

out. *Slang*. 4. n. Pewter, tin (Nah. 31.22), corrugated iron as used for roofing; any metal suggesting pewter. *Eng.* See *pili piula*. *Wai piula*, water from a faucet.

piula wai. n. Faucet, water tap, hydrant. *Lit.*, water metal.

pī ulua. v. To fish *ulua* from the shore with a line but no pole.

piwa. n. 1. Also **fiwa**. Fever. *Eng.* *Pi'i ka piwa*, to have a temperature or fever. 2. Also **biwa**. Beaver. *Eng.* *Pā-pale piwa*, beaver hat.

piwa 'ele'ele. n. Black plague.

piwa ha'i.ha'i iwi. n. Dengue fever.

piwa haka. n. Beaver hat. *Eng.*

piwa ho'o.nā.wali.wali. n. Typhoid fever. *Lit.*, weakening fever.

pī.wai. n. 1. A variety of wild duck. 2. A type of hard rock used for adzes.

pī wai. v. To sprinkle water. See *'aha'aina pī wai*.

pī wai anu.heā. n. Sweet pea (*Lathyrus odoratus*). Also *pī anuheā*. (Neal 455.) *Lit.*, cool, fragrant pea.

piwa lena.lena. n. Yellow fever. *Ua loa'a i ka piwa lena-lena*, gotten the yellow fever [lazy; a pun on *lena* meaning "yellow" and "lazy"].

piwa 'ula'ula. n. Scarlet fever.

po-. Same as *pō-*. See *poale*, *pohole*, *poka'i*, *poluhi*.

pō. 1. nvs. Night, darkness, obscurity; the realm of the gods; pertaining to or of the gods, chaos, or hell; dark, obscure, benighted; formerly the period of 24 hours beginning with nightfall (the Hawaiian "day" began at nightfall, cf. *ao* 1.) *Fig.*, ignorance; ignorant. Cf. *Halāli'i*, *Pō'akahī*, *Pō'alua*. *Hō'ike a ka pō*, revelation from the gods [as in dreams or omens]. *Inoa pō*, name suggested for a child in a dream. *Mai ka pō mai*, from the gods; of divine origin. *Kāne o ka pō*, *wahine o ka pō*, husband of the night, wife of the night [spirit lover: it was believed that a child born of such a mating might resemble an eel, lizard, shark, or bird, or might have supernatural powers; sometimes death or sickness followed nightly visits]. *Nā pō o ka mahina*, days [*lit.*, nights] of the month. *Pō 'ahia kēia?* What day of the week [or month] is this? *Pō nui ho'olokolako*, the great night that supplies [the gods revealed their will in revelations and dreams at night]. *Pō pouli 'a'aki*, a night so dark it bites with the teeth. *Pō i ka lā'au*, darkened by the tree. *Ua pō*, it's late [not necessarily night, but usually said if one is in danger of not being home by dark]. *Ua hana māua ā pō ka lā*, we worked until night; *lit.*, until the day darkened. *Ua hana māua ā ao ka pō*, we worked until daylight; *lit.*, until the night lighted. *Kēlā pō ā ao a'e i nehinei*, night before last; *lit.*, that night until dawned yesterday. *Kēia pō*, tonight. *Ka pō nei*, last night. *'O ke kumu o ka pō i pō ai* (KL line 8), the source of the night that was dark. *Ua hiamoe akula kona pō* (FS 99), he spent the night sleeping. *Kou pō ua moe 'ia*, 'o ko'u nei lā, 'a'ole (song), you slept during the night, but not I. *Iho i ka pō*, ā i ke kolu o ka pō, *ola hou mai*, descended into hell, the third day rose again from the dead. *He aha ka puana a ka pō?* What declares the night [any revelation from the gods? what is to happen in the future?]? *'O 'akahī ka pō*, 'o 'alua ka pō . . . *lele wale ka pō* (FS 47), one night spirit, two night spirits . . . the night spirits fly off. **ho'o.pō**. To behave in an ignorant manner, perhaps purposefully; to keep out of sight, to stay in the dark; ignorant. (PPN *poo*.) 2. vs. Thick, dense, of flowers or heady fragrance; to issue perfume. See ex., *niniu*. *Ma'ema'e Lihau pō i ka lehua* (song), lovely Lihau dense with *lehua*. *E pō puni ana ke 'ala o ka hala*, the fragrance of pandanus spreads everywhere and is overpowering.

pō-. Time of, state of. See below, especially *pō'ele'ele*, *pōhae*, *pōhihi*, *pōhina*, *pō'ino*, *pōka'a*, *pōka'o*, *pōlena*, *pōlewa*, *pōluku*, *pōmaika'i*, *pōnalo*, *pōniho*, *pōniu*, *pōpilikia*, *pōule*. Also *po-*. (Probably PCP *po(o)-*.)

