

- noisy consternation; confusion, alarm (sometimes preceded by *ke*). *Pi'oloke ka leo o ka palila*, frightened is the voice of the *palila* [bird]. *Ua pi'oloke loa ko'u 'uhane* (Hal. 6.3), my soul is sore vexed. **ho'o.pi'o-loke**. To cause confusion, consternation, vexation. *E ho'opi'oloke au i ka na'au o nā kānaka* (Ezek. 32.9), I will vex the hearts of the people.
- pi'olo.kū**. Intensifier of *pi'olo*.
- pio.loolo**. 1. Redup. of *piolo*. Rare. 2. Same as 'apu, medicinal concoction; to feed such a concoction. Rare.
- pī.ō.ō**. 1. Same as *pi'oloke*. See ex., *ke'ele*. **ho'o.pī.ō.ō**. Same as *ho'opi'oloke*. *He mea hou ho'opī.ō.ō*, disturbing news. 2. Same as *pioloolo* 2. Rare.
- pi'o.o.loke**. Redup. of *pi'oloke*.
- pio.pio**. 1. Redup. of *pio* 1-3. *Piopia moa*, chicken at about the fryer stage; little chick (see ex., 'Inana). **ho'o.pio.pio**. To pipe on a flute-like instrument. 2. Same as *pāpiopia*, a fish. 3. interj. Call to chickens.
- pi'o.pi'o**. Redup. of *pi'o* 1. **ho'o.pi'o.pi'o**. Redup. of *ho'opi'o*; a form of imitative magic in which the practitioner, while concentrating, touched a part of his own body, thereby causing injury to his victim's body in the same place, as a chest pain or headache. If the intended victim saw the gestures, he might imitate them and thereby send the black magic back to the original practitioner. Both practices were *ho'opi'opi'o*. (PPN *pikopiko*.)
- pī.pā**. 1. nvi. Alongside, as of a road, sidewalk, or river; to go along the side, turn to the side, dodge; sidewalk. *Ma ka pīpā kahawai*, along the stream. *Ma nā pīpā alanui*, along the roadside. 2. n. *Kā'e'e* bean and purgative made from it; the bean is also strung in leis. 3. Precipice, cliff. (And.) 4. (Cap.) n. Star name (no data).
- pī.pā.pī.pā**. Redup. of *pīpā* 1.
- pipi**. n. 1. Hawaiian pearl oyster (*Pinctada radiata*); in songs this is known as the *i'a hāmau leo o 'Ewa*, 'Ewa's silent sea creature [it was believed that talking would cause a breeze to ripple the water and frighten the *pipi*]. (PPN *pipi*.) 2. Feelers of an insect, as of an ant. 3. Same as *moa* 3 (*Psilotum*). 4. A kind of tapa. 5. Body depression; eyeball. Rare. 6. Lower part of an adze. (Malo 51.) Rare. 7. Also *bipi*. Beef, cattle, ox. Eng. See *pipi kāne*, *pipi wahine*. 'I'o *pipi*, beef meat.
- pipī**. Redup. of *pī* 2; squinting; twinkling, as stars. Fig., barely surviving. *Pipī ka ihu*, the nose snuffles and is stopped up. *Inā i kanu mau ā mahi mau ke kauwahi 'āina*, *ulu pipī wale nō ia lau kanu*, if certain lands have been continually planted and farmed, the plants grow feebly. *Pipī ka wahie*, *ho'onui ka pulupulu*, if wood smolders, add more tinder. **ho'o.pipī**. Caus/sim.; to smoke, as ham. *Kinai i ka 'uwiki e ho'opipī ana* (Mat. 12.20), quench a smoldering wick.
- pī.pī**. 1. Redup. of *pī* 1, stingy. 2. Redup. of *pī* 3; to urinate (Eng.) *A Inā e pīpī 'ia ke koko ona ma ke kapa komo* (Oihk. 6.27), when there is sprinkled of the blood thereof upon any garment. *Pipī holo ka'ao*, sprinkled, the tale runs [a phrase used at the end of tales]. **ho'o.pī.pī**. To cause to sprinkle, urinate. (PPN *piipii*.) 3. n. Female 'ō'ō, a honey eater.
- pipi 'au.amo**. n. Ox yoke.
- pipi'i**. Same as *pi'ipi'i* 1-5; the commonest meaning is "expensive, high-priced." *Wai pipi'i*, bubbling water, charged water, fountain. **ho'o.pipi'i**. Same as *ho'opi'ipi'i*; to set a high price. *Wai ho'opipi'i*, charged water.
- pipika**. vi. To draw away, shrink away, as an octopus tentacle on a fire; to crinkle up, contract; to turn aside so as not to meet, avoid. *Pipika a'ela ia ma ka pā pōhaku* (Nah. 22.25), he drew up against the wall. **ho'o.pipika**. Caus/sim.
- pipi kāne**. n. Bull. Lit., male beef.
- pipi kaula**. n. Jerked beef (beef salted and dried in the sun, broiled before eaten). Lit., rope beef.
- pipi kauō**. n. Ox. Lit., dragging beef.
