

- knows? *Pehea 'oe i kēia pālule?* What do you think of this shirt? *Pehea ka luhi, hana nō,* whatever the tiredness, just keep working. *Pehea noho'i inā ma'ane'i* (song), how would it be if [you looked] here. (PNP *pefea*.)
- pehemo, behemo.** n. Behemoth. (Ioba 40.15.) *Eng.*
- pē.heu.** 1. Same as 'ēheu 1-4. **ho'o.pē.heu.** Same as *ho'ēheu*. (PCP *pefe*) (*f,s*)*heu*, wing; cf. Marquesan *peheu*.) 2. vs. Soft, flabby, sagging, as fat flesh; swelling or protuberance, as on cheeks or neck.
- pē.heu.heu.** Redup. of *pēheu* 1, 2. 'Umi'umi *pēheuheu*, sideburns. **ho'o.pē.heu.heu.** Redup. of *ho'opēhue*.
- pehi.** nvt. To throw, throw at, pelt; an overhand throw, as in throwing the 'ulu. Cf. *kīpehi, kūpehi, pepēhi*. **ho'o.pehi.** To cause to throw or pretend to throw. (PNP *peesi*.)
- pehia.** Pas/imp. of *pehi*. *I ka pehia mau a ka ua*, in the constant pelting of the rain.
- pehina.** n. Throwing; pelting, as of rain (Kel. 17).
- pehu.** 1. nvs. Swollen, distended; swelling; to swell; dropsy, edema. *Fig.*, swollen with pride or conceit; longing to eat, hungry (short for *makapehu*, eyes big with hunger). Types of *pehu*, dropsy, were qualified by the terms *ale 'ai*, food gulping; *kāla'e*, clearing. See *wāwae pehu* and below. *Kai pehu*, surging sea. *Ma'i pehu*, dropsy. *Moa'e pehu*, a strong *Moa'e* wind. *A loa'a i ke kanaka ka pehu 'ana, ma ka 'ili o kona 'i'o, ā 'o ka pehu pala paha* (Oihk. 13.2), when a man shall have in the skin of his flesh a rising, or a scab. *He kuleana pehu, ka ho'oka'a pehu* (For. 6:402), a business of swelling in pride, a prideful paying of debt. *Hō mai he i'a na ka pehu o uka* (PH 29), give some fish for the big [-eyed] hungry ones ashore. **ho'o.pehu.** To swell, cause to swell, brag, boast. (PCP *pef,sju*.) 2. n. A variety of sweet potato. 3. n. A kind of seaweed.
- pehua.** 1. Pas/imp. of *pehu* 1. 2. n. A variety of taro.
- pehu-a-koa.** n. Tapa colored with an infusion made of *koa* bark. *Lit.*, *koa* swelling.
- pehu.ea.** nvi. To increase in volume, of the wind; such an increase. *He makani pehuesa ia no lalo* (chant), this is a rising wind from the south.
- pehu holo.kū.** n. Swelling of entire body. (Kam. 64:108.)
- pehu kumu niu.** n. Swelling of lower limbs. (Kam. 64:108.) *Lit.*, coconut tree swelling.
- pehu pala.** n. Scab (Kanl. 28.27), scurvy.
- pehu.pehu.** Redup. of *pehu* 1. **ho'o.pehu.pehu.** Redup. of *ho'opehu*; to brag; braggadocio; swollen, billowy, as a cloud.
- pei.** vs. Bent. *Rare*.
- pē.ia.** 1. demon. Thus, like this, this way (less definite than *penei*). (Gram. 8.3.) 2. vt. To say. *Pēia mai 'oia ia'u*, thus he spoke to me.
- peka.** 1. Same as *pekapeka*. *Holo peka*, to run and tattle. *Kolo peka*, to sneak and tattle. 2. Also **beka**. n. Bekah (ancient Hebrew unit of weight). (Puk. 38.26.) *Eng.*
- pē.ka'a.** n. 1. Sap of the green *kukui* nut, formerly rubbed over the tongue with the finger as a remedy for coated tongue or sore throat; very bitter. 2. Seed of the *kā'e'e* vine. *Rare*.
- pekala.kelia, pesalateria.** n. Harp (RSV), psalter (KJV). (2 Sam. 6.5.) (*Eng.* or Gr. *psalterium*.)
- pekale.** n. Peccary. *Eng.*
- pekana, pegana.** nvs. Pagan, heathen. *Eng.*
- peka.peka.** nvt. To tattle, tell tales, act as stool pigeon; tattler, stool pigeon.
- pē.kau.** vt. To place. *He pōhaku pēkau*, a placed stone.
- peke.** nvs. Dwarf, brownie, elf, goblin, midget; dwarfish, minute; short, as steps or stitches; tiny.
- peke.keu.** Same as 'ekekeu, wings.
- peke.kue.** vs. Blunt.
- pekela, betela.** See *nīoi pekela*.
- peke.lala, federala.** vs. Federal. *Eng.*
- pekēna, petēna.** See *mo'o pekēna*.
- peke.peke.** 1. Redup. of *peke*. See *lau'tpekepeke*. *Pekepeke ka humu*, the stitches are small. 2. n. Ridge (?).
