

do this step. **3.** vs. Tall, far apart. Rare except in proper names. *Ka-pali-ue-loa* (name of a chief), the very tall cliff. **4.** A kind of mat made without stripping the pandanus leaves. (And.)

uē, uwē. nvi. To cry, weep, lament, mourn; a cry, lamentation, weeping; to salute (Mat. 5.47). Cf. *auē, ha'uha'u uē. Uē wale*, to cry for no reason; crybaby. **ho'o.uē.** To cause weeping, make someone cry.

uea, uwēa. n. Wire. Eng. See *pā uea*.

uea haka.haka. n. Wire screen; screen, as on windows. *Lit.*, space wire.

uea kele.pona. n. Telephone wire.

uea kukū. n. Barbed wire.

uē (uwē) 'ala.lā. vi. To wail loudly, yelp.

uea maka 'upena. n. Chicken wire. *Lit.*, net-mesh wire.

uea moana. n. Undersea cable.

uea 'ole. n. Wireless.

uea 'ō.lēlo. n. Telegraph wire. *Lit.*, speaking wire.

uea poe.poe. n. Smooth wire. *Lit.*, round wire.

uē. 'ehene, uwē'ehene. Same as *ehehene*.

'uehe. Var. spelling of *'uwehe*.

uē helu. nvi. A wailing call of grief and love, recounting deeds of a loved one and shared experiences; to weep and speak thus. *Lit.*, enumerating weeping.

uē 'ino. nvi. To cry loudly; tantrum.

ueka. Var. spelling of *uweka*, dirty.

uē kani.kau. vi. To wail; wailing prayer.

'ueke. Var. spelling of *'uweke*.

ueko. Var. spelling of *uweko*.

ueko.eko. Var. spelling of *uwekoweko*.

uē leo nui. vi. To cry loudly, bawl.

uene, uwene. **1.** vi. To move back and forth, oscillate. *Uene ke kolopā*, the crowbar lifts [of success]. **2.** vi. To break wind slightly. **3.** n. Name of a string figure.

uepa, uwepa. **1.** n. Wafer. Eng. **2.** n. Whip. *Uepa kiani*, a flexible hand whip. Eng. **3.** nvt. Wax seal, as used on envelopes; to seal.

ue.ue, uweuwe. Redup. of *ue 1*; to wriggle, squirm. (PPN *ueue*.)

uē.uē, uwēuwē. Redup. of *uē. ho'o.uē.uē*. Caus/sim.; to imitate wailing; a wailing dirge.

ue.uēko. Var. spelling of *uweuweko*.

'ue. 'uele, uwe'uele. vs. Wet (used with *kēhau*, dew).

uha. n. Large intestine, alimentary canal, colon. Cf. *uaha-hemo, uahalehe, uhalena, uhanui, uha'ula*. See saying, *kāhela 1*.

ū.hā. Same as *puhi ūhā*, an eel.

'uha. nvt. Wasteful, extravagant; waste, extravagance; to waste.

'ū.hā. **1.** n. Thigh, lap, shoulder; hindquarters, as of a horse, beef, or pig. *'Ūhā moa*, drumstick of a chicken. (PCP *kuu(fs)aa*.) **2.** n. Foster parent of a chiefly child, or guardian, so-called because he might hold the child on his lap (*'āhā*). **3.** Var. of *pūhā 1-4*. **4.** Rare var. of *hāhā*, to grope.

'uha 'ai. nv. To waste food or anything; to squander; extravagant; extravagance. (The old Hawaiians did not waste food.)

uhāe. Same as *hāhāe*.

uhāele. Plural of *hāele*, to go, come. See ex., *māki'a. O uhaele mai*, won't you (plural) come.

'ū.hā hame. n. Leg of ham. See *hame*.

'ū.hā heke. Emerson (Malo 201) correction of *'āhā kākau*.

uha.hemo. n. Hemorrhoids.

'ū.hā hipa. n. Leg of mutton. *Lima 'ūhā hipa*, leg-of-mutton sleeve.

'ū.hā hope. n. Hindquarters, as of horse, beef, pig.

uhai. Same as *hahai*. *Ka uhai manu* (Kep. 89), the bird hunter.

uha'i. **1.** Same as *uhaki*, to break. *E uha'i ia i kō lākou mau iwi* (Nah. 24.8), he shall break their bones. **2.** n. Covering for door opening, doorway frame. *Lele kāhili, holo ka uha'i, uhi kapa*, feather standards sway, the door opening is moved into place, the tapa covers [the chief sleeps]. **3.** Similar to *'alu*.

uhai.ā.holo. vt. To pursue or run swiftly; to pass swiftly, as time. *E uhaiāhōlo ana i ka lei aloha* (Kel. 61), following quickly after the beloved child [in death].

