

pua.puahi. Redup. of *puahi* 1, 2. *Puapuahi ka pahapaha o Poli-hale*, gray is the seaweed of Poli-hale.

pua.pua'i. Redup. of *pua'i*; to pour continuously or often. *E puapua'i mai anei ka wai 'ono?* (Iak. 3.11), does sweet water pour forth?

pu'a.pu'ala. Redup. of *pū'ala* 1, 2.

pua.pua.moa. n. 1. Long-tailed dinner coat. Also *pupuamoa*. 2. A kind of adder's-tongue fern (*Ophioglossum pendulum*), found in Polynesia westward into Madagascar, commonly growing on trees. It has ribbon-like fronds, erect or bent and hanging, 60 cm long or less, some bearing short, narrow, spore-filled spikes.

pua.pua moa. n. Tail feathers of a chicken.

pua.pua.nui. n. A variety of banana.

pua.pupupu. n. Double flowering.

pū.'au. n. Ti-leaf blossom stem. (HP 206.) *Rare*.

pua.'ula. n. Young *kāmū* or 'āhuluhulu, fish.

pua 'ula.'ula. n. Natal grass (*Rhynchelytrum repens*), grown for forage; highly ornamental. (Neal 74.)

pū aupaka. Same as 'ōlulu.

pua.'u'u. nv. Masturbation; to masturbate. *Lit.*, to pull issue.

puawa. 1. Same as *pua awa*, young *awa*, fish. 2. Same as *kuawa*, guava. *Ni'ihau*.

pū.'awa. 1. n. Young white pandanus leaves that are good for plaiting. 2. nvs. Bitter; bitterness.

pū 'awa. n. Kava plant or root portion, formerly used as offerings: see *'ike* 1.

pū.'awa.'awa. Redup. of *pū'awa* 1.

pu'a.wai. n. Spittle, slobber, spray. *Rare*.

puawe. Same as *awe*, thin, soft. *Rare*.

pū.awe.awe. Redup. of *puawe*. *Rare*.

pue. 1. vi. To huddle or sit crouched, as with cold. **ho'o.-pue.** Caus/sim. 'O ka pua 'ilima i kui 'ia, ka'u e ho'o-pue nei i ka poli (song), the 'ilima blossoms strung in a lei, that I press to my heart. *Ho'opue au i ke ko'eko'e*, I sit huddled up with cold. 2. n. Feathers on the back of a bird above the *puapua*, tail feathers.

pu'ē. 1. nvt. Hill, as of sweet potatoes; dune; to hill up. Cf. *pu'e one*. (PPN *puke*.) 2. vt. To attack, force, ravish, rape, compel. *Keiki pu'e*, boy or youth who ravishes women. (Puk. 22.16.) (PPN *puke*.) 3. n. A lobelia (*Lobelia gaudichaudii* var. *kauaensis*) found only in mountains of Kaua'i. The stem, 1 to 2 m high, bears a tuft of narrow leaves 15 cm long, and three or four racemes of large flowers, whitish streaked with purple.

pu'ē.ēke. vi. To shrink away from; to shorten, contract; to grimace. **ho'o.pu'ē.ēke.** Caus/sim.

pu'ē.ēna. vs. Glowing, as fire. *Pu'ē.ēna maila ka lua i ke akua* (chant of Ka'ū chiefs), the pit glows because of the goddess.

puehu. 1. vs. Scattered, dispersed, routed, gone, tousled; fine, crumbling; every which way, as hair in the wind. 'Ai ā lawa, inu ā kena, puehu 'oe, eat until satisfied, drink until replete, all gone! *Ua puehu ka hulu o ka manu*, the feathers of the bird have scattered [said of one who has left in a hurry]. *No Hanamā'ulu ka ipu puehu*, an empty calabash at Hanamā'ulu [no hospitality at Hanamā'ulu, probably a play on *mā'ulu*, tired]. **ho'o.puehu.** To scatter, disperse, rout, blow away, whisk, crumble; blown away, fluff; gone. (PCP *pu(u)efu*.) 2. vi. Peeling, as sunburn. 3. nvi. Remainder, remnant; to remain. 'Elua ā puehu, two and a little over. 'Ā 'o ka puehu ka mea i puehu aku o nā pale o ua uhi lā, ā ka hapalua o ka pale puehu, e kau nō ia ma ke kua o ka halelewa (Puk. 26.12), and the remnant that remained of the curtains of the tent, the half of the remaining curtain, it shall hang at the back of the tabernacle.

pū.ēhu.ēhu. Redup. of *puehu* 1-3; tousled; flaky. *Hau pūehuehu*, snowflake. *Māhuna ka 'ili, nakaka pūehuehu 'ino'ino loa ke nānā aku*, the skin is flaked, cracked and peeling, unpleasant to look at. *Pūehuehu ka lā, komo 'ino'ino* (Malo 216), the sun is routed, storms enter. (PCP *puuefuefu*.)

pū.ēke. Same as *pūliki*, to gird.

