

piko-o-Hale-a-ka-lā. n. Type of braid used in the *pāpale* 'ie.
piko-o-Wā-kea. n. 1. Equator. 2. Same as *Ka-piko-o-Wā-kea*.
piko pau 'iole. n. Rat-taken navel cord, i.e., a chronic thief. It was believed that one became a chronic thief if his navel cord was stolen by a rat. Rats were famous for thieving.
piko.piko. Same as *pikapika* 1, 3.
piko ua.ua. n. A native variety of taro, one of the hardest *piko* taros and perhaps the only kind common in upland culture; yields good grade light-colored poi; distinguished by dark-green leaf stems with a pinkish base.
piko 'ula.'ula. n. A native variety of taro, distinguished from *piko lehua 'āpi'i* by having leaves smooth below; corms yield red poi of good grade.
piko uli.uli. Same as *haehae* 3, a taro.
piku, fiku. n. Fig (*Ficus carica*). (Neal 309-11.) Eng. See ex., *pāpalu*.
piku.mēna. Same as *pikimana*, bituminous; coal. Eng. *Lua pikumena* (Kin. 14.10), slime pit.
pila. 1. n. Any string instrument, formerly the fiddle; violin. Eng. *Ho'okani pila*, to play music. 2. Also *bila*. nvt. A bill; to make out a bill. Eng. 3. Also *fira*. n. Fir. Eng. *Lā'au fira* (Mele 1.17), fir. 4. nvt. To build, in a card game. (Eng. *pile*.)
pila 'aha. n. String musical instrument.
pila (bila) 'ai.'ē. n. Voucher.
pila (bila) ha'a.wina. n. Appropriation, allotment bill.
pila hāpa. n. Autoharp. *Lit.*, fiddle harp. Eng.
pī.lahi. vs. Thin, slim, frail, delicate.
pī.lahi.lahi. Redup. of *pīlahi*.
pī.laho. Short for *'ūpī laho*.
pila (bila) hō.'ai.'ē. n. Promissory note. *Lit.*, bill to extend credit.
pila kī.ko'o. n. Check, draft, bill.
pila kī.ko'o hale lōka. n. Money order. *Lit.*, post-office draft.
pila kī.ko'o ho'o.hui.hui 'ia. n. Blanket warrant.
pila koi. n. Requisition.
pila kuolo. n. Violin. *Lit.*, rubbing fiddle.
pī.lalahi. Redup. of *pīlahi*.
pī.lali. nvs. Hardened sap (*kohu*) of the *kukui* tree, gum; resin, birdlime; wax; honey in a banana blossom; gummy, sticky. *Kanakē pīlali*, cactus candy. *Pīlali kukui kau lā'au* (song), *kukui* gum on the trees. *Pīlali pālolo*, wax. *Pīpili ka pīlali i ke kumu kukui*, the gum sticks to the *kukui* tree [a person who stays close]. 2. n. White and black feathers under the tail of the 'ō'ō, a bird; used for *kāhili*, feather standards. 3. n. A seaweed.
pī.lali.lali. vs. Sticky, gummy, slimy, greasy.
pī.lali mai'a. n. Honey in a banana blossom, fed to small children.
pī.lali mea 'ala. n. Camphor. *Lit.*, fragrant gum.
pī.lali.'ohe. vs. Thin, delicate, rickety. *Rare*.
pī.lali pā.nini, pī.lali pā.pipi. n. Dried juice of prickly pear chewed as candy.
pila pā.'ume.'ume. Var. of *pila 'ume 'ume*.
pila.pilau. vs. Somewhat bad-smelling, not quite spoiled. **ho'o.pila.pilau.** To allow to spoil, as fish or meat. Cf. *ho'omelu. I'a ho'opilapilau*, slightly tainted fish eaten raw with salt and *kukui* relish.
pila puhi.puhi. n. Harmonica, mouth organ. *Lit.*, blowing fiddle.
pilau. nvs. Rot, stench, rottenness; to stink; putrid, spoiled, rotten, foul, decomposed. Cf. *pilo, popopo. Kū ka pilau*, the stench rises. *Maka pilau*, rotten eyes, one with rotten eyes, a ghost. *Make pilau*, complete defeat in a game. **ho'o.pilau.** To cause a stench. (PPN *pilau*.)
pila 'ume.'ume. n. Accordion. *Lit.*, tugging fiddle.
pila.wai.wai. n. Account, reckoning, as of an estate; invoice.
pī.lēka.lēka. nvs. Gummy, sticky, gluey, moldy; mold.