'ū.hā kā.kau. n. Subjects of the high chief. (Malo 194.) *Lit.*, tattooed thighs.

'ū.hā kapu. n. A taboo lap, said of persons unable to raise children successfully, believed due to jealousy of an *'aumakua* (family god); a person with the taboo lap. (It was believed that children of the *'ūhā kapu* would die unless reared by relatives.)

uha.kē. Same as *hakē*; broad, wide. *Uhakē nā iwi pāpā-kole*, the hip bones are broad.

uha.ke'ē. vs. Crooked, as a road.

uhaki. Same as *hahaki*, to break.

uha.kole. vi. To strain in an effort to evacuate the bowels. *Fig.*, disobedient, stubborn. *Lit.*, red colon.

uhaku. vt. To put together, roll up.

uhala.lē. vs. Obese. Cf. *halalē*. Rare.

uha.lēhe. Same as *wahalehe*.

uha.lēi. Same as *helei*.

uha.lēna. vs. Lazy, overstuffed with food. *Lit.*, lazy colon.

'uha.loa. n. A small, downy, American weed (*Waltheria indica* var. *americana*), with ovate leaves and small, clustered yellow flowers. Leaves and inner bark of root are very bitter and are used for tea or chewed to relieve sore throat. (Neal 575-6.) One of the plant forms of the pig demigod Kama-pua'a (FS 215). Also *'ala'ala pū loa, hala 'uhaloa, hi'a loa, kanaka loa*.

uhalu. Same as *puhalu 1, halu*; to deplete. *Uhalu ka wai-hona aupuni no ia mau loa'a*, deplete the national treasury of these revenues.

uhalu.halu. Redup. of *uhalu*.

uha.lula. **1.** Same as *hālula*, a sea urchin. **2.** vs. Lazy.

'ū.hā mua. n. Shoulder, as of a cow, horse, pig.

'uhane. nvs. Soul, spirit, ghost; dirge or song of lamentation (*rare*); spiritual. *'Uhane 'ole*, without a soul; shameless, like a beast. *Lele ka 'uhane*, the soul leaves [death]. *Ku'u i ka 'uhane* (Kin. 35.29), to give up the ghost. *Pili 'uhane*, spiritual. *'Uhane 'ololi*, thin, shriveled soul or ghost. (PEP *ku(f,s)ane*.)

'uhane hau.kā'e. n. Wandering, friendless spirits.

'uhane hele. n. A traveling spirit, usually of a living person.

'Uhane Hemo.lele. n. Holy Ghost, Holy Spirit.

'uhane 'ino. n. Unclean or evil spirit (*Biblical*), demon.

'uhane kia'i. n. Guardian spirit.

'uhane kT.hei pua. n. A spirit partially controlling a person and giving him strength, animation, or talents. *Lit.*, flower-mantle spirit.

'uhane noho. n. A spirit possessing a person completely and talking through him. Also *akua noho*.

uha.nui. vs. Fat, weak. *Rare. Lit.*, big colon.

uhao. **1.** Same as *hao 3, 4*. **2.** n. Cone-shaped base from the *kāhili* staff to the first feathers, formerly of feathers, later also of silk or ribbons. *'O ka mo'oni 'ula ka uhao ma ke kumu, i hana 'ia i ka hulu lena 'ō'ō* (*kāhili* chant), the cone-shaped base forms a red spiral at the staff, made with yellow *'ō'ō* feathers. **3.** n. Tenderloin. *Rare*.

'ū.hā pua'a. n. Ham.

uhau. Var. of *hahau*. (Neh. 3.2.) *Uhau i ke kau*, to present a chant; to strike, as in sorcery or as a blow (GP 66). *Uhau akula ia i ka pua'a ma ke alo o 'Iwa* (FS 21), he laid a pig down before 'Iwa. *'Ehia āu manawa i uhau ai iāia?* How many times did you hit him?

uhā.uhā. vi. To pant, puff, as a dog or as the wind (For. 4:77).

'uha.'uha. Redup. of *'uha*; prodigal, wastrel; to squander, debauch, dissolute. *'Uha'uha wale*, wanton. *Ka pa'ani, ka 'uha'uha, a me ka ho'ohiki 'ino*, gaming, waste, and blasphemy. *Ka 'uha'uha a me ka lapuwale* (Kekah. 1.17), madness and folly.

uhau.hakō. Same as *pāwale*, a plant; used as medicine the name may have been *uhau*. (Kam. 64:141.)

uhau.hala.lē. Redup. of *uhalalē*. *Rare*.
