

- pō.lina.lina.** Same as *pōhinahina*, a beach shrub. *O'ahu.*
- pō.liō.** nvs. Dark, dismal, gloomy; place of torment. *Rare.*
- poli.poli.** 1. n. A soft, porous stone as used for polishing or for octopus lure sinkers. 2. vs. Rounded, of an adze. (Malo 51.)
- pō.liu.** vs. Dark, mysterious.
- pō.liua.** Same as *polohiwa*. *Rare.*
- pō.liu.kua.** Same as *polikua*. *Lit.*, back mystery.
- pō.li'u.li'u.** Same as *kōli'uli'u*, far, dimly seen.
- poli.wai.ū.** n. Wet nurse. *Lit.*, milk bosom.
- poli.wā.wāe.** n. Hollow of the foot, instep.
- polo.** 1. vs. Large, thick, plump. *Polo hana 'ole*, fat one who does no work [especially one depending on his mate]. 2. vt. To poke, stab. 3. n. Special prayer offered to the spirits of the dead. (Kep. 23.) 4. Var. of *pololei* 2, and also usually followed by the epithet *kani kua mauna*. 5. n. Polo. *Eng.* 6. (*Cap.*) n. Star names. See below.
- polo-** An initial part of certain words referring to pandanus: *polohīnana*, *polokā*, *polope'a*, *polopoloua*.
- Polo Ahi Lani.** n. Name of a star, said to be associated with Mūlehu. Also *Pōhina*, *Polohilani*, *Polo 'Ula*, *Polo Wehi Lani*.
- polo'ai.** vt. To summon, command to appear, invite; to proclaim publicly.
- polohi.** vs. Smooth, as of skin. *Ka-'ili-polohi-lani-o-Lo'eau* (name), the smooth royal skin of Lo'eau.
- Polohi.lani.** Var. of *Polo Ahi Lani*, a star.
- polo.hina.** nvs. Gray, misty, smoky. *Fig.*, affectionate grief, pity. *Noe polohina no ke aloha i ku'u hoa* (chant), gray pitying mist for the love of my companion.
- polo.hī.nano.** n. White male pandanus bloom (*hīnana*) with its stem.
- polo.hiwa.** vs. Dark, glistening black, as clouds or tapa. (Kep. 175.) *Ua hala i ke ao polohiwa a Kāne*, passed to the dark clouds of Kāne [death].
- polo.hua.** Same as *'olohua*, berries of *pōpolo*. *Rare.*
- polo.huku.** 1. vs. Large, plump, swelling, bulging; rich, prosperous. 2. n. Boat hook. *Eng.*
- poloka.** n. 1. Frog, toad, *bufo*. *Eng.* 2. Also *boroka*. Broker. *Eng.* 3. Also *borota*. Broth. *Eng.* 4. *Canna* (*Canna indica*). (Neal 263-4.) Also *ali'ipoe*.
- polo.kā.** n. Ripe pandanus fruit.
- polo.kake.** nvs. Slippery; wobbly; saturation. *Ka polokake wai ua o Ko'olau*, the saturation of rain water at Ko'olau.
- poloka (poroka) kua.** n. Square pole, in surveying.
- polo.kalama.** n. Program, a term invented in the mid-1970s for the Hawaiian language radio program. *Eng.*
- polo.kā.wa'e.** n. 1. Fish spear. *Rare.* 2. Pining, wasting sickness. *Rare.*
- poloke.** vs. Broken; broke, without funds (slang). *Eng.*
- ho'o.poloke.** Caus/sim. *Ho'opoloke i ka mana'o*, to change the mind.
- polo.kē.** n. Fresh poi. *Rare.*
- pō.loke.** Var. of *pāloke*, wobbly. (FS 213.)
- polo.kika, polotika.** nvs. Political; politics. *Eng.*
- polo.lēi.** 1. vs. Straight, upright, direct, correct, right, O.K., accurate, all right; eyes front [military command]. Also *pololoi*. *Kū pololei*, to stand straight, sheer, perpendicular, vertical. *E pololei ana ke kua*, the back will be straightened. **ho'o.pololei.** To straighten, correct, reform; to aim, as a gun; to be partial and treat with favoritism. *Kula ho'opololei keiki kāne*, boys' reform school. 2. n. A land shell (*Lamellaxis*), frequently followed poetically by the epithet *kani kua mauna*, singing in the mountain ridges. *'O ka maiau pololei kani le'ale'a* (PH 204), the land-shell neatness singing gaily. 3. n. Fresh poi. *Kaua'i*. 4. n. An adder's-tongue fern (*Ophioglossum concinnum*), a small native fern with single narrow-oblong blade, which supports one narrow spore-bearing spike about 2.5 cm long.
- pō.loli.** nvs. Hunger, famine; hungry. *Make pōloli*, starved to death. **ho'o.pō.loli.** To deprive of food, starve, cause hunger; to fast. (PCP *pololi*.)
