

stem .6 to 1 m high, in a large ray-shaped head. Formerly, when 'ahu'awa was not available, the fibers of this sedge were used for straining kava. Also *mau'u pu'uka'a*, *pūko'a*, *pu'uko'a*. Cf. *kāhili kāpopo*, *kiolohia*. *C. trachysanthos* on Ni'ihau.

pu'u.kā'a haole. Same as 'ahu'awa haole.

Pu'u-Ka'ala. n. Wind, Mt. Ka'ala, O'ahu. (Nak. 57.)

-pu'ukahua. ho'o.pu'u.kahua. Same as *huahua*; to ridicule, belittle, taunt.

pu'u kā.lā. n. Sum of money. See ex., *a'e 5*.

pu'u.kala.hala. n. Redeemer, safeguard, one who helps in time of trouble; remission of sins, absolution (Kam. 64:119). *Lit.*, hillock erases sins. 'O Iesu kō kākou *pu'ukalahala*, Jesus is our redeemer.

pu'u kā.lā kū.mau. n. Perpetual endowment.

pu'u.kani. nvi. Sweet-voiced, as in singing; sweet-toned, as music; a singer. *E mele mai ana nā pu'ukani kau-lana*, the famous singers will sing.

pu'u.kani.lua. vs. Taut. *Rare*.

Pu'u-ka-pele. n. Same as *Pu'u-pele*, the name of a wind at Mānā, Kaua'i.

pu'u.kaua. n. Fort, fortification, stronghold (Lunk. 6.2). *Lit.*, war hill.

pu'u ke'o.ke'o. Same as *pu'u 16*. (HP 143.)

-pu'ukie, ho'o.pu'u.kie. To ensnare, entrap. (And.)

pu'u ki'o. nvi. The urge to evacuate the bowels; to evacuate. Also *pu'a hana lepo*, *pu'a ki'o*.

pū.'uki.'uki. vi. Crowded, packed tightly, difficult. *Pū-'uki'uki i ka pilikia*, beset by trouble. *Ku'u hoa o ka ua pū'uki'uki o ka mauna* (chant), my companion of the cold unpleasant rain of the mountain.

pu'u.ko'a. n. 1. Same as *pu'uka'a*, a sedge; *fig.*, one of low rank (Ii 150). *Hihia aloha ke oho o ka pu'uko'a* (chant), the leaves of *pu'uko'a* entwined affectionately. 2. A reddish-brown tapa.

pu'u.ko.ā.maka. n. A law or taboo pertaining to the god Ka-hō-āli'i only; the one breaking the law was said to have his eye scooped out and devoured by the god.

pu'u kohe.kohe. n. Enlarged or swollen tonsil, tonsillitis. *E hō'olā'olā me ke kohu kukui no ka pu'u kohe-kohe*, gargle with candlenut juice for enlarged tonsils.

pu'u.kohu.kohu. n. A gray tapa, Wai-pi'o, Hawai'i.

pu'u koko. n. Clot of blood; heart; blood-clot fetus, in which shape the heroes of some of the tales are born.

pu'u.kole. n. 1. Mons pubis. 2. Upper part of paddle blade joining the handle.

pu'u.kō.lēa. n. 1. Sweet potato tubers that form on old vines. 2. (*Cap.*) Wind associated with Kapa'au, Hawai'i.

pu'u.kole.lēi.loa. n. An unknown minor illness.

pu'u.kō.nane. n. A little-known variety of taro.

pu'u.kū. n. Treasurer, steward (I Nal. 16.9).

Pu'u-kū-'akahi. n. The hill that stands alone, name of the tarrying place of souls, where souls of living persons might obtain reconciliation with an estranged 'aumakua god.

pu'u.kukui. n. Tapa colored with dye made of bread-fruit blossom and *kukui* tree bark.

pu'u.ku'ua. n. Stone used for octopus lure. (Kam. 76:169.)

pū.'uku.'uku. vs. Wee, tiny, small.

pū.'ula. A seaweed. (And.)

pu'u.lau. vi. To increase rapidly in number. *Pu'ulau keiki*, to have many children.

pū.'ula.'ula. 1. n. Red hill, earth bank (short for *pu'u 'ula'ula*). 2. vs. Red.

pu'u lēhu. n. Ash or tuff cone.

pu'u.lele. n. Rupture, hernia. *Lit.*, falling round organ.

pu'u lele. v. To remove a lump. *Mamala 'eha'eha o ka lani, i ke ko'i pu'u lele, hana 'oi, pu'u lele, hana 'oi* (chant), the chief is sore and aching due to the adze removing lumps, a knife, removing lumps, a knife.

