

puhi pala.hoana. n. A shallow-water fish (*Brotula multibarbata*). Also *puhi hoana*, *palahoana*.
puhi.pala.lā. vs. Tall, thin, emaciated. *Rare*.
puhi palaoa. n. Baker.
puhi pā.lina. n. A variety of eel (no data).
puhi pā.pa'a. n. A variety of eel (no data). *Lit.*, burned eel.
puhi pau. vt. Blown away; completely burned; to blow or burn away. *Puhi pau 'ia nā mea huna*, all the secrets were blown away [revealed].
puhi.puhi. Redup. of *puhi* 2, to blow. (PPN *pusipusi*.)
puhi.puhi.ahi. Redup. of *puhi ahi*. *Fig.*, short-tempered.
puhi pule. n. A small, spotted eel. *Lit.*, eel variegated in color.
pū.hi'u. vi. 1. To break wind audibly (cf. *hio* 3), considered rude; to cause failure by audible flatulency; a term of contempt for show-offs. *Ua pūhi'u 'ia ka hālāwai*, the meeting failed because of [a member's] flatulency (a belief). *Pu'u pūhi'u*, flatulency difficult to suppress. **ho'o.pū.hi'u.** Caus/sim. *Lā'au ho'opūhi'u*, a medicine for relief of gas pains by flatulency. 2. Irreverence; rude. *'Ai pūhi'u* (Malo 30), to eat without observance of taboos, especially of men who prepared food for chiefs and who were allowed to eat in their presence.
puhi ū.hā. n. A variety of eel (*Conger cinereus*), mustache conger. It has a white ventral side and darker dorsal side and is nearly 1 m in length; greatly favored by some to eat.
puhi ū.hā kala.koa. n. A variety of eel (no data). *Lit.*, calico (*Eng.*) *ūhā* eel.
pū.hi'u.hi'u. Redup. of *pūhi'u* 1, 2.
Puhi-ula. n. Name of a legendary eel; according to one authority, a *Conger cinereus* eel. *Lit.*, red eel.
puhi 'u'uku. See *puhi* 6.
puhi wela. n. A variety of eel (no data). *Lit.*, warm eel.
pū.hō. Same as *pūhā* 1.
puho.hō. vi. Windy; to blow strongly, as through an aperture; a sweep of wind. See ex., *polikua*.
puhole, ho'o.puhole. Same as *pohole*, *ho'opohole*. Cf. *hole* 1.
pū.holo. vt. To steam, especially by stuffing flesh, as of pig, with hot rocks and placing in a sealed calabash; to take a sweat bath; to steam a corpse so that the flesh (*pela*) will separate from the bones.
pū.holo.holo. Redup. of *pūhōlo*.
pū ho'o.kani. n. Conch trumpet; any wind instrument, as trumpet, cornet, saxophone. *Lit.*, sounding triton shell.
puhue.hue. Var. of *pōhuehue*, morning glory. (And.)
pū.huli. vi. To grow thick, of *huli*, taro shoots.
pū.hulu.hulu. 1. vs. Hairy, shaggy, downy, hirsute, bushy. *'Umi'umi pūhuluhulu*, bushy beard. 2. Same as *hulu* 'lilo 1, 2, seaweeds.
pu'i. Same as *pu'ipu'i*.
puā. vs. Sweet-smelling, diffused, as fragrance; permeated with perfume, fragrant. *Ka puā 'ala o ka hanu* (song), the fragrant issue of the breath. **ho'o.puā.** To perfume.
puihē. Same as *iheihe*, a fish.
pū.'ika.'ika. vs. 1. Difficult to acquire or do. *Pū'ika'ika ke komo aku i kēlā kula*, difficult to enter that school. *Pū'ika'ika ka loa'a mai 'o kahi kālā*, difficult to get money. 2. Packed, crowded. *Piha pū'ika'ika*, crowded full.
puiki. Same as *puhiki'i*, young flying fish.
pū.'iki. Var. of *pūliki* 1.
pū.'ili. 1. n. Bamboo rattles, as used for dancing. 2. vt. To clasp, hold fast in the hand, embrace, grasp firmly. *Pū'ili mai 'oe ā pa'a*, hold tight. 3. n. A type of tapabater pattern: tips of zigzag ridges in adjacent surfaces meet and form sunken lozenges. Cf. *ko'eau*, in which the ridges are parallel. 4. n. Berry of the *pōpolo* plant. Also *'olohua*. 5. A game played with sugar-cane flowers. *Rare*.
pū.'ili-hā.lu'a. n. *Pū'ili* design with one or more *hālu'a* ridges or strips between the panels of the beater.

