

- pepa kala.kala.** n. Sandpaper. *Lit.*, rough paper.
- pepa.kene.** n. Cayenne pepper (*Capsicum annuum* cv. 'longum'). (Neal 742.) *Eng.*
- pepa ki'i.** n. Joker, in a deck of cards. *Lit.*, picture card.
- pepa kī.ko'o.** n. Check or draft for paying money. *Lit.*, withdrawing paper.
- pepa kī.ko'o kā.lā.** n. Money order.
- pepa kope.** n. Carbon paper, xerox.
- pepa lahi.lahi.** n. Tissue paper, thin paper.
- pepa lei.** n. Crepe paper, as used in lei making. *Lit.*, lei paper.
- pepa mā.noa.noa.** n. Cardboard. *Lit.*, thick paper.
- pepa.mina.** n. Peppermint (*Mentha piperita*). (Neal 734.) *Eng.*
- pepa 'omo 'T.nika.** n. Blotter.
- pepa pa'i ki'i.** n. Photographic film.
- pepa po'o.lēka.** n. Postcard.
- pepa wahī.** n. Wrapping paper.
- pepe** 1. vs. Flat, as a nose; low, squatty. Cf. *mene*, 'amene, 'upepe. 2. vs. Small, fine-meshed, as of a mat. *Pepepe* is more common. 3. n. Perhaps short for *pepeiao* 6; Emerson however gives "canoe seat" (UL 194) and "chock on which a canoe rests" (PH 114).
- pē.pē.** 1. Redup. of *pē* 1. *Na'au pēpē* (Kep. 75), modest spirit. *Hanapēpē* (place name), crushed bay [perhaps so called because of landslides]. *He pēpē 'ōmaka no Hilo, pā i ka pa'akai, uāni'i*, a crushing of the fish 'ōmaka from Hilo, touched with salt, stiffens [of a weakling]. **ho'o.pē.pē, hō.pē.pē.** Redup. of *ho'opē*; to flatten; humble. (2 Sam. 22.43.) (PPN *pee*.) 2. n. Baby. *Eng.* **ho'o.pē.pē.** To act like a baby; infantile.
- pepe'e.** 1. nvs. Twisted, crooked, deformed, misshapen, out of shape; deformity. **ho'o.pepe'e.** To bend, twist, etc. (Kep. 159.) 2. n. Young fern leaves, as of *hāpu'u*, *hō'i'o*, and 'ama'u, that are rolled up, sometimes suggesting a question mark. 3. See *pepe'e paka*.
- pepe'e.kua.** Var. of *pepe'ekue*.
- pepe'e.kue.** vs. Coarse, as lace or hair; thick; clumsy, lumbering, as a puppy's feet. See ex., *pupuka*.
- pepe'e paka.** n. Tobacco plug.
- pepehi.** 1. vt. To beat, strike, pound, kill. *Pepehi ā make*, to beat to death, kill. *Pepehi i ka mana'olana*, to dash hopes. *Pepehi i nā mā, pepehi mea 'ino*, disinfect. *Mea pepehi kanaka*, weapon. *Pepehi ā 'oki'oki holo-holona*, to butcher animals. **ho'o.pepehi.** To cause to beat, strike, kill; to pretend to beat. (PNP *pepesi*.) 2. n. Surface of a tapa beater formed by deep grooves with the wide ridges (up to 14) rounded off in the form of an inverted U; sometimes the beater itself was so called. Cf. *hoahoa, hohoa*.
- pepehia.** Pas/imp. of *pepehi* 1. (For. 5:509.)
- pepehi kanaka.** nv. Murder, murderer, manslaughter; to commit murder.
- pepehu.** Redup. of *pehu* 1. **ho'o.pepehu.** Redup. of *ho'opehu*; to flex the muscles or make them bulge.
- pepehua.** Pas/imp. of *pepehu*.
- pepehue.** Var. of *pepehua*.
- pepei.** Rare var. of *paipai*, to encourage.
- pepei.ao.** 1. nvi. Ear; to hear (*rare*). Cf. *Ipepeiao*. *Lohe pepeiao*, hearsay, to have heard only. *Pepeiao manana*, protruding ears. *Pepeiao pili*, ears pressing close to the head. *Pepeiao pilau*, infected ear. *E heluhelu ma nā pepeiao o nā kānaka* (Puk. 24.7), read in the audience of the people. 2. n. Cotyledon, as of beans. 3. n. Stipule, as of *noni*, a tree. 4. n. Scallops in lace. 5. n. Lugs or blocks inside a canoe hull to which the 'iako, booms, and perhaps the mast (For. 5:633) are fastened. 6. n. Comb cleats for canoe thwarts or seats. 7. n. Chinese cake stuffed with meat, named for a resemblance to an ear. Cf. cup-shaped *mea 'ono pua'a*. 8. n. Long nets 30 to 37 m deep, attached at each side of the 'upena kolo, bag net. 9. n. Valve of the heart. 10. Same as *pepeiao akua*.