puela. nvs. A long tapa strip, as used for a marker or banner; narrow, thin, as a banner.

pueo. 1. n. Hawaiian short-eared owl (*Asio flammeus sandwichensis*), regarded often as a benevolent 'aumakua (HM 124). *Keiki a ka pueo*, child of an owl [one whose father is not known]. 2. vs. Short (perhaps so called because the owl's neck was short). Cf. *hue nuku pueo*. 'Oki pueo 'ia ka lauoho, hair cut short. 3. Same as 'aho pueo, main purlin of a house. *Ku'u manu noho pū me ke kanaka: pueo* (riddle), my bird living with people: owl [pun on 'aho pueo]. 4. vt. To rock a child on the foot; while doing this one amused the child by chanting *pūeoeo*. 5. n. Shroud of a ship or canoe. 6. See *papapueo*, a taro. Other names recorded (HP 34) are *pueo hālenalena* and *pueo ke'oke'o*. 7. n. House lashing. (Kam. 76:97.)

pū.ēo.ēo. Redup. of *pueo* 4; to rock a child.

pu'e one. n. Sand dune, sand bar. *Ku'u ipo i ka he'e pu'e one* (song), my sweetheart surfing [over the] sand bar [referring to the old sport of surfing up into the very mouth of a stream].

pue.pue. Redup. of *pue* 1.

pu'e.pu'e. Redup. of *pu'e* 1, 2. (PPN *pukepuke*, to hold; PCP *pukepuke*, hills.)

pue.puehu. Same as *pūehuehu*.

puewa. nvi. To float, drift, as carried by wind or tide; a vagabond. *Rare*.

pu'e.wai. n. Agitated water, as under a waterfall or at the meeting of stream and sea. Cf. *he'e pu'ewai*.

pu'e.wale. vt. To force, attack, rape. *E ku'u kaikunāne, mai pu'e wale mai 'oe ia'u* (2 Sam. 13.12), my brother, do not force me.

pū.hā. 1. nvi. Abscess, burst sore, ulcer; to break, burst. *Ua pa'apū ko'u kino i ka ilo a me ka pāpā'a lepo, a laila pūhā hou a'ela* (Ioba 7.5), my body is covered with worms and filthy clots and then breaks out afresh. 2. n. Hollow, as a tree. *Noho ihola lākou maloko o nā pūhā lā'au* (Laie 431), they then lived within hollow trees. 3. vi. To belch, burp, clear the throat, hawk up phlegm. **ho'o.pū.hā.** Caus/sim. (PCP *pu(u)fa(a)*.) 4. vi. To breathe air, as a sea turtle. *Pūhā hewa ka honu i ka lā makani*, the turtle breathes at the wrong moment on a windy day [one who says the wrong thing]. (PCP *pu(u)-fa(a)*.) 5. n. A brown seaweed (*Colpomenia sinuosa*), cushion-shaped, hollow, surface smooth and uneven; not eaten. Cf. *nakeke*.

pū.hā.'a'ā. nv. Spots, as uncooked spots in taro; light spots on a cowry shell; to burst forth, as light. *Rare*.

puhaakakaiaea. Malo's spelling of *pūhakakaiaea*. (Malo 40.)

pū.hā.hā. Redup. of *pūhā* 4. *Fig.*, to speak loudly, harshly, or evilly of others.

puha.halu. Redup. of *puhalu*.

pū.hai. vs. Shallow, of roots. *He noni no Ka-ua-lehu, he pūhai a'a*, a noni tree of Ka-ua-lehu [a rocky place at Ka'ū Hawai'i] whose roots are in shallow ground [one with superficial knowledge].

puhai.nā.nā. To stare without replying, as to a question. (And.)

pū.haka. 1. n. Loins, waist. *Ka mea ma nā pūhaka, a me ka 'a'a o ke au ma ke akepa'a* (Oihk. 3.4), the thing by the flanks and the caul of the bile at the liver. 2. Same as *hakahaka*, empty. *Rare*.

pū.haka.haka. Redup. of *pūhaka* 2. *Rare*.

pū.haka.kai.ēa. Same as *noio*, a sea bird. *Rare*.

pū.hala. n. Pandanus tree. See *hala*. *Kumu pū hala*, pandanus tree. *Ulu pū hala*, pandanus grove. (PPN *fala*, PCP *puu fala*.)

pū.hā.lā.'au. n. Hollow in a tree.

pū.hala.hio. vi. To run away, dash by, whiz by. **ho'o.-pū.hala.hio.** To chase off, help escape.

pū.hala.kē. Same as *pōhalakē*. *Rare*.

pū.hala.lū. 1. vs. Large, flabby, fat, bloated, obese. **ho'o.pū.hala.lū.** To fill with air, inflate. 2. vi. To cry out, as a bird. *Rare*.

pū.hali. 1. n. A kind of fragile sea shell, possibly *Janthina* or *Argonauta*. *Lit.*, carried shell. 2. Stingy. (And.)