pili. 1. nvi. To cling, stick, adhere, touch, join, adjoin,

cleave to, associate with, be with, be close or adjacent; clinging, sticking; close relationship, relative; thing belonging to. Cf. *'aui-pili, pili wale. Pili 'ana*, connection. *Pili maika'i*, fitting nicely, compact. *Hoa pili*, intimate friend. *Ko'u pili* (Laie 483), my partner [in a *kilu* game]. *Kolone pili*, column at close intervals [military]. *E pili kāua*, let's be together. *Hehi i ka pili, wehe i ka pili*, to abolish relationship. *Maka pili*, squinting eyes that seem almost closed. *Pili hukihuki*, clashes between close associates, a bickering relationship. *He pili wehe-na 'ole*, an unseverable relationship. *Pili i ka hewa*, to be found guilty. *Pili ke kua me ke alo*, the back and front meet [said of a thin person]. *Ke kukui ka pili ia o ka uhu*, the *kukui* is the thing pertaining to the parrot fish; the *kukui* is related to the parrot fish (see *kukui* 1).
ho'o.pili. To bring together, stick; to attach oneself to a person; united, as friends; to mimic, imitate; to claim a relationship; to put together, as parts of a puzzle. Cf. *ho'opili wale. Ke 'ano a me ka ho'opili 'ia 'ana o nā helu*, the nature and application of numbers. *Ua ho'opili 'ia ma ka perita ma'ema'e o ka male*, united in the pure bonds of matrimony. (PPN *pili*.) 2. n. A grass (*Heteropogon contortus*) known in many warm regions, formerly used for thatching houses in Hawai'i; sometimes added to the hula altar to Laka, for knowledge to *pili* or cling; thatch (preceded by *ke*). (Neal 80.) *Hale pili*, house thatched with *pili* grass. *Lei kōkō 'ula i ke pili* (song), red network *lei* [rainbow] on the *pili* grass. *Hū wale aku nō ka waiwai i ke pili* (Kep. 119), the wealth overflowed on the *pili* grass [of great quantities]. 3. vt. To refer, concern, relate, pertain, apply. **ho'o.pili.** Caus/sim. 4. n. Shingles, so called because they replace the *pili* grass of the roofs of the old houses (preceded by *ke*). 5. nvt. A wager, bet, stake; to bet, wager. See *piliwaiwai*. 6. n. Border, edge of time units, especially of late night. *Pili aumoe*, the late night. *Ka pili o ka wana'ao* (Laie 469), at the approach of dawn. *Ka pili o ke ahiahi* (Laie 457), at the end of the evening, nightfall. 7. n. Uncolored sheets in a *ku'ina*, sleeping tapa. 8. n. Lining of a quilt under the layer of cotton or wool. 9. n. First stage of poi-pounding, with taro beginning to stick. 10. n. A narrow or precarious pass. *Rare*. 11. Same as *'ume*, the game, so called because the wand touched (*pili*) the players. (Malo 215.) *Rare*. 12. Same as *'ōpili*, numb. (UL 61.)
pilia. Pas/imp. of *pili* 1, 3. *Pilia i ke 'ala*, clinging to the fragrance. (PNP *pilia*.)
Pili-'ā. n. Rain name, Kani-kū, Hawai'i. (For. 5:93.)
pili.ā.'ai.kū. Var. of *pili'aikū*. *Rare*.
pili.'ai.kū. vs. Cramped, stiff, numb. *Rare*.
pili.'āina. Shore; interisland. *Hui Moku Holo Pili'āina*, Interisland Steam Navigation Company.
pili.alo. nvi. Bosom friend, beloved wife. Cf. *pilikua*.
pili.aloha. nvi. Close friendship, beloved companionship, beloved relative; loving association; to have a loving or tender relationship, to be in a bond of love, romance.
pili ā mo'o. vi. To cling like a lizard, as on a cliff.
pili 'ana wā anō. n. Present participle.
pili 'ana wā hala. n. Past participle.
pili 'ano. v. To resemble in character or nature.
pili.'ao.'ao. n. Mate, spouse, common-law mate with whom one lives openly.
Pili-hala. n. Wind associated with Ka-'awa-loa, Hawai'i. (For. 5:93.) *Lit.*, near pandanus.
pili hale. n. House shingle (preceded by *ke*).
pili hao. n. Corrugated iron, as used for roofing (preceded by *ke*). *Lit.*, iron shingles.
pili hihia. vi. To become involved in gambling, usually disastrously; in the old days, to bet one's life or wife; to be involved in an entangling affair of any sort.
pili ho'o.ipo.ipo. n. Love affair.
pili.hua. vs. Sad, sorrowful, dejected, astonished, confused (Ier. 14.9), bewitched (Oih. 8.9); weary. *Ā pili-hua ku'u nui kino* (chant), and my entire body is weary.
ho'o.pili.hua. To cause sorrow, astonishment, etc. *I*
