

- pū.nika, pū.nika.nika.** vs. Black-skinned, Negroid. Cf. *nika*, nigger.
- puni kā.lā.** vs. Avaricious, mercenary, commercial-minded. *E noho 'oukou me ka puni kālā 'ole* (Heb. 13.5), keep your life free from love of money.
- puni kaua.** v. Militaristic, warlike, fond of war.
- puni.kihi.** n. A game. *Rare. Lit.*, surround corner.
- puni koko.** v. Bloodthirsty.
- puni kualā.** nvs. Usurious; usurer; extortion.
- puni le'a.le'a.** v. Pleasure-loving, fond of fun.
- puni nani.** v. Fond of beauty, beauty-loving, fond of adorning self.
- pū.nini.** vi. To tack, as a ship; to float here and there, drift. **ho'o.pū.nini.** Caus/sim. *Ke ho'opūnini maila ka i'a*, the fish are drifting here.
- pūnini.** **ho'o.pū.nini.** To demonstrate pleasure at seeing one, as a child or dog; to cling to as with delight, frisk about happily; to perform ritual with the object of pleasing the gods (*rare*).
- puni.peki.** n. A game similar to fox and geese (the name is said to come from *Eng. Bonaparte*).
- puni.puni.** Redup. of *puni* 3; lie, to tell a lie, cheat; liar. **ho'o.puni.puni.** To lie, liar; to deceive, deceitful, false. *Kālā ho'opunipuni*, counterfeit money.
- pū.niu.** 1. n. Polished coconut shell or bowl. *'Umeke pūniu*, coconut-shell calabash, as for poi. 2. n. Small knee drum made of a coconut shell with fishskin cover, as of *kala*. 3. n. Human skull. *I holo mua nō i ka pūniu*, to go ahead indeed because of one's skull [intelligence]. See also *nīnau*. 4. n. Small fontanel of an infant. 5. vi. To spin, as a top; dizzy.
- pū.niu hui.** n. Place at the top of the skull where the bones unite, skull joint, bregma. *Lit.*, joining skull.
- puni wai.wai.** v. Avaricious, covetous, desirous of wealth.
- puni wale.** vt. Gullible, easily deceived, swayed, influenced. See also other meanings of *puni*. **ho'o.puni wale.** To fool, deceive easily.
- pū.nohu.** 1. nvi. To rise, as smoke, mist; to billow out, as a ship's sail; to spread out, as a shrub with low branches or as a cloud, to whiffle; such rising. *Pūnohu 'ula, i ke kai* (song), red rising mist on the sea. (The connotation of redness is sometimes present even without *'ula*. Cf. *ua pūnohu*.) *Nā ao 'ele'ele, maluna a'e o nā ao polohiwa i mau ao uli, a me nā pūnohu huna one, i mau ao ua* (Kep. 175), black clouds above the solid black clouds to dark clouds, and small sandlike rising clouds to rain clouds. Cf. also Lunk. 20.40. 2. n. Rainbow lying close to the earth. (UL 99.) 3. n. Slate pencil sea urchin. Also *hā'ue'ue*.
- pū.nohu 'ā.lewa.lewa.** n. Smoke, clouds rising and spreading.
- pū.nohu.nohu.** Redup. of *pūnohu* 1.
- pū.nolu.nolu.** vs. Affable, good-natured.
- pū.noni.** nvs. Red dye from *noni*-root bark; red, as tapa dyed thus. *Lehua pūnoni 'ula ke kai o Kona, ke kai pūnoni 'ula i 'ōweo 'ia* (chant), *lehua* flower that colors red the sea of Kona, the sea dyed red with scarlet. **ho'o.pū.noni.** To dye red with this dye.
- pū.nono.** vs. Gorgeously red, filled with sunshine, ever-beautiful; flushed red, as the skin; gorgeous. *Mau loa nō ko'u mahalo nui i ka nani pūnono o Kahana* (song), my great admiration for the gorgeous beauty of Kahana remains always. **ho'o.pū.nono.** To make attractive with bright or red colors, to dress or appear gorgeous.
- pū.nonohu.** Redup. of *pūnohu* 1. *Ulu pūnonohu*, to grow round and full at the base, rather than tall and spindly. *Ka ua pūnonohu 'ula i ka nahele* (UL 110), the rising red rain in the forest. **ho'o.pū.nonohu.** Caus/sim.
- puno.nono.** Redup. of *pūnono*.
- pū.nonu, pū.nonu.nonu.** vs. Spoiled, rotten, as eggs.
- pū.nua.** n. Young bird, fledgling. *Fig.*, young child or sweetheart. *Ka pūnua pe'e poli*, fledgling hiding in the bosom [a young sweetheart]. (PPN *punua*.)
- pū.nuhu.** *Rare var.* of *pūnohu* 1.
- pū.nuku.** nvt. Muzzle, halter; to muzzle; muzzled. *Ke hemo ka pūnuku*, when free of the halter [when at liberty].
