

pō.huku. vs. Swollen; protruding, especially of a round object; piled up, as a coil of hair on the head; heaped. Cf. 'ōhuku, pāhuku.

pō.huku.huku. Redup. of *pōhuku*; rising up and spreading, as smoke or clouds; overflowing; increasing in prosperity or number.

pō.huli. nvi. Sucker, sprout, shoot; to sprout, usually of bananas. See Neal 246. *E kanu ai i nā mea kanu maika'i, a e pōhuli i nā lālā waina* (Isa. 17.10), plant good plants, so that grapevine branches will sprout.

poi. n. 1. Poi, the Hawaiian staff of life, made from cooked taro corms, or rarely breadfruit, pounded and thinned with water. Cf. *kalo*. *Poi 'ili*, portion of a taro between the center (*hē*) and the peel. *Poi 'awa'awa*, sour poi [an unpleasant disposition]. (PPN *po'oi*, PCP *po(po)i*.) 2. Also *boi*. Boy. Eng.

po'i. 1. nvt. Cover, lid; to cover (preceded by *ke*.) Also *'ūpo'i*. *Hana Hilo i ke po'i a ka ua*, Hilo works under cover of the rain [much rain at Hilo]. *ho'o.po'i*. To cover. (PCP *poki*.) 2. nvi. Top or crest of a breaking wave; to break, of waves. *Inā e lawe 'ia au a ke po'i 'ana o ke kai, make au* (FS 15), if I am carried off by the breaking sea, I die. 3. n. Container, basin, as for liquids. 4. vt. To catch between cupped hands, as a small bird or butterfly; to pounce, as a cat on a mouse; to snatch. *He 'io po'i moa*, chicken-catching hawk [a thief]. (PPN *pō*.) 5. vt. To mound up, hill up.

po'ia. Same as *po'i* 1. *Po'ia i ke po'i*, cover with the lid.

pō.'ie.'ie. vs. Tired, weary, worn-out. *Pō'ie'ie ka la-wai'a a nehu o Wai-ākea, i ka ua, i ke anu, i ka ua, i ke anu* (chant), the *nehu* fishers of Wai-ākea are weary of the rain, the cold, of the rain, the cold.

poi hē. See *hē* 6.

po'i kalo. n. Mulch for dry-land taro. *Lit.*, taro cover.

pō iki. n. Early in the morning. *Ala i ka wā pō iki* (chant), rise in the early morn.

po'i.kū. vs. Overpowering, as love.

po'i lani. n. High heavens (preceded by *ke*).

poi mai'a. n. Mashed ripe bananas and water.

po'i.malau. n. Portuguese man-of-war (*Physalia*). Also *pa'imalau*.

poina. vt. To forget; forgotten. *Mai poina 'oe ia'u*, don't forget me. *Poina wale*, forgetful, absent-minded. *Poina ka no'ono'o*, forgetful; amnesia, dim memory. *'A'ole 'oe e poina i ke ali'i* (For. 5:125), the chief will not forget you. **ho'o.poina.** To cause to forget; same as above. *Ua ho'opoina 'oe i ke Akua* (Isa. 17.10), you have forgotten God. (PCP *poina*.)

po'ina. Same as *po'i* 2, but usually used as a noun. *Po'ina kai*, cresting of the sea, place where the sea crests and breaks.

Poi.nikia. nvs. Phoenicia; Phoenician. Eng.

pō.'ino. nvs. Misfortune, ill luck, affliction, distress, disaster, calamity, danger, misery, ill fate, damage, injury, peril, disaster; unfortunate. *Lit.*, evil time. Cf. *pō-maika'i*. *Pō'ino no ke Akua mai*, act of God. *Nui nā ola i pō'ino, ā 'o ka nui o nā pohō o nā waiwai i pō'ino*, many lives lost, and much loss of property through devastation. **ho'o.pō.'ino.** To harm, injure, distress, devastate; to cause misfortune, distress, damage. *Ho'opō'ino malū*, secret bringing of misfortune, sabotage. *Hale e hiki 'ole ai ke ho'opō'ino 'ia e ke ahi*, fire-proof houses.

poi palaoa. n. Flour poi, made by stirring flour in hot water, eaten alone or mixed with taro poi.

po'i pō. nvt. Night attack or ambush; to attack thus.

po'i.po'i. Redup. of *po'i* 1, 4, 5; to conceal, as property that one does not want to share with others, or as a secret; to cover up, as the truth; to smother, as a fire; to hush the wailing of a child. **ho'o.po'i.po'i.** Caus/sim. (PCP *pokipoki*.)

po'i.pū. 1. nvt. To cover over entirely, as of clouds or engulfing waves; to attack, overwhelm; onslaught, attack (For. 4:53). *Ua po'ipū i ka mana o ke kahuna*, entirely under the influence of the priest. 2. n. A kind of tapa.