- polo.lia.** n. Jellyfish.
- pololo.** vs. Talkative; to talk without tact. *Pololo ka waha*, to talk abusively.
- pō.lolo.** Same as *kauna'oa pehu*, one of the dodders (*Cassytha filiformis*).
- polo.loa.** vs. Blundering, awkward; to go astray. *Rare.*
- pololo.hua.** Same as *pololo*. Cf. *mīkololohua*.
- pō.lolo.hua.mēa.** vs. Dark, dense, distant. *Rare.*
- polo.loi.** Var. of *pololei* 1.
- polo.lū.** n. Long spear.
- polona.** Same as *polopolona*.
- polo.pē'a.** n. Thick stem of a pandanus fruit.
- polo.peka.** nvs. Professor; professorial; to be a professor. *Eng.*
- polo.polo.** Same as *pōpolo*, the plant.
- polo.polona.** n. Musty odor; rancid, moldy odor, as of mildewed clothes; stuffy or stale smell of a room long closed.
- polo.polo.ua.** n. Unripe, growing pandanus fruit.
- Polo 'Ula.** Same as *Polo Ahi Lani*, a star.
- polo.wai.** n. Water polo.
- Polo Wehi Lani.** Same as *Polo Ahi Lani*, a star.
- polu.** *Rare* var. of *'āpolu*, wet.
- polū.** vs. Blue, as of clothes or Euro-American objects and not of sea or sky. *Eng.* Cf. *uliuli*.
- polu.ā, poluwā.** n. Nausea, retching. Cf. *poluea*.
- pō.lua.** 1. vs. Dark, stormy. *Ku'u hoa pili o ka ua lani pōlua*, my constant companion in the rains from the deep dark heavens. 2. n. Disturbances produced by conflicting currents, as of air, water, tides, winds.
- polu.ēa.** nvs. Nausea, dizziness, seasickness; hangover; seasick, qualmish, dizzy. (Cf. *-ea*.) *'O Ka'ala, kuahiwi mauna kēhau . . . poluea ihola i lalo o Hale-'au'au* (PH 100), Ka'ala, hill mountainous and dew-covered, dizzy [to gaze] below at Hale-'au'au.
- poluhi.** vs. Dull, sleepy. Also *malohi*.
- pō.luhi.** n. Long spear. *Rare.*
- pō.luhi.luhi.** Redup. of *poluhi*. Also *mālohilohi*.
- pō.luku.** vt. To pound, as poi (Kep. 163); to destroy, slaughter, overthrow, pound to pieces. See ex., *palahē*. Cf. *pāluku*.
- pō.luku.luku.** Redup. of *pōluku*.
- polu.luhi.** 1. Redup. of *poluhi*. *Ho'omamalu ē, malu ka lani, poluluhi kaumaha ka honua* (chant), casting gloom, gloomy is the sky, the earth is heavy with drowsiness. 2. vs. Cloudy, misty, shady. *Rare.*
- pō.lumi.lumi.** vs. Packed, crushed together, as in a crowd.
- pō.lumu.** n. General name for trailing plants. *Rare.*
- pō.lunu.** vs. Chubby, plump, and short. *Rare.*
- pō.lunu.lunu.** Redup. of *pōlunu*, chubby, short.
- polu.polu.** vs. Flabby, fat.
- poma.** Same as *'āpala*, apple (*Pyrus malus*). (Neal 388.) (French *pomme*.)
- pō.mai.kā'i.** nvi. Good fortune, blessedness, blessing, profit, prosperity; prosperous, fortunate, beneficial, blessed, lucky; good luck, improvement (of property), welfare, benefits. Cf. *pō'ino*. *Pōmaika'i 'ole*, unfortunate, unlucky. *Pōmaika'i au*, blessed am I. *He pōmaika'i 'ia mai ke Akua* (Kel. 38), a blessing from God. *E pili mau nā pōmaika'i me 'oe*, may you always have good fortune [a way to say 'best wishes']. **ho'o.pō.mai.kā'i.** To cause good fortune; to bless, improve, ask grace; blessing.
- pō.mano.** n. Dam. *Rare.*
- pō mano.** nvs. Many nights; very dark.
- pō mano.mano.** Redup. of *pō mano*.
- pomei.kalana.** n. The pomegranate (*Punica granatum*), an ornamental and fruit-bearing shrub from Persia. *Eng.* Also *pomelaike*, *pomekelane*, *pomeraite*. (Neal 620-2.)
- pomeke.lane, pomegerane.** n. Pomegranate. *Eng.* (Kanl. 8.8.) See *pomeikalana*.
- pome.laike, pomeraite.** n. Pomegranate. *Eng.* See *pomeikalana*. *Kihāpai pomeraite* (Mel. 4.3), orchard of pomegranates.
- pona.** 1. n. Socket; eyeball, eye socket; joint of sugar-
