

kind of (preceding a stem). *Pono 'ai*, to eat in any way or anything, take potluck. *Pono hana*, to work any way that suits one. *Pono nō i ka noho*, living any old way, shiftless. *Pono lolo*, any kind of clothes. *Mai pono hana 'oe, akā e hana pono*, don't work carelessly, but work carefully.

pono hale. n. Furniture, household goods.

pono hana. n. Tools. See also *pono 6*.

pono.huku. Var. of *polohuku 1, 2*.

pono.T. nvs. Self, own; private, personal; directly, exactly. 'O wau pono'T, I, myself. *Kona pono'T*, his own. *Hawai'i pono'T*, Hawaii's own [own people]. *No'u pono'T kēia*, this is my own. *I mua pono'T*, directly in front. 'I'o pono'T, own flesh and blood. *Kona mana'o pono'T*, his personal opinion. *Nā hana loio nona pono'T iho*, attorney's private practice.

pono kai lawai'a. n. Fishing rights.

pono.kalapa, ponogarapa. n. Phonograph. *Eng.*

pono kau.like. n. Equal rights.

pono kī.wila. n. Civil rights.

pono koho pā.loka. n. Right of suffrage.

pono.kope. nvt. Copyright; to copyright; to copy in any way, not necessarily properly.

pō.nolu. vs. Carelessly, unceremoniously. *Rare.*

pono pa'a mau. n. Fixtures.

pono pili.kino. n. Private rights.

pono.pono. 1. vs. Neat, tidy, in order, arranged, cared for, attended to, administered. **ho'o.pono.pono**. (a) To put to rights; to put in order or shape, correct, revise, adjust, amend, regulate, arrange, rectify, tidy up, make orderly or neat, administer, superintend, supervise, manage, edit, work carefully and neatly; to make ready, as canoemen preparing to catch a wave (For. 5:127). Cf. *luna ho'oponopono, mea ho'oponopono. Ho'oponopono 'ole*, slovenly untidy, disorderly, careless, thoughtless, uninhibited, blunt, reckless. *Ho'oponopono hou*, to revise, reorganize, re-edit. *Noho ho'oponopono 'ole*, sitting in a careless or indecent way. *Kāna ho'oponopono 'ana i ka 'āina* (Laie 495), his apportioning of the land [on becoming chief]. *Ka ho'oponopono waiwai 'ana* (For. 5:129), the financial arrangements, adjustments. *Ho'oponopono waiwai*, administrator or executor of an estate; to administer an estate. *Hale ho'oponopono*, administration building. *Ka ho'oponopono 'ana*, regulation. *Kānāwai ho'oponopono 'ia*, revised law. (b) Mental cleansing: family conferences in which relationships were set right (*ho'oponopono*) through prayer, discussion, confession, repentance, and mutual restitution and forgiveness (Nānā 60). 2. Redup. of *pono 1*. 3. vs. Comfortably well off, wealthy. *Ponopono ka nohona*, comfortably well-to-do.

pono 'uhane. n. Spiritual welfare.

pono wai. n. Water rights.

pō.nuhu.nuhu. Var. of *pānuhunuhu*.

pō.nulu. vs. 1. Bulky, loose, as a bundle. *Rare.* 2. Rising and floating off, as smoke, clouds. *Rare.* 3. Short, stumpy. *Rare.*

ponu.lulu. Redup. of *pōnulu 1-3*. *Rare.*

pō.nulu.nulu. Redup. of *pōnulu 1-3*. *Rare.*

ponununu. Var. of *ponululu*.

po'o. 1. n. Head, summit, head or director of an organization, executive, principal; end, as of a rope, leaf, pole, cane, *kōnane* board; head of a penis or boil; headline, heading, title; father (see *po'o lua, po'o 'ole*); hair in such expressions as *po'o hina, po'o kea* (preceded by *ke*). See saying, *pau 1*. *Po'o mai'a*, upper part of a banana stalk. *Ke po'o o nā moku*, the head of the islands [Hawai'i]. *Nā po'o 'oihana*, executive departments. 'A'ohe mea nāna e pa'i i ke po'o, no one can slap his head [he has no superior, especially in knowledge]. *Moe po'o ā hi'u*, to lie from head to tail [in trouble]. **ho'o.po'o**. To appoint a head or leader; to go ahead; to be brave. *Lele ho'opo'o a'ela ka ua* (For. 6:240), the rain falls headlong. (PEP 'upoko.) 2. n. A whole note (music). Cf. *po'o'ele, po'olima, po'omana,*

po'omanakolu, po'omanalua. 3. nvt. Depression, cavity; to dip, scoop, hollow out, dub, erode, dig; to splash, as water by scooping the base of the palm; to make a squeaky sound by placing one hand against the armpit of the opposite arm, and pressing that arm against the hand; to make a noise by snapping the lips with the fingers. Cf. *kapo'o, napo'o. ho'o.po'o*. To dig, dub out. (PPN *poko*.)