pū.'ili.'ili. 1. Short for *pu'u 'ili'ili*. 2. Similar to *pū'ulu-ulu*; to collect.
pū.'ili-ko'e.au. n. *Pū'ili* and *ko'eau* designs combined.
pu'i.pu'i. vs. Plump, stout, stocky, heavy-set, sturdy, husky. *Pu'ipu'i ka ua Wa'ahila o Mānoa* (song), stocky the Wa'ahila rain of Mānoa. *He po'e pu'ipu'i wale nō; ua koa nō lākou āpau* (Lunk. 3.29), they were strong, able-bodied people; all were soldiers. **ho'o.pu'i.pu'i.** To grow or increase in weight.
puī.puīa. Redup. of *puā*.
pū.'iwa. nvs. Startled, surprised, astonished, aghast, frightened; surprise, amazement, fright. **ho'o.pū.'iwa.** To startle, astonish, etc. *Me nā mea kani e ho'opū'iwa iā 'oukou* (2 Oihn. 12.12), with the instruments to startle you.
pū.'iwa.'iwa. Redup. of *pū'iwa*; to shy, as a horse; excitable, as a horse that is easily frightened.
puka. 1. n. Hole (perforation; cf. *lua*, pit); door, entrance, gate, slit, vent, opening, issue. Cf. *pukaihu*, *puka kui*, *lei pūpū puka*. *Ka puka kahiko*, the ancient hole [the anus]. **ho'o.puka.** To perforate, puncture, make a hole or opening. (PCP *puta*.) 2. vi. To pass through, appear, emerge, come out, get out of, issue, come into sight; to rise, as the sun. *Kua puka*, a sore on the back, as a saddle sore on a horse's back. *Puka mau*, to appear frequently, as a newspaper. *Puka lā*, daily issue. *Puka mahina*, monthly issue. *Puka makahiki*, annual issue. *Puka wā*, to appear irregularly, as a paper. *Puka ka niho*, to teethe. *Puka kinikini*, *puka kinikini*, 'a'ohe ona puka e puka aku a (riddle), many many holes, many many holes, no hole to go out through [answer: a fish net]. *Puka mai ka lā*, the sun rises. *Puka ka niho o ke keiki*, the child gets his teeth. **ho'o.puka.** To issue, as a permit; to acquit, as a defendant in court; a chant to which dancers issue. *Ho'opuka 'ana*, edition. *Ho'opuka mua*, first edition. *Ua ho'opuka 'ia paha mamuli o ka palapala ho'opi'i kūpono*, acquitted after a proper indictment. *Ho'opuka i kai ka lā i Unulau*, let the sun rise at the sea at Unulau. (PCP *puta*.) 3. vi. To graduate. **ho'o.puka.** To graduate. *E ho'opuka 'ia ana ka papa i kēia makahiki*, the class will be graduated this year. 4. vi. To say, utter, speak. *Puka maila kāna 'ōlelo*, he spoke (*lit.*, his word came out). **ho'o.puka.** To proclaim, speak, say, pronounce. *Ho'opuka 'ana*, pronunciation. *Ho'opuka mana'o*, to suggest, comment. *Ho'opuka hewa*, to speak out of turn, make a slip of the tongue. *Ho'opuka 'ino*, *ho'opuka pono 'ole*, to insult, slur, say evil or blasphemous things. *Ho'opuka kū*, to speak rudely, uncivilly, bluntly. *He wahi mana'o ho'opuka*, a modest comment. *Kou na'au e ho'opuka aku i kekahi mea* (Kekah. 5.2), your heart to say something. 5. nvi. To gain, win, profit; to draw interest; winnings, gain, profit. *Puka o ke kālā*, interest. *Puka nui*, large profit or gain. *Puka a me ka pohō*, profit and loss. **ho'o.puka.** To invest; to make a profit; profitable. Cf. *waiwai ho'opuka*. 6. n. Trap, snare. Cf. *kīpuka*. 7. idiom. Almost. *Nā anana 'eono ā puka hiku*, six and a fraction fathoms. *Ka'u kaupano, ua puka haneli*, my weight is almost one hundred.
pū ka'a. n. Mounted cannon, artillery. *Lit.*, rolling gun. *Nā mahele koa pū ka'a*, artillery divisions.
puka.'aki. To distribute evenly, as a fish catch. (And.)
pukaa.maka. vi. To seal an affinal relationship by the birth of a child. *Lit.*, appear to eye. (Gram. 8.7.2.) *Ua pukaamaka mākou me kēlā po'e*, our relationship with those people is sealed by the birth of a child.
puka 'ana. n. Exit, Exodus (in the Bible). *Ka puka 'ana o ka lā*, sunrise.
puka.ani.ani, pukāni.ani. n. Window. *Lit.*, transparent opening.
puka hale. n. Door of a house; window (Isa. 60.8). *Kau i ka puka hale*, placed in the doorway (of a beggar).
pū.kahi. Same as *pūpūkahi*; sometimes said of the three Hawaiian gods, Kū, Kāne, and Lono.
puka.hipa. n. Sheep market. (Ioane 5.2.)
puka ho'o.komo iho. n. Socket. *Lit.*, hole for entering core.
