

pū.pū nuku loa. n. A shell (*Fusinus nicobarus*, *Latirus nodatus*). *Lit.*, long-beaked shell.

pū.pū-o-Hā.upu. n. A shell (*Trochus histrio*). *Lit.*, Hā'upu-hill shell.

pū.pū 'ō.kole 'oi.'oi. n. Trochidae shell. *Lit.*, sharp-buttocks shell.

pū.pū 'olō. n. A marine shell (*Terebra maculata*, *Pyramidella sulcata*).

pū.pū 'olō kiwi. n. A marine shell (*Cymatium muricinum*).

pū.pū 'ō.lēpē. n. A marine shell (*Tapes japonica*). *Lit.*, bivalve shell.

pū.pū 'ō.nohi awa. n. A marine shell (*Haminoea* sp.). *Lit.*, milkfish-eyeball shell.

pū.pū Pā.kō. n. An introduced edible shellfish (perhaps *Viviparus* sp.), found in taro or rice patches; Chinese snail. Also *pūpū lo'i*.

pū.pū pani. n. A marine shell (*Janthina fragilis*). *Lit.*, cork shell.

pū.pū pē'ē.lua. n. A marine shell (*Acanthochiton viridis*); used in *māwaewae* ceremonies for first-born babies. *Lit.*, caterpillar shell. Also *kuapa'a*.

pū.pū pō.niu.niu. Var. of *pūpū 'alā*. *Lit.*, dizzy shell, perhaps so called because they were considered poisonous.

pupupu. 1. vs. Numerous, crowded, thick, teeming, congested. 2. vs. Double-flowering, as hibiscus, hollyhock, *pikake*. 3. n. Temporary hut, as for shelter from the sun for beating tapa; hovel; covering. 4. n. White tapa.

pupu.pua. Redup. of *pupua* 2.

pupu.pue. Redup. of *pupue* 1.

pupu.puhi. Same as *pupuhi*.

pū.pū puhi. n. 1. Sundial shell (*Solarium* sp.). Called *hālili* in some localities. 2. Conch shell. *Lit.*, shell to blow. *Kona*.

pupu'u. vi. To double up, draw the limbs together; foetal position, hence, *fig.*, the womb; position of an infant able to get up partially on its knees. *Moe pupu'u*, to sleep curled up. *Pupu'u anu*, to curl up or huddle because of cold. *Pupu'u ho'olei loa*, quick as a flash. *Pupu'u ho'olei loa, kū ana ke kūkini i ke alo o ke ali'i*, quick as a flash the messenger stood in the presence of the chief. *Mai loko mai o ka pupu'u ho'okahi*, from within the same womb.

pupu'u ho'o.lēi loa. See *pupu'u*.

pupu'u.lia. Pas/imp. of *pupu'u*. *E Kaulu ē, pupu'ulia* (For. 4:527), O Kaulu, double up.

pū.pū waha loa. n. A shell (*Bulla* sp.). *Lit.*, long-mouthed shell.

pū.pū weu.weu. n. 1. Clump of grass; clump of greenery, especially as placed on the hula altar to the goddess Laka. 2. A chant prayer to Laka after a period of training in the hula to free the taboo.

pu'u. 1. n. Any kind of a protuberance from a pimple (*pu'u* 2) to a hill: hill, peak, cone, hump, mound, bulge, heap, pile, portion, bulk, mass, quantity, clot, bunch, knob; heaped, piled, lumped, bulging; pregnant; to pucker. *Fig.*, obstacle, burden, problem, discomfort, trouble, sorrow. Cf. *alelo pu'u*, 'ōkolepu'u, *pu'u kālā*. *Pu'u kaimana*, diamond setting. *Lae pu'u*, prominent or bulging forehead. *Pu'u kānaka*, group of people, mass of people. *Pu'u ka leo*, paralyzed tongue with resulting speech defects. *Pu'u ka nuku*, protruding the lips, as in anger; to eat until satiated, or to be unable to eat all one has. *Pu'u kapu*, a forbidden or taboo place. *Eia ka pu'u nui mawaho nei, he ua, he 'ino, he anu* (chant), here is the burden of discomfort outside, rain, storm, cold. **ho'o.pu'u.** To heap up, collect in heaps; to frown; resentment. Cf. *ho'opu'ukahua*. (PPN *puke*.) 2. n. Any of various round parts or protuberances of the body, as pimple, wart, mole, callus, lump, Adam's apple, throat (see ex., *burn*), larynx, tonsils, heart, stomach, fist, knuckle, ankle joint; gizzard, as of chicken; hard stomach, as of some fish. Cf. *pu'u kohekohe*, *pu'upu'u*, *pu'upu'u lima*, *pu'upu'u wāwae*, *pu'uwai*. *Mau nā pu'u*, stuck together, of dogs occasionally in coition. *Pu'u 'eha*, sore throat. 'A'ī