po'o'ele. n. Quarter note (music). *Lit.*, black full note.

po'o.hala. vt. To carry on the virtues, arts, and skills of the family. *Lit.*, passing on the head.

po'o hina. vs. Gray- or white-haired; ash-colored. (PH 34).

po'o.hiwi. n. 1. Shoulder. *Ua lawa pono nā po'ohiwi*, shoulders are very strong. (PCP *pokofwi*.) 2. Wing of the body (*manu*) of a kite.

po'o ho'o.lewa. n. A very taboo chief whose shadow might not fall on himself or on any other person; he was carried about at night. *Lit.*, carried head.

po'o hou. n. Symbol of a paragraph. *Lit.*, new heading.

po'o.hū. nvs. 1. Wound, swelling, as on the head. *Po'ohū ka lae*, his forehead is bruised [he has paid dearly]. *Po'ohū ka lae i ka 'alā*, lumps in the forehead from the hard volcanic rock (a large fee). *Po'ohū ka lae, kahi i ka pohue*, lumps in the forehead, rub with a gourd [get the remedy for trouble]. 2. Prolonged resonance, as of a gong or as heard after striking a certain kind of stone. *Rare.*

po'o hua'i. n. Splitting headache. *Po'o hua'i lama*, a splitting headache or hangover caused by liquor.

po'o huku. n. Top point of a hill, ridge; sharp tips of ridges of a file or rasp. *Lit.*, protruding head.

po'o hulu. n. Chief featherworker for a chief, a hereditary office.

po'o huna. vs. Hidden, mysterious, invisible, as the gods. *Po'o huna i ke ao uli*, godheads hidden in the dark clouds.

po'o.ke'eo. vs. Bent over, as in carrying a heavy load. *Rare.*

po'o.kanaka. n. 1. A variety of watermelon. *Lit.*, human head. 2. Kohala name for pansy. See *pāneki*.

po'o kanaka. n. Human head, skull. Cf. *heiau po'o kanaka*.

po'o kea. Same as *po'o hina*.

po'o.kela. nvi. Foremost, best, superior, prime, outstanding, greatest, supreme, utmost, superlative; champion; to excel. *E ho'oha'aha'a 'ia nō kō 'olua mau po'okela* (Ier. 13:18), your principalities shall come down.

po'o.keo.keo. Same as *pōkeokeo 3*. *I ku'u 'ike 'ana i ka po'okeokeo 'ana o ka po'e hewa* (Hal. 73:3), when I saw the prosperity of the wicked.

po'o ke'o.ke'o. nvs. White-haired; platinum blonde.

po'o kepa. n. Hair cut in an extraordinary manner, as of one in mourning in the old days, with only part of the hair cut. *Lit.*, sideways head.

po'o.ki'e.ki'e. n. High heads, a name for the great gods, Kāne, Kana, and Lono. (Kep. 19.)

po'o kihi.kihi. vs. Cocked, as a hat; angular, as a head.

po'o.ki'i. n. Mask, jack-o'-lantern. *Lit.*, image head.

po'o.koi. vs. Envied. *Rare.*

po'o.ko'i. n. Sorcerer.

po'o ko'i. nvs. Adze-headed, a term of ridicule for one with a sharp or projecting forehead; also an insulting term for evil sorcerers, so-called because they were "frequently" beheaded (Kam. 64:123).

Po'o-kole. n. Rain said to occur in the month of Welo. (For. 5:665.)

po'o kua.keā. vs. Gray-haired. *Lit.*, bleached head.

po'o kumu. n. School principal. *Lit.*, teacher head.

po'o.lā. n. 1. Stevedore. *Lit.*, sun head. 2. The few Hawaiian varieties of small native trees (*Claoxylon sandwicense*), in the euphorbia family, with soft wood, large oblong, toothed leaves, small clustered flowers, the fruit a three-parted capsule. (Neal 499.) 3. See 'ama'ama 1, laukea 1.