- pipi keiki**. n. Calf. Lit., child beef.
- pipiki**. vs. Shrunk, crinkled; tight, cramped. Cf. *piki* 1, *pipika*, 'āpiki. **ho'o.pipiki**. To cause to shrink, clamp.
- pipi kō.'ala**. n. Broiled beef, steak.
- pipi kolo**. n. Yearling cow or bull.
- pipi kū**. n. Stew beef, beef stew.
- pipi kua.pu'u**. n. Bison. Lit., beef [with] humped back.
- pipi laho**. n. Bull.
- pī.pī.lani**. n. Some kinds of green seaweeds (species of *Enteromorpha*). Maui. Also 'ele'ele.
- pipili**. 1. Same as *pilipili*; tenacious. *Lepo pipili*, sticky earth. *Pipili me nā hoa lapuwale*, associating with worthless companions. **ho'o.pipili**. Same as *ho'opilipili*; to paste, glue, stick. *Mea ho'opipili*, paste. (PNP *pipili*.) 2. n. *Drymaria* (*Drymaria cordata*), a slender, weedy herb, with rounded leaves, tiny flowers, and tiny one-seeded dry fruits with sticky stems, which catch on passersby. It is a tropical shade-dwelling plant. (Neal 345.) Also *pilipili*. 3. Same as 'ihi kūkae hipa, kūkae-hipa, a weed.
- pipili.kia**. Redup. of *pilikia*.
- pipilo**. Redup. of *pilo* 1. (PCP *pipilo*.)
- pipi loke (roke)**. n. Roast beef. Eng.
- pipina**. Var. of *pipine*.
- pipine**. nvs. Promiscuous; promiscuous person.
- pī.pine**. vs. Miserly, stingy. Lit., stingy often.
- pī.pī.noke**. vi. To rain continuously; to jibber jabber, talk and argue continuously. Lit., constant sprinkling. Rare.
- pī.pī.nola**. n. A kind of squash with edible shoots and fruit, commonly fed also to pigs, called chayote and *pinella* by Neal 813, and *Sechium edule*. (Probably Portuguese *pepineiro*.)
- pipio**. Redup. of *pio* 1-3.
- pipi'o**. Redup. of *pi'o* 1. *He kanaka kua pipi'o*, a stoop-shouldered or hunchbacked person.
- pipi ohi**. See *ohi* 1.
- pipi'o.lepo**. Redup. of *pi'olepo*.
- pipi Pā.kō**. n. Water buffalo, carabao. Lit., Chinese beef.
- pipi palai**. n. Beefsteak. Lit., fried beef.
- pipipi**. 1. n. General name for small mollusks, including *Theodoxus neglectus*. (KL line 32.) *Lei pipipi*, lei of *pipi* shell, a new type of lei; formerly *kūpe'e* ornaments were called *lei pipipi* because of a superficial resemblance. (PCP *pipipi*.) 2. vs. Small and close together, as stars or *pipipi* shells; small, squinting, as eyes. **ho'o.pipipi**. To put close together; to squint. *Kanu ho'opipipi i nā 'ano'ano*, plant the seeds close together. 3. See *hale pipipi*.
- pipipi 'ā.kō.lea**, **pipipi kō.lea**. Same as 'ākōlea 2.
- pipipi 'ā.kō.lea ihī.loa**. n. A mollusk (*Planaxis labiosus*). Lit., long-necked gourd 'ākōlea shell, so called because of its shape.
- pipi.pī'i**. Redup. of *pi'i* 1-5. 'O *Pi'i-lani*, 'O *Pi'i-kea*, 'o *Lono-a-Pi'i*, *pipipi'i i ka 'ako'ako nā li'i nui* (chant for Kua-kini), *Pi'i-lani*, *Pi'i-kea*, *Lono-a-pi'i*, the great chiefs climbing to the crest [note fondness for repetition].
- pipipi kō.lea**. n. Periwinkle (*Littorina pintado*, *L. scabra*). Lit., *kōlea*-bird shell, perhaps so called because of its color. Also *pāpū kōlea*.
- pipipi kō.lea ihī.loa**. n. Periwinkle (*Planaxis labiosus*).
- pipi po'a**. n. Steer. Lit., castrated beef.
- pipi pulu**. n. Bull. Lit., bull beef. Eng.
- pipi wahine**. n. Cow. Lit., female beef.
- pī.pī.wai**. n. All species of a genus of sedges (*Eleocharis*). (Neal 87.) Also *kohekohe*.
- pī.pī.wai**. v. To percolate, ooze, of water; to sprinkle water.
- pipi wai.ū**. n. Milk cow.
- pī Poko.liko**. Same as *pī nūnū*. Lit., Puerto Rican pea.
- piuka**. n. Pewter. (Nah. 31.22.) Eng.
- piuke, biute**. n. Beauty. Eng.
- piula**. 1. n. Mule, donkey (*Moloka'i*). 2. n. A card game; the player must follow suit in discards, and if he cannot, he draws from a pack; the object is to play all of one's cards, and the player left with a card at the end is the *piula*. Also *kēkake*. 3. vs. Tired, exhausted, worn-