po'iu. vs. Afar, very high, of high rank, glorious, sacred.

poi 'uāla. Same as *pa'i 'uāla*.

po'i 'uhane. nv. Soul snatching; to snatch or capture the souls of either the dead or of living persons, as by sorcery.

pō.'iu.'iu. Redup. of *po'iu*.

poi 'ulu. n. Breadfruit poi.

po'i wai holo. n. Washbasin, finger bowl. *Lit.*, water container for washing.

poka. Same as *moka*, offal.

pō.kā. n. Bullet, cannon ball, shot, shell, pellet; ball at the end of a prisoner's chain. *Pōkā ua hekili*, hailstones; *Lit.*, thunder-rain ball.

pō.kā'a. nvt. Ball, coil, roll, reel, spool, as of twine; dried pandanus leaves being kept for plaiting; to wind, roll, coil, as into a ball; to revolve, go around, gyrate. Cf. *ka'a*, turn.

pō.kā'a.kā'a. 1. Same as *pokaka'a*; overwhelmed and confused as by too much work. **ho'o.pō.kā'a.kā'a.** Same as *ho'opokaka'a*; to overwhelm, bewilder with a succession of tasks. 2. Redup. of *pōka'a*. *E pōka'aka'a mai 'oe i nāhi lau hala*, wind up some pandanus leaves.

pō.kā'a kaula. n. 1. Ring, as used in a game of ringtoss. *Kiloi pōka'a kaula*, to toss rings in a game of ringtoss or quoits. 2. Coil or roll of rope.

pō.kā'a lopi. n. Spool of thread.

pō.kā'a pī.lali. n. Bobbin winder, of a sewing machine.

pō.kā'a.wili, pō.kā'u.wili. Similar to *ka'awili*. *Ahi poka'u.wili*, pinwheel (fireworks).

poka'i. vi. To go along, as wind-blown smoke. *Rare*.

pokaka, potasa. n. Potash. Eng.

poka.kā. Short for *pokaka'a*. *Ua lohi nā pokakā o kona mau ka'a kaua* (Lunk. 5.28), the wheels of his war chariot were slow.

poka.kā'a. Redup. of *pōka'a*; revolving, gyrating, whirling, spinning; wheel, as on a pulley or cart, swivel.

ho'o.poka.kā'a. To spin, roll, coil, revolve; to repeat the same story over and over.

poka.kā'o. Redup. of *pōka'o*.

pokake. nvs. Mushroom-shaped; head of the penis.

pō.kala.kala. Same as *pua kala*, the beach or prickly poppy.

pō.kā lū. n. Buckshot, gunshot, grapeshot. Cf. *lū*.

pō.kano. vs. Very dark.

pō.kā'o. vs. Barren; dry and tasteless, as flavorless meat; naked, destitute. *Fig.*, boring, lacking in humor. Cf. *ka'o, pīka'o*.

pō.kā'o.kā'o. Redup. of *pōka'o*. Cf. *laho pōka'oka'o*.

pō.kā pahū. nvs. Bomb, bullet, mine, bombardment; to bomb, shoot. *Lit.*, bursting bullet.

pō.kā pō.pō ahi. n. Incendiary bomb.

pō.kā pū. n. Bullet for gun or pistol.

pō.kā pū kuni ahi. n. Cannon ball. *Lit.*, bullet from the fire-burning gun.

pō.kā ukali. n. The wadding discharged from a weapon, such as rifle or cannon; the weapon is muzzle-loaded with powder secured by wadding followed by a projectile in the form of a ball or small shot.

poke. nvt. To slice, cut crosswise into pieces, as fish or wood; to press out, as the core of a boil (Kam. 64:105) or the meat of an *'opihi* shell; section, slice, piece. *Poke he'e*, a severed portion of octopus; *fig.*, a chubby person. *Poke 'ina*, the tongue-like meat found in the *'ina*, sea urchin; to remove this meat.

pō.kē. nvt. Bouquet; to make a bouquet. *Pōkē 'ōmou*, corsage. Eng.

pokea. Pas/imp. of *poke*. (For. 6:401.)

Poke.kona. n. Boston. Eng.

pokela, potera. n. Potter; pottery. Eng. *Ka 'āina o ka potera* (Mat. 27.10), the potter's field.

poke'o. 1. nvs. Child, childhood; preadolescent. 2. Rare var. of *pake'o*. 3. n. A type of ancient prayer. (For. 6:17.)

pō.keo.keo. 1. nvs. Turkey gobble, turkey, sound of a turkey hen's cluck. *Ni'ihau*. More commonly called *pe-lehā*. 2. vs. Plump. 3. nvs. Prosperous, well-to-do; prosperity, a large sum of money. Also *po'okeyeokeo*. 4. vs. Drenched. *Rare*.

poke.poke. Redup. of *poke*; to chop.