- puō, puwō.** nvi. To roar, wail, howl; muffled sound, as of clapping.
- pu'ō.** Same as *pua'ō*; to blaze up, as fire; to bend, as coconut fronds in a wind; to lift up; to bloom. *Pu'ō ke ahi*, the fire blazes up. **ho'o.pu'ō.** Caus/sim.
- puo'a.** n. Thicket. *Rare*.
- pu'oa.** Pas/imp. of *pu'ō*. *Mehe kapa kea lā ka 'ale o ka moana, ka pu'oa a ke kai i nā moku manu* (chant), like white tapa are the billows of the ocean, as the sea lashes against the bird islands.
- pū'o'a.** n. Tower, steeple, pyramid, peak; house for depositing a corpse; peaked hut, lean-to, tent. *Pū'o'a o ka nalu*, crest of the wave. *Pū'o'a pele*, belfry. *Nā pū'o'a ki'eki'e o nā hale pule*, the tall steeples of the churches.
- pū'ohai.** n. 'Ohai tree or shrub. See *'ohai* 1.
- pū'ohe'ohe.** n. Job's-tears (*Coix lachryma-jobi*), a coarse, branched grass closely related to corn, growing in many tropical regions, either wild or cultivated. It is an annual, .3 to 1.8 m high, with long, pointed leaves, and, at stem tips, hard, round, beadlike seeds—black, gray, or white—which are used for leis, mats, food, medicine. (Neal 80-1.) Also *kūkaekōlea*, *'ohe'ohe*, *pū-pū kōlea*.
- puoho.** nvi. Startled; to cry out in alarm; fright, shock; to explode, as a lava flow; to wake suddenly; sudden appearance, as a burst of fragrance. *Puoho 'o Lono ma ka ho'āla o kona akua*, Lono was startled and awakened by his god. **ho'o.puoho.** Caus/sim. (PCP *puoho*.)
- puoko.** vi. To rage, burn hot.
- puoko.oko.** Redup. of *puoko*.
- puo.lani.** v. To place high, or in a lofty or sacred place. *Rare*.
- pū'olē'olē.** n. Conch horn.
- pū'olo.** nvt. Bundle, bag, container, parcel, packet; bale, as of hay; to tie up in a bundle. Cf. *ki'o'ōpae, mālama pū'olo*. *Ka'u wahi pū'olo*, my small bundle; *fig.*, message, topic. *Ho'i pū'olo*, to return home with a bundle, especially a gift (cf. *ho'ina*). *'O ka iliau loha i ka lā, pū'olo hau kakahiaka* (For. 4:283), the *iliau* plant drooping by day, the carrier of morning dew.
- puolo.olo.he'e.** A kind of grass. (And.)
- puoni.** To save, preserve. (And.)
- pū'ō.ni'o.ni'o.** n. A shell (*Partridge tun*).
- pu'ō.pu'ō.** Redup. of *pu'ō*; to blaze up and die down; to bob up and down, as a canoe in the waves. **ho'o.pu'ō.pu'ō.** Redup. of *ho'opu'ō*.
- pū pa'a.kai.** See *pū* 9, to eat a little. **ho'o.pū pa'a.kai.** To gather salt; salt gatherer. *Ka'ū*.
- pū pā'ani.** n. Toy gun, popgun.
- pū.palō, bufalo.** n. Roebuck (RSV), fallow deer (KJV). (I Nal. 4:23.) *Eng.* Cf. *pāpulō*.
- pū.pana.pana.** n. Pistol. *Lit.*, snapping gun, revolver.
- pupo, bubo.** n. A kind of small owl. (Kanl. 14.16.) (Latin *bubo*.)
- pū pō.kole.** n. Blunderbuss. *Lit.*, short gun.
- pupo.nika, bubonika.** vs. Bubonic. *Eng.* See *ex., hoene*.
- pū po'o.hiwi.** n. Musket. *Lit.*, shoulder gun.
- pupu.** Probably similar to *pupupu* 3. *Ku'u wahi pupu* (Nak. 96), my small shelter. *'O kahi pupu mamua o ku'u wahi wa'a lā, 'o Pāka'a nō ia* (Nak. 119), the one in my shelter for my small canoe is Pāka'a.
- pupū.** vi. 1. To stall; to move slowly and with difficulty, as a canoe or invalid; to remain near; stuck, blocked. *Pupū ke ka'a*, the car is stalled. *A'o pupū*, to learn slowly. *Kō lākou mau ka'a kaua, i hele pupū ai lākou* (Puk. 14.25), their war chariots, so that they drove heavily. *Pupū ke kai i ka 'alalauā*, blocked is the sea by the fish *'alalauā* [of any difficulty; an omen of the death of royalty]. **ho'o.pupū, hō.pupū.** To stall; cause to get stuck (*transitive*); to balk, resist, hold back; bumpy, rough, as a road. Also *ha'apupū*. 2. Same as *kolopupū*. *Ku'u wahi pupū 'elemakule* (For.