pō.ā, **pōwā**. nvt. Robber, pirate; to rob, plunder. See ex., For. 5:489. *E pōā wale ka hele aku ā kō ha'i 'aina*,

make (For. 4:47), like a robber to go on the lands of others, death.

po'a. 1. nvs. Castrated, emasculated; eunuch. Cf. *lio po'a*, *pipi po'a*. *Ka luna o ka po'e i po'a 'ia* (Dan. 1:3), the chief eunuch. (PPN *poka*.) 2. nvi. A sudden sound, as of flapping wings of a rooster, or of the thumping sound of the palms of the hands pressed together with fingers locked, or of hands striking the surface of the water; to make such sounds. 3. vt. To dig under, undermine.

po'a'aha. 1. Redup. of *pō'aha* 1. 2. n. The same as *wauke*, but the leaves commonly smaller, entire, and rounded. The leaves of *wauke* are commonly lobed.

po'a'ala. vi. To thump, as a drum with the base of the hand. *Rare*.

poa'e. Same as *poahi* 1, 2. *Rare*.

pō.a'e.a'e. Redup. of *poa'e*.

pō.āe.āe. n. 1. Armpit. 2. Axil of coconut frond. (For. 5:595.)

pō'aha. n. 1. Circle, as of flowers; ring, as of tapa about a sore that prevents friction; a round support for a calabash made of pandanus or ti leaves wrapped into a ring and bound with a cord. *Pō'ai 'ia ka pō'aha a puni i ka pōhaku*, the circle was completely encircled by stones. 2. General name for trailing plants.

Pō'ahā. n. Thursday; Congregational church meetings held weekly on Thursdays. *Lit.*, fourth day.

pō'aha mā.lama.lama. n. Halo. *Lit.*, light circle.

poaha.nui. Hollyhock. (And.)

poahi. 1. vs. Dim, obscure. 2. vi. To revolve, spin, go around; to rotate, of hips in a hula. *Rare*.

pōahi.ahi. Redup. of *poahi* 1, 2.

pō'ai. nvi. Circle, circuit, hoop, girdle; group, as of friends; to go around, make a circuit, encircle, girdle, coil, wind up; circulating; encircled, surrounded. Also *pōhai*. See ex., *pō'aha* 1. *Pō'ai a'ela ka huaka'i a puni 'o Hākau* (FS 141), the procession completely surrounded Hākau. **ho'o.pō'ai**. To encircle, surround, besiege, etc. (PCP *pookai*.)

pō'ai.āi. Redup. of *pō'ai*.

pō'ai.ā.lunu. n. Monopoly. *Lit.*, greedy circle.

Pō'ai-anu 'Ā.kau. n. Arctic Circle. *Lit.*, north cold circle.

Pō'ai-anu Hema. n. Antarctic Circle. *Lit.*, south cold circle.

pō'ai haele. vt. To go around, make a circuit, circumnavigate. *Ke pō'ai haele nei 'oukou i ke kai a me ka 'āina* (Mat. 23.15), you traverse sea and land.

Pō'ai-hala. n. A rain famous at Kaha-lu'u, O'ahu. *Lit.*, surrounding pandanus.

Pō'ai-hale. Var. of *Pō'ai-hala*. *Lit.*, surrounding house.

pō'ai hapa.lua. n. Semicircle, half circle.

pō'ai hele. Same as *pō'ai haele*.

pō'ai.lani. n. Horizon. *Lit.*, sky circle.

pō'ai.lewa. n. Firmament. *Lit.*, air circuit.

pō'ai.lō.'ihi. n. Ellipse, oval. *Lit.*, long circle.

Pō'ai-olu 'Ā.kau. n. Tropic of Cancer. *Lit.*, northern cool circle.

Pō'ai-olu Hema. n. Tropic of Capricorn. *Lit.*, southern cool circle.

pō'ai puni. vt. To travel around, circumnavigate, go completely around, encircle, besiege.

pō'ai puni maka.pō. n. Blindman's bluff. *Lit.*, circle surrounding blind.

pō'ai-waena-honua. n. Equator. *Lit.*, circle middle earth.

po'aka. n. Scar; mark, as of tattooing or tapa design.

Pō'akahī. n. Monday. *Lit.*, first day.

Pō'akolu. n. Wednesday. *Lit.*, third day.

Pō'akolu Kau Lehu. n. Ash Wednesday.

pō'ala. 1. Same as *pōka'a*. 2. vi. To sail off and on, as a vessel. *Rare*. 3. vt. To gargle. See *'ai pō'ala*.

pō'ala'ala. Redup. of *pō'ala* 1-3.

po'a.lani. n. A variety of fish (no data).

poale. vs. Deep, open, as a hole or sore; absorbent. Cf. *ale* 2.