Pu'u-lena. n. Name of a famous cold wind at Kī-lau-ea, Hawai'i and at Puna. See ex., *ahe, pahoehe 3, pāweo*. *Ke ano la'i aloha a ka Pu'u-lena* (chant), the peaceful loving mystery of the Pu'u-lena wind. *Ua hala ka Pu'u-lena, aia i Hilo, ua 'imi akula iā papa lauahi* (saying),

the Pu'u-lena wind has gone away, there [it] is at Hilo looking for lava flats [off one's course]. Cf. For. 5:581 for nuance of sadness.

pu'u-lepo. n. A reddish-brown tapa.

pu'u lepo. n. Earth mound or heap; earth target for archery (*pāpua*).

pu'u lima. n. Wrist joints, knuckles, fist.

pū.uli.uli. nvt. Dark; to paint or stain dark.

pū.'uli.'uli. n. A variety of small gourd, as used for making feather gourd rattles (*'uli'uli*), medicine cups (*'apu*), and individual poi containers. *Ka lonolau nō i ka lonolau, ka pū'uli'uli nō i ka pū'uli'uli*, large gourds to large gourds, small gourds to small gourds [chiefs seek the society of chiefs, commoners seek the society of commoners; in battle chief against chief and commoner against commoner].

pū.'ulu. nvi. Group, crowd, army, party, gang, retinue; to form a group, crowd; to crowd, throng, assemble. *Pū'ulu ali'i* (Kep. 141), chiefly retinue, band. *Nā pū-'ulu kīwila*, civilian groups. *Ka pū'ulu ha'aha'a iho o nā koi*, lower group requirements. **ho'o.pū.'ulu.** Caus/sim.

pū.'ulu kaua. n. Army, fighting band, division, phalanx.

pū.'ulu.'ulu. Redup. of *pū'ulu*; to collect.

pu'u makani. n. 1. Gaseous stomach, biliousness. 2. Windy hill.

pu'u.make. n. Dire threat, mortal danger. *Mai ho'okanane'o aku i ke anu, he pu'umake kēnā*, don't persist in going into the cold, it will be [your] death.

pu'u.mana. n. 1. A caret sign of omission. 2. A new mesh added in the enlargement of a net. *Lit.*, branching knot.

pu'u.mimi. n. Bladder.

pu'u mimi. n. Desire or need to urinate. Cf. *'iha'iha*.

pu'u.momoni. Same as *pu'umoni*.

pu'u.moni, pu'u.moni.'ai. n. Throat. *Lit.*, swallowing throat, food-swallowing throat.

Pu'u-nahele. n. Wind associated with Wai-pā, Kaua'i. (For. 5:97.) *Lit.*, forested hill.

pu'u.naue, pu'unauwe. nvt. To divide, share; division. *Pu'unauwe aku i ka waiwai pio* (Puk. 15.9), divide the spoils.

pu'u.naue loa. n. Long division.

pu'u.naue pō.kole. n. Short division.

pu'u.nohu. Same as *pūnohu*.

pu'u.'o'a. Same as *pū'o'a*. *Rare*.

pu'u 'oi.'oi. n. Sharp point, peak, summit.

pu'u o'i.o'ina. n. A roadside resting place (*o'io'ina*) consisting of a hillock, heap of stones, rock, mound.

Pu'u-o-Kona. n. Wind associated with Kuli-'ou'ou, O'ahu. (Nak. 56.)

pu'u.ō.lā'i. n. The sharp-nosed puffer fish (*Canthigaster rivulatus*). *Lit.*, volcanic cone, earthquake hill.

pu'u.one. n. 1. Divination. See *hale pu'uone, pu'upu'u-one*. 2. Pond near the shore, as connected to the sea by a stream or ditch.

pu'u one. n. Sand dune or heap.

pu'u.one.one. Redup. of *pu'uone 1*.

pu'u 'ō.pala. n. Trash heap, garbage pile.

pu'u.pā. 1. nvi. Obstacle, struck object; to be struck. *Pu'upā Ni'ihau na ka Unulau* (chant) Ni'ihau is struck by the Unulau wind. *He pu'upā hiolo wale nō i ka leo*, an obstacle that can be upset by the voice [by gentle speech]. 2. n. A stone used for *maika* stones. *Rare*. 3. (*Cap.*) n. A *lua* fighting stroke. 4. vt. To give and receive freely. *Rare*.

pu'u.pā'a. n. 1. Virgin, virginity. *Lit.*, firm mound. *'A'ole i loa'a ia'u he pu'upa'a* (Kanl. 22.14), I did not find virginity. 2. Kidneys. *Fig.*, affections, emotions. (Oihk. 3.4.) *Na ke Akua pono i ho'ā'o nā na'au a me nā pu'upa'a* (Hal. 7.9), the righteous God will try the minds and hearts.

pu'u.pale. n. Defense, shield.

pu'u.pau. n. Sore throat with swelling on sides of the neck; throat cancer. *Lit.*, destroyed throat.

pu'u pa'u lena. n. Hill of yellow soot (a term of re-