- pepei.ao akua.** n. Tree fungus, the Jew's-ear (*Auricularia auricula*). Also *akua pepeiao*.
- pepei.ao 'oha.** n. Earache.
- pepei.ao.hao.** n. Horn of an animal; trumpet or horn made of an animal's horn. (Hal. 118.27.) *Lit.*, iron ear.
- pepei.ao hohono.** n. Infected ear; said derisively of farmers with reference to the smoky odor (*hohono*) of their fires.
- pepei.ao kuli.** n. A deaf ear, deafness, disobedience, refusal to listen to advice.
- pepei.ao lā.'au.** Same as *pepeiao akua*, tree fungus. *Lit.*, tree ear.
- pepei.ao pulu.'aha.** See *pulu'aha*.
- pepei.ō'ō.** n. Overripe breadfruit or banana kneaded with coconut cream, wrapped in ti leaves, and baked in the oven. This could be preserved for a season. Also *paipai'e*.
- pepela.** 1. Same as *pelapela*, filthy. 2. Redup. of *pela*, to spell. *Eng.*
- pepele.** Same as *pele* 3, a tapa.
- pepelo.** Same as *pelopelo*, to lie. (PNP *pepelo*.)
- pepelu.** Redup. of *pelu* 1-3; repetitious in speech. (PPN *pepelu*.)
- Pepe.luali.** n. February. *Eng.*
- pepe.lu'e.** Redup. of *pēlu'e*. *Rare*.
- pepena.** Redup. of *pena* 1, to paint. *Eng.*
- pepeno.** Redup. of *peno*.
- pepenu.** Same as *penupenu*. 'O ka 'ōpelu e pepenu ana lā (song), the 'ōpelu, the fish that is dunked [in sauce].
- pepe-o-Hina.** Same as *lepe-o-Hina*, a seaweed.
- pepepe.** Redup. of *pepe* 1, 2. *Maka pepepe*, small mesh. (PCP *pepepe(pe)*, low.)
- pepeu.** Redup. of *peu* 1, 2.
- pepeua.** Hard, thick, disobedient. (And.)
- pepeue.** Redup. of *peue*.
- peu.** 1. vi. To thrust up, push up, uproot, prod, bunt, root, nudge upward, elbow upward, pout, jostle with the feet as to attract attention; to rise up, as grass that has been trod upon; to thrust, as a male in coition. **ho'o.peu.** To thrust up, etc. 2. nvi. A vulgar gesture, in which the fist is doubled and jerked upward; to make the gesture. 3. n. Cartilage of a pig's nose. 4. n. Point at canoe bow.
- pe'u.** Same as *pelu*. *Moloka'i*.
- pē.'ū.** n. Cooked taro leaves. (PH 74.) Commonly called *lū'au*.
- peua.** Pas/imp. of *peu* 1, 2.
- peue.** vs. Dull, blunt. *Fig.*, stupid, dull. *Ka peue, pepeue, ho'owalea o loko o ka hale* (For. 6:402), the stupid ones, the stupid, stupid ones, passing the time within the house.
- peu.peu.** 1. Same as *pepeu*. 2. Same as *peue*.
- pewa.** 1. n. Tail of fish, shrimp, lobster. Cf. *hi'u*. 2. n. Rectangular patch or wedge used for mending bowls, perhaps so called because of a resemblance to a fishtail. 3. Rare var. of *pawa* 1, usually following *huli*. 'Elua wale nō huli pewa 'ana o ka piha makahiki (Kel. 10), after the dawning of just two years. (Also Kel. 61.) 4. n. Clump or group, as of trees near a forest. 'Ōhi'a uliuli i ka ua i moku pewa 'ia (PH 33), 'ōhi'a trees darkened by the rain and cut off as a clump.
- pewa.pewa.** 1. Pectoral fins of a fish; to move or vibrate these fins. 2. Redup. of *pewa* 4. *I ka pewapewa lā'au mauka o Pu'u-lele* (song), the tree clump inland of Pu'u-lele.
- pī.** 1. nvs. Stingy, miserly, niggardly; stinginess (sometimes preceded by *ke*). **ho'o.pī.** Stingy, extremely economical, frugal; to skimp. 2. nvi. Sputtering, smoldering, as green wood that burns poorly; to snort, as a horse; to sniffle or have difficulty breathing due to a congestion in the nose, as caused by a cold; to break wind with a slight sputtering sound. See *maka pī*. *Pī ka 'amo*, the anus sputters [to work hard like a slave]. 'O ke kāne kēnā, pī ka 'amo, if he's your husband, you'll know plenty of drudgery; *lit.*, the anus will give a pī sound. 3. vt. To sprinkle, as water with the fingers. (PPN *pihi*.) 4. n. Peas, lentils (2 Sam. 17.28); a kind of bean; hyacinth bean (*Dolichos lablab*) or Lima bean. *Eng.* Called *pāpapa* in some localities. 5. n. The letter "p." *Eng.*