- Nā 'alu ame nā pekepeke o laila* (chant), the ravines and ridges (?) of the place.
- pē.keu.** 1. Same as *pēheu* 1, 2. **ho'o.pē.keu.** Same as *ho'opēheu*. (PCP *peekeu*, wing; cf. Marquesan *pekeheu*.) 2. n. Method of trapping owls by gumming ropes on an upright stick. *Rare*. 3. n. Stirrups. *Rare*.
- pē.keu.keu.** Redup. of *pēkeu* 1.
- peki.** 1. nvi. Pace; to move along step by step, to tread along, trudge along, jog. *Eng.* *Ku'u lio holo peki*, my pacing horse. 2. vi. To back up, as a car. *Eng.* *E peki mai 'oe i hope*, back up. **ho'o.peki.** Caus/sim. 3. n. Spade, as in playing cards. *Eng.*
- peki.kini, petikini.** vt. To present, as arms (*petikini i nā pū*). *Eng.*
- pē.koi.** *Rare* var. of *pīkoi*.
- peku.** nvt. A kick; to kick; to ward off, as a spear. *Kini-pōpō peku*, football. **ho'o.peku.** To have kicked, cause to kick, feign kicking, kick.
- pekua.** Pas/imp. of *peku*.
- pekula.** n. Picul, as used for the sale of sandalwood. *Eng.*
- pekuna.** n. A kick.
- peku.nia.** n. Petunias (*Petunia xhybrida*), garden herbs grown for their bright, attractive, funnel-shaped flowers of various colors. (Neal 739.) *Eng.*
- peku.peku.** Redup. of *peku*; to flick out, as bark while scraping *olonā* (Kam. 76:45).
- pela.** 1. Same as *pelapela*; fertilizer, any decomposed material, especially decayed flesh and intestines removed from a corpse; the bones were buried secretly, and the flesh (*pela*) thrown into the sea (cf. *kapa lau*). (PPN *pela*.) 2. nvs. Spelling; to spell. *Eng.* *Pehea e pela ai kou inoa?* How is your name spelled? 3. nvt. Bale; to bale; mattress, cushion; package, as of hard poi. *Eng.* *Pela mau'u malo'o*, bale of hay. 4. Also **bela**. nvt. Bail; to bail. *Eng.* 5. n. Pail. *Eng.*
- pē.lā.** 1. demon. In that way, like that, thus, so, that way. (Gram. 8.3.) *Pēlā anei?* Is that the way it is? Is that so? *Pēlā 'ea?* Is that how? So that's it! Isn't it? *Pēlā iho!* Wait! Wait a minute! *Pēlā 'i'o nō*, that's right, that's certainly it. *Pēlā nō*, that's so, that's it, that's how it is, exactly. *Ā pēlā aku*, and so forth, thereby. *Pēlā paha*, maybe so, perhaps, probably so [very common]. *Hele pēlā!* Get out! Go away! Begone! *Pēlā iho ā hina le'a mai ka makani*, wait a moment until the winds blow fair. (PNP *peela*.) 2. vi. To say. *Pēlā aku 'o Ka-malama*, Ka-malama said.
- pela.kano, pelatano.** n. Plane tree (RSV), chestnut (KJV). (Ezek. 31.8.) (Gr. *platanos*.)
- pela.mika, pelamida.** n. Pyramid. *Eng.*
- pela.moe.** n. Mattress.
- pelane.** n. Plane tree (RSV), chestnut (KJV) (Kin. 30.37.) *Eng.*
- pela.pela.** vs. Filthy, dirty, nasty, indecent, unclean, vulgar, lewd, obscene. **ho'o.pela.pela.** To befoul, make dirty or filthy, soil, pollute. (PPN *pelapela*.)
- pela.uea (uwea).** n. Bedsprings (later replaced by *pilina*). *Lit.*, wire bale. *Eng.*
- pela.uluna.** n. Pillow.
- pele.** 1. nvs. Lava flow, volcano, eruption; volcanic (named for the volcano goddess, Pele). See ex., *kūkaepele, lepopele, manō*. 'Ā *pele*, lava rock of any kind. *Hū ka pele*, lava pour forth, to erupt. 2. vs. Soft, swollen, fat; pounded or kneaded soft, as poi or dough. Cf. *hāpele, kāpele, kūpele, napele*. 'Ōpū *pele*, fat stomach. **ho'o.pele.** To knead. 3. n. Choice Kaua'i tapa (FS 252-3), scented with *maile* and *kūpaoa*, said to be gray and dyed with charcoal made of burned sugar cane mixed with coconut water (preceded by *ke*). *Pele 'iliahi* (GP 8), *pele* tapa scented with sandalwood and associated with Kahana, Kaua'i. 4. vs. A term qualifying *ko'i* (adze), similar to *kūpele*. 5. Also **bēle**. n. Bell. *Eng.* *Hale pele*, belfry. *Pele 'aina*, dinner bell. 6. (*Cap.*) Volcano goddess.
- pele.au.** Same as *pele* 2.
- pele.hū.** n. 1. Turkey (*Meleagris gallopavo*). *Lit.*,
