**Pu'u-pele.** Same as *Pu'u-ka-pele*.

**pu'u pele.** n. Volcanic mound, heap, hill.

**pu'u pepa.** n. Deck of playing cards; stack of playing cards; hand of cards; pile of paper.

**pu'u.po'o.lā.** n. Bilioussness, gastric discomfort. *Rare*.

**pu'u pū.hi'u.** n. Urge or need to break wind.

**pu'u.pu'u.** 1. Redup. of *pu'u 1*; full of protuberances, lumps; lumpy, piled in heaps; heaped up, swollen up.

*'A'a pu'upu'u*, water-worn gravel or stones. *Poi pu'upu'u*, lumpy poi, *fig.*, an unsocial person. *Pu'upu'u lei pali i ka 'ā'i*, an irregular or imperfect [*lit.*, lumpy] lei is a cliff on the neck [a lei is beautiful when worn].

**ho'o.pu'u.pu'u.** Redup. of *ho'opu'u*; a mound, to mound up. (PCP *pukupuku*.)

2. Redup. of *pu'u 2*; knuckles, joints; clenched fist, blow with the fist; pimply, full of blotches; skin eruptions, scurvy (Oihk. 21.20).

**ho'o.pu'u.pu'u.** To clench the fist, to shake the fist threateningly.

3. Redup. of *pu'u 9*; knotty. 4. n. Eyes at a joint, as of sugar cane or kava. 5. n. Capital, as of a candlestick. (Puk. 25.31.)

**pu'u.pu'ua.** Redup. of *pu'ua 1*.

**pu'u.pu'u hala.** n. Lumps or growths on the trunk of a pandanus tree.

**pu'u.pu'u.kaua.** Same as *pu'ukaua*.

**pu'u.pu'u koko.** Same as *pu'u koko*; tumor (1 Sam. 5.9).

**pu'u.pu'u kula (gula).** n. Gold nuggets.

**pu'u.pu'u lā.'au.** n. Knot, lump, as on a tree trunk; knothold.

**pu'u.pu'u laina.** Same as *laina*, hives.

**pu'u.pu'u li'i.li'i.** nvi. Smallpox; to have smallpox. *Lit.*, small lumps.

**pu'u.pu'u lima.** n. Clenched fist, knuckles, blow of the fist.

**pu'u.pu'u mane'o.** n. Itching skin irritation or eruption.

**pu'u.pu'u niu.** n. Coconuts right after blossom stage.

**pu'u.pu'u.onē.** n. 1. A beach hut, as for fishermen or for teaching and practicing the divination called *pu'u-onē* or *kuhikuhipu'uone*. 2. A game in which small stones were hidden in mounds of sand.

**pu'u.pu'u wā.wā.** n. Ankle bones, ankles. *Nā pu'u-pu'u wāwāe ona* (Oih. 3.7), his ankles.

**pu'u.wai.** n. 1. Heart. Use of *pu'uwai* as a center of emotions (instead of *na'au*, *'ōpū*, or *loko*) is probably a Western concept, but was noted in a chant dated 1853:

*Ke hō'eu'eu nei i ka pu'uwai*, stirring now the heart.

*Pu'uwai 'ele'ele*, scoundrel, rogue; black-hearted.

*Pu'uwai hāmama*, generous, openhearted. *Pu'uwai hao kila*, heart of steel, courageous. *Pu'uwai Ho'āno*,

Sacred Heart. *Pu'uwai kapalili*, fluttering heart. 2. A heart-shaped locket, as of gold (*kula*) or silver (*kālā*).

3. Small suckers on a taro plant (probably from *pu'u uai*,

lumps removed, since these shoots were broken off so that the tuber might grow larger). *Rare*.

4. Wrapped packages of vegetable food. *Rare*.

**Pu'u.wai La'a.hia.** n. Sacred Heart.

**pu'u.wai.ū.** n. Breast. *Ua nui nā pu'uwaiū* (Ezek. 16.7),

the breasts were large.

**pu'u welu.** n. A heap of rags. *Fig.*, straggler, as a *hau*

tree growing apart from a *hau* clump. *Hānau ka pu'u*

*welu*, *he weluwelu kona* (KL line 529), the stragglers

are born, they are despised.

**Pu'u.wepa.** n. Name of a star (no data). Also *Pūwepa*.

**pu'u wini.wini.** n. Sharp-pointed hill.

**pū.wā.** vi. To shine, glitter, reflect brightly, as a night

fire. *Ua pūwā ka 'ili o kona maka* (Puk. 34.30), the

skin of his face shone.

**pū.wā'a.wā'a.** vs. Stupid.

**pū.waha.nui.** n. A medicinal plant (no data).

**pū.wai.** n. A sentinel's call of alarm, a trumpet call, as in

war. (Ioela 2.1.)

**pū wai.** n. Water gun, squirt gun.

**pū wai.kaua.** n. War alarm. (Ioela 2.1.)

**puwalu, pualu.** 1. vs. All together, in unison, united, co-

operative. (Cf. *-walu*, many, as in *makawalu*,

*olowalu*.) *Hīmeni puwalu*, choral singing. *Heluhelu pu-*

*walu*, reading in unison. 2. Var. spelling of *pualu*, a

surgeonfish. 3. n. Flag, as on a pole or canoe sail.

**pū.wela.wela.** vs. Warm, hot.

**Pū.wepa.** Var. of *Pu'uwepa*.

**pū.weu.weu.** 1. Same as *pūpū weuweu*. *E noho iho i ka*

*pūweuweu*, *mai ho'oki'eki'e*, in the grass clumps, do

not be conceited. 2. Same as *pūhuluhulu 1, 2*.

**pū wili.** n. An old type of gun, sometimes called Maxim

gun.

**puwō.** Var. spelling of *puō*.

**puwō.puwō.** Var. spelling of *puōpuō*.

## R

*All loan words from English sometimes spelled with initial r- are entered under l-. For example: raisi, see laiki, rice; ropi, see lopi, rope; rumi, see lumi, room.*