pu'u, calloused neck. *Pu'u 'ōkohekohe*, swollen tonsils. 'A'ohe *pu'u*, 'a'ohe *ke'e*, no pimples, no crooks [commonly said in tales of flawless persons]. *He ma'u i ka pu'u ke moni* (song), refreshing to the throat to swallow. *Ka pu'u o Abesaloma* (2 Sam. 18.14), the heart of Absalom. 3. n. A desire, need, as for evacuation (used with *hī*, *ki'o*, *mimi*, *pūhi'u*). *Hae ka pu'u i ka 'ai*, fierce is the craving for food. 4. n. Any earth bug, beetle, especially as found in dry earth; rose beetle, Olinda beetle, stinkbug, ground beetle. 5. n. Hand of cards, stack of cards, deck or pack of cards. Cf. *pu'u pepa*. 6. n. Stack, shock, as of grain. (Lunk. 15.5.) *Nā pu'u hua palaoa* (Puk. 22.6), stacks of grain. 7. nvi. Head, as of cabbage or lettuce; to form a head, sprout. *Kupu ā pu'u* (KL line 487), to grow and sprout. 8. n. Dress material such as dotted swiss that has raised dots. 9. n. Fancy knot or mesh, as in *kōkō*, net. 10. vt. To cast or draw lots, as with a knotted string, or by heaping up pebbles under a tapa, and guessing the number in each heap, or calling one heap positive and the other negative, with the answer to the question provided by the heap with the greatest number of pebbles. *Pu'unauē i ka 'āina ma nā pu'u e ili ana* (Nah. 34.18), divide the land by lot for inheritance. 11. n. Hinge of pearl oyster. 12. n. A method of catching plover: a sharpened bone was half buried and anchored on a string tied to a rock. The bone would become lodged in the throat (*pu'u*) of a plover attempting to eat it, which was then held by the string. 13. n. Sixth stage in the growth of taro. See *kalo* for names of generations. (Kep. 153.) *Rare*. 14. n. A kind of fish. *Rare*. Also *ehe'ula*. 15. n. 'O'opu young about 5 or 10 cm long. *Rare*. 16. n. A hard, white variety of sweet potato. Also *pu'u ke'oke'o*.

pu'ua. 1. vs. Choked, suffocated, strangled; to choke, strain. *Fig.*, disturbed mentally. *Pu'ua keiki*, a baby that is not born at the proper time and must be removed by surgery. *A pu'ua i ka hānau keiki 'ana* (Kin. 35.16), travail in childbirth. **ho'o.pu'ua.** To choke. 2. n. A surfboard. *Rare*.

pu'ua.ahi. n. Bonfire.

pu'u.'ai. Same as *pu'u'ai'ai*.

pu'u.'ai.'ai. n. Stomach, gizzard. *Lit.*, eating round organ.

pu'u 'ai lōkē. n. Rose beetle (*Adoretus sinicus*). *Lit.*, rose-eating *pu'u*.

pu'u 'ako. n. Throat inflammation.

pu'u.alu. vt. To carry on the hips or back, as supporting by the arms.

pu'u 'ēha. n. Sore throat.

pu'u.haku. vs. Protruding, bulging, irregular; to bulge. Cf. *haku*, lumpy.

pu'u hā.nau. n. Hillock or obstacle encountered while hauling a new canoe from the forest to the shore.

pu'u.hau. n. A hard lump growing on the joints or in the groin, consisting of calcium deposits. *Rare*. Also *hau-pu'u*, 'ohākula'i.

pu'u hī. n. A desire to evacuate when bowels are loose. Cf. *wai hī*. *Rare*.

pu'u.holo. n. Mobile lump. (Kam. 64:108.)

pu'u.honua. 1. nvi. Place of refuge, sanctuary, asylum, place of peace and safety. *Kūlanakauhale pu'uhonua* (Nah. 35.11), cities of refuge. 2. n. A level area, as used for game sites; also used for grave plots in Puna.

pu'u ho'o.maha. n. A resting place for travelers; easement, relief; to find such. *He aha ka pilikia o ke kThā, 'oiai he pu'u ho'omaha ia*, what's wrong with belching, for it is a source of physical relief.

pu'u i'a. n. 1. A heap of fish; a string of fish, as on a ti leaf. 2. The hard rounded stomach of some fish, as mullet.

pu'u.ili. n. A fish related to the 'aha and iheihe.

pu'u 'ili.'ili. n. A pile of pebbles, as used in drawing lots or in divination.

pu'u.ka'a. n. A coarse native sedge (*Cyperus ferax* var. *auriculatus*), growing in marshes. It has long narrow leaves, and many tiny flowers are borne at the top of a
