

- pili-puka**. n. 1. The period between midnight and dawn. *Lit.*, near appearance [of the sun]. 2. One of the tapa covers in the *pūhenehene* game, which were named for different parts of the night.
- pili'uhane**. vs. Spiritual.
- pili uka**. n. A stiff, tufted, native grass (*Trisetum glomeratum*), 0.3 to 0.9 m high, with leaves 10.2 to 25 cm long and flowers crowded in narrow spikes; a good forage grass, growing only at rather high altitudes. On Hawai'i this is apparently called *he'upueo*.
- pili.wai.wai**. nvs. Gambling, betting, gambler; to bet, gamble. *Lit.*, to wager wealth.
- pili wale**. vi. To cling, etc., for no reason or cause; often used in unfavorable sense of living off other people.
- ho'o.pili wale**. Caus/sim. *Nohona ho'opili wale*, living as a dependent.
- piliwi**. vt. To believe. *Eng.* 'A'ole i piliwi 'ia (song), [it] was not believed.
- pilo**. 1. nvs. Swampy, foul odor, as of a swamp; halitosis; polluted. **ho'o.pilo**. To cause a bad odor. (PPN *pilo*.) 2. n. Some species of native shrubs, in the coffee family (*Hedyotis* [*Kadua*]), the leaves bad-smelling when crushed. See also *kōi* (*Coprosma kauensis*) and *au 13*. 3. n. All Hawaiian species of *Coprosma*, a genus of shrubs and small trees belonging to the coffee family, with narrow to rounded leaves, tiny greenish flowers, and yellow, red, or black berries. 4. Same as *maiapilo* (*Capparis sandwichiana*). 5. idiom. Any kind, any whatsoever (used with 'a'ohe). 'A'ohe *pilo uku*, any pay at all is all right; any pay whatsoever. *I lei paha no kākou*, 'a'ohe *pilo lei*, let's wear leis, any kind of leis. 'A'ohe *pilo 'ō'ō* (Kep. 159), any kind of digging stick.
- pilo kea**. n. A small native tree or shrub (*Platydesma spathulata*), in the orange family; leaves large, thick, oblong, more or less pointed; flowers few, cream-colored; fruits small, dry, four-lobed.
- pilo kea lau li'i**. n. A native shrub (*Platydesma rostratum*), with long, narrow leaves, clustered, axillary flowers, and beaked, four-lobed fruits.
- pī.loli**. vs. Weak, small. *Rare*.
- pilo.pilo**. Redup. of *pilo 1*. *Wai puna pilopilo* (Sol. 25.26), polluted water. (PCP *pilopilo*.)
- pilu**. vi. To shake, quiver, vibrate. *Rare*.
- pilu.pilu**. 1. Redup. of *pilu*. *Rare*. 2. vi. Overdressed, richly and elaborately overdressed, perhaps in a ridiculous way. *Rare*.
- pima, bima**. n. Beam, as for scales. *Eng.*
- pime.neko, pimeneto**. n. Pimento (*Capsicum annum*). *Eng.*
- pina**. *Rare* var. of *pine*.
- pī.na'au**. See *Holoholo-pīna'au*.
- pī.na'i**. 1. nvs. Again and again, repeatedly; to come or do repeatedly, constant; to wear out a welcome by repeated visits; close together, crowded. Cf. *kūpina'i*, *lele pīna'i*. 'O ka *pīna'i iho nō*, e *pīna'i ai*, just repeating, repeating a visit and wearing out one's welcome. *Mai pīna'i i ke aloali'i*, don't stay constantly in the presence of the chief. *Pīna'i kāna 'ai 'ana*, he eats all the time. 2. vt. To patch, fill up a crack or hole, as in wood.
- pinana**. nvi. To climb; a climb. See ex., 'oe 1. *Pinana ka ihu*, to elevate the nose, as in scorn. **ho'o.pinana**. To elevate, cause to climb.
- pīnana.ea**. Same as *pīnauea 1, 2*. *Rare*.
- pina.na'i**. Var. of *pinapina'i*.
- pina.na'i.ea**. vi. To turn aside, as the head, or as the bow of a ship when struck by a large wave. *Rare*.
- pinao**. 1. n. Dragonfly. (KL line 290.) Cf. *lelepinao*. (PCP *pingao*.) 2. n. Flying gurnard, a fish (*Dactylopterus orientalis*). Also *loloa'u*. 3. vs. Blurred, as eyes of a drunkard. Similar to *pōnalo 2*. 4. n. Broad jump. 5. n. Perhaps a swing. (For. 6:374.)
- pī.nao.nao**. Redup. of *pinao 3*.
- pinao'ula**. n. A variety of dragonfly. *Lit.*, red *pinao*.
- pina.pina'i**. Redup. of *pīna'i*. *Kani pinapina'i o nā pū kuni ahi*, successive booms of the cannons.
