarse, thick. *Rare*. Cf. *pe'ekue*.
- pe'ē-** See *pe'elua*, *pe'epe'emakawalu*.
- Pe'ē-hala.** n. Name of a wind associated with Hāmākua, Hawai'i. Cf. *Pe'e-pū-hala-hīnano*.
- pe'ē.kue.** Same as *pepe'ekue*. Cf. *honu pe'ekue*. 'O *ke kā pe'ekue*, 'o *ke kā lahilahi* (For. 5:89), the thick bailer, the thin bailer.
- pe'ē.lua.** 1. n. Caterpillar (2 Oihn. 6.28; KL line 287); army worm (*Cirphis unipuncta*). Also *kupa*. 2. vs. Brindled, striped: see *pōpoki*.
- pe'ē.lue.** Var. of *pe'elua*.
- pe'ē.lulu.** nvs. Confusing; confusion. *Rare*. **ho'o.pe'ē-lulu.** To create confusion; confusion; confusing.
- pe'ē.one.** n. Sand crab that buries itself backwards in wet sand (*Hippa pacifica*). *Lit.*, sand hiding.
- pe'ē pao.** nv. One who hides in a cave; to hide in a cave; secret cave; term of contempt for vagabonds or cowards.
- Pe'ē-pā-pō.haku.** n. Name of a rain associated with Kau-pō, Maui. *Lit.*, hide [at the] stone wall.
- pe'ē.pe'ē.** 1. Redup. of *pe'e* 1. *Pe'epe'e pueo*, to hide like an owl, i.e., in a tree. **ho'o.pe'ē.pe'ē.** Redup. of *ho'ope'e*; camouflage. 2. Same as *līpe'epe'e*, a seaweed. *Maui*. 3. n. Name of an ancient illness (no data).
- pe'ē.pe'ē akua.** Same as *pe'epe'e kua*.
- pe'ē.pe'ē kua.** nv. The game of hide-and-seek; to play the game (short for *pe'epe'e akua*, hiding ghost).
- pe'ē.pe'ē.kue.** Redup. of *pe'ekue*.
- pe'ē.pe'ē.maka.walu.** 1. n. Large house spider. Cf. *hula pe'epe'emakawalu*. 2. vs. Alert.
- pe'ē poli.** vs. To hide in one's bosom, as a secret; secretive. *Ka lei pe'e poli* (Kel. 2), child cherished in the heart.
- Pe'ē-pū-hala-hīnano.** n. Rain name. Cf. *Pe'e-hala*.
- pehe.** 1. n. Owl snare. *Rare*. 2. Same as *mehe*, like. *Pehe ua lā*, like rain. 3. vs. Unsteady. *Rare*.
- pehe.** See *kāpehe* 2; *waipehē*.
- pehē.** vt. To peel off, pare, strip; to remove skin or bark.
- pehea.** inter. How? What? How about it? (Gram. 8.3.) *Pehea 'oe?* How are you? What about you? *Pehea lā!* I don't know how! *Pehea ho'i!* How, I don't know! Who