- pinau**. vi. 1. To recoil, snap, as a rope. *Rare*. 2. See *lelepinao*.
- pī.nau.ea**. vs. 1. Weak; of dim vision, as of an aged person. 2. Short and skimpy, as a skirt or *pā'u*. *Rare*.
- pinē**. 1. nvi. Pin, compass needle, peg, bolt, picket; stanchion to hold animal's head with yoke and pin; to pin. *Eng.* *Kui pine*, common pin. 2. n. A tame bullock tied to a newly captured wild cow or bull. When released it would lead the wild animal to a pen. *Ke pine*, the tame bullock. (Larry Kimura, personal communication.)
- pī.nē**. nvi. Falsehood, lie; liar; to lie. *Rare*.
- pine hoaka**. Same as *pine niho pua'a*. *Rare*. *Lit.*, crescent pin.
- pine kai.apa**. n. Safety pin. *Lit.*, diaper pin.
- pine kau.la'i**. n. Clothespin. *Lit.*, hanging pin.
- pineki**. n. Peanut (*Arachis hypogaea*). (Neal 450-1.) *Eng.* 'Aila *pineki*, peanut oil.
- pī.nē.nē**. n. Vagina. *Rare*.
- pine niho pua'a**. n. Hog's tooth pin. Formerly also called *pine hoaka*. *Lit.*, pig tooth pin.
- pine 'ō.mou**. n. Stickpin, brooch.
- pine pā**. n. Fence picket.
- pine.pine**. vs. Frequent; often, many times, frequently. (PNP *pine*.)
- pine uma.uma**. n. Breast pin, brooch.
- pinika**. n. Vinegar; an intoxicating drink made of fermented molasses and water. *Eng.*
- pino**. Var. of *pilo 1, 2*.
- pino.pino**. Var. of *pilopilo*.
- pī.nū.nū**. n. Pigeon pea (*Cajanus cajan*).
- pio**. 1. nvs. Captive, prisoner, victim, prey; conquered, captured, made prisoner; game of tag; to play tag. **ho'o.pio**. To conquer, subdue, defeat, make prisoner, capture, overcome. 2. vs. Extinguished or out, as a fire or light (used in pidgin English); disappeared, as a ship at sea; to have gone out of sight; to die down, as a wave. *Pio loa*, to vanish. **ho'o.pio**. To put out, extinguish, as a light or fire. *Ho'opio mana'olana* (Kel. 14), sinking hopes. (PCP *pio*.) 3. nvi. To peep, chirp; to whistle with fingers on the mouth; to pipe on any flute-like instrument; peeping, peep. *Kani ka pio hone i ke kula* (song), a sweet whistle sounds on the plains. 4. n. A measure of three *iwilei* (yards), especially of cloth.
- pi'o**. nvs. 1. Arch, arc; bent, arched, curved; to arch, of a rainbow. *Ka-pi'o-lani* (name), the heavenly arch. *Ka pi'o mau o ke ānuenuē i luna o ia wahi* (FS 127), the constant arching of the rainbow above this place. **ho'o.pi'o**. To arch, bend, curve, crook. (PPN *piko*.) 2. n. Marriage of full brother and sister of *nī'aupi'o* rank, presumably the highest possible rank. Their offspring had the rank of *naha*, which is less than *pi'o* but probably more than *nī'aupi'o*. Later *pi'o* included marriage with half-sibling. Cf. *moe pi'o*. (Malo 54.) 3. Same as *kāpi'o 1*.
- pi'o.ā.ea**. vs. Tactless. *Ka'u*.
- pī.oe**. n. General name for barnacles. (KL line 24.)
- pio.ea**. Same as *pīnauea 1*.
- pī.oe.oe**. vs. Long and sharp, as a pin; long and thin, spindly. *He wahine pīoeoe, wīwī, lō'ihī*, a thin woman, bony, tall.
- pī.oe.oe**. Same as *pī.oe*. *Pipili mau 'ia e ka pī.oe.oe*, always clung to by barnacles [one constantly pursued by those of the opposite sex].
- pi'o.hi'a**. Same as *kanawao 1*, small trees.
- pi'oi**. n. 1. Kaua'i name for *hoi*, the bitter yam (*Dioscorea bulbifera*). 2. Hawai'i name for edible fruit of the *lama* (*Diospyros* spp.) or perhaps *kukui*.
- pī.oi.oi**. vs. Half-shut, as eyes; to look with half-closed eyes.
- pi'o.lepo**. n. Column of dust, cloud of dust. *Lit.*, dirt arch.
- piolo**. vt. To rub back and forth, saw; to pucker and unpucker the lips. *Fig.*, to go over and over in the mind, to mull over, think. Cf. *olo*.
- pi'olo**. Short for *pi'oloke*.
- pi'o.loke**. nvs. Alarmed, startled, perturbed, vexed, disturbed, confused and excited, agitated, harassed; in
